At Night the Art Comes Out to Play

I wouldn't describe listings editor Wayne Alan Brenner as having an especially jaundiced view of the world, but I did laugh out loud when he said this to me yesterday: "The more I view art and review art, the more I'm sick of it and artists."

Context is key here: Brenner was talking to me about why he WEHAVE was drawn to profile Ion Art, the subjects of this week's cover **AN ISSUE** story. A small shop founded BY KIMBERLEY by husband-and-wife team Greg and Sharon Keshishian. JONES Ion Art is responsible for some of the most iconic neon signage in town (including the Chronicle's own I-35-facing one, a pinkish-red beacon since the early Nineties). Brenner was lamenting how snooty the art world can be, dismissive of neon as a medium. "You know, it's bars and strip joints, that's what that is,"

Brenner said, mimicking art elitists, "They [Ion] have to work against that stigma."

In reporting his story, Brenner spent some time at Ion Art's design-build studio, marveling at the work-in-progress pieces

for their upcoming Surreal Garden interactive art exhibit at the Zilker

Botanical Garden. (He was our man with a camera, too; Brenner shot the studio photos, while John Anderson took the cover portrait and more shots to be found online with this story.) Pointing to Ion's facility with not just neon but also glass and wood

and metal, not to mention the engineering know-how required to make it all zing, Brenner drew a thematic line back to the Shaker ladder-back chair – another exquisite intersection of art and craft.

Take that, art snoots.

For 40 years, the PALS (Peer Assistance, Leadership, and Service) program has trained students how to mentor and simply be friends with younger students. Just ask AISD counselors and teachers how valuable the PALS program has been in empowering students to serve each other, not to mention how much the program helps counselors, in an appropriate and supervised way, reduce their formidable workload by having kids help kids. Sometimes all a student needs is an older buddy.

At very low cost and very high value, PALS, which is often the most meaningful and memorable class students recall from their time at AISD, has enabled students to serve (which they want to do) as mentors and be served as mentees.



Don't Ask Texas Schoolchildren to Fund Your Corporate Expansion

Central Texas schoolchildren and taxpayers are getting ripped off by large corporations rushing to take last-minute advantage of a failed state program that will be phased out by the end of this year. Applied Materials, with \$23 billion in 2021 profits, has applied to Hutto ISD for a decade's worth of Chapter 313 tax breaks, and Germany-based Infineon Technologies, with a market capitalization of over 50 billion euros, wants the same from Del Valle ISD. Chapter 313 of the Texas Tax Code authorizes school districts to give 10-year tax abatements as incentives to companies and then get reimbursed BY by the state. This arrangement is MICHAEL

problematic in every way. School districts are reimbursed by Texas FLOYD taxpayers with over \$1 billion per year in state dollars that could otherwise be used for the educational system as a whole, so relatively few school districts benefit at the expense of the majority.

Major exposés in the Texas Observer and Houston Chronicle have uncovered that Chapter 313 has been costing Texas schools over \$1 billion annually, that the tax incentives usually play no major role in a company's decision to relocate in Texas, and that the good jobs promised by this corporate giveaway often haven't materialized. When Central Texas Interfaith and our Texas IAF sister organizations, along with allies, pointed this out to lawmakers in the last legislative session, no wonder there was bipartisan agreement that Chapter 313 should not be renewed beyond 2022.

Our "Losers and Winners" analysis demonstrated to legislators that if this lost \$1 billion was distributed to each school district on a per-student basis, 95% of students were in districts that lost potential money to Chapter 313. For example, AISD loses a potential \$10 million per year, Bastrop ISD \$1.5 million per year, and Round Rock nearly \$7 million per year, while the biggest winners are major oil, gas, and [liquefied natural gas] companies like Corpus Christi Liquefaction, which gains \$56 million per year from 313 agreements.

Now that time is running out, there is a last-minute rush by oil, gas, and major manufacturing companies to take advantage of Chapter 313 before it expires in December. This includes some hightech firms already in Central Texas like Applied Materials and Infineon, even though Chapter 313 is supposedly intended to encourage companies to relocate to Texas, not to finance the expansion of companies already here. The Texas comptroller even tried to make it easier for companies to apply by relaxing the reporting rules, so that they would not have to give information that could be used to monitor their

performance. Public outcry led by the likes of CTI finally made him relent.

Chapter 313 is based on a self-contradictory notion of economic development. Austin has become recognized as the best city in the country for high-tech growth,

not because of tax-abatement incentives, but because employers are attracted by the supply of highly skilled employees. The growth of high tech in the Austin area depends upon a large pool of top talent, which in turn depends upon a steady flow of well-qualified students from well-funded STEM programs in both public schools and universities. High-tech growth cannot be achieved by a program that pits local school districts against one another in a contest for diminishing funds, thus undermining their ability to provide the costly STEM education that high-tech firms require.

Central Texas Interfaith has worked for years on city and county tax incentive policies, ensuring that in exchange for these breaks, companies must pay living wages, benefits, and have a career ladder and a strategy to hire locally. But we draw the line at school districts: It is shameful to take money from schoolchildren to bolster the profits of major corporations.

It would be better let Chapter 313 die a natural death before it does anymore harm. To corporations currently applying for Chapter 313 incentives, we say: Withdraw your applications. To school district boards considering 313 applications, we say: Just say no. To local leaders and chambers of commerce, we say: Unite to oppose this corporate welfare steal.

When It Comes to Health Care in **Austin, There Can Be No Equity Without Accountability**

While Central Health, our countywide public health care district for the poor, recently celebrated breaking ground on replacing two clinics in Eastern Travis County, Austinites might want to hold their applause. Health Equity First, the collaboration of the local LULAC and NAACP has released a troubling new report detailing eight Central Health major red flags that suggest serious financial and operational mismanagement. The report (which can be found at healthequityfirst.com/red-flag-report) questions whether Central Health is serving well either the poor or the taxpayers.

This issue is coming to a head in the next few weeks as we are calling on the county commissioners to BY NELSON order an independent, comprehen-LINDER + FRANK sive performance audit of Central Health. The county commissioners have financial supervisory authority over Central Health and the community needs independent, complete answers to these serious issues.

Central Health's budgets are misleading to the point of appearing false. For example, it stated recently that "ninety-seven percent (\$491 million) of Central Health's fiscal year 2022 \$506 million budget is dedicated to health care delivery for people with low incomes." In reality, only 20% of Central Health's budget constitutes actual health care services. Its alleged \$491 million in "health care delivery" includes items such as travel, printing and copying, phones, utilities, insurance, marketing, community relations, legal, and other administrative expenses not usually considered health care.

Its budget also shows that \$298 million of its alleged \$491 million in "health care delivery" is actually just sitting in a reserve account for unexplained future contingencies. These reserves have increased from \$36 million to \$298 million over the last five years and now make up 59% of its budget. Contingency funds sitting idle in a bank account and various administrative expenses shouldn't be portrayed to the public as health care for the poor.

In addition to its questionable budgets, a performance audit is critical to restore the community's trust in Central Health. When voters approved a tax increase for Central Health in 2012, its leaders repeatedly promised that "... a specific amount of the estimated \$54 million a year in new tax revenue - \$35 million - would be permanently earmarked for services provided to needy patients by the medical school's faculty and residents, who are physicians in training," as reported by the Austin American-Statesman on Oct. 14, 2012. Similar promises were made in other articles in the Statesman, The Austin Chronicle, and KUT.

Central Health has broken its word. County taxpayers to date have paid the medical school \$280 million, yet there is no

documentation showing any health care has been delivered to the poor for these funds. The community has asked again and again for years for the numbers for patients seen and care provided. Nada.

Central Health is quick to argue that there is no need for a performance audit because it is audited financially every year, but this is misleading. Financial audits do not look at whether Central Health is miscategorizing budget items or spending taxpayer dollars inefficiently, ineffectively, or outside its mission. As for the scheduled 2023 audit Central Health claims will evaluate its performance, it should be noted that Central Health undermined the integrity of the last performance audit conducted in 2017 by insisting on controlling the audit. This effectively prevented the public from receiving independent, trustworthy analysis. The main question the community wanted answered in 2017 was artfully dodged by its manipulated audit: How much of the then \$105 million of its funds to the medical school went for health care for the poor?

Frankly, Central Health cannot be trusted to audit itself. Our county commissioners should order a comprehensive, independent performance audit now. We deserve reliable answers to two basic questions: How much health care have the poor received from the medical school for \$280 million? Is Central Health spending taxpayer funds effectively, equitably and in compliance with its mission to the poor? That should not be too much to ask for.

The project seeks to raise awareness about the need to increase transparency and accountability of public hospital districts in Texas, such as Central Health, so they better serve the poor's health care needs.

May 7 State and Local Election

Austin no longer elects its City Council in May (other area cities still do, including Round Rock, Georgetown, Lakeway, and Cedar Park), but city voters have a citizen initiative to consider as Proposition A. There are also two constitutional amendments that came out of the 87th Lege too late to make last November's ballot, and a proposition in Leander with regional implications. (This is not also the run-off date for the party primaries; that's later in May.) The Chronicle Editorial Board makes these recommendations.

State Constitutional Amendments Proposition 1: FOR Proposition 2: AGAINST

We have often urged readers to vote against all constitutional amendments as a protest against this incredibly opaque, and thus often malign, way of changing state policy. These two proposed amendments illustrate what's wrong with the system, but one of them is at least a gesture toward equity, which is pretty rare to see coming from the Capitol.

That's Prop 1, the ballot language for which is tragicomically tortured. The measure will eliminate an unintended consequence of the Lege's last attempt to shoulder as little as possible of the burden for paying for schools while also lowering property taxes, by compressing the school district tax rate.

Under the status quo, taxpayers over 65 or living with disabilities whose taxes are frozen would end up, at some point, paying more in school district property taxes than the median homeowner. Kudos where due to state Sen. Paul Bettencourt, R-Houston, who can also often be malign, for being proactive to get it fixed.

Prop 2 is much more straightforward but is also just straight-up pandering. It's almost guaranteed to pass now that everyone's seen their new tax appraisals, but increasing the school district homestead exemption (from \$25,000 to \$40,000) is the coward's way out of broad-based tax relief: Schools really need that money, and in many cases, this simply shifts the burden to renters.

City of Austin Proposition A: FOR

This proposition, put on the ballot by citizen referendum, would decriminalize marijuana possession in Austin and also prohibit the use of no-knock warrants. The best reason to get out and vote for it is to create a data point: "Austinites voted 99-to-1 to decriminalize cannabis." That will be useful as de jure legalization inches forward at the state and federal level. The second-best reason is to help Ground Game Texas, the group led by former congressional candidates Mike Siegel and Julie Oliver, prove its concept that organizing around hot-button social issues can work for progressives as well as conservatives; decent turnout on this election would help. (Nobody appears to be mobilizing opposition to this, so "99-to-1" is not really a joke.) The specifics of the ordinance are almost irrelevant, since all the relevant parties have already decriminalized personal-use possession in practice, and Austin police can go for years at a time without executing a no-knock warrant. But an ordinance to codify these things would be great!

Leander Proposition A: FOR

Leander's got a whole slew of charter amendments and props on its ballot, but this one matters to nonresidents, too: It's the vote to keep Leander in Capital Metro, which of course they should. Yes, it is a lot of money! But the blame here belongs to Leander, not Cap Metro: If the city had stayed the course it set when it bought into being the terminus of the Red Line, it would be making bank on commercial property taxes right now, and there would be a lot more multifamily to absorb the boom tide in one of the fastest-growing towns in America. Plus, nobody is saving money here in the long run, since the city wants to capture the same sales tax for itself. How much of that revenue is Leander going to have to spend on improving mobility for its ever-growing number of single-family subdivisions? More than half? Lean in, folks, and make Cap Metro work for you and everyone else.

VOTING BY MAIL

Mail-in voting rates have dropped with dipping COVID hospitalizations. During the March primary, about 7% of Travis County's participating voters used mail-in ballots. Due to recent legislative changes, across the state at least 18,000 mail-in ballots were rejected during the March primary. We recommend taking extreme care in your application.

Q: Which deadlines do I need to know?

A: The last day to request a ballot by mail is Tuesday, April 26 (received at the Travis County Clerk's Office, not postmarked). Completed ballots must be postmarked by May 7 and received by May 8.

HEADLINES

KEEPING THE LIGHTS ON The typical Austin Energy customer will see about a \$16 per-month increase in their electric bill if Austin Energy's proposal to raise the base rate sticks. The power provider submitted the proposal Monday. April 18, because the entity needs a \$48 million (or 7.6%) base revenue increase, based on the cost of providing electric service to the community in fiscal year 2021 (and Winter Storm Uri was not the cause).

INFOWARS GOES BUST Several of Alex Jones' business entities, including InfoWars, filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy April 17, as Jones waits to see how much he has to pay Sandy Hook Elementary School families who sued him for repeatedly claiming the 2012 massacre of their children was a hoax. Attorneys for Sandy Hook families accuse Jones of trying to hide millions in assets.

UKRAINIANS CAN STAY The Department of Homeland Security announced Tuesday, April 19, that it would expand Temporary Protected Status for Ukrainians in the U.S. An early March order from the Biden administration blocked deportation of any Ukrainian who entered the country prior to March 1. U.S. Rep. Lloyd Doggett, D-Austin, led 64 members of Congress in writing to Biden to ask for an extension in that cutoff date. The new effective date is April 11.

DECLARING WAR ON THE BORDER State Rep. Matt Krause, R-Tyler, suggested to Attorney General Ken Paxton March 28 that Texas can go to war with migrants crossing the border. The letter from the Texas House General Investigating Committee, which Krause chairs. asks Paxton whether the federal government has failed "to uphold its obligations to protect our state from invasion ... and whether Texas has the sovereign power to defend itself from such invasion."

SPEAKING OF WAR ON THE BORDER Gov. Greg Abbott and Arizona's Doug Ducey led 24 other Republican governors (that's all but two) in banding together for the new American Governors' Border Strike Force, a multistate partnership "designed to disrupt and dismantle the transnational criminal organizations taking advantage of the chaos Joe Biden has created," according to the announcement April 19.

SUPER GROUP ALERT Austin nonprofits Bike Austin, Walk Austin, and Vision Zero ATX announced a merger to form a new transportation-focused organization April 19. Safe Streets Austin's mission is to build a movement to transform Austin's streets, bikeways, and trails so they are safe, vibrant, and equitable.

MASSIVE MONEY MOVE In one of the largest acquisitions of a Central Texas company ever, a New York investment firm announced Tuesday, April 19, that it will buy American Campus Communities, an Austin-based student housing company, for \$12.8 billion.



We Can Survive the New Boom

But we need to throw our entire weight into increasing our power as Texans

Busytown came to a complete halt for a moment last week when the Travis Central Appraisal District dropped its latest property valuations and took the public's breath away. Even though home sale prices in Austin and Travis County are **AUSTIN**

not routinely disclosed to TCAD, its appraisers can read, and they've seen the headlines each **AT LARGE** month about 30% growth in BY MIKE CLARKsales prices year over year, and so even with all the pressure upon them to undervalue Austin property as a form of tax relief, they can't not raise the roof on property values; the question is just how much.

Do realize, dear readers, that these numbers are a starting point for negotiations. If you don't protest your appraisal, regardless of what kind of property you own, you're a

fool and TCAD will genuinely not know what to do with you. The agency doesn't have the staff or the time to really individualize these appraisals and so they're willing to listen

when owners say, "But this and this." Sometimes you luck out, as I did

last year, and find that the appraiser is ready to offer a valuation that's lower than your target. Just do it. You can hire people to do it for you if you're not someone (like me) who really geeks out on real estate stuff.

Do realize also that commercial property owners hire skilled experts to do this for them and almost never, ever, ever fail to get steep reductions on appraised value. People like Paul Bettencourt, who also just happens to write Texas property tax law as a state senator, nice gig. In more sane states that have seen fast-changing property values and economic fortunes, in both directions, taxing entities can just say that due to current conditions, they're going to only tax a portion of a property's appraised value, without having to institutionalize separate exemptions. Texas doesn't allow that.

NOR DOES IT ALLOW TAX HIKES

Lest you think your or your landlord's property tax bill is going up 30% as a consequence, not in this state! Remember all this noise we made about "revenue caps"? That's because state law, written by Bettencourt, says the maximum tax rate a city or county can levy is one that brings in no more than 3.5% additional revenue than the year before - that being the ballpark rate of inflation for the years prior to the 2019 session at



which the cap was adopted. It was formerly 8%; when COVID and then Winter Storm Uri hit, the reduction to 3.5% was delayed by the law's waiver of the cap in emergencies, which are normally more localized. School districts have different, but equally austere, limitations on their tax rates.

So what this means for Austin and every other major Texas city that's growing faster than the state as a whole (most of them) is that they have no choice this summer but to steeply lower their tax rates. The only people who are going to be paying closer to full freight for their ballooning valuations are those who put property (including improvements) on the tax rolls in 2021, so new construction, of which there is a lot in Austin, enough to make its sundry owners an empowered lobbying force at all levels of government. Some of that new construction is intended to be affordable but TCAD does not really have a way of making its tax appraisals reflect this, another consequence of the Texas taxation tradition.

Do you see where we're heading with this? We need to change state law.

US? AUSTIN? ARE YOU HIGH?

There is no chance in hell that, regardless of the outcome of the November elections. the 88th Texas Legislature will have any other real mandate than to lower property taxes by any means necessary. Again, this is going down in every booming Texas community, not just blue cities but also places like The Woodlands and Frisco that are adding commercial property at an enormous rate. We have Tesla, but they all have Amazon ware-

houses and giant mail-order businesses and sportsplexes and entertainment hubs and outlet malls. They don't wanna pay, either!

So can you see how we forge a purple tide here? The way we did in 2018 when Beto O'Rourke, though himself not a victor, propelled enough new Democrats into the Lege and chastened enough MAGAnational Republicans therein to deliver the biggest fix to school finance in 20 years. Then we had a plague and the wackass 2020 cycle and last year's endless Fox News special docuseries that was the 87th Lege, and everyone forgot to keep those swing voters happy. So is there now a totally new battlefield on which to fight for better, more equitable tax policy, in ways that many GOP lawmakers are not going to find repulsive? This is a real test for Texas Democrats and their ability to take the lead on issues even if they remain a permanent minority. That's how Dems in red states have made small but important stuff happen for years, and how they had candidates at the ready to win, for example, the Kansas governorship when the opportunity arose. Their constituents do not spend nearly as much time as do Texas Democrats wringing their hands and bewailing their own clumsiness, fumbling a ball that is really closer than we think. We need to get on top of this.

Growing Pains

Tell us something we don't know

As we went to press last week, city demographer Lila Valencia was busy holding forth on Austin's 2020 census data and what this means for our city and surrounding areas. Not surprisingly, the numbers backed up what already knew: The region continues to grow, with pain and displacement falling disproportionately on Austin's commu-**PUBLIC** nities of color.

NOTICE Per the census, the area's biggest population driver in the BY NICK last 10 years was the influx of BARBARO non-Hispanic whites, largely due to in-migration from elsewhere in Texas and the U.S. (international in-migration decreased in the same period). Austin's Asian population was the fastest-growing single-race group since the 2010 census, today making up 8.9% of our population. At the same time, the percentages of African Americans and Hispanics shrank, now down to 6.9% and 32.5% respectively.

Most of the growth occurred in outlying areas, though the Domain, Mueller, and Downtown all gained some population due to increased housing density. The census also confirmed that African American and Hispanic populations continue to be pushed farther out, away from their historic neighborhoods, with non-Hispanic whites taking over more areas

In the pain vs. gain department, median home prices shot up 154% in the last 10 years, with the median home price within the Austin city limits pegged last week at an eye-watering \$624,000. Over the same period, median rents increased 49%. with a two-bedroom unit now going for roughly \$2,018 a month.

east of I-35.

On the gain side, we've had strong job

growth and low unemployment. But as the above numbers demonstrate, none of that helps if you're not in a tech job pulling down at least six figures a year. The area also added more housing units than in prior decades, but is still struggling to keep pace with a steady influx of all those wealthier, whiter people who keep showing up.

Why does this matter? Well, for one thing, these numbers determine what share we'll get of the \$1.5 trillion in federal funds that are allocated based on census data. In fact, city leaders think Austin was undercounted at 961.855 residents total, and are requesting a review, which, if they're right, could potentially pry loose a few more federal dollars.

In short, it's a lot of growing pains, with very little under our direct control and no brake pedal in sight. Let's take it as a sober reminder to make sure our policies moving forward are focused on everyday Austinites and low-income residents - not just the burgeoning wealthy who really should be able to take care of

themselves.

On a related note, the revamped vertical mixed-use ordinance, which had been slated to hit the City Council agenda this Thursday, has now been postponed until June 9. Helmed by Council Member Ann Kitchen, the draft would strengthen the city's existing VMU ordinance with the goal

> of adding more housing along transit corridors, including an increased percentage of affordable units, at deeper levels of affordability.

Representing many months of work by city staff and housing advocates, the draft would retain the city's current compatibility standards, but allow for future discussions related to compatibility, as Kitchen noted in a Council message board post. However, last week CM

Chito Vela posted two amendments to the message board that would completely eliminate compatibility for building height and parking requirements, obviously controversial changes for many older neighborhoods adjacent to corridors.

Vela's proposals are no doubt well intentioned, and we're all feeling increasingly desperate in the light of the newly released median home prices. But these amend-

ments would enact sweeping citywide changes that haven't been vetted through the traditional public process and would affect – and potentially displace – an unknown number of residents. At the very least, we need a clear understanding of how these amendments would impact existing market-affordable housing along and near transit routes before we take the lid off.

Second, we don't want to inadvertently undercut Austin's **Affordability Unlocked** ordinance, which is designed to provide many more deeply affordable units than VMU, in exchange for waivers of development regs very similar to the ones now proposed by Vela. If for-profit developers can reap the same benefits while providing far fewer affordable units, how likely are we to get deeply affordable projects on the corridors? And when it comes to income levels, which residents are more apt to use public transit anyway?

Personally, if I ran the zoo, I'd reserve all transit-adjacent properties for Affordability Unlocked (but of course, it's Texas, so we can't). Failing that, it behooves us to keep what little bargaining power we have for deeply affordable projects, not give it away in a rushed process, the full implications of which we haven't had time to identify.

With all that in mind, Council agreed at their Tuesday work session to postpone the

VMU ordinance until June 9 to allow for more discussion among Council members and more community engagement. Mayor Pro Tem Alison Alter suggested creating small Council working groups that would include members typically on opposing sides of land use issues to brainstorm areas of agreement. Council also agreed to schedule another discussion for the May 17 work session to allow members to daylight relevant proposals.

If Vela's amendments are solid, they can withstand the genuine community conversation they deserve and the time it takes to get them right. The postponement gives them – and us – that chance.

Project Connect's working groups continue to meet, sharing plans for specific transit stations and corridors and gathering public feedback. Next up is the **Lady Bird Lake Bridge** to carry the Blue Line trains out to the airport, on Tuesday, April 26, 5:30pm on Zoom. Get info and register at projectconnect.com/get-involved.

To V(MU) or Not to V

Austin's best density bonus remains in suspense

Travis County homeowners are still recovering from the shock they experienced last week after the Travis Central Appraisal **District** released preliminary property appraisals for 2022, showing a 53% increase in the median market value for a home across the county compared to last year. The Austin Board of Realtors reported that the median sale price for a home in Austin rose to \$624,000 in March, a 22% year-over-year increase.

But however troubling the housing market is for owners, the situation is much more dire for Austin's renters, who account for 54% of the city's residents. By some estimates, rents in Austin have increased by 35% in just one year. Commercial property owners - including apartments - have no equivalent to a homestead exemption, so they will feel the full impact of soaring tax bills, which will get passed on to renters. (More on this in "Austin at Large," p.10.)

Viewed in front of this backdrop, Council's continued inaction to increase Austin's housing supply is even more problematic. Once again, it faced an opportunity to take meaningful policy action this week and punted. (For a different view, see "Public Notice," p.12.) Council was set to vote today, April 21, on revisions to a density bonus program that would allow multifamily developers to build bigger in exchange for setting aside more units for income-restricted tenants.


The existing **vertical mixed-use** program allows developers of properties (mostly) along the city's **transit priority network** to build up to 60 feet, with other relaxed site

standards, if they price 5% of owner-occupied units and 10% of rental units at levels affordable to people earning 80% of Austin's median family income (for one person. that's about \$55,400). Staff estimates VMU has produced about 5,379 housing units 2 (540 of which are income-restricted) since its adoption in 2007.

Changes proposed by Council Member Ann Kitchen last November would create two tiers: VMU1 and VMU2. The latter would increase the allowable building height to 90 feet and increase the affordability set-aside to 12% for owned units at 80% MFI, and 12% of rental units at 60% MFI (\$41,580 for one person) or 10% set aside at 50% MFI. Fee-in-lieu options to pay to build affordable housing somewhere else would exist for owned units, but not rentals. The city, and not a third party. would ensure long-term compliance.

All 11 council members, regardless of where they sit on the land use paradigm, ostensibly support more housing on mobility corridors. In practice, though, this irresistible force has repeatedly collided with the immovable object of city planning emotional homeowners reflexively resistant to adding housing to their neighborhoods. That group has been up in arms over VMU2 since staff and the Planning Commission began work on proposed language for the ordinance change, and for the time being, they have won a delay.

At Kitchen's urging, CMs agreed Tuesday, April 19, to delay a vote on VMU2 to, mavbe. June 9. Amendments to the program proposed by CM Chito Vela that would exempt



VMU projects from compatibility standards that limit building height and increase parking requirements are causing some CMs heartburn. Incumbent homeowners, historically, treat these rules as sacred cows - compatibility in particular, which progressively restricts the height of buildings within 540 ft. of properties that are either zoned or used as single-family homes.

Builders widely agree that if left intact, compatibility standards that limit height would totally neuter the effectiveness of VMU2. A staff analysis bears this prediction out; the Housing and Planning Department found that 59% of sites currently zoned VMU are prohibited from building to the maximum allowable height of 60 ft. due to compatibility standards. Further, just 34% of VMU sites would be able to build to the new maximum allowable height in VMU2 of 90 ft.

Swirling around the debate is how to enact the new program without running afoul of state law requiring property owners to be notified of proposed zoning changes and allowed to protest. That's what has kept Council focused on land use policy proposals

that could garner the nine votes needed to overrule a valid petition (one signed by owners of 20% of the property within 200 feet). For now, it appears that the best way forward is to change the Land Development Code to create VMU2, but stop short of rezoning all VMU-eligible properties citywide. Owners seeking rezoning to get VMU one by one is a slower and more costly way to increase housing supply, but one that would be wellinsulated from legal challenge.

For the next seven weeks, Council offices and city staff will conduct some kind of community engagement effort to inform the public of possible code changes VMU2 could bring. Meanwhile, the housing crisis shows no sign of abating and warrants urgent action, as Vela noted Tuesday.

"All of our housing indicators are very negative right now," the CM said. "Unfortunately, the time for smaller changes and tweaks has come and gone. The scale of the crisis is such that the number of units that can be built along corridors is where we can give our renters some breathing room and potentially home buyers as well."

Land Trust Homes Could Go to Displaced Austinites

The city of Austin is preparing to implement a "housing preference policy" that would give displaced Austinites an avenue to return, by selling city-owned homes at affordable prices to people who can prove their generational ties to the city.

Also often called a **right to return** policy, the framework for these sales has been in the works at (what is now) the Housing and **Planning Department** since 2018. Prospective buyers who can show they or their immediate family members were displaced by gentrification since 2000 will have an edge in the selection process to sell these homes at an affordable price to first-time home buyers earning no more than 80% of Austin's median family income, or \$63,300 per year for two people. That makes the price point for a two-bedroom just under \$200,000; currently (as of March 2022) the median home sale price in Austin is \$624,000, according to the Austin Board of Realtors.

This house on Linden St. will be the first to be sold to a local with demonstrated historical ties to the neighborhood for just under \$200,000 as part of the city's right to return program

Those prices are possible by folding the 28 properties (as of right now) in the program into a **community land trust**, where the city (or a nonprofit) owns the land but sells the structures to individuals. Most of these 28 properties are in Council Districts 1 and 6, with others in Districts 2, 4, 5, 7, and 8. The first, located on Linden St., will open for applications later this month.

Housing and Planning intended to implement the policy in 2020 but was delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic. When applications for each property open, people will have 30 days to apply online. Applicants will be scored on factors like income-to-debt ratio, generational ties to gentrified parts of Austin (as defined by the 2018 Uprooted study by UT-Austin's Schools of Law and Architecture), and gross income. Qualified applicants will then be entered into a lottery, whose randomly selected winners will be offered the chance to proceed with purchase.

A department spokesperson said H&P is working with the city's legal and real estate departments to fine-tune details; after the Linden Street house is sold, the process will be reviewed and refined as needed before the next five properties go up for sale in June. - Austin Sanders

CAN THE AIRPORT KEEP UP WITH AUSTIN'S BOOM?

Austin-Bergstrom International Airport, which would like us to call it AUS and not ABIA, has been in the news lately for reasons it would rather not be. It got wrapped around the axle at City Council for springing its new jet fuel depot on its nearby neighbors by surprise, and it made national headlines a couple weeks back for a complete meltdown at its short-staffed Transportation Security Administration checkpoints. So what the heck is going on?

Basically, it's the same dynamic that's driving the exponential increase in home prices and property appraisals: Everybody wants to get a piece of Austin before it's too late. The AUS expansion master plan, adopted in 2018, was basically made obsolete by COVID-19 and has already been outstripped by demand, and has effectively been replaced by the current Airport Expansion and **Development Program**. Or, in the biz-speak of the professionals running the airport: "Following major COVID-19 impacts, AUS re-strategized the Airport Expansion Program to meet our Recovery Profile ... The AEDP will increase capacity at AUS using a strategic approach, including optimizing the Barbara Jordan Terminal and enabling our future expansion with utility and airfield infrastructure. Timelines for projects will be different than were originally anticipated prior to COVID-19."

That's why the public engagement that had been done, or that was supposed to happen in the future, regarding the fuel depot failed so badly. The AEDP is going through federal **environmental assessment** – a lighterweight version of the process being used for I-35 and Project Connect – on a rolling basis, so not everything in the "re-strategized" vision has been exposed to public engagement. But

it basically has three parts – the two referenced in the AUS statement above (optimizing the BJT and building out infrastructure, which includes that fuel depot) and the actual big deal, a new midfield concourse that could add 24 gates over time, connected by a tunnel to a new BJT "entrance hall." As noted elsewhere in this issue (see p.16), that tunnel may have attracted the attention of the **Boring Company**.

The entrance hall is a big deal because the lack of one is basically what made the recent TSA staffing meltdown into a national news story - the lines extended out the doors because there is so little space in between the checkpoints and the street, a design feature that became a flaw post-9/11. The expanded checkpoint at the low-numbered end of the existing concourse is part of "optimizing" the BJT, so the capacity to handle large crowds is mostly there; it's TSA's ability to staff it up that is lacking, and that's for the same reasons that every other public-sector employer, from the police department to the schools to the city permitting staff, is short-staffed - the hotter-thanhell Austin labor market and the long-tail Great Resignation as we exit the pandemic.

Airport Advisory Commission Chair **Eugene Sepulveda**, who has many connections inside City Hall and in the tech world, summed up his and AUS's assessment and advice in this regard: "The airport deeply regrets the trouble caused to passengers, and we're greatly pleased that the airport, TSA, airlines, and passengers are all stepping up. But at the tail end of the pandemic, with labor conditions as they are in Austin, we'll always have that vulnerability. So get there two hours ahead of time."

Can't Delete Trauma

Georgetown ISD parents say some students involved in sexually assaulting a peer, allegedly on video, must face CONSEQUENCES BY MORGAN O'HANLON

Nearly a month after several **Georgetown ISD** students participated in the violent sexual assault of a classmate off campus, parents of children in the district are protesting that neither the administration nor local law enforcement has done enough to protect their kids or hold anyone accountable for the crime.

On April 7, about two weeks after the March 26 incident, the Georgetown Police **Department** arrested two students in connection with the assault, which is still under active investigation. Parents say the administration and police should have acted sooner, and worry that other students accused of participating in the assault who are still on campus pose a danger to their kids. The victim of the assault was hospitalized, and parents organized a GoFundMe to raise money for the family's medical expenses.

At the center of the calls for action are copious reports of a video depicting the sexual assault that was reportedly spread via **Snapchat**. According to parents whose

children saw the video, several GISD students (besides the two arrested) are identifiable in the video.

During a GISD Board of Trustees meeting on April 19, those parents asked the board why administrators weren't adhering to their own Code of Conduct by launching an investigation and removing the accused students from class in the interim. "Some of us in this room need a refresher course on the steps we need to take to keep students in our community safe," said Tiffany Pressler, the mother of a GISD middle schooler who saw the video, "We have perpetrators of this crime still sitting next to our children, my child, at Benold Middle School long after the administration has been made well aware of the evidence that exists to support the removal."

The district's first official acknowledgment of the incident came on Friday, April 1, in the form of an email to parents. "It's been reported to the Georgetown Police Department that an off-campus incident occurred last



weekend that involved several students from our campus," wrote Brandon Jayroe, principal at Benold, who said administration was cooperating with the police investigation. "Please know that we take very seriously any concerns regarding the safety and well-being of our students both on and off campus." The district did not respond to additional requests for comment from the Chronicle.

The comments at the board meeting were the culmination of a weeks-long effort from parents to persuade administrators to remove accused students from GISD classrooms. Throughout the week of April 4, student and

City Staffers in Vegas' Tesla Tunnels: Still Not Clear Why!

Austin Development Services Director Denise Lucas authorized 10 of her staff members to fly to Las Vegas last week to visit two tunnels built by the Boring Co., the Elon Muskfounded infrastructure firm headquartered in Pflugerville. which currently move people in **Teslas** underneath the Las Vegas Convention Center. The stated purpose was to learn about reviewing and permitting such infrastructure, which DSD may need to do for large-scale Austin projects such as the Project Connect transit system and a new midfield concourse at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport.

ment Services' programs (environmental, site plan, drainage, etc.). The tour, as invited guests of Boring Co. and the DSD team's counterparts in Las Vegas, was the first such visit. according to a DSD spokesperson. Why send 10 people to see a project that's not comparable to anything in Austin's future (Boring Co. has no experience with transit systems or airports)? The spokesperson said the site visit was routine: "The City of Austin meets with a wide variety of industry experts to benchmark best practices and lessons learned for the benefit of Austin's community."

The site visit included reviewers from throughout Develop-

Staffers from Capital Metro and the Austin Transit Partnership, the entity that will actually build out Project Connect, met with Boring Co. officials for the first time last year - at the firm's request - to "provide relevant public information about future construction opportunities," a spokesperson told us. Since then, "multiple meetings" between Boring Co., ATP, and Cap Metro have involved "high-level conversations" about Project Connect, potential procurement timelines, and federal requirements for the massive expansion of Austin's transit system.

"Austin is in a unique position, as a community without a subway, to learn from the many transit agencies who have already built and operated these systems, and to ensure we are bringing the best practices, knowledge and approach to the Project Connect program," the spokesperson said. Again, that would not include the Boring Co. Since 2018, staffers have visited cities that do have transit infrastructure similar to what could be built in Austin - such as Los Angeles, Boston, and Washington, D.C.

Agency staff have also met with other engineering and construction firms, at their request, to share publicly available information about Project Connect. Procurement for the construction of the underground portions of Project Connect is not expected to begin for several years. The spokesperson said Cap Metro and ATP "were not aware [of] or involved" in the Vegas trip, nor in the "most recent conversations" the city has had with the Boring Co. related to permitting underground infrastructure projects.

As for AUS, the prime contractor for the current Airport **Expansion & Development Program** (see "Can The Airport Keep Up With Austin's Boom?" p.15) is HNTB, which has been designing and building infrastructure since 1914, including many projects in Central Texas: it has multiple subcontractors. and AUS is also soliciting some specialized support from professional service firms. Because its procurement is ongoing, the city's Aviation Department cannot discuss opportunities with other firms who haven't responded to solicitations; a spokesperson said they were "not aware of anyone from the airport meeting with Boring Company officials." - Austin Sanders

parent protesters carried signs outside Benold that read: "GISD [Superintendent] **Fred Brent** your silence is deafening"; "U can delete the video but U can't erase the memories"; and "Remove the Rapists." On Friday, April 8, several dozen students at both Benold and nearby **Georgetown High School** organized a walkout, and some parents kept their kids home the following Monday, April 11, in protest of the district's

inaction. One of the protesters, Georgetown High student Royanne Kelly, who graduated from Benold last year, said at the April 19 board meeting that inaction and lack of communication from the administration makes her afraid to attend class.

LaRessa Neuman, who organized many of the pro-

tests, is the parent of a child who attends Benold and has coordinated with other concerned parents. She said it's "common knowledge" that seven GISD students were present in the off-campus residence when the sexual assault occurred on March 26. She characterized the concerns of parents in GISD as worries over the safety of their kids in classes with peers who may have been involved in the incident. "If they did this to their friend, what makes anybody else think they can't do it again?" she said.

According to the GISD **Student Code of Conduct**, there is grounds for a student's immediate emergency removal from campus if they are "the alleged perpetrator of sexbased discrimination, sexual harassment, or retaliation." The Code of Conduct states the

removal would occur after the district conducts an "individualized analysis" and concludes the removal necessary to protect other students from harm. Such language in a Code of Conduct is mandated under Chapter 37 of the **Texas Education Code**.

Since knowledge of the sexual assault began circulating in the last days of March with the video, GPD has provided limited information other than confirming that an incident occurred off campus and involved several minors. On April 19, Captain Roland Waits, a spokesperson for Georgetown PD, declined to answer what those two minors had been charged with. "Due to the fact that everyone involved in the incident are juveniles, the Georgetown Police Department is prohibited by law

from sharing any details or updates on the case." A statement on the department's Facebook page said detectives have not found evidence of the Snapchat video, "despite a significant amount of commentary on its existence," and also added that there has been "a

great deal of misinformation" spreading on social media. Waits declined to answer if the department has gotten a warrant to obtain the video from the social media company. He deferred to the previous statement, which asked anyone with knowledge of the video's whereabouts to report the information to Detective Ruben Vasquez.



Moral Panic

Fear, anxiety for Texas trans kids under GOP attack

Despite a temporary halt to politically motivated child abuse investigations of families with trans kids, parents and advocates say they continue to live in fear as anti-trans moral panic sweeps through the Lone Star State's GOP base voters and their leaders

The ACLU of Texas and Lambda Legal have won four successive rulings in their challenge to Gov. Greg Abbott's directive to investigate normal gender affirming health care as child abuse. Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton has asked the Texas Supreme Court to overrule a lower court's injunction and allow Child Protective Services investigations to continue immediately. Shelly Skeen, a senior attorney from Lambda Legal representing the plaintiffs, told the Chronicle that she expects a favorable ruling, because both the law and medical experts are on Lambda Legal's side.

"The [Texas] Family Code says parents have to provide medically necessary care to their kids," Skeen said. She noted that gender affirming care is proven to dramatically improve the mental health of and reduce the rate of suicide in trans young people. "Why would the government come in and say, well, despite all this [evidence] we're going to tell you what you can and can't do?" If the courts allow this intrusion into people's private lives, she asked, "Where does it stop?"

Texas continues to look for other ways to put pressure on trans kids, their parents, and their health care providers. In late March, Paxton's office filed new investigative demands in a civil case against two pharmaceutical companies, Endo Pharmaceuticals and AbbVie Inc., which provide puberty-blocker drugs. Although approved by the Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of children who enter puberty early, they're also prescribed (with the backing of experts like the American Medical Association) as a way to delay puberty in transgender kids who are too young to receive other forms of medical treatment such as hormones.

Paxton has accused the companies of advertising their drugs to doctors for use in trans health care, which could contravene FDA guidelines. Neither pharmaceutical company responded to a request for comment from the Chronicle, but Endo told The Texas Tribune that they're complying with the investigation.

Multiple court cases have upheld the legality of "off-label" use of prescriptions, meaning doctors could continue to prescribe puberty blockers to trans kids, regardless of the outcome of this civil investigation. Similarly, Paxton's December 2020 legal opinion, which urged mandated reporters (those legally required to report abuse, such as doctors or teachers) to report



families with trans kids to Child Protective Services, is not legally binding. However, Ricardo Martinez, executive director of Equality Texas, emphasized that Texas is becoming increasingly hostile to transgender people, after years of sustained attacks by the right, regardless of the legal protections that remain in place.

Some health care providers have reduced or eliminated services to trans kids and adolescents. Equality Texas, Lambda Legal, and their partner organizations have been flooded with reports of threats against people across the LGBTQIA spectrum, of all

ages, in recent months. These have included verbal bullying, pressure for educators to stay in the closet, and even physical assaults against students.

Martinez suggested the last Texas legislative session marked a significant change for the worse. "People are afraid to just navigate the daily tasks of life because they don't know if there's going to be someone who's ... going to discriminate against them because they've been emboldened by this rhetoric that's been at the forefront for the past two years."

Recently, right-wing pundits and online trolls began promoting the notion that adults

INTEGRAL CARE MANAGEMENT: ABOUT THAT UNION DRIVE ...

Integral Care employees working to unionize Travis County's public mental health agency fear that IC management is moving to neutralize those efforts by weakening the document that would establish the structure and powers of the union.

At a special called meeting of the agency's board of trustees on April 14, IC's general counsel Lisa Laky presented a version of the proposed **Consultation Policy** between the agency and United Workers of

Integral Care that had been heavily revised by management. A redlined version of the document obtained by the Chronicle contained more than 150 revisions. Some are minor word changes that could result in outsized consequences; others would fundamentally change how the union interacts with management.

An example of the latter: a change that would require all policy recommendations discussed by the union and agency executives to garner consensus support before being forwarded to the board for consideration. As drafted by UWIC organizers with assistance from the Communication Workers of

> America, the Consultation Policy stipulated that when the union and management could not reach consensus, each could present its case to the board. As revised by IC, the board would not have an opportunity to hear the workers' recommendation if management disagrees.

Another small revision that could have big consequences is in the "Basic Principles" of the Consultation Policy. The UWIC/CWA version identifies the Integral Care Consultation Committee, the working group tasked with negotiating workforce policy changes, as "the official body for employee consultation with non-Executive Management personnel," whereas the version revised by management changes this

principle to identify the ICCC as "an official body." Union organizers fear this could open the door for IC to promote a management-controlled alternative to UWIC.

The proposed changes shocked union organizers; at a March 31 board of trustees meeting, Integral Care CEO David Evans and board Chair Hal Katz both said they were confident the Consultation Policy could be approved at the board's next regular meeting in late April. (In a subsequent interview, Evans told us he expected the policy to win approval with the possibility of "some minor modifications.")

Other edits proposed by IC management include holding ICCC meetings quarterly instead of monthly; changes to the range of topics the ICCC could discuss; and a requirement that union members receive approval from their direct supervisor before attending ICCC meetings. "I'm worried, but not surprised," Raven Rojas, a mental health professional and union organizer at IC, told us. "If they are implemented, it would significantly decrease the power and leverage the union would have and, in my opinion, it wouldn't even be worth having a union." - Austin Sanders who support trans or queer kids are "groomers" or pedophiles – which is a modern spin on a very old form of homophobia. One mother of a nonbinary 12-year-old (who uses they/them pronouns) told us that widespread bullying in an Austin-area public school put her child in crisis, ultimately resulting in

their hospitalization for emergency mental health care. (The *Chronicle* agreed to keep the family's identity anonymous.)

In one particularly harmful incident, her child's teacher claimed, in front of the classroom, that the reason her child is transgender is because they were groomed by their queer parents. Their mother told us, "Once the directive hit I was terrified that the teacher would report us." Abbott's

anti-trans "abuse" directive has also made the entire process of getting health care for her child fraught with risk. "It's really scary having to disclose [their] gender identity," she wrote. "Because we never know who is safe and who is a bigot." Like many families with trans kids, she's considering leaving the state, though her financial situation prevents them from leaving immediately. "We thankfully have a lot of support from friends and family that would help [us] relocate if things got worse here."

Abbott's directive has reportedly also thrown CPS into disarray. At least a half-

dozen investigators have resigned over the directive. In addition to the resignations, other CPS officials filed an amicus brief on behalf of the ACLU and Lambda Legal lawsuit. Abbott's directive forces CPS officials to closely investigate every single claim of abuse involving a trans kid, and prevents them from closing the cases after they've shown the families to be safe and

Austin lawyer **Tracy Harting**, who is defending two Central Texas families, told us that the investigations against her clients remain open to this day, months after CPS determined that there were no signs of abuse. "It's still hanging over them like that boulder over the coyote," she said.




Playing with Areas of Circles!

The Mean Garden

Through steel, wood, glass, and gas, Ion Art turns Zilker into a glowing wonderland $\mbox{\ \ by\ \ wayne\ \ alan\ \ brenner}$

No one else could have done this.

No one else in Austin, at least, and likely no one else in Texas: supercharging the verdant acres of Zilker Botanical Garden

for six nights with more than 100 fantastical works of neon art, works of technical and artistic creativity so huge (some of them) and so extraordinary (all of them) that the familiar place is transformed into a wonderland of illuminated, frequently kinetic, often interactive glass and gas and steel and wow.

That's the people of Ion
Art. That's the husband-andwife team of Greg and Sharon
Keshishian, who started the Austin company in 1986 with the intent of creating
and selling neon art, and who now employ
around 40 people – artisans all, and deeply
invested in bringing the company's varied

visions into view – to make this city glow ever brighter.

"I started off doing stained glass before I did neon," says Sharon Keshishian, wisps of blonde hair flickering in the

wind that blows across Ion Art's
6-acre South Austin compound. "I've always done art, and when I was doing stained glass, I started going to Houston, because I'd heard about some guys down there doing neon. And I started getting neon pieces made to go with my glasswork. And then Manuel's on Congress asked me, forever

ago, if I could do some neon for their restaurant – and that was my first neon commercial piece."

Forever ago: before our quiet college town morphed into the sort of 24/7 tech-bro





carnival it is today. But now, among the parts of Austin that remain worthy of our love: Who made that eye-catching sign for Stubb's BBQ on Red River? Ion Art. Who made those signs for Maudie's Tex-Mex, the Broken Spoke, El Chilito, Emmer & Rye, Stiles Switch, Oilcan Harry's, and (ahem) *The Austin Chronicle*? Ion Art. Who built that illuminated ACL guitar for the

popular music fest? The rainbow cowboy for Art in Public Places at Ninth and Colorado? The immense Playboy rabbit head that galvanizes the darkest nights in the wilderness of Marfa? The polychrome, eminently climbable ATX in front of the Whole Foods flagship at Sixth and Lamar?

It was all Ion Art, but it wasn't just Sharon. "Greg

does all the metalwork," she says. "Our talents really complement each other and, together, we can build anything."

"I do the mechanical stuff," confirms Greg Keshishian, smiling as he climbs onto a stationary bicycle that's attached to a gear that links to a chain that will rhythmically shift yards and yards of wood carved and painted to resemble layers of ocean waves. "Sharon's the main creative force and artist," he says, "and I'm kind of the nuts-and-bolts guy.

"But it's not just the two of us," added Greg, gesturing into the main warehouse that brims with arcane machinery and the artisans who use it. "We've been doing this for years, and we always have a ton of talented people working here." He begins pedaling; the wooden waves undulate in front of a cephalopod behemoth that's risen in full tentacular glory.

"I don't know if you know that old *Baron Munchausen* movie," says Sharon, "but they had that octopus stage with the waves that went back and forth? So I asked Greg if he thought we could build one for the installation at Zilker. And now," she gestures at the enormous contraption. "People can pedal it

at the garden – and you'll be able to walk up on the stage for pictures!"

But that's perhaps not the most impressive thing you'll see at Zilker Botanical Garden when Ion Art's "Surreal Garden" is fully installed and open to the public on April 22. There'll be a trio of soaring, interactive pendulums, the top parts of which will be neon-chased

to resemble stellar night-sky phenomena. "They have these big counterweights," says Greg, "so people can push them and they'll swing for a long time on their own. You won't see the stems of them at night – it'll look like meteorites going back and forth, and they'll be swinging over the dance cages."

The, um, dance cages?


Sharon nods. "They're usually full all night with people. A lot of folks wear costumes, it's a fun grownup party."

There's a Brobdingnagian sea monster, too, a glammed-up, light-enhanced angler-fish that's big enough to walk around inside of; the fish is rigged with smoke emitters and LEDs, a single good tooth gleaming from its rows of seemingly razorlike (but

softly vinyl) dentition. There's a complexly arching Star Gate that will serve as entrance to the Primordial Forest. There's ... a tall rotating pole with neon fireflies?

"All six of them flash on and off independently from one another," says Greg, adjusting one of the big insect's wings, "so it'll seem really realistic - like an actual flock of fireflies."

"A flock?" says Sharon, frowning. "I don't know if they're called a flock." The two artists grin.

But even this neon project - like all endeavors that require planning and effort – is not all sweetness and light. "We have to rent some equipment to drive around in the garden," says Sharon. "Our regular crane can't fit in the space, so we need to get some smaller lift items. We'll have like five days to set everything up. Art Seen Alliance is doing all our staging - every year, they've been one of our biggest pro bono helpers. They'll set up the stage that we'll put the octopus on. And we'll have to bring everything in a certain order, so some of it doesn't block the others. The octopus has to be one of the first things in, but the sea monster, where he's

going, we have to get some other things – like the Star Gate - in first. And the meteors and all the smaller, stand-alone pieces - we're still trying to figure out the logistics of it all."

But they'll figure it out in time for the garden-based celebration, you can be sure of that: Experience is, after all, one of the best teachers around. Ion Art staged their first such party in the vast parking lot outside their headquarters in 2017, which pulled in about 1,000 intrigued Austinites. By the time of their third, in 2019, the attendance had swelled to 4,000 and the space no longer seemed quite so vast.

"At that point we were overwhelmed," says Sharon. "But some people from Zilker Botanical Garden happened to be here, and they thought it'd be great for the garden. So we were gonna try to do it in 2020, and, well, you know what happened then. So this party's been put off for two years and we're all super excited that it's finally gonna happen."

Review: The Rocky Horror Show

Still tasteless, plotless, pointless, and perfect by bob abelman

When The Rocky Horror Show opened on Broadway in 1975, Newsweek found the outrageous rock musical by Richard O'Brien "tasteless, plotless, and pointless." The New York Times suggested that it "is not easy to see why this campy trash was a long-running hit in London and a smash in Los Angeles except that transvestism has always fascinated the British and the L.A. scene is almost as kinky." Such mainstream condemnation not only led to the show's limited time on the New York stage (only 45 performances), but inspired counterculture audiences to regularly attend midnight showings of the musical's low-budget

film rendition later that year. It also fueled their rebellious inclination to get in on the action. Fans came dressed as favorite characters, armed themselves with homemade props, and engaged in call-and-response to the corny, sci-fi, B-movie dialogue. There were shouts of, "Asshole!" at every mention of the bespectacled hero Brad Majors and, "Slut!" at virgin heroine Janet Weiss, the two sexually repressed innocents who happen upon mad scientist Dr. Frank-N-Furter's lair on the

stormy eve of the great unveiling of his perfect boy-toy creation, Rocky. Soon, audience participation became a cultish ritual, in a good way, that has persevered for more than four decades.

It takes center stage in the current Zach Theatre production. But with props available for purchase in "party packs" at the concession stand, the distribution of handouts to guide their usage, and verbal cues worked into the show's script for those averse to reading handouts, the fun seems a tad forced this time around. Still, fun of any ilk in a group gathering is most welcome amidst

a Stage 2 pandemic, and the creatives behind this production make sure there is plenty of fun to be had.

The Rocky Horror Show was a late addition to Zach's season, having taken the time slot originally held by Reunion '85 when the highly immersive comedy concert was canceled in 2021 during the city's surge of COVID cases. Good move, given the popularity of this cult classic and director Dave Steakley and choreographer Robin Lewis' critically acclaimed collaboration during Zach's 2006 production of the show.

Rather than tilting toward the dark, ultra-hard-rocking, and

deeply maniacal world embraced by so many contemporary productions of The Rocky Horror Show, this version creates a suitably disturbing but not demented place to play, where glitter outweighs goth. Here, the tight threepiece onstage band (bassist Zach Crissman, percussionist Arnie Yanez, and keyboardist/conductor Allen Robertson) serves to support the cast's spectacular voices rather than vie for dominance. And the show's choreography, particularly during produc-

tion numbers like "Time Warp," is so delightfully over the top that it succeeds at keeping the musical from taking itself too seriously.

Driving this production, clad in bedazzled high-heeled boots, a leather bustier, and fishnet stockings - and owning it - is the swaggering and playfully seductive Cecil Washington Jr. as Dr. Frank-N-Furter. His triple-threat take on "Sweet Transvestite" early in Act I sets the high standard for everything that comes after it, and his remarkable "I'm Going Home" late in Act II seals the deal, and the rest of this talented cast follows suit. There's

Cameron Mitchell Bell's (Riff Raff) otherworldly octave jump during the climax of "Over at the Frankenstein Place." There's Daisy Wright (Janet) and Jordan Barron's (Brad) pitch-perfect harmony during the same song and their highly sexualized transformation during "Super Heroes" at the play's end. There's Jill Blackwood's (Magenta) unexpected and spot-on saxophone solos during an otherwise lackluster "Hot Patootie."

Putting on a mask is no longer required to attend live theatre. But putting your hands on your hips, bringing your knees in tight, and doing the pelvic thrust is highly recommended for this one.

Review: Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?

A perfect measure of schadenfreude on the rocks, with an angst chaser

These days, productions at the City Theatre feel like a litmus test for one's ability to sit through three-plus hours of live theatre after a two-year COVID hiatus. And not just any theatre. We're talking risk-taking, game-changing, wordheavy plays the likes of Oscar Wilde's An Ideal Husband, which was the company's first fulllength production of the season, and Edward Albee's Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? which opened this past weekend.

Albee's 1962 drama invites audiences to be a collective fly on the wall of George and Martha's modest home to witness their cruel psychological warfare, intense verbal abuse, and what amounts to some of the best writing for the American stage.

Divided into three one-hour acts, the play begins as George - a middle-aged, underachieving associate professor of history at a small New England college – and his malcontent wife, Martha, return home at 2am, familiarly

and functionally drunk from a Saturday night party at the college president's house. Much to George's displeasure. Martha has invited an opportunistic young assistant professor and his mousy wife to their home for a nightcap. Over the course of the late-night hours, George

and Martha ply Nick and Honey with alcohol and use the two as pawns, props, and cannon fodder in increasingly punishing and cruel mind games titled "Humiliate the Hosts," "Get the Guests," "Hump the Hostess," and "Bringing Up Baby." It all amounts to an excruciatingly painful shitshow and marvelously orchestrated display of schadenfreude, a German term coined in the mid-1800s that refers to the pleasure one derives from the misfortunes of others.

With this production taking place in the intimate Trinity Playhouse in Downtown Austin, the City Theatre company puts the audience directly in the line of fire. So close are the performers - made even more so by director Karen Sneed's tendency to push them to the edge of the performance space - that there should be a splash zone for the flying gin, spewed insults, and shattered egos.

Key to a successful Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? is having a gritty, foul-mouthed, ballbusting Martha who can unleash violent rants and merciless barbs, emasculate George and Nick while in the process of seducing them, and then earnestly bare her frailty and deep-rooted self-loathing. Meredith O'Brien is perfect in the role. She creates a Martha that is as complicated as she is compelling. It is almost impossible to take your eyes off her during the production.

Equally important is having a pathetic George wallow in his own mediocrity and misery, and fold under Martha's hard-hitting humiliation, only to match and then best her fury with bitter arrogance, astute intelligence, and a keen awareness of the tender spots of her soft underbelly. Rick Smith is brilliant in this role, as if it were

> written for him. Both he and O'Brien, who shared this stage in last year's Gross Indecency, ride the emotional pendulum that is Virginia Woolf? like the seasoned performers they are.

As for their young guests, Carl Kraines and Chiara McCarty are wonderful in

these deceptively simple but extremely challenging roles, and they ride that same pendulum with convincing inebriation, consternation, and mounting outrage. Sneed's perpetually forward-moving direction keeps the pace lively while Artistic Director Andy Berkovsky's scenic and lighting design make the Sixties-style living room that houses this play look lived-in. The burgundy walls, dark wood furnishings, uninspiring artwork, and lack of windows create a palpable sense of confinement and oppression, which is what this play calls for. Characterdefining and period-perfect costuming comes courtesy of Rosalie Oliveri.

A perfect storm of production and performance has been created for Albee's masterpiece. Rather than taking cover from this three-plus-hour downpour, it's time to get out and get wet.





DAY TRIPS

The Texas Roadstand in Cedar Creek still looks more like the vegetable market it used to be, rather than a temple to the essence of the hamburger that it has become.

Tucked away in a wooded area off Highway 21, 3 miles south of Highway 71 between **Austin** and **Bastrop**, the restaurant, a cinder-block kitchen and screened-in dining room, was built by the previous owner. Most diners



devour their burgers at the picnic tables under the ancient honey mesquite tree.

This is no ordinary burger joint. New Jersey-born **Marian Barrett** excels at making five kinds of burgers, a grilled chicken breast sandwich, and a veggie burger that even carnivores like.

The burgers start with a beef patty that Marian grinds herself to get the fat content just right. About the size of a smashed fist, the patties are thick and juicy. The array of toppings - bacon, jalapeños, fried onions, fried egg, or pimento cheese - add the artistry to her masterpieces.

Marian's house-made pickles add a garlicky crunch to the sandwiches. The fermented cucumber slices are such a local favorite she sells them to go by the pint.

Her most popular sandwich is the "Wax's Podcast Burger." The cheese is mixed into the meat and topped with bacon jam and haystack onions. It's gooey and slightly sweet.

Marian says she named it after Wax the Rapper, aka Michael Jones, who has a popular podcast. She was thrilled when the Los Angeles-based band stopped in for burgers. "He calls us the official restaurant of the Wax podcast," Marian says.

The Texas Roadstand is open Wednesday through Sunday from 11am to 3pm. Since this is a one-woman show, it's always best to call 512/827-6215 to check availability.

In Gut-Check Time. **True Colors Shine Through**

On Saturday, Austin FC rallied from 0-2 down with three goals in the final 10 minutes of play to stun D.C. United on their home field and vault toward the very top of the Western Conference standings. It was the sort of comeback effort that had to be seen to be believed, and even then required a few looks at the match highlights to really register.

"It gives confidence to the idea that no matter what the situation is, the team can come together and persevere," a reflective Josh Wolff would say days later. "When [the players] have got to fight and struggle together, that's when you really see who you are."

It's becoming abundantly clear that the version of Austin FC that returned from D.C. with all 3 points is made of different stuff than the squad that ended last season on a 14-match road winless streak. There were gut-check moments up and down the 2021 expansion year, but few instances where the Verde and Black actually rose to meet the challenge. This time around, though, the club is taking its opportunities like a bona fide playoff contender. So wherein lies the difference?

One could certainly point to an overall increase in talent level throughout the roster, or to the fact that most members of the Verde squad have an extra year of familiarity with each other after the trials of 2021. But the club's on-field acumen is just part of the story. Wins like the one Austin FC captured in the nation's capital only come with a heavy dose of intangibles: grit, belief, fortitude. It's in those areas where Austin FC has made the biggest strides between seasons, and they know it. "It's a very collective group. It's much more unified this year than it was last year, and I think that's very visible," Wolff said.

Ironically, the players most responsible for bringing the unity and camaraderie to Austin FC are the ones who've been with the club the shortest amount of time. Veteran offseason additions Maxi Urruti, Felipe Martins, and Ruben Gabrielsen have all quickly established themselves as vocal leaders inside the Verde dressing room - the kind of stabilizing forces the club desperately lacked on its inaugural squad.

At halftime in D.C., with Austin FC trailing, it was Gabrielsen's turn to speak up. In a moment captured in an ATXFC social media video, the former Molde captain laid into his teammates (and himself) for a lackluster first-half performance. "My message was that it was not good enough. That we're much better than that, and we showed it in the second half," Gabrielsen said. His headed goal in the 90th minute capped off the comeback. "If I didn't say something, somebody else would have said it."

"The vibe was, 'We're going to win this game," said **Danny Hoesen**, who also scored. "I think that's a huge, huge step from last year where if we were behind, especially on the road, 9 out of 10 games we would have lost it."

Hoesen watched much of the club's expansion season from the sidelines after a hip injury ended his season after five games. He authored his own comeback story with the 80th minute goal to get Austin FC on the board in just his second appearance back in action with the club. The Verde's original No. 9, who struggled in his minutes before the injury, might be more sensitive to the collective change in mindset than anyone.

"It's been a long, tough year for me." Hoesen said. "To be in this team with this spirit and this heart, and everybody is so together, it feels almost like a family."

Something Rotten in the State of Iceland

Forget the horned helmets and drinking horns: Robert Eggers' The Northman is a brilliant, bloody reenactment of the Viking myth behind Hamlet BY RICHARD WHITTAKER

The greatest achievement possible for a historical drama is to truly immerse the audience in a time and place. Not just to re-create set dressing and dialect but to inform every moment with the culture, the world view, the feeling of that setting. By that measurement, Robert Eggers' The Northman is an extraordinary feat of cinema - but it's also a bloody, mournful, violent tale of vengeance that is never simply academic, but visceral, sensual, emotional, and epic.

It's also not about Vikings. After all, that is a term that was applied by outsiders to the peoples of Northern Europe, a name that translates roughly to "pirate." Instead, Eggers looks from within, and there is arguably no filmmaker better suited to the task. In both The Witch and The Lighthouse, he absorbed a vast amount of research on two particular locales and eras (the early Colonial American Eastern

Seaboard and the isolation of 19th-century lighthouse keepers, respectively) and used it all to quietly color every moment. The Northman works on a vast canvas - or rather, map. The time is the decades around the turn of the 10th century, but there is not one place, rather a swath of Northern Europe from the Orkneys to the bleak and recently settled hinterlands of Iceland, to the farmlands of the Rus on the western steppe. There's no monoculture here, but vying kingdoms, warbands, faiths, mythologies, and interests.

It's in the furthest Scottish isles in which The Northman begins, at the court of the returning King Aurvandil (Hawke), a raider back from the sea with plunder and slaves, back to Queen Gudrún (Kidman), the mother of his son and heir, Amleth (Novak). But any happiness is soon devastated by blades loyal to the king's brother, Fjölnir (Bang), who usurps the throne and sends his nephew fleeing for his life. The man who returns years later is not the scared little boy

but a giant of a man (Skarsgård). a battle-hardened berserker who has constantly chanted the same pledge in his exile: "I will avenge you, father. I will save you, mother. I will kill you, Fjölnir."

If the story and the name resonate with familiarity, it's because the story of Amleth is a Viking tale of unclear origins, later versions of which were the basis for Shakespeare's Hamlet.

Scripting alongside author and longtime Björk collaborator Sigurjón Birgir Sigurðsson (writing here under the nom de plume Sjón) to fulfill a longtime ambition of Skarsgård to recreate the era, Eggers weaves together the strands of mythology and history that are what we know. He conjures up the sensation of what it was to live in the cold mire of the firm belief that the Norns had your fate ordained, and that one of the slaves with whom Amleth hides himself (Eggers regular Taylor-Joy) can channel Slavic

earth magic. It's a past place where shamans can speak to the dead and warriors can channel atavistic spirits. Magic is in the gut and the soil, as real as iron and wood and bone. Violence is a constant interrupter, even though Eggers more often shows the disturbing result than its execution.

It's the perfect tone at which to pitch The Northman. because our understanding of exactly what the time of the Vikings (curse that word) was like is imprecise. The film is subjective, an onscreen exercise in reconstructive archaeology rich with the kind of subtext that flows deep in Eggers' work (such as the struggle between the honor-driven Odin cultists and the fertility rites of Freyja). Yet it's never dry, figuratively or literally. Amleth cuts a bloody path through the Norse realms, his gore-soaked hands keeping an ever-lessening grasp on the slippery concept of revenge. Like Hamlet, he is faced with choices as to whether to continue or not, but there is more than an enraged shade of his father forcing his inevitable steps toward a spectacular showdown on the ashen slopes of a volcano. The Northman lives and breathes like the old epics: not Old Hollywood's cartoonish depictions of warriors with horned helmets, but the ancient tales to which he pays deep respect.

9 BULLETS

D: Gigi Gaston: with Lena Headev. Sam Worthington. Dean Scott Vasquez. Cam Gigandet. La La Anthony. Barbara Hershev. (NR. 97 min.)

Old stories don't go away; they just get smaller budgets. Take the old tale of the grumpy and begrudging guardian of a kid who was witness to a crime and now is the only person that can take down a crime syndicate. Think Harrison Ford in Witness or Mercury Rising, and now there's 9 Bullets, in which Lena Headey takes a tween bitcoin trader (Vasquez) on the lam from Sam Worthington as a redneck gangster who complains about his girlfriend serving carrots.

9 Bullets wants to think it's cool and edgy by having Gypsy be a former burlesque performer who is working on her new book (which you can tell because her straight-from-central-casting agent calls her like a minor character from a Nineties sitcom), and having her slowly warm to parenthood. However, that's overshadowed by some garbage filmmaking, like a bag of money buried two inches underground, or the characters sitting by a pool in what is clearly the late afternoon, watching a sky full of stars. Even if moments like that could slide past audiences, lousy plotting and beyond questionable character motivations bring the story to a constant, grinding halt. Even the addition of Anthony as Tamsin, an equally unwilling sidekick/accidental hostage, and dropping by a motel run by Lacey, Gypsy's former college professor (Hershey), fails to bring anything of importance. Those additions are seemingly supposed to add thematic relevance about women coming together under extraordinary circumstances, with stripper Tamsin and intellectual Lacey seemingly representing the two sides of Gypsy (a wild and insulting cliche about dancers and sex workers being dumb crooks if ever there was one). But instead 9 Bullets just constantly misfires, and never gets better than the inadvertent comedy of Worthington pulling a gun on a dog as a negotiating tactic.

I've seen Aline described as a comedy, which I think is a generous read of this biopic inspired by the life of singer Céline Dion, notably made without the permission or participation of the international icon. But there is at least a kind of contact high that comes from Lemercier's utterly demented decision to play Dion (rechristened "Aline Dieu" for the film) at age 5 and 12 and 17 and so on, through digital trickery

and clever camera setups and a kind of childish energy that recalled for me Molly Shannon's Catholic schoolgirl *SNL* creation, Mary Katherine Gallagher. It's so out there – so distracting and discomfiting and high-wire thrilling in its seeming wrongheadedness – that it raises expectations that the rest of *Aline* will be just as gonzo.

Alas, as the age gap between Aline and Lemercier's true age shrinks, so too does the feeling that Aline is doing anything especially original. (Improbably, Lemercier was awarded the César Award for Best Actress for her performance; the film earned another nine nominations.) I wonder if Lemercier chose to play the character at all ages to avoid the ickiness of casting a child actor against Sylvain Marcel, who plays the funhouse version of Dion's manager and eventual husband René Angélil. What little dramatic tension the film unearths is drawn from the couple's transition from child star and Svengali (they first met when she was 12 and he was 39) to furtive lovers and then a deeply devoted married couple with kids. There's nothing particularly probing about the film's examination of their relationship, or Aline's relationship to her fame; it's all surfaces and soft edges. French singer Victoria Sio. dubbing in for Lemercier's lip-sync performances, is a capable dupe for the original, and the production and costume design convincingly re-create the eras and Dion's most memorable costumes. But to what purpose? There are no insights here, only lavishly budgeted cosplay.

THE BAD GUYS

Based on the Aaron Blabey kiddie graphic novel series of the same name, *The Bad Guys* is about a crew of, well, bad guys who love criming. It's the only life they know. They love a good bank heist and, really, who doesn't? Mr. Wolf (Rockwell), Mr. Snake (Maron), Mr.

Piranha (Ramos), Mr. Shark (Robinson), and Ms. Tarantula, aka Webs (Awkwafina), rob banks seemingly just for the fun of it. They eventually get caught and swear to the governor, Ms. Foxington (Beetz), that they're going to go straight and become model citizens. Wink, wink.

The voice acting in *The Bad Guys* is really strong. In more than a few animated films, the actors don't sound like they're really interacting with each other. It's like they're reading lines to no one. That's not the case here; whether they were in the same room or not, it sounds like they are. Rockwell and Maron are the standouts here (I can't believe I'm the only one who, at first, thought Mr. Snake was voiced by Danny DeVito), and Awkwafina is great as Webs: She can be grating, for sure, but not here. If you can make me want a stuffed animal version of your character, you've done a good job.

I dug the animation style. Although, you know I have that thing about animals having human teeth *shudder*. The action sequences are effective but the twist (yes, there is a twist – isn't there always a twist?) doesn't really succeed so the last act does feel a bit draggy. For a feature directorial debut, Pierre Perifel has nothing to be ashamed about. He and his team have made a solid film for kiddos.

I'm not sure *The Bad Guys* is something kids on the younger side will enjoy, as the action and humor seem aimed at a slightly older, 10-and-up crowd. Still, there are some good lessons to be learned here about staying true to your friends and not judging someone on the way they look – a lesson we all, not just the kiddos, need to learn. There is some crude humor, including one running joke that runs throughout the film. If flatulence jokes are your thing (and they absolutely are not mine), then this is the movie for you.
















DRIFTING IN THE HISTORY OF BARTON SPRINGS

New website lets you dip into the Barton Creek Timestream By ELLEN DALY

Do you know how lucky you are to live in a city as environmentally protected as Austin?

Sure, you've walked into the Greenbelt through the Gus Fruh entrance, but have vou ever wondered who Gus Fruh is? Love to swim at Barton Springs but never heard of Beverly Sheffield, once known as "mayor" of the Springs? Maybe you've pondered how Austinites got so lucky as to have an oasis of cold, swimmable water to help us survive the blistering Texas summer heat, right in the heart of Downtown. It's certainly not luck that got us here – it's the result of over 50 years of conscious effort by community members dedicated to protecting your waters.

For the first time ever, that history has been collected and digitized into the Barton Creek Timestream (bartoncreektimestream. org), a virtual history exhibit and interactive timeline allowing lovers of the creek to learn about the rich and intentional history of its protection. The interactive timeline takes users on a journey from the 1950s to now, with the opportunity to explore firsthand accounts of the stewards who pushed policies that make the creek what it is today. Read old Austin Chronicle and Austin American-Statesman clippings and find out how residents reacted to early neighborhood development plans, MoPac's construction, and the building of Barton Creek Square - and what they did to prevent these once-perceived monstrosities from soiling the stream.

The site supplements a physical exhibit of the same sentiment that's free to visit at the Beverly S. Sheffield Education Center in the Barton Springs Bathhouse. Project creators Karen Kocher and Monica Flores wanted to increase access to their archive, so they decided to digitize the exhibit they'd unfortunately launched at the height of the pandemic.

"It's the civic duty of those who use the Greenbelt to learn about it," Kocher explained. Her appreciation for her predecessors is palpable. "It's amazing to me how few people put their time, effort, and money into pushing the rock up the hill. You'd think that more people would have done it, but it was a very small group of individuals."

The project's an offshoot of Kocher's Living Springs documentary series, an ongoing, multiplatform educational experience designed to teach Austinites about the history, science, and cultural and spiritual significance of Barton Springs. Living Springs combines documentary films and interactive exhibits at the Sheffield Center, the latest of which is the physical Timestream, which Kocher pitched as a means of funding research for her next Springs film.

The archive's only shortcoming is Kocher's and Flores' exclusion from its list of stewards, though their eventual addition must be inevitable. Through documentary filmmaking and curating archives, the two have committed themselves to preserving the rich history of the protection of Austin's waters and providing resources for residents to honor their legacy through the continued pursuit of the water's protection (see the Timestream's "Get Involved" tab, where visitors can discover ways to ensure their kids and grandkids will get to enjoy the same clean waters they did). Just as the ongoing efforts of environmentalists are invaluable and no accident, such are the works of Kocher and Flores. Thus, the team's motto: "Love the creek. Learn the story."

Dip into the Barton Creek Timestream at bartoncreektimestream.org. You can also celebrate the site's launch at a special event at the Beverly S. Sheffield Education Center, 2201 William Barton, Sat., April 23, 11am.

reimagines this location as a dusty rural fiefdom lorded over by gangsters who treat the peasant workers like slaves.

That first film was quite confusing, with innumerable plot twists, perhaps a few too many stylistic flourishes, and about half a dozen central characters who are difficult to distinguish from one another due to their identical burly builds and giant, but impeccably manicured, beards. Thankfully Chapter 2 launches with a recap that reminds the audience of the important moments and characters before jumping right into the action.

We now find Rocky's apparent heroism to the people of K.G.F. slipping. He seems to be getting greedy, pushing the workers beyond their limits, but there's something more going on that we don't find out until much later. Like its prequel, Chapter 2 is packed with self-aggrandizing monologues, blisteringly edited and executed action sequences, and a whole lot of slow-motion ogling of Rocky's unimpeachably slick Seventies attire and flowing mane. This film is all about glorifying its star, and it is unashamed.

K.G.F: Chapter 2 is an odd mix of a director with a million ideas trying to cram them all in, and a star whose audience relishes in the opportunity to cheer on their hero as often and as loudly as possible. This type of masala/ mass worship film is not a genre we have in America, and while there is certainly a lot to love, the frequent digressions from the plot in order to gaze upon Yash's awesomeness might feel awkward for unfamiliar audiences. There are a number of rousing songs in the film, but only one of them is accompanied by dancing of any kind: the rest are set to footage of Rocky either walking into or out of kicking some poor sap's butt. It happens so much that it'd almost be funny if the film weren't so intentionally devoid of humor.

Stylistically, K.G.F: Chapter 2 is overflowing with bravura choices from Neel in every department. The action sequences, which range from burning bridges to a kickass car chase to a number of insanely loud gun battles, are all well worth the time you'll invest. Neel and his editor, 19-year-old Ujwal Kulkarni, work wonders with a convoluted plot and action sequences that require very precise timing. The grand scale of the film, the biggest ever made in the Kannada language, could be used as a crutch, but Neel never sacrifices his vision for a vista, and though we may not always know exactly what's going on, we're left with little opportunity to be bored.

Though not quite the guaranteed universal crowd-pleaser that RRR was, K.G.F: Chapter 2 should bring some new fans to regional Indian mainstream film. With a big, domineering performance from Yash front and center; a love of bonkers action and unrelenting brutal violence; stunning camerawork from Bhuvan Gowda; and a director with flair to spare, crime and action lovers would do well to give it a chance.

Émilie (Zhang) and Camille (Samba) are in love. Émilie and Camille are not in love. Camille is falling in love with Émilie, and she doesn't want that. Émilie is in love with Camille, but he doesn't love her back. Émilie and Camille are ex-lovers who can't quite get out of each other's orbit. It just depends when you see their very average but still fascinating relationship, the instigating arc of Jacques Audiard's Paris. District 13, and their intersections with a growing population of characters.

There's nothing extraordinary about the stories told here. Instead, Audiard searches for modern mundanity in his trail through the young professionals in Paris' 13th arrondissement, most especially the areas around les Olympiades (the film's original French-language title), one of the tonier, trendier areas of the city. Like 2012's Rust and Bone, Audiard constructs a single narrative from unrelated short stories by a North American author: In the earlier film, it was two of Craig Davidson's short stories from his anthology of the same name, and now adapting several works by American comic artist Adrian Tomine. Arguably as famous for his New Yorker covers as for his illustrated storytelling, rife with characters burdened by disaffected self-analysis. Audiard transplants his stories from the States, arguably keeping their flavor but not necessarily giving them the structure they need to really flourish as a singular narrative.

Paris, 13th District feels like it wants to be part of a tradition of emotionally and sexually blunt dramas that reaches through David Mamet's Sexual Perversity in Chicago and Patrick Marber's Closer (there's even a core plot component triggered by a wig). Zhang and Samba are often fascinating as the two failed fuckbuddies, never quite in the same place emotionally with each other, but Audiard decides to convolute the issue by introducing Merlant (Portrait of a Lady on Fire) as Nora, a recent transplant to Paris whose life is complicated and bruised when she's confused by her fellow college students with a famous cam girl. These segments, loosely adapted from Tomine's "Amber Sweet," feel like the setup to a genuine anthology approach, but instead it's a long, looping storyline that intersects with and increasingly replaces Émilie and Camille's rocky and often unromantic relationship. It's also oddly fantastical, and inevitably works better on the page than on the screen, if simply because it implausibly depends on Nora being readily mistaken for the actual Amber (Beth, of British rock band Savages).

Audiard undoubtedly has an eye for the little details of relationships, and also of the 13th arrondissement, one of Paris' most diverse and vibrant communities. Paul Guilhaume's silvery cinematography catches it all in a gorgeous palette of grays, his black-and-white vision making

flesh supple and lithe across the series of erotic encounters - some playful, some emotional, some tinged with tragedy and desperation. Yet the moments never quite become a whole, not least because of the disjoint between the stories of Émilie and Camille, and Camille and Nora. Maybe it's an attempt to correct the flaws of the classic rom-com trope of "the other girlfriend," a character introduced to add a little wrinkle in the central romance in so many films, by giving her actual agency: Yet it also means that Paris, 13th District never quite provides a good enough reason to smoosh two of Tomine's stories together. *** - Richard Whittaker

THE UNBEARABLE WEIGHT OF **MASSIVE TALENT**

D: Tom Gormican; with Nicolas Cage, Pedro Pascal, Tiffany Haddish, Sharon Horgan, Ike Barinholtz, Alessandra Mastronardi. (R. 105 min.)

There are actors, there are film legends, there are stars, and then there are people like Nicolas Cage, star/subject of metacomedy The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent. Then again, is there really anyone quite like the mega-acting force behind A Score to Settle, 211, and Pay the Ghost?

Why name those films, rather than bigger box-office successes like The Rock or National Treasure, or critically acclaimed work like Wild at Heart, Adaptation, Leaving Las Vegas, Pig, or Joe, or even intriguing oddities such as Lord of War? Because those are as important to Cage's career as those more noted movies. They're the ones that have paid the bills, and they're the ones about which Nicolas Cage is belittled by young Nicky Cage. Both parts are played by ... Nicolas Cage in a not-always-flattering self-portrait, with hallucinations of the blazing young artist berating the burned-out performer, divorced, broke, and flailing between the parts that make money and the parts that will make him an actor again.

It's the financial desperation that leads to him agreeing to take \$1 million to spend

a weekend with the ultimate Nicolas Cage superfan, Javi Gutierrez (a suitably daffy Pedro Pascal). He's exactly the kind of Cage-oholic who would watch all those straight-to-video releases with the same reverence as a 70mm restoration of Leaving Las Vegas, even if the source of that million bucks isn't exactly legit, as is explained to Cage by the FBI.

The script by director Tom Gormican (creator of the short-lived Adam Scott/Craig Robinson supernatural comedy Ghosted) undoubtedly shows the fingerprints of his co-writer, Kevin Etten, and his tenure on format-busting TV shows like Scrubs and Kevin Can F**k Himself. There's a playfulness, even giddy silliness, with Nic and Javi goofing around, high as kites, like over-excited schoolboys on a shared sugar rush. Those moments are fun, but they're also part of a subtle tragedy that keys into Cage and every decision he's made - creative, personal, professional.

Cage is far from the first actor to play himself, and there's a self-critique at play that would make for a suitable double bill with Jean-Claude Van Damme's self-castigation in JCVD. Yet there's undoubtedly a major difference between the two projects. JCVD was a way for "The Muscles From Brussels" to show that he was more than the two-dimensional action hero. Its defining scene is a monologue in which the star literally levitates out of the story to make observations, and it's a way for the broken-down universal soldier himself to prove that he can be more than just that guy that does the splits. We already know what Cage is capable of, all the extremities and various forms of him. Here, another monologue delivery is a vital turning point, but it's when Cage blows an impromptu audition by being too much Cage.

This is Cage trying to find himself in all those messy decisions he's made, trying to make amends while accepting and celebrating who he is. Even when the film sporadically becomes formulaic and fits into a more singular actioncomedy groove, it's its own commentary on the divide between what Cage wants and what the audience wants, and his preparedness to give

them what they want. In its final moments. The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent gives Cage a glimpse of what it is he truly wants. Whether you see that as tragic or hopeful depends which Nic Cage you want to see, and will leave you with one question: What would the Nic Cage in the audience, watching Nic Cage watching Nic Cage playing Nic Cage, think of all this?

UNPLUGGING

Shot during the course of the pandemic without specifically commenting on it outright, The Hangover series editor Neil-Fisher's feature debut attempts to comment on a growing societal dysfunction afflicting hundreds of millions of adults and kiddos alike: Too much time spent staring at our subversive little black mirrors is unhealthy. Whether in the name of our already stressy and out-of-whack work-life ratios or by simply deep-diving into the rabbit hole of Wikipedia for just a moment that magically turns into four suddenly vanished hours, our over reliance on our iEverythings is fragmenting not only the political and pop-cultural zeitgeist but also what it means to be part of a traditional nuclear family. To paraphrase pioneering futurist, computer scientist, and philosopher Jaron Lanier, you are not your gadget. But for countless tech-savvy Homo sapiens, such warnings go unheeded.

In Neil-Fisher's rom-com-ish riposte, Jeanine and Dan (Longoria and Walsh, respectively) are a happily married couple raising a teenage daughter (Finley) in Chicago. Mom is a workaholic commercial leasing director and former attorney who's glued to her iPhone 24/7 while house-husband Dan runs an artisanal hot sauce micro-business out of the family's garage. Alas, the "happily" part of their marriage is in danger of disintegrating due to familial technocracy. When Jeanine's boss orders her to take a twoweek "mandatory sabbatical" after her techy enthusiasm goes one workplace email too far (a fact she fails to mention to her husband), Dan decides what this faltering and apparently sexless relationship needs is a digital detox: a threeday weekend in the countryside with no phones, tablets, or other distracting gadgetry. It's just the two of them (and some edibles) in a rough-hewn cabin in the woods with barely any cell service to complicate matters. For a while the getaway seems to be working, but they've both snuck in their phones, which leads to a comically desperate search for reception and mutual bickering. So much for that rustic sexytime holiday.

Walsh co-wrote the script with Brad Morris, and while the premise is solid, Unplugging struggles to find the right balance between comedy

and serious social criticism. As the more chill Dan, Walsh is technically the voice of reason, literally crying out in the wilderness because - irony of ironies - a cell signal evades him. There's an unnecessary and unexplained subplot about mysterious, possibly military drones chasing the couple across hill and dale, which may be an attempt to link their own overuse of technology with that of Big Brother. Thompson shows up, also without any real reason, as a local survivalist with a raccoon named LuLu, and the always welcome Keith David gets a cameo as a funky bartender.

Unfortunately for a film that has so much to say about a topic of great import, Unplugging is hamstrung by its ricocheting tone and undercut by sequences that probably provoked chuckles during the initial read-through but too often fall flat in the finished product. That's a shame because - oh, hang on a sec, would you? I've got an incoming text. Just, you know, I'll be right back. Promise.

Who am I? It's a fundamental question where the answer is a life's pursuit. The life's pursuit. really. Establishing our identities (always plural, ever fluid) is a much more complex endeavor in our current century, largely due to all those names listed on a philosophy class syllabus. But also the internet. Formerly a luxury, now a requirement, the internet's tendency can often resemble a perpetual stream of desperate egotism, but it also provides a platform that affords opportunities to try on various identities, as opposed to, say, a millennium ago, when if your surname was Miller, your life's pursuit was grinding wheat, Socrates be damned.

In We're All Going to the World's Fair, this online conduit for restless expression and experimentation is shown through the framework of

an online horror role-playing game. The film begins with Casey (Cobb) going through the World's Fair initiation ritual: the incantation spoken thrice, the drawing of blood, the smearing of blood on monitor, and the watching of the revelatory video. Players of the World's Fair subsequently begin to mutate, and post videos documenting their descent into madness, supernatural possession, and other staples of creepypasta mythology. A standard setup for a horror film, but filmmaker Jane Schoenbrun (who, among other projects, was ringleader/executive producer for the equally slippery SXSW 2016 feature collective:unconscious) has not made a horror film, but a fractured portrait of teenage malaise, of deceptions (both of self and others), and of the awkward probing of a cocoon's inner shell. Casey draws the attention of JLB (Rogers), who seems to be the game master of World's Fair, and the two begin corresponding on the forum. Their friendship turns strange and borderline nefarious, although Schoenbrun leaves it for us to fill in this tabula rasa.

Apart from interludes of ASMR videos and footage of other World's Fair participants, Schoenbrun concentrates on an isolated Casey and her videos, shot either in her black-lightinfused bedroom or out in the desolate winter woods of upstate New York, or on JLB occupying spaces in his unnervingly enormous house. When Casey's father and JLB's mother pop fleetingly out of the periphery for brief moments, it is with that same frisson of shock as a jump scare. The outside world is just as frightening as any paranormal activity.

Seed Banking on the Future

Gardeners and librarians join forces to catalog hope

"I want to tell you about the most hopeful thing in the world. It is a seed." – Janisse Ray, The Seed Underground: A Growing Revolution to Save Food

When it comes to foodways preservation and environmental restoration, the small but mighty seed lives in the center of the Venn diagram. In Central Texas, a growing network of believers – including horticulturalists, plant conservationists, hobby gardeners, and librarians – are actively rallying to spread the gospel of seed saving. Says Colleen Dieter, the founder of Central Texas Seed Savers, "The magic of seeds is genetic information, and that's what librarians are organizing."

Dieter owns and operates her own business, Red Wheelbarrow Design, as a land-scape consultant and horticulturist. What began as a personal garden project to continue growing delicious and well-adapted Armenian cucumbers morphed into a seed-saving mission. Founded in 2018, Central Texas Seed Savers – a grass-roots project of nonprofit group Fruitful Commons – is dedicated to providing seeds to the Austin Public Library Seed Collection by organizing volunteers to collect, package, and share all kinds of fruit, vegetable, and native plant seeds.

Through the partnership, the city currently boasts 12 (and counting) seed collections at various neighborhood library branches and local business locations, each with a unique origin story. And the Central Branch Downtown is home to a very special project hub where librarians are cataloging and storing a variety of seeds in an eye-catching classic card catalog from the Austin History Center. The best part: Everyone is welcome to "check out and return" seeds from the Central Library Seed Collection and all of the seed libraries across town, for free. As public libraries do.

Kate Abel and Jace Furches are both adult services librarians for Austin Public Library Central Branch and gardeners to boot. Furches says of the alignment, "It promotes the sharing of seeds, and the sharing of seed knowledge. The library is promoting literacy and, historically, that's been books principally. But now it's come to be all kinds of literacy, including health literacy, cultural literacy, and environmental literacy. So this fits nicely in there. We see the seeds as nutritional and historical suitcases. The plants help nourish us, but they also provide cultural sustenance. So we say in our mission statement that seed collections like ours are intended to promote sustainability, self-sufficiency, food security, and interpersonal exchange."

As the story goes, there was "a bit of serendipity" in how the Seed Savers and library partnership came together. "Kate is definitely a sustainability warrior" and was hoping to find more engagement opportunities, says Furches. Around the same time, in January 2018, Dieter had been taking classes and working with fellow seed swap volunteers at the Sustainable Food Center. That October, the first seed swap brought together more than 100 volunteers at the Central Branch, and in January 2019 the Central Library Seed Collection opened, followed by several other neighborhood libraries. Just

first fruit tree scion swap happened at Texas Keeper Cider. When the libraries were closed and swaps were not happening, Seed Savers shared more than 7,000 seed packets via food pantries, community gardens, porch pickups, and little seed libraries; the library branches offered virtual classes (still available on the website) and curbside pickup. Collectively, tens of thousands of seed packets have been shared since 2018, and the mission is growing stronger than ever with Seed Savers' support from Fruitful Commons and APL's gradual return to in-person programming and seed gatherings.

The list of reasons to save seeds is nearly as long as the list of seeds to save: With climate change and increasing pressures on nature, it is critical to protect culturally important (and delicious) varietals like the Tatume squash, which has survived generations to shape local foodways, Dieter says. It's also about preserving plants that are well-adapted to

Central Texas' often harsh climate, and protecting less commercial varieties from extinction – something left to small-scale growers and home gardeners. Ideally the plants would be grown in isolation, harvested, and stored frozen in libraries, but more infrastructure and research are needed.

In addition to fruits and veggies, Seed Savers is also dedicated to initiatives for tree preservation, like a pilot program with TreeFolks aimed at improving diversity in the local tree canopy. They collect seeds for native species like walnut, emerald ash, and

various nut and fruit trees. "Genetics are very complicated. That's why scions and grafts are so import-

ant to preserve that genetic lineage. You can't store that genetic info in a library; it must be stored in living trees – orchards, networks of yards – and mapped," says Dieter.

Growing the network of growers and improving preservation abilities to resist the pressures on native plants is precisely what conservation biologist

Minette Marr at the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center does every day. An expert in plant identification, Marr is involved with all the different gardens across the center's 284 acres and the 54 ongoing and ever-changing research points for land management. She says, "Some plants are introduced deliberately, some accidentally, and I try to keep us current with the current classification. But my favorite thing was always collecting seeds, especially walking with volunteers and landowners to collect

seeds. It's one thing for me to go out and make a seed collection. But it's much more important to share that skill with other people, so they can pass it on."

Essentially, the Wildflower Center Seed Bank works on two main types of collections. The first focuses on preservation of rare and habitat-specific plant populations at risk of extinction due to development and climate change. Marr says requests for small quantities of seeds (like 150) come from academia and scientists from across the globe for studies on genetics, distribution, and invasion. The second, formerly part of the Millennium Seed Bank funded through the Royal Botanic Gardens in the UK, focused on large amounts (10,000-20,000) of common species, often for restoration projects like in coastal regions post-hurricane. After the funding dried up, the Center has continued to partner with various projects, state and federal agencies, naturalist chapters and native plant societies, and even the Texas Forest Service nursery in Lubbock. But for the most part, large quantity efforts have previously been on hold. "We still have the seeds and we still share seeds," Marr says, but this is why Dieter and the librarians' work is so extremely important: The Wildflower Center hosts only two plant sales per year for fruits, vegetables, grasses, wildflowers, and more, so "grow outs" are slow-going, but, "Colleen works with people in their vard," explains Marr, "She can take that same seed collection and immediately make a difference" with plants like deer-tolerant grasses, others that only grow on steep stony slopes, and some that tolerate junipers' shade. And by making the seeds available through our public library system, versus a very formal scientific process, "they're pushing them out there as soon as possible. And that's powerful.

"It's really important that there's that quick turnaround on it because that way, the seeds are spread out amongst a lot of people that can grow [the plants] and then more seeds and it just expands. Each [location] represents a little island seed bank, hopefully," says Marr. "People's backyards might actually end up being much more diverse than some of our natural areas that don't have protection from [factors like] deer. [Conservationist] Doug Tallamy has this idea [that] 'our next national park is the collective of all of our backyards.' And Colleen's already doing that."

U.S. Department of Agriculture and Native American groups with large-scale growing capacities helps create robust collections.

"I've had this crazy dream and everybody just kind of shakes their head, but for years I've been pushing that we should collaborate with H-E-B," Marr says. "Habitat for H, enhancement for E, Bees for B. Or Butterflies!" They would need a huge volume of seeds, "but if I keep talking about it, somebody's gotta do it. Because when you're sharing information, you're building capacity."

Discovering new options for home gardens is an added bonus – plants that most people don't think of when they think of Central Texas but grow really well here.

Local orgs like Seed Savers and their partnerships with community resources like the public library will shape the future of seed preservation networks, including seed banking. From the Seed Collection's library page: "Imagine a network of freezers all over Central Texas storing a collection of rare, valuable seeds. We don't need a vault in an arctic mountain. We just need a corner of your freezer for a quart jar full of seeds." The network of freezers connects to growers to preserve genetics, then distribute, then database. Abel says, "We're not a seed bank in the traditional sense that we're holding seeds for perpetuity. It really is intended to get them into people's hands. And at the same time, folks aren't required to return anything."

Everyone involved strongly encourages folks to get involved in any capacity they're able. The seeds are labeled in packets in the drawers and people can take home four at a time by simply filling out the little form. Donations can be given to library staff or Seed Saver volunteers, and all volunteer skills are welcome - carpenters, sewers for cotton-saving bags, packaging, driving, and collecting. Furches adds, "The seeds are free and you can always plant more, so I always encourage people not to be afraid. All you need to do is start by putting some seeds in the ground and giving them some water and sunlight. Sometimes it works and sometimes it doesn't. You just learn along the way. It's really important. that exchange - not only of seeds, but of knowledge."

For more information, you remember the drill: Just ask a librarian. Find this story online for advice on seed saving from Jennymarie Jemison of Joy Max Jardín and for more resources.

"The library is promoting literacy and, historically, that's been books principally. But now it's come to be all kinds of literacy, including health literacy, cultural literacy, and environmental literacy."

Marr is also hopeful about the Wildflower Center's new director of science and conservation, Shawn Griffin. With a background in habitat restoration and pollinators (specifically native bees), he is "finally" able to assess data from their 20-year project. Marr adds, "I think there will be a much-needed emphasis on collecting seeds for the wildflowers and grasses that we know pollinators use." Knowing which areas need which plants (like milkweed on butterfly migration paths) aids in cultivating availability lists, and sharing info with the

Popular seeds to "check out" include the usual suspects like basil, cilantro, tomatoes, and kale. Kate Abel says, "Any kind of wildflower seeds get checked out just as fast as they're added to the collection, and sunflowers, poppies, bluebonnets, blanket flowers, they all fly out of the drawers." She added they have some "weird" seeds, too, like peanuts, which grow really well in Texas. Furches started seed saving with longneck squash from a swap and says, "Sharing that magic and wonder, it's so easy – seeds are so generous."



Erwin Center Replacement, the Moody Center, Opens on **UT Campus**

The 15,000-capacity concert/basketball arena, plus more debuting venue news

Almost 45 years after the opening of the Frank Erwin Center, its replacement is ready across MLK.

Like its predecessor, the Moody Center offers a leading Austin locale for major concerts and events, as well as a home court for Longhorns basketball. Nestled between I-35 and the football stadium in a former UT parking lot, the stadium's flexible setup will allow for over 15,000 seats. (The Erwin lists its largest-ever attendance at 17,829 for a 1978 **John Denver** show.)

FASTER After a private event with Earth, THAN Wind & Fire on Tuesday, the Moody dives into a busy opening SOUND week of John Mayer, Bon Jovi, BY RACHEL and Justin Bieber. Further bookings like The Who, Leon Bridges, RASCOE Iron Maiden, Roxy Music, and professional bull-riding stretch to December. Whereas the Erwin was initially designed to step up UT basketball attendance, the Moody was customized with concerts in front of mind.

Decades show in the design. To contrast with the retiring "Superdrum's" fortified exterior, the Moody's curvy lines let in natural light on both sides with glass encasing it. While architects behind Erwin helped build the **Astrodome**, the new Moody was envisioned by the local branch of the firm Gensler, veterans of the Q2 Stadium and the Domain Northside. During a Monday


media preview. Gensler principal David **Lynch** pointed out curved composite wood panels, which extend from the prominent overhanging roof to indoor hallways.

The project received a \$130 million grant from the Moody Foundation, the same family behind all the other Moody building names in Austin. With construction launched in 2019, the multiuse venue boasted no

cost to taxpayers or students with private funding provided through Oak View

Group, Live Nation/C3 Presents. University of Texas, and Matthew McConaughey. Live Nationowned Austin promoters C3 are also a partner in programming at Waterloo Park's 2021-opened Moody Amphitheater, and continue to expand their reach with a new Riverside project (more on that below).

While Live Nation has an equity stake in the arena, the Moody Center is open to other promoters. C3 founder Charles Attal confirmed as much on Monday. AEG Presents, the concert industry's second-largest promotions entity after Live Nation, is putting on Wednesday's Justin Bieber show. Meanwhile, the Moody Center's official grand opening next week is booked by the Austin-based Messina Touring Group. The two nights, April 29-30, feature George Strait, Willie Nelson & Family, and Randy Rogers Band.



the arena's large sunken floor, which will allow risers to be pulled out for standing student sections during basketball games. With a dug-in bowl shape, audiences actually walk down to the best seats after

entering at street level, shortening the cheap seat's upward hike. Fans upstairs in the mezzanine access a huge outdoor balcony, with a panoramic view encompassing the state Capitol, UT Tower, football stadium, and track field. The balcony and front plaza will host food trucks and other activations during UT football games, as well as an outdoor stage featuring all-local acts.

"Lots of food and beverage, the big ceilings - you want people to feel like they're in a place they can hang out, and not just rush in and rush out," said Attal. "The nosebleed's not even nosebleed anymore."

Around the finished building, surrounding access roads are still under construction. Work blocks Robert Dedman Drive in both directions, as well as the ongoing closure of Red River Street - which was rerouted to allow for the arena. The Moody Center website actually recommends rideshare drop-offs on I-35 southbound frontage road in between MLK & 15th Street, on the east side of the Erwin Center. Attendees can purchase parking ahead of time at a few UT garages - ranging from \$26 to \$62.

The doomed Erwin lot will eventually make way for expansion of the UT Dell Medical **School**, with no destruction date set yet. Having already hosted its last games, the Erwin is still booked for UT's graduation ceremonies in late May.



New Parish Concept Opens in Former North Door

A rebranded, relocated Parish opened last week at 501 Brushy, former home of the **North Door**. The midsized venue represents the cooperative venture of two of Austin's leading independent concert promoters. Heard and Resound Presents. Said new concept drops "the" from the Parish's former Sixth Street identity - just like that scene in The Social Network.

After hosting comedy programming for the Moontower Just for Laughs festival, Parish's first concert landed Saturday with intense Japanese post-rock experimentalists **Mono**. Renovations placed a larger stage. previously in the corner, center on the venue's back west wall. Under a big disco ball. the guartet put the new venue to the test with steep sonic dynamics, a flashing light show, and heavy smoke.

All succeeded in the high-ceilinged former soundstage, with some guests standing against the railings in the renovated, albeit limited-visibility, upstairs balcony. Parish hasn't yet debuted a planned separate-but-connected bar, called My Oh My, in the building's smaller second room. Under Resound's calendar management, upcoming acts include Carl Craig, Lunar Vacation, and Buffalo Hunt.

The old Parish, purchased by **Empire Control Room** operators Heard in 2018. abruptly closed last October after property owner Matt Reppert changed the locks and boarded up windows. According to a lawsuit filed by venue owners seeking more than \$1 million in damages, the landlord "hatched a plot to commandeer the business." According to Parish partners, the new location began to take shape within days of shutting down, and they were able to secure a 10-year lease on Brushy Street.

C3 and a Hotel Vegas Co-Owner Back Riverside Electronic Club

The long-vacant site of former male strip club La Bare will reopen as a new club backed by prominent names in Austin entertainment. As initially reported by Austin Business Journal, the building near the intersection of East Riverside and South Congress – which at one time housed a second iteration of the popular Sixth Street venue Steamboat - has now been leased by NoCo Hospitality, of Downtown bar Higher Ground. The group is run by Charles Ferraro (co-owner of Hotel Vegas, Volstead Lounge, and LoLo) and Paolo Soriano (co-owner of Rainey's Reina). The project at 110 E. Riverside Dr. also finds funding from Elevate Development Partners and C3 Presents, which will exclusively book the club under leadership of **Bobby Clay**. The talent booker told news site **Axios** the new venue will specialize in electronic music.





Spaceflight Records' Nonprofit **Clears for Takeoff**

An ambitious vision for debt-free record deals attracts notable music industry interest BY RACHEL RASCOE

The Spaceflight Records takeover of the annual open-to-the-public Auditorium Shores stage on Thursday, March 17, of South by Southwest, was noteworthy for multiple reasons.

Onstage, the show assembled all-locally sourced heavyweights like ... Trail of Dead, Heartless Bastards, and Golden Dawn Arkestra for skyline-backed sets off Lady Bird Lake. Behind the scenes, the event marked the first time musicians were paid \$200 per individual for each hour

spent performing, by the city of Austin. The new base pay rate, previously set at \$150 since 2016, was passed by the Austin Music Commission the week prior.

Between sets, the record label announced the launch of their own effort at improving financial equity for musicians. Spaceflight is officially a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, a long-sought goal of founder/CEO Brett Orrison. The status allows the label to roll out an experimental concept: Whereas record labels typically must make money off their artists to stay afloat, Spaceflight plans to support artistry without the expectation to recoup.

"I just can't tell you how many artist friends I've had that get super stoked to be signed to a label, and two years later, they're right

where they started," says Orrison, calling from on tour mixing live sound for Jack White. "Nobody, the label or the artist, got paid. Small indie labels are great for the community, but they don't seem to be able to get that artist lifted up financially enough to keep making music, which is the most important thing. There has to be a better way."

While a few other indie outlets have obtained 501(c)(3) status, Orrison wants to be the first that can provide major-label-level support to artists. In five years, he's already assembled a roster of over 30 majority-Austin artists, pinpointing engaging talent across genres on the up-and-up to grow beyond their hometown.

On the Jumbotrons over Auditorium Shores, the label announced fundraising efforts in their intergalactic visual aesthetic.

Going forward, Spaceflight plans to fund releases through fellowships. Envisioned as a record contract without the debt, artists won't owe the label for the investment made in

> their album rollout. Rather, they'll begin collecting a percentage of profits immediately after the release. With details still being worked out, Orrison imagines a customized investment offer anywhere from \$15 to \$50,000. True to Spaceflight's existing practice, fellowship recipients will retain 100% ownership of their music.

> "Unfortunately, to succeed right now in this business, artists have to take on a lot of debt and give up anywhere from 50[%] to 80% of their profits right off the top," says Orrison. "This totally sour deal has become commonplace, and causes so much exclusivity and lack of diversity. We want to see if we can structure it a better way, so artists make money off their first record."

The fellowship will cover a variety of services already in Spaceflight's wheelhouse, including PR, radio promotion, licensing opportunities, and legal services.

Rollout of Spaceflight's first fellowships. planned for later this year, naturally depends on increased fundraising. Alongside public donations, Orrison plans for the nonprofit status to usher in grants and corporate sponsors, including adding and utilizing a team member with grant-writing experience. Corporate sponsors have supported Spaceflight's

growing bookings, including free happy hour sets every Friday at Scholz Garten.

Orrison would also like to eventually pay his all-volunteer team of around five, plus interns. The founder supports himself as a producer and engineer, while Spaceflight Chief Marketing Officer Sam Wainwright Douglas works as a filmmaker and PR Director Samara Simpson teaches live music & talent management at Austin Community College. After being laid off from Old Settler's Music Festival in 2020, Simpson expanded into day-to-day operations at the label, typically helping out with around 10 album releases at a time.

"We're trying to find a way to change the game and do away with record advances," she explains. "That's how record labels make money: They need to recoup. With the fellowship, part of our corporate sponsorship would repay our staff, so we wouldn't need to be recouping at all."

Informational resources also factor heavily into what Spaceflight provides to its roster. A new advisory board includes Widespread Panic's Dave Schools, Black Pumas' Adrian Quesada, Free Lunch organizer and event producer Jazz Mills, former MTV marketing exec Mark Greenberg, C3 Presents talent buyer Quinn Donahue, Austin Music Foundation Director Jennifer Dugas, KUTX's Laurie Gallardo, and entertainment lawyer Brooks Rice. Orrison describes the assembly as "basically people that have promised I can call them at any time."

Other advisors, like Nine Mile Records' Rick Pierik and Light in the Records' Matt Sullivan, draw from label-world experience. The latter, connected with Orrison through shared involvement with the Black Angels - one of the few contemporary acts on Sullivan's tastemaking reissue label, wrote to the Chronicle: "I don't think there's anything like Spaceflight in terms of it being a nonprofit and its dedicated mission to help artists grow their career. The music business is a mess, so what Spaceflight is doing is needed now more than ever. I'm happy to lend a hand in any way I can."

Orrison's decades of music industry relationships have bolstered the label's quick growth since 2017. After producing Kalu & the Electric Joint's debut Time Undone, Orrison started Spaceflight to support the psychedelic soul record. A vear later, after a conversation with city Music & Entertainment Division Manager Erica Shamaly, Orrison closed down Spaceflight's LLC to relaunch as a nonprofit called Spaceflight Mission, initially just state-recognized. Days later, he connected through friends of friends for ongoing distribution through Ingrooves Music Group, owned by Universal.

Since then, the label has also established a deal with Austin-based Frog Music Licensing, placing around a dozen Spaceflight songs on TV shows in the past few months. They've partnered with local Gold Rush Vinyl and White's Third Man Records for vinyl manufacturing. Alongside international distribution, a central goal of Spaceflight's nonprofit effort is to afford vinyl pressing – currently paid for by artists.

All of the above applies to label act Urban Heat, helmed by vocalist Jonathan Horstmann. His band's forthcoming July EP, Wellness, joins Spaceflight's calendar of incoming releases from Big Bill, Primo the Alien, Calliope Musicals, the Tender Things, and latest addition Garrett T. Capps. An angel investor fan has offered to privately fund Urban Heat's vinyl.


Currently, Urban Heat has free access to Spaceflight's lawyer for contract negotiations with a publishing administrator. Further label connections, Horstmann considers C3 booker Donahue an unofficial team member to seek advice from. Alongside consultation from Simpson, he also values the community nurtured by Spaceflight's roster and events.

"Being part of a family of artists locally." especially during the pandemic, has been really great," says Horstmann. "Now it's about seeing how long it takes for them to be able to make enough money to really change the career trajectory of some artists. It's an interesting experiment, and part of being a musician is being a dreamer. Spaceflight has the potential to make us

grow much faster than we would on our own, so it's also like, 'Why the hell not?'"

Spaceflight's admins dream big, too. With no office, the label works on plans for a campus integrating a recording studio, content creation, and film studio - available to their artists at no cost - as well as a music venue and record store. Simpson wants two nights at Auditorium Shores next SXSW and Orrison intends to peach from major labels.

"Our goal is to sign any big artist with a shitty record deal," he says. "Whatever we make from that goes back into subsidizing our artist development, so it's this big reciprocation. We can be a modern-day, new kind of deal. It's not a mom-and-pop nonprofit; it's not Austin-centric. There's no ceiling to it."



RETT SMITH

Americana Drugs

With last year's What the Walls Cannot See, Rett Smith doled out a bruising, brooding template. The album leaned more heavily on the Texas songwriter's lyrics, pushing his intense and dark vocals to the fore as he catastrophized love. New FP Americana Drugs remains on theme but laces in the rocking impulses of Smith's previous outfit, SAENTS, as the lead track "Brighton Bar" scorches electric guitar over the slowly boiling percussion. Smith still thrashes against the melancholy misery as he tortures himself crawling across barroom floors and fantasizing about murderous border town revenge ("Better Run"), but here pummels toward catharsis. Jessica Lea Mayfield, who dueted on Walls centerpiece "The Hook," returns to burn the lonely lingering of "I'll Still Stay," her vocals echoing the avalanche of a broken heart on the chorus. Outlier among the four tracks, closer "Billy Wayne Reed" turns from the solipsistic wallowing and suggests where Smith might be headed next. The song drives with the ominous psychedelic impulse of the Black Angels and cornered breathlessness of its fugitive on the run. Smith is still trying to find the right balance of leaden solemnity and erupting force, but Drugs moves him closer to achieving that alchemy.

LAUGHING BOY

I Am the Man From Space (Persistence of Vision)

So here comes Laughing Boy, that flash ginger formerly of NYC, Austin-based for decades, having leveraged the harsh downtime of Our Pandemic Situation to rap up a solo rodomontade in the form of 10-track album I Am the Man From Space. An audio array as self-released as it is redolent of iconic hip-hop inflections, the Brothers Cup expatriate's latest breaks orbit on rapid-fire multisyllabics, but with rhymes and reasons more attuned to LB's own intellectual and middle-aged milieu. Opener "Fridays of Sorrow" is a syrup-soaked sojourn through everyman's quotidian misery, while "Crocodile Man" starts with pomp and circumstances itself into beat-backed aural collage to limn a legend's life, abetted by vocals from Austin opera sensation Liz Cass. The hard-hitting title track explodes rap cliches sonically and mentally, dissing would-be detractors with lines like, "Remember that I'm coming from the second dimension/ It's flatter than your mater in the Latin declension," before invoking the quantum solace of physics: "You can't track me, you can't know both my hip-hop spot and velocity." By the time you hear Laughing Boy's earnest take on Coleridge's "The Rime of the Ancient Mariner," you'll know you've been more schooled than fooled, mauled by some true jewels, until it's all silence and sic transit gloria mundi. – Memory Harker



Homer Henderson 1952-2022

Homer Henderson - the fiery, hilarious renegade songwriter and one-man band - has passed away, though details of his death are as obscure as the records he put out.

The singer/guitarist/drummer/ harmonica-player (often simultaneously), real name Phil Bennison, co-wrote and performed "Lee Harvey Was a Friend of Mine," an underground 1985 single about a childhood friendship with the alleged JFK assassin that's been so often covered including by Asylum Street Spankers, Laura Cantrell, and Oswald's girlfriend Judyth Vary Baker - it qualifies as a folk song.

"I think we wrote most of it while we were driving around drinking Slurpees and smoking weed," the Continental Club and Antone's regular, raised in North Texas, told the Chronicle in 2013.

Henderson specialized in Norton Records-style raw blues but also treaded in novelty music, like the humorous "Hillbilly Pecker" about being uncircumcised. Sadly, the Austinite's brash demeanor involved - in recent years - using racist language to express rightwing beliefs.

Known for his impressive one-manband skills, which Gary Clark Jr. told the Chronicle inspired him to attempt the style ("[the bass drum] would slide and I'd be chasing it around the stage. So I gave up. I figured I would leave that to him."). Henderson also recorded with Eve & the Exiles, 3 Balls of Fire, and the esteemed, late music journalist and biographer Nick Tosches, including the 1998 gem "The Sweet Thighs of Mother

"We moved [here] March 1. I was supposed to see my buddies Power Trip two weeks later."


Except that being March 2020, the PT show at Mohawk canceled - as did all music that year. Sitting on his back porch in Bastrop, Spirit Adrift pilot Nathan Garrett shook his head sadly six months later, sitting for a Chronicle cover

profile. Equally canceled: Power Trip frontman Riley Gale, who overdosed August 2020. "I was talking to all those guys," added Garrett in an exchange not in the story. "I was like, 'Hey I'm gonna be that asshole that's like, "Put me on the list,"' but we're buddies. We

toured together. I love them. That's one of my favorite bands ever – musically and as people. "Yeah, the Texas bands are ZZ Top, Pantera, Power Trip, That's it."

Spirit Adrift now calls the Lone Star State home. Like Power Trip, Garrett's majestic doom starship transcends genre by fusing classic and contemporary thrust into a modern force of metallurgy. Last year's Forge Your Future EP chugged, marched, and soared on his sizzling six-strings, melodic as Michael Schenker, thrilling as Rossington/Collins, and aggro as Blake

"Texas has such an incredible sonic legacy, and it's important to me that I earn my musical citizenship here," emailed Garrett last week about Spirit Adrift's hometown christening with this show. "So we're gonna bring it." - Raoul Hernandez

Call Londoner Nilüfer Yanya's deep, soulful croon to cracking broken hearted voice "R&B" at your own peril. Pain and needling shine through just a touch on her sophomore LP, Painless.

Australia's prime modern-day punk exports return to the Eastside's prestigious hipster garage room for two nights, in service of last year's Comfort to Me fulllength. The incendiary 13-song, 34-minute release is the byproduct of the young fourpiece's pandemic lockdown in their Melbourne band house. Described by rowdily charismatic singer Amy Taylor as "a Mitsubishi Lancer going slightly over the speed limit in a school zone," Comfort's the most robust recorded representation of the live firepower Austin's lucky to experience intimately.

WET. ZSELA Mohawk. Thursday 28

Mohawk hosts "no genres, just vibes" on Thursday with two genre-bending indie/R&B/pop/mellow-emo acts, Brooklyn-based duo Wet and otherworldly queen Zsela. Now in their 30s, Wet's Kelly Zutrau and Joe Valle have come into all their art-school indie glory with April's EP Letter Blue after Fader named them one of 2015's most promising acts. Zsela is fine arts royalty; her father is Chocolate Genius, her mother is photographer Kate Sterlin, and Tessa Thompson is her half sister. Zsela spent years putting together 2020's ethereal five-track Ache of Victory and lately records fun bops with her father on - Clara Wang Instagram.




