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Home Movie

Joss Whedon follows 'Avengers' with a Shakespearean labor of love filmed at his house

Of course, when you're in the midst of making the biggest, highest-stakes Hollywood blockbuster of the year, the thing you want to do is take what little downtime you have and make another movie. In your own house.

Ah well, nobody ever accused Joss Whedon of treading the conventional path. Despite the Good Hollywood stamp of approval that came with helming Marvel's *The Avengers*, Whedon's track record is that of a maverick, developing quirky genre mash-ups that most would write off as geek-set follies: a high school horror comedy (*Buffy the Vampire Slayer*), a Western in space (*Firefly*), a sci-fi musical parody for the Web (*Dr. Horrible's Sing-Along Blog*). But his new film, an adaptation of William Shakespeare's proto-rom-com *Much Ado About Nothing*, made on his own dime while he was still wrangling Marvel's megabudget superteam, may set a new standard for the writer-director's iconoclastic ways. He and his wife, producer Kai Cole, were set to celebrate their 20th anniversary as a couple with a holiday in Venice when she urged him to use the free time instead to shoot a long-discussed version of *Much Ado*. The idea was inspired by a reading of the play at the couple's home, with Amy Acker and Alexis Denisof, from Whedon's *Buffy* spin-off *Angel*, as the feuding cynics Beatrice and Benedick, who are tricked by their friends into believing that each is desperately in love with the other. For years, Cole and Whedon had hosted Sunday readings of Shakespeare plays with friends who had worked on various projects of Whedon's, and this one struck a special chord. In less than a month, Whedon wrote a script that moved the play to contemporary Southern California while preserving the Elizabethan text, composed new music for the play's three songs, recruited a cast of colleagues and friends from various projects – Clark Gregg (*Avengers*), Nathan Fillion (*Firefly*), Reed Diamond (*Dollhouse*) – and shot the whole thing in 12 days, using his and Cole's Santa Monica home as the sole location. In advance of the film's South by Southwest premiere, Whedon explained to the *Chronicle* just what it was that inspired him to make the film.

Austin Chronicle: So what started the readings at your house all those years ago? Is there a secret society of Shakespeareans in Hollywood?

Joss Whedon: Hardly. No, I don't think so. Or if there is, they've kept it a secret from me. [*Buffy* star James] Marsters said something about doing the show feeling like being in rep, and we had had readings like this when I was a kid at my house with my mom and my stepdad, and I enjoyed them, and I thought, "Well, why don't we do that? Why don't we all get together and have a read?" And they just kept going. And it was one of the great sources of joy in my life, to be able to get my friends together and just sit down with the book and a glass of wine and just explore.

AC: Are you still able to do that?

JW: I am going to be. I had children, which sort of shut things down for a few years, and then we had just started again. But before we'd stopped, Amy and Alexis had read Beatrice and Benedick, and I had thought, "Well, if I'm ever going to film something, I would love to put those performances on film." But for a long time, I just didn't have a take on the material. I hadn't found my way in. And then, suddenly, when my wife suggested that it was time to shoot it already, I looked at the text, and it was as though I was reading it for the first time. I realized what a coherent and specific work it was and also what a great ensemble piece. I think too often it's played

as a two-hander, and it's so much more than that.

AC: How did that inform your casting? Did you have a sense from that first reading that this person would be perfect for this role and that one for that role?

JW: Amy and Alexis were always in the mix. And when I started to think that I might really do this, so now I need to figure out who I think the rest of them are, obviously Nathan Fillion as Dogberry was the first thought that crossed my mind. And then I sort of had been nosing around a bunch of friends, finding out, "Well, are you

free when ...?" and "Is it possible that you could ...?"

without telling them why and ended up with my dream cast, because everyone was either free or made the time. Obviously, I leaned heavily toward people who have Shakespearean experience, although a number of the cast didn't. A lot of the heavy lifting – people like Reed, as Don Pedro, is a complete rock star, and Clark, who had also done a bunch of theatre – I believe his first-ever role was Benedick. Fran [Kranz], also classically trained, as clearly shows. Knowing I had those heavy hitters, I was able to take some chances with some other people. I had an embarrassment of riches of

people who were capable. I really felt these were exactly the people that I hoped would come along.

AC: Given that other film you were directing at the same time, did you ever see yourself as Nick Fury, pulling together all these star players into a team for this extraordinary mission?

JW: I did not see myself as Nick Fury, but now that you've said it, I'm going to. That would be much cooler. I did feel similarly about the two projects in the sense of, *Avengers* was all about making sure every character carried equal weight, had equal fun, mattered in the final battle, in the final analysis, that everybody was somebody's favorite. And when I got into really parsing the text, I was like, "Oh my God, I'm in love with Margaret. Oh my God, Borachio is a tragic hero in his own mind."

All these people opened up to me, and that's kind of how all my storytelling works: making sure that everybody gets respect.

AC: And while you were shooting it, were you ever thinking, "We should have taken that trip instead?"

JW: No, I never once did. I'm too selfish for that. It was and will always be the greatest vacation of my life.

AC: There's a real joy that comes through in every frame that reflects that.

JW: I'm glad to hear that. You know, we all felt that. It bled into the crew, who weren't people that I worked with before. Everybody was in the same giddy state. And that doesn't always translate. Sometimes you look at a movie and go, "Well, they clearly

had fun, but I'm not." In this instance, I felt like it would be useful. It would be something that is part of the play, because it is everybody having a good time – sometimes a little too much of a good time, and sometimes it goes sour, but there was true joy that permeated the thing, so I'm glad to hear that it showed up on screen.

AC: There is this sort of dichotomy between *Much Ado* and *The Avengers* that's like, to use a Marvel reference, Bruce Banner and the Hulk. You have one of the biggest blockbuster films that Hollywood makes and one of the smallest indie films that gets made. As the person in the director's chair, the person leading the way, what shift in mentality did it require, moving among those radically different scales?

JW: I would say the biggest difference was, here I was literally at home with the people I love most in the world, doing something where the stakes were nonexistent and that was purely an expression of our feelings about a piece of art and our attempt to create one. *Avengers* I was very happy about, but the process itself is kind of grueling, so really what I had to adjust to was the idea that I could have so much fun. Because you're dealing with so many of the same problems: You're always losing the light; your actors' schedules are always messed up; the paint is drying on the set. All of that's going on in every production, and, in this instance, that adjustment wasn't so different. If I could have traded one thing, you know, running sound in your own neighborhood turns out to be ... there's a lot of mowing that goes on in the world. ■

Kathleen Hanna Kills It

‘The Punk Singer’ turns up the volume on riot grrrl pioneer’s passion, politics, and devastating illness

Bikini Kill’s 1992 eponymous EP, which celebrated its 20th anniversary reissue last fall, marked a pivotal moment not just for music, but for a movement. The segue from “Suck My Left One” into “Feels Blind” perfectly illustrates the Olympia, Wash., punk band’s balance of subversion and empowerment, which pushed the third wave of feminism into action. Singer Kathleen Hanna delivers the latter song’s gut-punch expertly: “As a woman I was taught to always be hungry. Women are well-acquainted with thirst.”

The riot grrrl movement, which sprang from Bikini Kill’s live shows, zines, and activism, was fundamentally linked to the music of that time, but its message has evolved along with the fourth wave of feminism, and its influence has been far-reaching: Hanna is a vocal advocate for Pussy Riot, the band of Russian artists and activists who were arrested last winter for performing in a Moscow cathedral; riot grrrl’s history is now part of the curriculum of Girls Rock Camps across the country.

For a bit more context on that pivotal moment, filmmaker Sini Anderson’s *The Punk Singer* focuses the lens on Hanna. After gathering footage for a Le Tigre concert doc three years ago, Hanna asked Anderson if she would do a proper documentary. Anderson had another angle. “Kathleen started making work 20 years ago,” she says. “I thought she should tell her story.”

So Anderson quit her full-time job and started filming with no outside funding, “scraping pennies together to get hard drives.” Anderson visited with Hanna seasonally, starting in the summer, then fall, then spring, then summer again. She also made good use of NYU’s Riot Grrrl Collection – compiled by Hanna in 2011 for the Fales Library – for archival footage and ephemera. The film explores the press blackout after riot grrrl became a buzz word, the breakup of Bikini Kill in 1997, and Hanna’s subsequent relocation to NYC and formation of Julie Ruin and Le Tigre, cut with live footage and interviews.

“When I watch myself on camera, in any capacity – being interviewed, performing, 20 years ago or yesterday – there’s a part of me that really doesn’t grasp that it’s me,” Hanna says when asked if it was strange to revisit her younger self. “I’m not like Sasha Fierce or something. I just have a chip in my brain that makes me feel divorced from my recorded image.”

By the time we get to Hanna’s days with Le Tigre, her “feminist party band” of the early Aughts, her increasing health issues are becoming a barrier from performing, and Anderson captures Hanna’s frustration elegantly. This piv-

ots the film into its second half, when Hanna eventually receives a diagnosis of Lyme disease in 2010, and subsequently reforms Julie Ruin, now known as the Julie Ruin. Anderson shows us good days of creativity and bad days, hazy with medications.

“I never knew how much making music meant to me until I got sick,” Hanna says. “I remember laying in bed and thinking who would be in my dream band, and it was [Julie Ruin’s] Carmine, Kathi, Sara, and Kenny. At that point I was pretty sick, but there were times when I was functional and I started thinking this is maybe the only time I even have these functional windows, so I started my dream band. Sometimes I would show up at practice barely able to make it up the subway stairs, just feeling totally terrible, but once we started playing I felt normal again. I wasn’t the illness anymore; I was me, and to be honest, I hadn’t seen me for a long, long time.

“I did write one of the best songs on the record with an IV sticking out of my arm, which I’m pretty proud of.”

Anderson’s decadelong friendship with Hanna eases the more emotional parts of the film, the postproduction of which was funded quite successfully via Kickstarter. She is careful not to step on her subject’s toes, letting Hanna tell the story. Anderson also has Lyme disease, so there is an empathy to the storyline, shading the doubt, confusion, and fear, as well as the irony of the situation: This artist, so engaged in feminism and activism, could not fight off this particular attacker.

“It was intense,” Anderson says. “The way the disease works, there are flare-ups, and there were periods of time when I would just not hear from her. But also, it’s like, that’s my friend. And I’ve never met someone who shows up as much for the cause as Kathleen.”

That idea is the core of *The Punk Singer*; Hanna is still a rallying force, but she is not her illness. That Anderson made this film on a very DIY level, with contributions from fans and friends, emphasizes the support

Hanna has and reinforces the impact of her art, not just in queer and feminist circles.

“I was just writing whatever and letting it be,” Hanna says of the new Julie Ruin material. “I can tell now that I was channeling my anger, fear, and sadness about my illness into it, but also letting go of all the toxic people in my life that I didn’t have the energy to deal with anymore. Once I got sick, I had no patience for petty bullshit or toxic people, and I think that fueled my creativity as much as anything.” ■

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SOUTH BY SO MUCH PUNK

There’s a wealth of punk docs at SXSW this year, spanning the 40-year existence of the genre and spotlighting a few international scenes. A spiritual sister to *The Punk Singer*, *Pussy Riot: A Punk Prayer* documents six months in the life of three Pussy Riot members who were sentenced to seven years in prison after performing a punk prayer, later deemed an act of “hooliganism,” in a Moscow church in February 2012. We most often saw images of the three women – Maria Alyokhina, Yekaterina Samutsevich, and Nadezhda Tolokonnikova – behind bars or glass, or on trial. Directors Mike Lerner and Maxim Pozdorovkin take the time to get each woman’s backstory, and give us a sense of Russia’s feminist and activist history.

Over in Finland, *The Punk Syndrome* follows the four members of the band Pertti Kurikan

Nimipäivät, each of whom is developmentally disabled. They sing about the classic punk themes – hatred of rules, the plight of being misunderstood – and the film is a nice balance of humor and pathos, as we look into their day-to-day lives.

The Belfast punk scene of the late Seventies is the focus of biopic *Good Vibrations*, the diary of glass-eyed madman Terri Hooley (Richard Dormer) and his record store, Good Vibrations. He later started a label of the same name, releasing bands like the Undertones and shaping Belfast’s musical community at a time when political conflict paralyzed Northern Ireland. Dormer’s embodiment of Hooley’s idealism and manic optimism is spot-on.

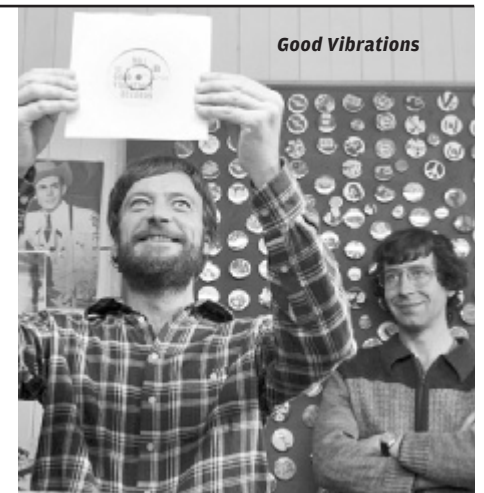
Detroit trio Death – brothers David, Bobby, and Dannis Hackney – bypassed the R&B of their hometown and embraced political punk in the

early Seventies, providing the connective tissue for bands yet to come. They get the doc treatment with *A Band Called Death*, tracing their rediscovery via the Internet generation and their gripping family history (the Hackney brothers were preacher’s sons, which no doubt informed their rhetoric).

Does the world need two separate Green Day documentaries? Probably not, but nevertheless they exist and make their debut at SXSW. *Broadway Idiot* follows singer Billie Joe Armstrong’s unlikely ascent from mainstream punk commodity to Broadway star with the musical *American Idiot*; *jCuatro!* captures the 2012 studio recording of albums *jUno!*, *jDos!*, and *jTré!*, as the band tries to recapture the magic after *American Idiot*’s international success.

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Queer Culture From the 1970s to 70

Three documentaries highlight a generation of gay icons

As gunshots sound in quick succession, the red, white, and blue American flag is replaced with a rainbow-hued gay pride flag. MC5's "Kick Out the Jams" roils up, igniting a montage of black-and-white photographs of queers getting arrested and throwing a riotous fit. This is the opening sequence of MC5's "Kick out the Jams," Malcolm Ingram's *(Bear Nation, Small Town Gay Bar)* new documentary premiering this year at SXSW. It concerns a moment in LGBTQ history, the post-Stonewall 1970s, when LGBTQ folks of all stripes were beginning to flex their political muscles. One of the more interesting leitmotifs of this year's SXSW documentary film programming is how many films review that famous decade.

The 1970s were littered with gay spaces and icons that, in the intervening years, have since taken on a mythic status – perhaps none more so than the Continental Baths in New York City, the subject of *Continental*. Opened in 1968, the Baths famously hosted performances throughout the early Seventies from the likes of Bette Midler (known there as "Bathhouse Bettie"), Patti LaBelle, Barry Manilow, the New York Dolls, and even a Metropolitan Opera diva. Frankie Knuckles, aka the Godfather of House Music, got his start DJ'ing day and night at the Baths' in-house disco; he refers to the Baths as his "finishing school." But the primary function of a bathhouse is, and always was, the smooth facilitation of quick and easy sexual encounters between consenting men. As such, bathhouses were meaningful spaces to enact a liberationist sexuality. And today, as discussions of marriage reign supreme in gay politics, Ingram's documentary puts the spotlight squarely on nonmonogamous sex. The filmmaker is clear: "I think people have to think about sex a lot more, and sex is complicated. ... It is incredibly satisfying, with this film, to be able to celebrate sexuality."

Yet the Baths' story as Ingram relates it isn't all sunshine, blow jobs, and bath towels. Bathhouses were subject to constant police raids and harassment and were often either owned by or heavily indebted to crime syndicates. There's a darkness there, too.

The spine of Ingram's documentary rests on the testimony of one individual, Steve Ostrow, the former owner of the Baths. Ostrow, now living in Australia, has kept his penchant for community organizing by

founding Mature Age Gays, one of Australia's largest gay senior groups. Ingram retells Ostrow's life and career as an aspirant opera singer and businessman. "I wanted to make sure his story wasn't lost," says Ingram. "If I didn't get to work, there was a chance the key players wouldn't be telling the story themselves."

One of the most important contributions of *Continental* is that it gives viewers an opportunity to reflect on a narrative that doesn't end with the mass trauma of HIV/AIDS; the Baths closed in 1974, long before the pandemic began in earnest. They closed due to a host of otherwise banal business decisions that might foreclose any business – Ostrow strayed from his initial model and put his money, time, and resources into evening cabaret shows that brought in nongay crowds. The regulars felt like half-naked ornamental baubles for the straights happily slumming it in the Baths. The bathhouse was, in short, no longer a bathhouse.

If *Continental* is focused on an important cultural place of the Seventies, *I Am Divine*, directed by Jeffrey Schwarz (*Vito, Wrangler: Anatomy of an Icon*), sets its sight on an equally important cultural figure from the era, Divine (née Harris Glenn Milstead). While hunky gays were dancing up a storm on the disco floors of New York, Divine was infamously eating dog shit, hanging with the Cockettes in San Francisco, and eventually coming to a more mainstream consciousness with her trashy electron-

ic dance music. If the Baths stood for a radical sexual hedonism, Divine stood for a proto-punk nihilism carefully embroidered with caustic irony.

John Waters (boyhood neighbors with Milstead) is an always-entertaining staple of the documentary circuit, but his interviews here are more germane, as he's able to reveal a great deal about someone he was close with. The documentary, like Schwarz's other documentaries, is satisfyingly slick and peppered with minirevelations. The emotional core of the film, however, is Milstead's estrangement from his family and their eventual reunion. In 1988, when Milstead takes his mother to the opening of *Hairspray*, familial love and pride rule the day. Weirdly, the film is heavy on why Divine was so ... heavy. Friends and family make educated guesses about the corpulent

Trinidad, this film is a deep character study. Documentaries on older subjects can easily tip toward nostalgic treacle, but Raval's empathic and slow eye structurally prevents such one-note readings. In the process, we are left with a vision of how the 1970s lives on (or doesn't) in the folks who are now themselves in their seventies.

One character, 76-year-old Dennis, who lives in Niceville, Fla. (a place he describes as "the pits"), is a cross-dresser who, throughout the documentary, comes into his own as "Dee" in more and more visibly public ways. Elsewhere, Ty Martin heads up SAGE (Services & Advocacy for GLBT Elders) in Harlem, N.Y. We see him tabling, at Harlem Pride, as a ring bearer, and discouraging with ease and elegance on the host of social struggles for older gay men and men of color. Closest to home is Robert "The Mouth," who is the drag queen figurehead/owner of Robert's Lafitte bar in Galveston, Texas. He's a "crazy old bird" who "picks up stray cats," a self-identified hoarder. His world is one of Hawaiian shirts and Mylar curtains, recalling the trappings of Los Angeles' Silver Platter, showcased in last year's *Wildness* (Wu Tsang). "I wanted to do a Texas story, especially living in Texas," says Raval, "but I initially just chose each person because I was interested to know where they were going in life. All three represent a different stage of the life cycle: adolescence, middle age, and finally, growing older."

These men's lives are by turns outlandish and interestingly humdrum. Kinda like the 1970s.

Together, *Continental*, *I Am Divine*, and *Before You Know It* make clear that the 1970s continue to serve as a touchstone for the films' primary subjects and directors. Uncoincidentally, all of these documentaries are made by men who spent their early and formative childhood years living in the 1970s. Raval, like many of his contemporaries, may not "have a recollection of the Seventies, but I have a concept of what the Seventies mean: It's that weird time period between post-sexual revolution and pre-Eighties capitalist consumerism." Now as adults, Raval, Schwarz, and Ingram recover what they can to help define a more holistic contemporary queer politics. ■

You Can't Always Get What You Want

Yen Tan's 'Pit Stop' finds humanity in transaction

Credit cards slide, change is made. Anxiously bright packaging is shoehorned into digestible rows. It's right there in the names: Kwik-Stop, Go-Mart, In-and-Out. We're not supposed to linger at gas stations. But where most of us divert our eyes in the body memory of commerce, Yen Tan keeps his wide open.

Pit Stop, Tan's third feature, uses the coldness of a convenience store to warm a different sort of transaction – uneasy agreements made in desperation and foolhardy compromises made in stasis. The film follows two semicloseted men in rural Texas dealing with the weight of former relationships. Gabe (Bill Heck) returns to the comfort of his ex-wife after an abrupt affair with a married man. Ernesto (Marcus DeAnda) juggles the animus of a live-in ex-boyfriend with the sickness of another past love.

The characters were a bit of an accident. In 2003, Tan was spending much time traveling between Dallas and Houston. Observations led to imagined plot points and then research on the rural sections of then-popular hook-up site Gay.com. "From the very beginning, I was drawn to the setting because it is not an environment I was familiar with. Small-town America fascinates me. Being gay adds another level of intrigue. A lot of the men I chatted with were married, closeted, or semicloseted. Most had blue-collar professions, but they were somehow fine with living in small towns."

For the Malaysian-born, city-raised director, the challenge was in making the story relatable. "We're tempted to say that you're more lonely as a gay person in a small town. But with *Pit Stop*, I was stripping it down to basic human emotions – the feelings you are going through when you're getting out or about to get in a relationship, that semi-drunken call to an ex. Those transitional moments are very identifiable for most of us." But where the film could have very easily drowned in melodrama, Tan pulls back. His approach is more akin to Bergman than Sirk. He explains: "Cinematically, I like putting characters in solitary confinement. ... In taking a moment to allow for introspection in the character, it allows us to have an introspective moment with ourselves."

Still, if not exactly a tragedy, *Pit Stop* does spend most of its running time in quiet grief. Tan admits the film may not be for everybody, laughing at a particularly snarky Sundance review from *The Hollywood Reporter*. "What is considered as boring or slow is such a subjective thing," he says. "If you are connected at a very early point, a film can be slow and you are still along for the ride. Even with

action films, it's funny how we take the image for granted." *Pit Stop*'s slower scenes may not give the viewer whiplash, but they nudge the plot along, and the viewer's patience is rewarded with a novelistic intimacy. It's a bit like those crowded gas station aisles. You only find what you want if you're looking. ■

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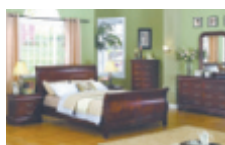
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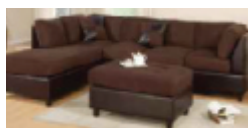


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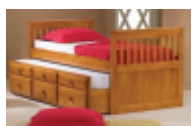
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Air Sex in the Name of Love

Bryan Poyser's 'The Bounceback' strives to strike a balance between comedy and emotion

When it comes to taking risks that might make audiences uncomfortable, there are movies that play it safe and movies that take chances. Then there are movies that center a great deal of the plot on forcing the audience to watch several of your protagonists pretend to hump the air in multiple, extended sequences. *The Bounceback* is the latter sort of film.

But for a movie in which the characters spend a good deal of time simulating sex with invisible partners, *The Bounceback* also has a surprising amount of heart, which director Bryan Poyser says was the balance he worked hard to strike. "It's really about all of the dumb things that you do when you're in your 20s, in pursuit of finding the right person for you," he explains.

Those dumb things sometimes include getting involved in performance art events like *Air Sex*, planning impromptu cross-country trips in the hope of running into someone you broke up with months ago, living in squalid group apartments with loser friends, and engaging in a string of regrettable one-night stands – all of which are poor decisions that the characters make in *The Bounceback*. For Poyser, the key is making sure that that the dumb things his characters do are dumb things that an audience can relate to. That meant carefully balancing dumb gross-out humor and dumbness committed as a part of the quest for true love.

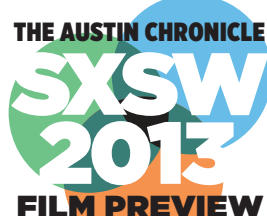
"I wanted all of the characters to be likeable," he says. "In the early screenings, there was a lot more *Air Sex* in there, but people felt it kinda pulled away from the emotional turmoil. There's a lot more *Air Sex* on the cutting room floor, but it was a balance between it being in there enough for people to recognize that it was a real thing, and for them to dread the idea that it was a real thing." It is a real thing – Alamo Drafthouse CEO Tim League owns the trademark, which he licensed to Poyser for a dime – and

the *Air Sex* work; you understand why this character would do this."

Exploring the richer themes of the film – the emotional inertia following a failed relationship, what it's like to watch a close friend spiral downward – through such an unlikely device seems to be something that Poyser delights in. "I don't know why it works," he says. "So far, it seems to be working – people are on board with the comedy, and they're laughing, and they're on board with the emotional through-line of it."

Finding that through-line seems like it was easy enough for Poyser: Mostly, it seems, it just involved remembering what it's like to make absurd choices as part of the pursuit of happiness. "I did a lot of those things," he laughs, and getting back to that frame of mind helped him balance the laughs with honesty.

"That's the thing about being in your 20s," Poyser says. "The pursuit of love and relationships is really the most important thing in your life. It really is. There's this hanging question over your head of, 'Will I ever find someone who really loves me, who I really love?' For me, that was definitely a huge part of making it through my 20s. A lot of the movie was just trying to get back to that state of mind, so the emotional points would be impactful and seem earned and not be out of line with all of the craziness that goes along with it."

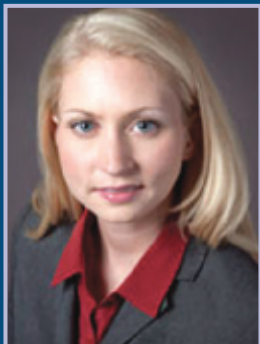
Zach Cregger, *The Whitest Kids U'Know* alum whose character does the lion's share of the air-humping in the film, almost declined the part because of it.

These particular films take us from fake accents in Scotland to Japanese driving escapades and political dancing at Mardi Gras, and, in each, the film's geographic turf is as central to the project as any of the leads. The Great Hip Hop Hoax

Director Jeanie Finlay documents the journey of Silibil n' Brains, aka Scotsmen Billy Boyd and Gavin Bain, who were so intent on becoming international hip-hop superstars that they faked being American ... and landed a record deal in the process. With meticulously honed Californian accents and manufactured backstories, the two best friends are launched on a path to stratospheric success, only to buckle under the stress of their lies.

Getting Back to Abnormal

City council politics meet the racial divide of New Orleans – but it is more than just black and white. Directors Louis Alvarez, Andrew Kolker, Peter Odabashian, and Paul Stekler take on the huge task of documenting the political season in the cultural gumbo where desegregation and civil rights issues still remain as integral to the landscape as the sea level. Glitter and church, Saints and sinners, and a constant quest for improvement are all part of the NOLA story, but so are poverty and post-Katrina reconstruction woes. Real New Orleans citizens are a colorful bunch, and the film offers glimpses of the hilarious and triumphant personalities that reign in the Big Easy.

Dog Flesh (Carne de Perro)

Director Fernando Guzzoni gives viewers a front-row seat to one man's desperate attempt to exorcise emotional demons in this equally grotesque and enlightening narrative. Viewers will see the lasting effects of Augusto Pinochet's dictatorship in Chile through the lens of ex-military man Alejandro's suffering. An act of gut-wrenching violence transforms the man and illuminates the idea that despair knows no cultural bounds.

And Who Taught You to Drive?

A comedic conglomerate of mismatched cultures, this film documents the hilarity and frustration that ensue when three expatriates attempt to acquire driver's licenses on foreign soil. Director Andrea Thiele sheds light on global communities' idiosyncrasies through the simple act of road lessons in Tokyo, Bavaria, and Mumbai. In their respective crash courses in cultural quirks, American Jake experiences struggles with the basics in Japan, German Mirela holds her own on India's chaotic roads, and Korean Hye-Won is determined to assimilate on the Autobahn.

These Birds Walk

A docudrama that takes place in one of the largest and most violent cities in the world – Karachi, Pakistan – this film records the lives of the most vulnerable of any society: homeless children. Save for some kind souls along his way, Omar, a runaway boy, is alone and barefoot as he struggles with life's cruelties; he becomes a poster child for self-preservation. Armed with little more than his faith, he seeks to find his place in the world and pinpoint his home in this equally heartrending and inspirational quest for truth. At times breathless and afraid, at other times indignant, Omar exemplifies the power of the human spirit.

The Network

Limited electricity, widespread illiteracy, and Sharia law? No problem. As post-Taliban restoration continues in Afghanistan, director Eva Orner follows the Moheni family as they build an empire of radio and TV programs aimed at swapping town-square executions for *Sesame Street* and daytime soap operas, highlighting positive changes in attitudes about police, community, and women's rights.

Maidentrip

At 14, Laura Dekker wanted to take on the world, and she was willing to go to court to prove she could, but that's only the beginning: Dekker sought to become the youngest person to ever sail a complete lap around the world ... solo. Jillian Schlesinger's film combines Dekker's own at-sea footage with a documented account of the maturity she developed as she explored islands of paradise and confronted her fears – always keeping her eyes focused on the horizon.

Sofia's Last Ambulance

This piece by director Ilian Metev is a super up-close-and-personal (indeed, you're in the face of the three leads for the duration) look at a day in the life of an EMS team in Sofia, Bulgaria. They make stops for patients, battle with their dispatcher (inefficient and haphazard at best, costing lives at worst), and generally show the more personal side of a career that many take for granted. The team shares some of the same universal gripes as the rest of us – troubled love lives, job frustrations, etc. – which makes their plight that much more relatable. But they are indeed some of the last of their kind, and you have to wonder how much longer they can take it.

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Traveling Road Show

Archivist Rick Prelinger debuts an interactive ode to America in moving pictures

Rick Prelinger is a retro-futurist philosopher who collects things. Lots of things. Best known as the founder of the Prelinger Archives, a collection of over 60,000 educational, industrial, and sponsored films acquired by the Library of Congress in 2002, he has recently begun stockpiling other people's home movies. He's arming himself to challenge everything you think you know about documentary filmmaking.

"There's this notion that a documentary today isn't complete unless it has a narrative arc and characters," he told me over the phone from his home in San Francisco. He says the contemporary emphasis on storytelling has spawned an industry of "cookie-cutter docs" that cram archival footage into a three-act mold festooned with music, talking heads, and fancy graphics. Why gild the lily? A home movie already *has* a narrative, characters, and action. "It might be an unschooled auteur, but you're always playing with things that have an intentionality to them. I think the public is more than capable of looking at raw material and figuring out their own interpretation," he said. On March 10, *No More Road Trips?* will give the audience a chance to do just that.

No More Road Trips? is a live-performance, interactive film presentation culled from home movies of American car trips and family vacations spanning the 20th century. Like most of his 8mm and Super 8mm source material, *Road Trips* has no sound. The audience will provide real-time audio commentary. It's an unscripted cinema experience Prelinger calls "silent but noisy." He wants people to get "rowdy," like sports

fans: "Why can't movie audiences be so uninhibited?" During the film, he'll preside as referee: "I'll ask the audience to identify things ... to dispute one another, but most of all, to talk about ideas." Whatever happened to the romance of the highway? Has the westward journey, so deeply ingrained in our national consciousness, come to an end?

With funding from the Creative Capital Foundation, equipment support from the Internet Archive, and the help of a handful of volunteers, Prelinger has sifted through some 9,000 cans of home movies, digitizing and editing approximately 90,000 minutes worth of footage into a 90-minute film. When I ask him how many hard drives he's had to buy to store all these video files, he treats it like a rhetorical question. "It's just insane, this level of excess." We're in mad genius territory here. *Road Trips* is a journey through the past designed to get us all talking – loudly – about the future. ■

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Celluloid Icons

The larger-than-life John Milius and the enigmatic, introverted Harry Dean Stanton come into focus

The careers of John Milius and Harry Dean Stanton have intersected on two occasions – *Dillinger* and *Red Dawn* – and, in the broader scheme, share an uncommon prolificacy. Still, new documentaries on each leave the viewer with wildly divergent images: Milius as a marauding Hollywood Hemingway on perpetual safari; Stanton, a wizened stray foraging for scraps and eluding predators in a moonlit Laurel Canyon.

Swiss director Sophie Huber's *Harry Dean Stanton: Partly Fiction* finds the singular 86-year-old character actor more dysthymic than dynamic in reflecting on his life and credits, but when Stanton offers up renditions of George Jones' "Tennessee Whiskey," Will Callery's "Hands on the Wheel," and Fred Neil's "Everybody's Talkin'," things come alive and get transcendent pretty quick. Expertly interspersed with clips from *Cool Hand Luke*, *Alien*, *The Straight Story*, *Repo Man*, and *Paris, Texas*, the film builds to understated bursts of revelation.

Milius, meanwhile, the feature-length debut from industry stalwarts Joey Figueroa and Zak Knutson, is as outsized as its subject and as consuming as his best work, erring on the side of excess. It simultaneously blows away and amplifies assumptions about the prodigious screenwriter (*Dirty Harry*, *The Life and Times of Judge Roy Bean*, *Apocalypse Now*), director (*The Wind and the Lion*, *Conan the Barbarian*), executive producer (*Rome*), and script doctor (*Jaws*). "He doesn't write for pussies, and he doesn't write for women," Sam Elliott helpfully points out early on. "He writes for men, because he's a man."

In the days leading up to SXSW Film 2013, the *Chronicle* spoke with Huber by phone in advance of *Partly Fiction*'s North American premiere and Figueroa and Knutson together, also by phone, in advance of *Milius*' world premiere. Austin Chronicle: Were you at any point vexed by Stanton as a subject?

Sophie Huber: In a way, yes, but I've known him for a long time. We've been friends for 20 years or so. I thought of recording his music before I did the documentary. ... Once I started doing it, I thought it would be great to document it in a film. It took another year to persuade him to agree. Eventually, I said, "Look, it's not about you. You don't have to talk about yourself. We're just going to record

songs. If you don't like it, we can stop." [Laughs] And that was that. Initially, he would say, "No way, I'm never going to do that." He doesn't care about the past much; he says there's no ego. So, of course, a documentary would be all about the past and a celebration of his career, but I knew that he had regrets of not fully using his musical talents.

AC: He talks a little about that, late in the film –

SH: With Kris Kristofferson, yes.

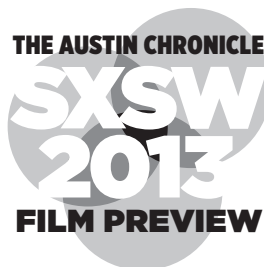

AC: And I'm wondering if you got the sense that he eventually looked at this as an opportunity to correct that.

SH: That's how I got him interested. He agreed, eventually, so I think a part of him was intrigued by it. But it was only after I got an Oscar-nominated DP [Seamus McGarvey], and David Lynch already had said yes to participating, that he really came around.

AC: Can you tell me about how you built the film, what your blueprint looked like, and whether you had to stray from it or if you ended up getting more than you thought you might?

SH: It was clear to me that I didn't want to make a talking heads documentary. I wanted Harry to be the leading man, and I wanted to make his philosophy and state of

mind palpable to create the kind of atmosphere that he exudes in person: a certain sense of peace and calm, at least when he is in a good mood. His main philosophy is to be in the present moment. He also says that everything is connected. I tried to find thematic and visual connections in the edit, through the placements of songs and also film clips ... I wanted the film to reflect his thoughts, like a stream of consciousness, being in his mind and therefore, hopefully, feeling connected with him.

AC: Why this film for your first statement in English?

SH: *Paris, Texas* really had a profound effect on me. I saw that when I was a teenager, coming of age in Switzerland. Having this idea of America, the way it's portrayed through Wim Wenders' eyes, having also this deep fascination. I felt I knew this character; I knew Travis somehow, and could relate. When I actually met Harry, even more so. And, then, his music, I just felt I needed to give him that platform. It was very difficult, but it was just something I needed to do. I felt it had to be done. ■

Austin Chronicle: When you've got Charlie Sheen calling your subject insane and Oliver Stone saying he's not grounded in reality, you know you've got something special. Which of your sources were the most insightful?

Zak Knutson: It's kind of unique. I think Steven Spielberg would be the heart of the piece. Steven came from a place of talking about one of his best friends in the world. He has known John since they were kids in film school; a lot of these guys have. Somebody like George Lucas, who's basically giving you the black-and-white and background from somebody who looks at John as a big brother figure. And Scorsese, who's bringing this film historian aspect to John's output. Everybody kind of took a different angle to it. One thing with Oliver Stone: You've got two guys who are polar opposites when it comes to politics. But, when it comes to films, they were on the same page.

AC: You mentioned *Milius*' politics. Can you talk about his iconoclastic –

ZK: Calling himself a Zen anarchist.

AC: Right. The idea of him being blacklisted as this right-wing NRA nut job. How serious and how significant of an issue was that, from your point of view?

Joey Figueroa: I think that whole political angle has a few layers to it. What I like about bringing that up in the documentary, you kind of have to let the audience make up their own mind about how they feel on where he stands. ... That whole thing about being blacklisted, you know some people think that he was, based on his political beliefs, because of his outlandish statements. Other people say, "No, he's just crazy, Hollywood doesn't give a shit. Hollywood only cares if you can generate a buck."

AC: Is he a hero to you guys? Is that what drew you to this project to begin with?

JF: He's become someone who I've grown to admire immensely. For reasons that you might not imagine. You look at John, and the writing's amazing. His body of work is amazing. In the beginning, my knowledge of John was just that: his work. But what I appreciate about John is his personality, and what we've learned in this process.

ZK: For me, I love John's work. I think *Dillinger* is an overlooked masterpiece. It's beautiful. *Conan the Barbarian*, I was a fan of it when I was a kid, still am. *Red Dawn* ... John definitely had a take to his films. You can call it macho, you can call it masculine, you can call it guy stuff, but it was a unique point of view, which made John stand apart. ■

You're Next, AJ Bowen

Local actor shares his SXSW with a teen rom-com and a brutal thriller

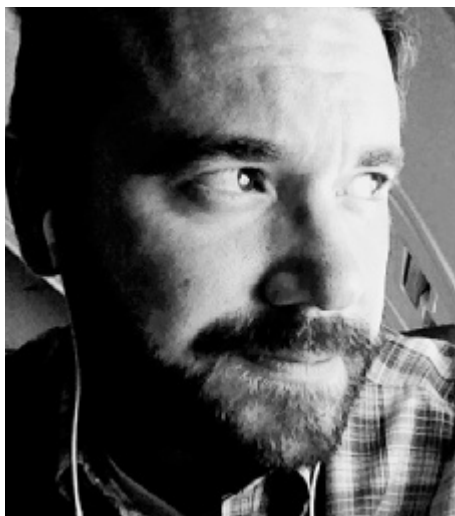

AJ Bowen isn't a bearded killer; he just plays one really well.

If you've never heard of him, he wouldn't be shocked. He said, "I've resigned myself to being involved perpetually with projects that five to 10 people see, and most of those people are related to me." His signature roles have been in underground shockers, from *The Signal*'s mentally imploding husband to his award-winning depiction of a serial killer in *A Horrible Way to Die*. Dramatic irony time: Bowen doesn't enjoy onscreen brutality. He said, "I can't watch *A Clockwork Orange*. People look at me like I'm insane; they think I'm saying that it's shitty. No. It's a Kubrick film. That resolves that issue. But I can't watch people do ugly, terrible things to people." So how does he square that creative circle? Because, for him, it's about the underground, not the shock. He said: "There's this misconception that I'm just a horror guy. That's partially true, but the world that I end up living in most of the time is actually this weird, strange, independent art world."

His two SXSW films could change his "underground horror guy" rep forever: Austin-lensed *Grow Up*, *Tony Phillips*, a delicate teen rom-com where the clothes stay on; and *You're Next*, a home-invasion flick with glacial family dynamics that would make Ibsen wince. That brutal/cerebral thriller is spawned from the loose affiliation known as mumblecore: Written and directed by his *Horrible Way* collaborators Simon Barrett and Adam Wingard, *You're Next* reunites Bowen with scene mainstays Joe Swanberg and Amy Seimetz. A U.S. debut at Fantastic Fest 2011 showed the trademark awkward personal relationships remained but with Friday night multiplex-pleasing action mixed in. After a ferocious bidding war, it disappeared into Lionsgate's vaults. Now it's penciled in for an Aug. 23 release, but first it breaks loose for three SXSW Midnighter showings. At 36, Bowen is phlegmatic about the claims it will be the next *Scream* ("I've done enough bad movies," he said, "and I've done enough good movies where I was really fond of them and people shit at them that it's all arbitrary to me.") However, festival director Janet Pierson loved it so much she broke her informal rule about not rescreening another Austin festival's debut.

As a SXSW and Fantastic Fest regular, Bowen is an honorary affiliate of the Austin film community, a position he secures with local enfant terrible Emily Hagins' latest feature. He plays Pete, the ne'er-do-well cousin of Halloween-obsessed high school

senior Tony (Hagins' *My Sucky Teen Romance* star Tony Vespe, brother of Ain't It Cool News mainstay Eric Vespe, aka Quint). Bowen flew to the set of the micro-indie pretty much straight from the set of his next major picture, Ti West's *The Sacrament*. So why scale down to Hagins' Kickstarter-funded project? The best reason: He wanted to. "I like her brain, and I wanted to work with her, and I knew that one of my best friend's brother, who is a pretty good actor, was going to be in it. So yeah, I absolutely wanted to do it."

His peers know why they keep hiring him: He does films that call to him, with people he likes, and he delivers a scene that sticks. In *Grow Up*, he puckers up for an extremely awkward kissing lesson with Vespe. Likewise, he tilts *You're Next* on its head with a three-minute monologue to co-star Sharni Vinson. Just before its Fantastic Fest screening, she called Bowen "bar none, the best actor I've worked with to date." She recalled: "The day we shot that scene, I was just blown away. I couldn't believe that somebody could deliver four pages of dialogue so convincingly."

Whether *You're Next* is the summer smash Lionsgate wants or not, Bowen seems content with where he's heading. He recently finished a script with *Smashed* co-writer Susan Burke and is focusing on what he wants next. He said, "I'd reached a point of stagnancy where I was like, 'I'm done being the heavy' – and I mean that literally and figuratively. I'm done being the fat guy that's somehow warm and teddy-bearish, even though he kills people." ■

Liberty and Justice

Michael Morton tells
Al Reinert his story of
wrongful conviction and
25 years behind bars

By the time Michael Morton returned to the historic Williamson County Courthouse last year, it had long since been transformed into a museum.

The last time he was there, in 1987, Morton sat in a wooden chair for six days, listening to then-District Attorney Ken Anderson tell a jury that Morton was clearly responsible for the bludgeoning death of his wife, Christine, inside the couple's home just north of Austin the previous year. Morton adamantly maintained he was innocent, but in the end that wasn't enough to convince the jurors, who convicted him and sentenced him to life in prison for the murder. Walking back into that room last year, "the way I felt [back] then came back," Morton says. It's not that it was "haunting," he says, "but so many things have gone on ... and I haven't had time to grieve."

In the years that followed his conviction, Morton learned how to live in prison, and he struggled mightily with loss and with the demons of revenge before DNA testing finally revealed that the DNA of another man, eventually identified as Mark Alan Norwood, was mingled with Christine's blood on a blue bandana found discarded behind the couple's home after the murder. While Morton spent his 30s and 40s behind bars – in the process losing his only child, Eric, who was just 3 at the time of Christine's murder and who grew up believing his father had killed her – Norwood was free, cutting a path of crime across several states that allegedly included the 1988 murder of another young mother in Austin: Debra Baker, also found bludgeoned in her bedroom.

To make matters worse, it appears there was ample evidence available back in 1987 to demonstrate that Morton was innocent and that someone else was responsible. Had law enforcement officials, including Anderson, paid attention to that evidence, it is reasonable to believe not only that Morton would not have been convicted, but also that Baker's life might have been spared. In February, a rare court-of-inquiry proceeding commenced to determine whether Anderson

deliberately withheld that evidence – including reports from neighbors that a van had been seen parked behind the Morton's home in the days before the killing and a transcribed phone conversation between Christine's mother and the case's lead investigator, now-retired Sgt. Don Wood of the Williamson County Sheriff's Office, wherein Morton's mother-in-law explained that Eric witnessed the murder and was describing to her the "monster" who did it, a man not his father. Anderson could face criminal charges if the judge considering the case determines that he knowingly withheld any exculpatory evidence.

In May 2012, Morton returned to the historic courtroom to spend two days in a similar wooden chair and share with journalist-turned-filmmaker Al Reinert intimate details of his story, from conviction to his eventual release from prison in the fall of 2011. When Reinert first asked if he'd mind shooting in the old courtroom – the same place where his fate had been sealed a quarter century before – Morton sort of shrugged it off, Reinert recalls.

Indeed, says Morton, he agreed with Reinert that it would be the best location, and he didn't expect it to affect him at all. "Maybe I'm apathetic – or ignorant. I [just] looked around and thought, 'This is the spot.'" But once the filming got going and Morton began to tell his tale, the emotion of the past rose to the surface, Morton says, and caught him off guard.

The result is Reinert's new documentary, *An Unreal Dream: The Michael Morton Story*, a revealing account of the personal impact of wrongful conviction. Indeed, Reinert, likely best known for his award-winning 1989 documentary about the Apollo space program, *For All Mankind*, says he

was interested in making a crime-and-justice movie focused not on lawyers and courtroom action, but on how Morton survived as an innocent man in prison. "What was really appealing to me was that this guy spent 25 years in prison and came out of it, not just sane, but, you know, with grace," said Reinert. "What really interested me was ... Michael's personal story. And I really think that's the film that we made."

Indeed, Morton says that Reinert went out of his way to make him comfortable with the process. The finished product is an intensely personal tale of loss, survival, and second chances. In the film, Morton is startlingly honest – as when detailing his obsession with exacting revenge on those he deemed responsible for his plight – and even beatific, describing an in-prison revelation that quite literally turned his life around.

"He is the movie," says Reinert. "I'm not telling his story; he's telling his story."

For Morton, making the film was about more than just sharing a personal tale of redemption; it was about showing how very ordinary he is and how corruption in the criminal justice system could make anyone a target of wrongful conviction. "There is nothing between what happened to me and you but the grace of God, the roll of the dice," he says. "I am not trying to acquire fame and fortune – I'm not that kind of guy – but the thing I want to do is whatever I can to keep what happened to me from happening to anyone else."

Reinert says that he hopes that people are as "moved" by Morton's story as much as he has been. And he hopes too that the film might help to influence the debate in Texas – and beyond – on legal reforms that would ensure prosecutors and other law enforcement officials in the criminal justice system are held accountable when they hide evidence of a person's innocence. "I hope it really does help," Reinert says. "It's always nice if the work that you're doing has some ramifications in the real world." ■

What Goes Around ...

With 'Some Girl(s),' Neil LaBute circles back from stage to screen

Times change. People change. Or do they?

That question curls around the heart of *Some Girl(s)*, the new film based on Neil LaBute's 2005 play in which a writer on the verge of matrimony makes a cross-country odyssey to visit old flames. Ostensibly, he's reconnecting to apologize for his past hurtful conduct – to “make things okay,” he tells one – but the longer he talks, the more he comes off as the same self-absorbed, self-justifying jerk that he was when he was involved with these women.

Likewise, 16 years have passed between LaBute's impressive screenwriting debut with *In the Company of Men* and *Some Girl(s)*, but he says, “If you watch those films back to back, you might think: What's different?” He's still setting scenes in airports and hotel rooms, still focusing on small numbers of people, still revealing their characters through what they say, and in the center of the frame are still those men behaving badly. But between these somewhat similar indie films have been studio projects from which, LaBute says, he's “learned to craft a more traditional screenplay.” Films such as *Possession* or the much-maligned *The Wicker Man* – a remake that LaBute considers freighted by “too many different expectations” – are worlds away from *In the Company of Men*, which makes *Some Girl(s)* a return to his roots.

“It's funny. The journey is almost circular,” he says. “*Some Girl(s)* started as a play, but even as a play, it felt like a road movie – four locations, different parts of the country. So the decision to open it up a bit, jumping from airports to hotel rooms and back, felt very natural.”

In transferring this script from stage to screen, LaBute also sees himself completing a circle, careerwise. While he's worked continuously in film since *In the Company of Men*, as both a writer and director, he's found more opportunities to develop his writing on stage. “Making film opened up my career as a theatre practitioner,” he says, and, as a result, he's better known now as a playwright than a filmmaker. Bringing one of those theatrical successes to the cineplex is a special way of re-establishing himself as a screenwriter.

That's screenwriter, not director. For the first time, LaBute didn't call the shots while a script of his was being filmed. That was done by veteran television director Daisy von Scherler Mayer (*Nurse Jackie*, *Mad Men*). So did LaBute have difficulty surren-

dering that control? Not a bit, he says. “I’ve had my scripts directed by other people so many times in the theatre that it didn’t feel strange at all.” And don’t imagine that he had the sort of gender issues that one of his characters might have. “I totally loved that it was going to be a woman directing,” he says. “You have this guy writing all these women’s parts, so it’s great to have a woman’s voice in there.”

LaBute feels the timing is right for this story of a man (played here by Adam Brody) whose effort to make amends with others is really about salving his own conscience, satisfying himself. “I think the film will resonate even more than when the play was done. We’re in such a show-me, look-at-me culture. People feel the need to relate their moment by moment. They will Instagram the hell out of you until they exhaust you. You can tell them that, but it still won’t stop them doing it. This guy is feeding off those experiences. He has those best intentions, but it’s also self-serving.”

And would LaBute ever like to revisit each one of his old films to apologize for what he didn’t get right? “Every movie, I could go back to and see things that I’d change,” he says. “Too many people here. I shouldn’t have cut this scene. I wish it were still in there.” But theatre has helped him make peace with those things. “You’re always seeing someone do something different with your script.” ■

Nerd Wars

'Zero Charisma' and the social costs of geekdom

Of all the fan debates passionately argued on the Internet over the past year, few saw more passion from people on both sides than the one surrounding the (probably mythical) existence of the "fake geek girl." Ostensibly a creature who enjoys the trappings of geekdom – say, a Green Lantern T-shirt and an enthusiasm for video games – the "fake geek girl" incites ire for having never suffered the years of alienation that pursuing those interests led to among the so-called "real" geeks. Self-identified geeks are very protective of their stuff.

The urge to protect nerd culture from interlopers is at the core of the Austin film *Zero Charisma*, which enjoys its world premiere at SXSW. The film stars Sam Eidson as the übergoober dungeon master Scott Weidemeyer, whose world is shaken up when a cool, socially acceptable, one-might-even-call-him-a-hipster named Miles joins his gaming table – and subsequently disrupts the most important thing in Scott's life. It's an experience that the film's co-directors,

Katie Graham and Andrew Matthews, were surprised to be able to identify with when they moved to Austin in 2010. "The nerd culture and hipster culture really kind of blend here," Graham explains.

"When we moved to Austin, I found that it was so easy to find *Dungeons & Dragons* games here," Matthews says. "And there were so many ... I guess you would call them 'hipsters' who played it. This was a new thing to me. It worked so perfectly, because you have Scott, who takes everything so, so seriously. And then you have the hipster, who doesn't take anything seriously."

While Graham and Matthews don't want the script (which Matthews also wrote) to take sides in the geek/hipster wars that have inflamed the Internet ("We're certainly not trying to condemn one side or another with the film," Matthews says), the pair do feel some sympathy with its geeky antihero.

"There is certainly a part of me that is like, 'This is not fair. This belongs to us,'" Matthews explains. "I feel like a lot of the

hipster-geeks are people who never paid a social price for these things. It's not a refuge anymore; it's just taste."

Matthews and Graham have been immersed in this debate since they began work on *Zero Charisma*, but they've also got a unique perspective on the debate over social costs and the "right way" to like something. It was at the core of a movie that both of them worked on in a number of roles that had its premiere at SXSW 2009 – *Best Worst Movie*, the documentary about the fans of the nigh-unwatchable cult horror classic *Troll 2*.

"When we worked on *Best Worst Movie*, you heard that argument a lot – about liking

things for genuine reasons or ironic reasons," Matthews explains. "We were inundated with the argument about what's the 'right way' to like something."

Despite their own biases as self-identifying geeks, the experience of making *Zero Charisma* has helped Matthews and Graham recognize that everyone's story is probably a little deeper than it might seem at first glance. Even Miles, *Zero Charisma*'s hip interloper, explains that his interest in role-playing goes back to high school – and Matthews recognizes that a lot of the "hipster-geeks" may not have had it as easy as it seems. "I know that I've always been into this stuff, and I've paid a social price for it," he says. "But people who you would look at and think, 'You don't look like a geek,' you wonder: 'Were you a geek, and you learned not to be?'"

Regardless, the walled gardens of geekdom continue to find themselves overrun by people who wear deep-V T-shirts over oversized black ones with dragons on them. With *Zero Charisma*, the geek/hipster war becomes as immortal as the Battle of Wolf 359 or the Siege of Asgard. And that much, everyone can agree, is pretty cool. ■

Lovely Freda Responds Discreetly

The Beatles' longtime secretary takes center stage

Lovely Freda was (and still is) Freda Kelly, the Liverpudlian secretary who took a job when she was just a teenager, in 1962, answering fan mail for the four Liverpudlians whose new band was on fire at the local club scene. Of course, we know the story of the Fab Four and while – after 11 years with them – Freda certainly knew more than any of us, she never told. She was much too loyal and discreet for that. And besides, she felt, she'd always been “just a secretary,” and “who would want to hear the secretary's story?” Fifty years later, Freda decided that her grandson really ought to know grand-mum's (no pun intended) story, so she approached filmmaker Ryan White (*Pelada*, 2010), whom she knew through his local relatives, about making this film.

“We both agreed from day one that this wouldn't be about scandalous stories or an attempt to make money, but instead be 100 percent the truth and a story that is faithful to Freda's high standard of ethics,” says White. And that it is. When asked on camera, for example, whether she dated any of her employers, Freda recoils with an irrepressible, still-girlish, “That's p-e-h-sonal!” Charming, self-effacing, and guileless, Freda is definitely the star of the show. What we get is an inside look at the best advocate screaming fans worldwide could have asked for. Say you dreamed of possessing a pillowcase that Ringo had actually slept on. No problem. Freda would walk that pillowcase over to Ringo's house and come back for it the next morning. Just the kind of girl she was.

Austin Chronicle: Going into this, did you think the film would be more about the Beatles or more about Freda? Was getting the right balance difficult?

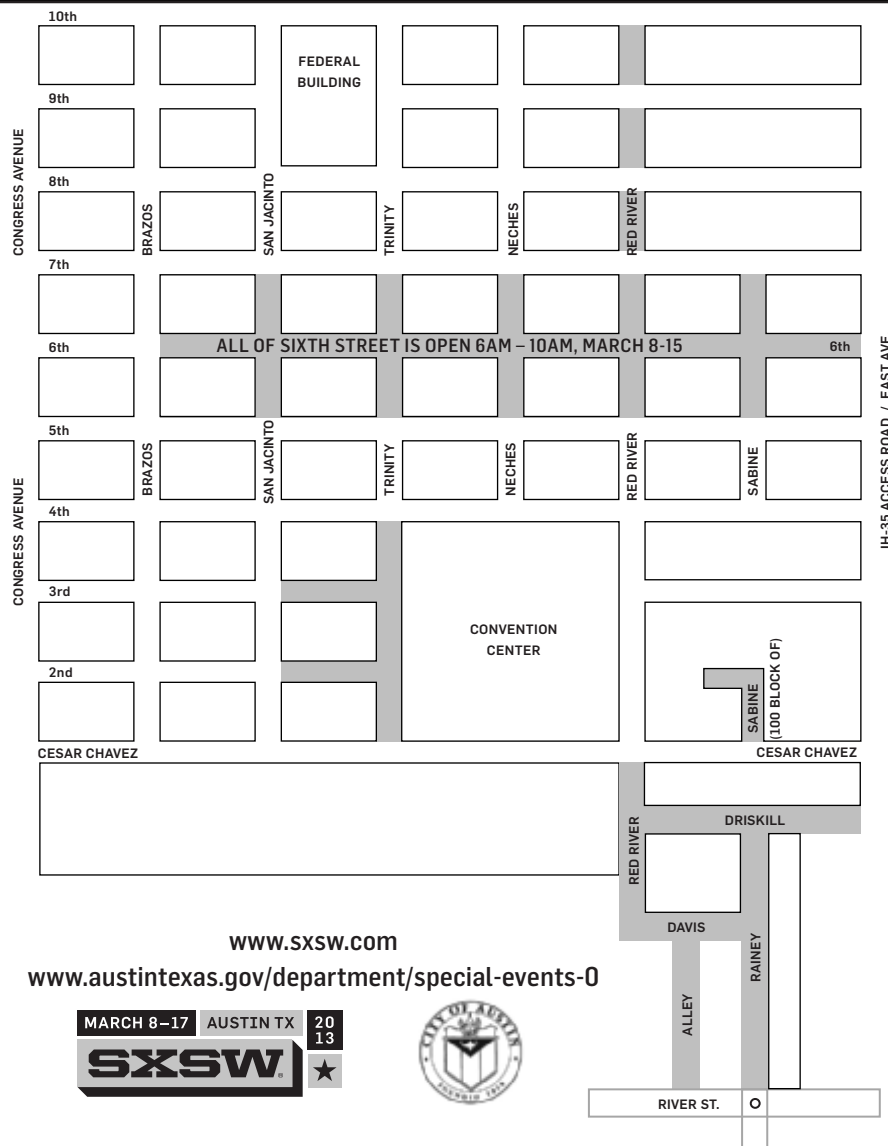
Ryan White: That's a really interesting question. If I'm being honest, I think originally I thought this would be “the Beatles story through the eyes of their secretary.” And then Freda and I spent weeks and weeks doing interviews in her living room, and her strong character blew me away. Her ability to remember stories and deliver them with humor and charm and genuine emotion was incredible. So I realized almost immediately that this wasn't just a story about the four Beatles, but a story of a remarkable girl – she began when she was 16 – and then woman who played her own important role in music history. The interviews with others only cemented that. The main players who were around at the time have amazing things to say about Freda and the role that she played. **AC:** What must your music budget have been for the rights to all those Beatles songs?

RW: Our budget has been almost nonexistent. My team has been incredible – almost everyone has worked for free, and many of those people actually put their own money into the film, too. We're very passionate about getting Freda's story out there. That being said, we're very lucky Apple Corps made an extremely rare exception to allow Beatles music to be used in a movie. I'm not at liberty to discuss prices, but let's just say we are very thankful to Apple that they were willing to work with our very small, very independent documentary. And then the fact that the Beatles were willing to work with us gave us instant credibility – which is why we were able to line up a killer soundtrack including other artists like Little Richard, Buddy Holly, Fats Domino. It's all a testament to Freda that these record labels have been willing to take my phone calls and hear me out. ■
