



So Many Museums, So Little Time: **Creating Your Austin Museum Day Plan**

Austin Museum Day is here, and it's time to plan your itinerary! But with so many great museums, how can you choose? Well, that depends... Will this be your first visit to an Austin museum? Or have you already seen a few museums and want to see more? Or maybe you really have seen them all? Whatever your situation, there's a plan for you!

If you've never visited an Austin museum, you may want to start with some of the larger and betterknown institutions. Several museums are located on the University of Texas campus, including the Blanton Museum of Art, one of the largest university art museums in the United States: the LBJ Presidential Library which boasts a 3/4 scale replica of the oval office; and the Texas Memorial Museum featuring dinosaurs, wildlife exhibits, and more. Just across the street from the UT campus is the Bullock Texas State History Museum with three levels of Texas history exhibits. And located further north in the Mueller community, the Thinkery has 40,000 square feet of kid-friendly science and technology themed exhibits.

If you have visited those popular spots before, Museum Day is a great time to check out some smaller or lesser-known venues. In the mood for art? The Mexic-Arte Museum, located in the heart of downtown, is the Official Mexican and Mexican American Fine Art Museum of Texas, and Women & Their Work Gallery exhibits and sells contemporary art by Texas women. Austin music history is on display at the South Austin

Museum of Popular Culture, featuring a collection of vintage posters and artifacts from the live music scene. And the Texas Military Forces Museum at Camp Mabry is a must-see for military buffs.

In addition to these museums and galleries, Austin Museum Day also includes historic houses, public art, and outdoor venues. Some of the many historic buildings you can visit are the Joseph and Susanna Dickinson Hannig Museum, once the home of an Alamo survivor; the Elisabet Ney Museum, former home and studio of the German-Texan sculptress: and the kid-friendly Capitol Visitors Center, housed in the historic General Land Office Building. If you prefer the outdoors, you can explore the trails at the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center or the popular-withchildren Pioneer Farms. Discover art outside at the Umlauf Museum & Sculpture Garden or take a public art tour with Landmarks on the UT campus.

But if you really have seen everything in Austin, then it's time for a day trip! Head west to the Science Mill in Johnson City, east to the Texas Wendish Heritage Museum in Giddings, or north to the Williamson Museum in Georgetown or its satellite location on the Chisholm Trail in Round Rock.
