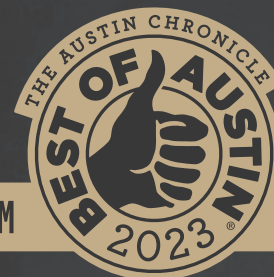

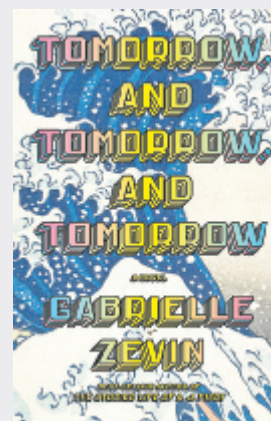

Regular people must move into a friend's tiny guest room, get a second job, skip medications, and eat ramen. Government should stand up for citizens, not bow down to the evil death eaters bulldozing our Shire.

HEADLINES

AND THE BACKSLIDE WILL BRING YOU DOWN This week the **Texas Senate** passed bills to ban gender affirming medical treatments for transgender minors, criminalize drag and other “sexual” performances in the presence of children, and block libraries that host drag from receiving public funding. Yes, it’s that bad.

THE WHOLE THING’S PHONY For the first time in American history, a former president, **Donald Trump**, has been indicted and arraigned on domestic criminal charges. Trump was processed Tuesday in a New York criminal court for the charges, related to paying porn star **Stormy Daniels** hush money and falsifying documents. He continues to spread conspiracy theories about the case.

ALL UR LIFE U NEVER SEEN A CAR DRIVEN BY ITSELF In lighter news, **Waymo**, formerly known as the **Google** self-driving car project, will begin testing its fifth-generation driver across Central and East Austin soon. Eight years after Waymo debuted its Firefly prototype vehicle in the residential Mueller neighborhood, they’re back in Austin with the fully autonomous **Jaguar I-Pace**.

TWEET SOME LIES, TWEET UNSAVORY LITTLE LIES **Austin police** issued a statement saying rumors of a serial killer on the loose after two corpses were found in **Lady Bird Lake** near the **Rainey Street** entertainment district are unfounded — there’s no evidence of foul play. Still, the cases are under active investigation.

GMS, THEY WILL COME AND THEY WILL GO After nearly 40 years working for **Austin Energy**, General Manager **Jackie Sargent** announced her retirement effective immediately last week. Sargent became the first female general manager of Austin Energy in 2016, and she will be replaced in the interim by deputy general manager and Chief Operating Officer **Stuart Reilly**.

JUST AN INVITATION WOULD’VE BEEN JUST FINE The **Office of the City Auditor** released a report last week finding a complicated application process results in life-guard shortages, as many lifeguard applications were wrongly rejected due to system errors.

ROCK ON, POLLEN WOMAN A Texas bill would make it illegal to label honey produced by bees from outside the Lone Star State as “**Texas honey**.” Some beekeepers argue the punishment (up to 180 days in jail) goes too far and details of inspection are unclear.

STOP DRAGGIN’ OUR PROFS AROUND The **Texas Senate** advanced a bill in committee last week that would eliminate tenure for professors at public universities in Texas, KUT reported. Introduced by Sen. **Brandon Creighton**, R-Conroe, Senate Bill 18 would supposedly curtail “rogue” profs who teach topics related to queerness and race. Professors say this would lead to an exodus of academics from Texas, and a “brain drain” of talent.

Now That’s the Tea

TEA is taking over special ed at AISD and parents aren’t happy **BY BRANT BINGAMON**

It’s partly the irony that has disgusted parents and teachers at **Austin ISD**. The **Texas Education Agency**, under federal investigation since 2020 for mishandling special education services in the state, announced on March 31 that it would be installing a group of managers to oversee the provision of these same services in Austin’s public schools.

The move is known in education circles as a “conservatorship.” Conservatorships are frightening for school districts, but this one won’t seize as much control as TEA’s takeover of **Houston ISD** two weeks ago, which involved the dismissal of its elected board of trustees and superintendent. AISD’s board and interim Superintendent **Matias Segura** will remain in their

positions, while TEA’s people join AISD’s in addressing special education. For their part, Segura and the trustees presented a calm front after the announcement, issuing a statement: “We welcome collaboration with TEA.”

That sentiment is not widely shared. On April 3, the board held a meeting to discuss TEA’s plans. They heard several dozen prerecorded comments, many from members of AISD’s employees union, **Education Austin**. The vast majority condemned TEA for stepping in, noting the ongoing federal investigation. They also expressed support for Segura and the board and asked them to appeal the decision.

Tracy Hopkins, a fourth-grade teacher,

said the new board, elected in November, needs time to turn the special education crisis around. “We elected a board that we know will do better than the prior board and administration for students with disabilities,” Hopkins said. “TEA deciding on a conservatorship is a political move, not a sincere one.” Most parents agreed. “I am skeptical of TEA’s motives and I just want to tell you we are with you and support you,” said Alison Dwyer, a mother of four.

Several parents expressed support for the intervention, however, telling stories of their frustrating attempts to secure services for their children. Tara Trower, a mother of two, said school officials were

“Might Have to Kill a Few People”

And other texts that suggest Daniel Perry intended to commit murder **BY BRANT BINGAMON**

The murder trial of Army Sgt. **Daniel Perry** for the killing of Black Lives Matter protester **Garrett Foster** is halfway over. The trial – District Attorney **José Garza**’s most important prosecution to date – began on March 27 and has so far provided little new information about the killing. But prosecutors have developed a fuller picture of Perry’s intention and possible premeditation by showing the depth of the hatred he harbored for BLM demonstrators protesting police violence in the summer of 2020.

Two months into those protests, on Saturday, July 25, 2020, Perry, a sergeant stationed at Fort Hood and working as a rideshare driver in Austin, accelerated his car into a crowd of protesters at the corner of **Fourth Street and Congress Avenue**. Garrett Foster, a 28-year-old Air Force veteran openly carrying an AK-47 across his chest, approached the car. The driver’s side window opened and Perry shot Foster four times in the chest and abdomen. Perry turned himself in to Austin police seconds later, claiming he’d shot in self-defense after Foster raised the barrel of his gun. Austin Police Department officers questioned Perry and let him go. Garza presented the case to a Travis County grand jury shortly after

taking office in 2021. The grand jury indicted Perry for murder and assault.

The testimony confirming Perry’s anger toward protesters came on the third day of the trial as prosecutors displayed text messages and social media comments showing that he thought about killing them. “I might have to kill a few people on my way to work, they are rioting outside my apartment complex,” Perry wrote to a friend in June of 2020. “I might go to Dallas to shoot looters,” he wrote on another occasion. Perry also encouraged violence in a variety of social media posts.

In addition, Perry speculated about how he might get away with such a killing – by claiming self-defense, as he is now doing. Prosecutors presented a Facebook Messenger chat between Perry and a friend, **Michael Holcomb**, which occurred two weeks before he shot Foster. In it, Perry argued that shooting protesters was legal if it was in self-defense. Holcomb, who was called to the stand Wednesday afternoon, seemed to try to talk Perry down. “Aren’t you a CDL holder too?” he asked, referring to the men’s licenses to carry concealed handguns. “We went through the same training ... Shooting after creating an event where you have to shoot, is not a good shoot.”

None of this seeming premeditation was on display after Perry turned himself in to APD officers. In his recorded 911 call, played on the fourth day of the trial, Perry claims that he drove into the protesters by mistake after taking a wrong turn. Body-camera video played the next day shows Perry, after being taken into custody, telling officers Foster had pointed his gun at him. “I didn’t know he was going to aim it at me,” Perry says. “I thought he was going to kill me ... I’ve never been so scared in my life.”

This claim – that Foster raised the barrel of his AK-47 – is, of course, Perry’s principal hope to escape a murder conviction. It was refuted over and over during the first three days of the trial by witnesses who were near Foster that night. All repeated a version of the same story: They heard squealing tires

as a car sped into a group of about 20 protesters. The protesters, some of whom had almost been hit by the car, slapped and kicked it. Garrett Foster strode to the car’s side and issued an order to the driver. All of the witnesses insisted that Foster did not raise the barrel of his gun. According to the D.A.’s lead prosecutor, **Guillermo Gonzalez**, his gun was recovered with the safety still on and no bullet in the chamber.

The courtroom where the trial is unfolding is less than a mile from where Foster died. It has been packed through the first week with family members and the young people who protested alongside Foster and his fiancée, Whitney Mitchell. Foster’s family sits in the front row on the right side of the courtroom. His mother, Sheila, has wept as pictures of her son’s dead body are displayed and attorneys reenact his killing. Perry’s parents, visibly worried, sit behind him in the front row on the left side of the courtroom. He sits beside his attorneys, **Clint Broden** and **Doug O’Connell**, wearing a dark-colored suit, his hair buzzed close, his face dipping down.

On the trial’s sixth day, before resting and allowing the defense to begin presenting witnesses, prosecutors played interviews recorded with Perry after his surrender to officers. In these, Perry cries, talks compulsively, and constantly repeats, “I’m sorry.” He reacts with something like panic when he learns Foster has died, saying, “Oh my god, oh my god, he’s dead, oh my god!” But after being told that he will be released he calms down. By the end of the interviews he’s calm enough to attempt a joke, asking, “Do I get to keep the jumpsuit?” ■

very slow to evaluate her child for autism after they initially diagnosed her with emotional difficulties. “I’ve been engaged in an incredibly frustrating four-year battle to get my youngest child properly evaluated,” she said. “In the spring of 2020 I requested a reevaluation, specifically for autism. Despite being promised a timely evaluation, it was not completed until the fall of 2022.”

All sides agree this is the heart of the problem: The district’s evaluation process for determining which students get services slowed to a crawl during the COVID pandemic. **Pam Kaminsky**, an attorney for the district, described how the evaluation process bogged down. “This was a perfect storm if there ever was one,” Kaminsky said. “There was an increase in the evaluations and referrals for special education well before the COVID lockdown ever happened. ... And then COVID happened and the lockdown ended up impacting the ability to do evaluations.” During this same time,

AI&S lost a flood of special education staff, including many evaluators. Figures presented at the meeting show that only 22 of 75 evaluator positions are currently filled. The shortage of evaluators has led to waits longer than a year for students seeking services.

Segura said that at his appointment in January he understood the special education crisis was the most immediate one facing the district. “It was made clear in every conversation I had with each and every trustee on the dais that special education was the single priority, amongst all others, that had to be put at the top,” he said. He explained the “Priority 1A plan” that he and the trustees have devised to track each of the hundreds of students in the evaluation process, but said stakeholders should expect the plan to take up to two years to work, given the scale of the problem.

Segura and the trustees ended the meeting without saying whether they will appeal TEA’s conservatorship plan. They have until April 17 to do so.

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Missing Half a Mil

Queer Eye-featured clinic investigated for fraud

For months after *Queer Eye*'s Austin season back in 2021, Dr. **Jereka Thomas-Hockaday** and the clinic she co-founded, **Central Texas Allied Health Institute**, enjoyed their moment in the spotlight. A glowing *Elle* profile described the profound work CTAHI was doing in the community, distributing COVID vaccines and tests through contracts with Austin Public Health and the Economic Development Department. *Elle* also noted that APH had terminated their contract with CTAHI, though they provided a statement that "we believe their work is critical to building a diverse, locally sourced health care workforce."

Now, the scope of that work is being called into question after the **Office of the City Auditor** released a report last month finding that between December 2020 and September 2021, CTAHI misrepresented over **\$1.1 million** in financial transactions to APH, overreporting vaccinations and directing employees to falsify invoices and bank statements. CTAHI was paid \$2.8 million in total from the contracts, \$417,000 as a result of these fraudulent claims. After an APH investigation, CTAHI conducted its own investigation internally and agreed to pay APH \$375,000 back in June 2022; as of March 2023, they had only repaid \$12,500. CTAHI's general counsel Mikal Williams told the *Chronicle* \$68,000 in late monthly payments is forthcoming.

CTAHI's response to the audit denies any intentional fraud and attributes discrepancies "100% [to] APH's inadequate and inappropriate guidance" on billing, and to

simple mistakes resulting from circumstances like Thomas-Hockaday filling in for co-founder **Todd Hamilton** while he was on vacation. **Brian Molloy**, investigator for the auditor's office, says, "None of that makes any sense with the evidence we found. I don't know how you can create an invoice, and add details to it to make it look like it was paid, and call that a mistake. Someone at CTAHI is sitting down and editing PDFs."

By comparing CTAHI data to APH and state vaccination records, the audit found that CTAHI overstated vaccination totals by 20%-30%. They reported over 1,000 vaccines on one day, June 5, 2021, though internal records confirm only 59, and a "witness with knowledge of vaccine operations" told the auditor 1,000 in a day was beyond their capacity. CTAHI disputes this, says the auditor's office fixated on one day unfairly, and blames "disgruntled employees who had been fired" for falsifying records. One employee in question was supposedly motivated to retaliate by a mandatory return to office communicated in July 2021; Molloy says CTAHI began submitting falsified documents in 2020, "so blaming it on this individual doesn't add up."

The auditor's office also received allegations that Hamilton embezzled \$30,000 to \$60,000 from CTAHI, though CTAHI refutes this and the auditor could not confirm. In a written statement, CTAHI denies any intentional or unintentional fraudulent activity, and Thomas-Hockaday writes: "This process was not only frustrating but has caused irreparable damage to our name and reputation. ... There is a long-documented

history of the City of Austin having difficulties working with small minority contractors and then blaming the failures in execution on the contractors themselves. ... I was told by numerous peers who had worked with the city before to not take this contract, but I naively thought I could make a difference because of the pandemic."

"No one was targeting CTAHI," Molloy counters. "Everyone was rooting for CTAHI at the city and wanted this to work out. They had a great-sounding mission, they were targeting a part of the community that APH really wanted to reach out to. This fell apart because of CTAHI's actions." He says this is the first case of pandemic fraud that the city has received, though fraud complaints did increase as workers returned to office.

Nationally, the Department of Justice is investigating billions of misused pandemic-related dollars. APH mentioned in their response to the audit that understaffing and the emergency of the pandemic contributed to rushed contract monitors with larger workloads and less oversight, and Molloy says the auditor is developing data analysis tests of APH's other vendors in light of this. The report notes that new processes for contract managers to verify expenses will be implemented August 1 this year.

The Austin Police Department is investigating CTAHI for fraud, and the Law Department "remains in conversation with City departments about appropriate next steps" should CTAHI fail to pay APH back fully. ■

Need an Abortion? We've Got Good News ...

March was a (relatively) good month for Texans trying to access abortion care. First, on March 23, **Whole Woman's Health** announced the opening of its closest clinic to Texas, a full-service facility in Albuquerque that also marked the relaunch of Whole Woman's Health of New Mexico. Then the powerhouse Texas abortion fund **Lilith Fund** resumed the work it originated to do: helping people pay for abortions (now, post-Roe, these are all taking place in states where this care is still legal).

All abortion funds had been on pause for months as Texas Attorney General **Ken Paxton** and other officials threatened the nonprofits with prosecution if they continued to cover abortion-related expenses for care sought in other states. Whether or not Paxton actually has power to enforce any such punishments, Lilith Fund and other abortion funds sued over his statements' chilling effect on constitutional rights to free speech and interstate travel. Federal

Judge **Robert** ruled in the nonprofits' favor in February, granting a preliminary injunction that blocks Paxton and local prosecutors from prosecuting anyone for helping people obtain abortions in other states until the completion of the court case.

Following Pitman's decision, Lilith Fund spent weeks with their attorneys figuring out exactly what that ruling meant for their operations, and then retraining volunteers and generally pivoting their operations. Now they're up and running, offering **\$1,000** to Texans who contact them in need of an abortion and \$500 to Texans seeking non-abortion reproductive health care, including STD testing, contraception, sonograms to determine how far along they are in a pregnancy, and more. They're funding everyone who requests assistance for now, and haven't put a cap on the number of people they can serve.

The effects of bottlenecking in clinics may arise, though. "Clinics in other states are facing huge capacity challenges," interim Executive

Director **Neesha Davé** told the *Chronicle*. "I'm sure if you're a Texan calling one of these clinics you're going to face a huge wait time."

The new WWH location is not overwhelmed at the moment. There, fully bilingual staff provide medication abortion up to 11 weeks of gestational age, and first- and-second trimester in-clinic abortion procedures up to 18 weeks. They plan to expand up to 24 weeks for procedures in the near future.

WWH's CEO and founder **Amy Hagstrom-Miller** told the *Chronicle* in December that she expected a New Mexico-Texas border clinic would serve roughly 4,000 people a year – "not as busy as all four of our Texas clinics were combined, but maybe as busy as one of our clinics in Texas was," she said at the time. Whole Woman's Health VP Andrea Ferrigno told the *Chronicle* Wednesday that they don't have a good idea of what demand will ultimately be for the clinic's services, but that they expect it to ramp up in the coming weeks. For now, the new clinic doesn't have a waitlist, so you can call and get an appointment within a week. As to whether WWH is still planning for a New Mexico clinic right near the border with Texas, Ferrigno said "we are currently focused on our Albuquerque clinic and welcoming everyone who needs abortions." – *Maggie Q. Thompson*



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



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The Root of the Crime Problem

County attorney: Keeping kids out of prison should prevent future violence

Up to now, few young Travis County residents facing criminal charges have gotten a second chance through our local court system: the offer of having their charges dismissed in exchange for going through programming to better themselves and address root causes of crime.

In Texas, where 17-year-olds suspected of crimes are tried as adults, such diversion programs are rare. Travis County's diversion program, **Project Engage**, is only serving about 30 to 35 people between the ages of 17 and 19 at a time. There are more than 700 youth working through the court system who could be eligible for the program, per the Travis County Attorney's Office. So County Attorney **Delia Garza** has made it her mission to dramatically reduce the

number of young people who receive punishment when they need support. A newly launched countywide effort will expand Project Engage's reach and scope.

"We believe the changes being made are a groundbreaking shift in how we can truly address violence prevention," Garza told the *Chronicle*. "We are fortunate to be in a community that believes in second chances, especially when it comes to our youth."

The way it works now, teenagers 17 and older could find themselves in any county court. Based on the discretion of the prosecutor in their case, they could be transferred to County Court No. 6 where Judge **Denise Hernández** oversees Project Engage. Under the new model, every defendant age 17 to 20 will go straight to Court No. 6, where four of the county's most experienced prosecutors will be dedicated to screening and reviewing potential diversion participants, with the help of a newly created and internally funded paralegal position. The only cases ineligible for the program are those involving family violence.

So what will prosecutors be looking for? Serious violent offenses? Low-level drug charges? All of the above. "Really the ideal case is one in which the participant is open to the process of acknowledging wrongdoing," Garza said. "One in which the participant is willing to learn from their experience and actively participate in getting the help that they need."

Staff at nonprofit partner **Life Anew** will guide young people through a process of restorative justice – one in which the defendant and the person whom they harmed both receive counseling and eventually meet so young defendants can make amends (if the victim is willing). This model is all about violence prevention and "an effort to end cycles of violence," Garza said.

Already, youth in the diversion program do community service, receive mentorship and counseling, and get help in résumé-building and job-finding. Under the updated program, they'll also get free assistance from attorneys with **Volunteer Legal Services of Central Texas** to navigate the complicated process of expunging criminal charges from their record. That's important to Garza, because dismissed cases still show up on background checks, hampering young people in their job and housing searches, while expunctions

mean cases are good as gone.

Hernández, the four prosecutors assigned to her court to handle Project Engage, and nonprofit partners, among others, will be taking on the lion's share of the work, but more resources will only increase the program's reach and efficiency. "The most important support to gain is that of the participants – in believing in themselves and that they can turn their lives around, in believing in a system that wants to provide help and support," said Garza. ■

Congress get any rail at all? And what about mixing and matching from multiple elements of the options? In response to the last question, an ATP spokesperson noted the organization's emphasis on community feedback, but did not confirm if mixing and matching is actually on the table.

Without flexibility to mix and match, Austinites are likely not going to immediately get the connectivity they've been hoping for and expecting. That could impact whether the city can meet its 2039 goal of a 50-50 split of people who drive alone versus using an alternative mode of transportation. Annick Beaudet, the city's Project Connect mobility officer, said the city would likely be reviewing progress to that goal next year, as well as creating new forecasts. She added that the additional MetroRapid lines will be key in helping the city reach a 50-50 split.

The city is also developing an implementation plan for equitable transit-oriented development, in part to plan for denser, more affordable housing near transit hubs. Assistant City Manager Robert Goode said that plan is expected in September, allowing time to pivot to focus on certain locations based on which of the five options is selected.

Turn This Train Around

As Project Connect enters its trade-offs era, Austin Transit Partnership needs your input

Greg Cannally wouldn't characterize the revelation of five scaled-back light rail options as under-promising to over-deliver. He would call it "realistically promising."

But it's a stark change in approach for the Austin Transit Partnership, which Cannally has headed since May 2022. In the years since voters approved Project Connect, ATP revealed exciting ideas to Austinites, such as a multistory system below-ground connecting much of Downtown (complete with snazzy renderings) and a tunnel under Lady Bird Lake, as well as the maybe less tantalizing but highly important vision for two new MetroRapid lines by the end of 2023. A little over two years in, that big dream of six underground stations and tunneling below the river are completely out of the budget. And while it's not a budget problem, the MetroRapid lines are now slated for 2025 because of a miscalculation on electric bus charging.

So it's not surprising that the five new design ideas ATP presented on March 21 were disappointing (sometimes to the point of fury) for Austinites who feel that a project aiming to "connect" the city fails at that mission if it might not reach past UT at the top, or hit South Congress and the airport at the bottom.

But if the baby steps approach is disappointing, it might at least beat dreaming of a widely accessible light rail system for 40 years and still not having it. For Cap Metro president and CEO Dottie Watkins, the five options make the public transit expansion more real. "Cap Metro has spent the better part of two decades trying to figure out how to get light rail built in this community," she said. Watkins, who has worked at Cap Metro in some capacity for almost 30 years, said the idea of having a rail system was "already in the consciousness of the voters" when the agency formed in 1985.

Realistic promises seem to be the new goal at ATP. The new options don't reflect the grand vision for an Orange and Blue line that has been consistently splashed across Project Connect marketing, but ATP said it represents a feasible first step. "Around the country, other communities start with a vision, they start implementing, and they get to that vision over time, and I think that's where Austin is right now," Cannally said.

Awais Azhar, chair of ATP's Community Advisory Committee, said he appreciates the presentation of a more realistic project. "We were really pushing [for] honest trade off conversations with community members," he said. "I'm excited to see that I think that is indeed what's happened."

One line or two? Aboveground, underground, or on street? How many riders will it transport? Will it go to the airport? Where will it cross Lady Bird Lake? Will South

The budget is, of course, a primary reason for the pared down first step, and Cannally is adamant that the project will stay on budget. He said ATP expects the federal government to cover 50% – an increase from the expectation two years ago that it would cover 45% – of the \$5 billion (in current-year dollars) that it will cost to build the project. City property tax revenue dedicated to Project Connect following the 2020 vote will cover the rest. Cannally said ATP has funding to pay for both building and operating the light rail system.

Staying at street level is a cost saver, and two of five options keep the train at street level for the entirety of the line, with the exception of crossing Lady Bird Lake. (Side note: An ATP engineer laughed at me when I asked if the maps not marking the river crossings as "elevated" meant that somehow the rail line would be floating on the river.)

However, ATP did insert a new wrinkle in its designs by looking at elevated tracks Downtown. "We did start talking about the need to look at elevated areas that hadn't been looked at, and to look at a simplified tunnel," Cannally said. "If you remember

that the underground got really, really super complex with multiple layers and levels.” He said the complex underground system Downtown was an example of scope creep – when additional elements get added during the design process, increasing costs. And the underground possibility raises accessibility questions. For example, other cities have at times struggled to maintain elevator operations. But Nancy Crowther, a Transit Forward board member, said it’s “just going to depend on the topography and the needs of the area and community,” adding that elevator technology continues to improve.

And of course there’s the Legislature reveling in the opportunity to mess with Austin. State Rep. Ellen Troxclair, R-Lakeway, has taken a not-so-subtle jab at Project Connect’s funding structure, filing a bill that would require the public to vote on local government corporations, like ATP, issuing bonds to fund projects. When asked about the legislation, which was set for discussion in committee as we went to press Wednesday, Cannally said almost 60% of Austinites already voted for Project Connect and that the vote was conducted according to state law. If Troxclair’s legislation were to impact Project Connect, he added, that would go against the will of the voters. “It might mean that Austin and Texas aren’t interested in moving forward on infrastructure projects, and there’s lots of infrastructure projects that need to happen in Austin.”

Should ATP hit any bumps in the road, they have set up a healthy contingency fund. Despite some speculation that leftover cash from that fund could be dipped into to extend lines, an ATP spokesperson told us the 40% contingency is in line with Federal Transit Administration guidance:

“With where we are in design for the alignments, especially with the change in grade Downtown, it is fiscally prudent.”

SPEAK NOW OR ...

So as ATP reels in its Project Connect spending to lay the foundation for future expansion, how do we pick what limited pieces come first? Azhar said ATP needs to “prioritize conversations with folks who are generally left out or historically have been left out of these conversations.” He said those groups include BIPOC, working-class, and LGBTQ communities, as well as people with disabilities.

Alex Karner, a nonvoting member of the CAC and associate professor at UT, said the most important thing is to actually speak with people who rely on Cap Metro. “If ATP hears from a bunch of folks that want airport alternatives, I worry that those voices are going to drown out people who actually rely on public transit today,” he said, pointing out that wealthier people tend to be more vocal and prefer airport routes. Karner added that ATP needs to meet current transit riders in the community at places of worship, community events, and transit stops, to name a few. A Cap Metro spokesperson said in an email that the agency will offer support with outreach at bus and rail stops where needed in the coming weeks.

When asked about their preferred options, or even which factors they view as most important, ATP, Cap Metro, and city officials are united: Right now, it’s up to the public. Through May, ATP will collect community feedback on the design options and use that information to inform its recommendation in June. You can submit feedback at atptx.org/about/light-rail. ■

It Takes a Village

WITH NEW DESIGNS PROPOSED, HERE’S WHAT THE CITY NEEDS TO SORT OUT

ATP will build and Cap Metro eventually will operate the rail lines, rapid buses, and micro-mobility services. However, the city also plays a (slightly less sexy) role in Project Connect. Annick Beaudet, the city’s Project Connect mobility officer, said she coordinates over 40 city departments involved in the project’s execution, with about 25 of those “deeply involved” in the process to create a 30% design – the stage of the process where scope and timeline are generally determined.

Creating a well-oiled permitting system will be key to the project’s success. Three of the options (38th Street to Oltorf and Yellow Jacket, North Lamar to Pleasant Valley, and 29th Street to the airport) include a bullet point stating they would require “significant utility relocations.” Beaudet said that mainly references Austin Water and Austin Energy, but also storm drains overseen by the Watershed Department. “It’s almost like a utility project because we’re going to do water, wastewater, and Austin Energy,” said Assistant City Manager Robert Goode. And utility relocations aren’t necessarily a bad thing, he added. The city intends to take advantage of the economies of scale presented by such a large project to make upgrades to other infrastructure along the corridor, such as drains, water lines, bike lanes, and sidewalks. – Benton Graham

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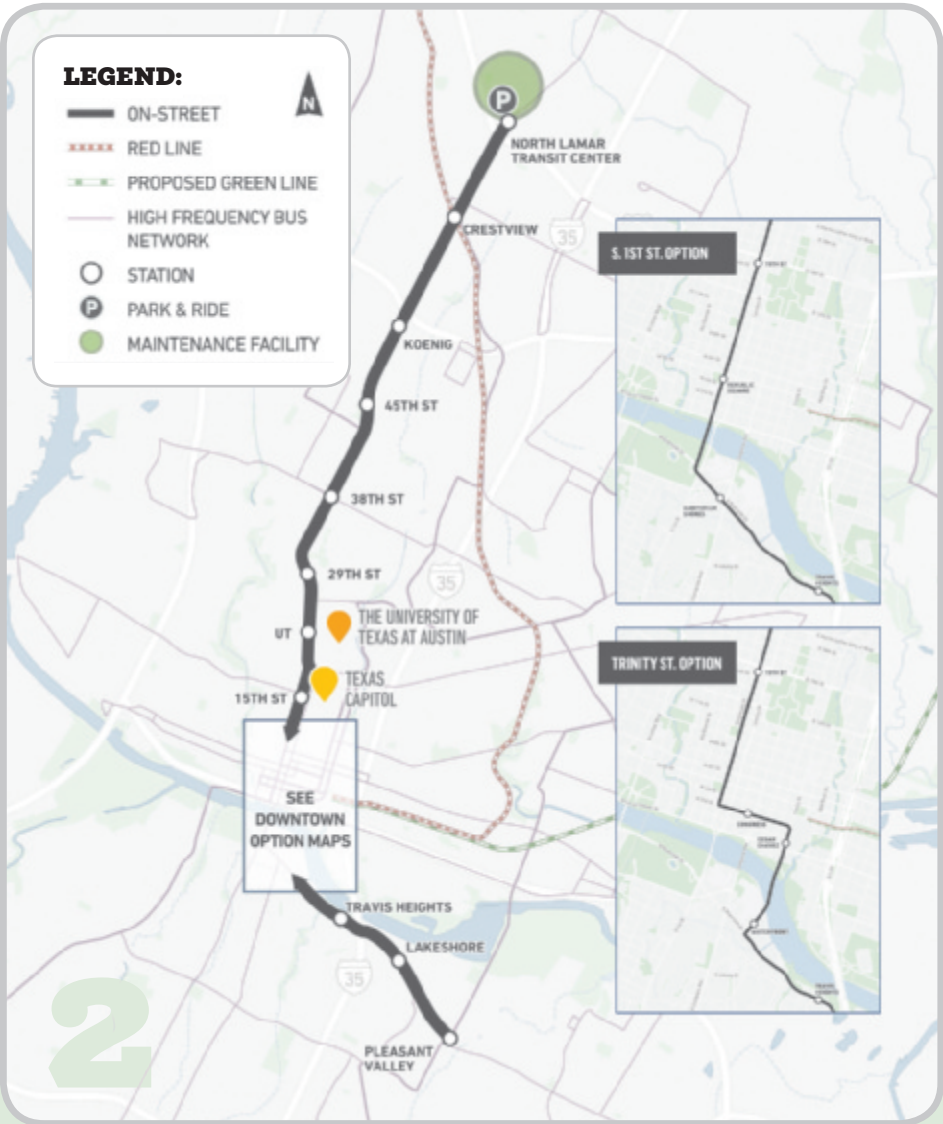
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THE FIVE OPTIONS



Option 2 – The Front-Runner

On-Street: North Lamar to Pleasant Valley

This option stole the show for a number of attendees at the March 21 open house. The line would carry almost 40,000 average daily riders – the most of any option and around the same as the Red Line’s *monthly* ridership. It appeared to score highest in each of the four characteristics evaluated by ATP: mobility & customer experience, access to opportunities, environmental benefits, and land use & housing. It offers two river crossing options – South First or Trinity Street – and would connect to Crestview Station, allowing it to link up with the Red Line. However, that benefit also presents the challenge of needing to create grade separation from the Red Line – the two lines would operate on different rail types (freight and light). Alex Karner, a nonvoting member of the CAC and regional planning professor at UT, conducted his own analysis of the data, finding that Options 1 and 2 would be within a half-mile of more homes and jobs than the other three. He also said Option 2 “completely dominates the other alternatives.”

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Option 1 – The Flex Option

On-Street: 38th to Oltorf to Yellow Jacket

This offers the same river crossing options as Option 2 but would split into two lines after crossing. This option also lists flex segments that could extend to 45th Street at the north end and St. Edwards Drive at the south end. What are flex segments? Depending on where the line crosses the river, these are sections that we might have the budget for but can't guarantee, an ATP spokesperson said. While ATP is not banking on it, coming in under budget is a possibility that could allow for more investment in any of the options, even though this option is the only one with built-in flex segments.

Option 3 – The One With the Airport

On-Street: 29th to Airport

The community will also weigh in on the importance running to the airport. This is the only option that extends that far – largely elevated from Ben White to the airport, but otherwise at street level. This option, which starts at 29th Street, doesn't knock it out of the park on any of the four metrics. As mentioned in our "Public Notice" column two weeks ago, might there be a way to have the airport pay for one of the other lines to extend to the airport? An ATP spokesperson said they are open to other funding sources, but that does not factor into any of the options presented to the public.

Option 4 – The Lifted Model

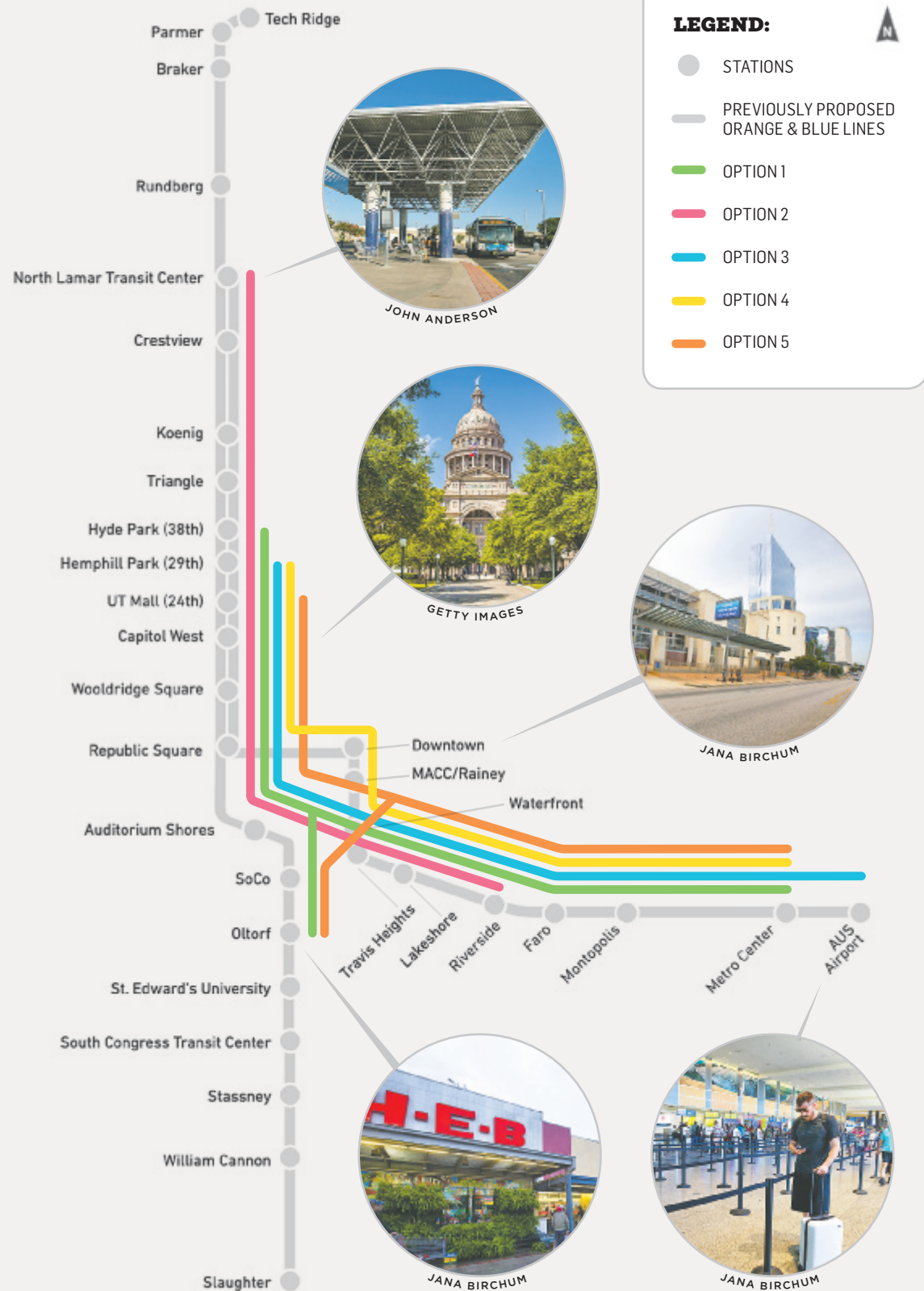
Partial Elevated: 29th to Oltorf and Yellow Jacket

This option runs from 29th Street and would elevate the tracks from around Guadalupe and Eighth Street across the river to east of Auditorium Shores. Then it would split into two lines across the river, with one heading to Oltorf and the other to Yellow Jacket. The elevation would lessen impacts on right-of-way and utilities and create separation from drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians Downtown.

Option 5 – The Roller Coaster

Partial Underground: UT to Yellow Jacket

The shortest of the options employs a mix of underground and aboveground tracks. Like Option 4, it would be aboveground from Guadalupe and roughly Eighth Street across the river to east of Auditorium Shores. However, it would go underground from 20th Street to just south of Eighth Street. According to ATP projections, this option would carry the fewest riders at 20,000 per day – about half of Option 2. It also receives low marks in mobility & customer experience and access to opportunities.

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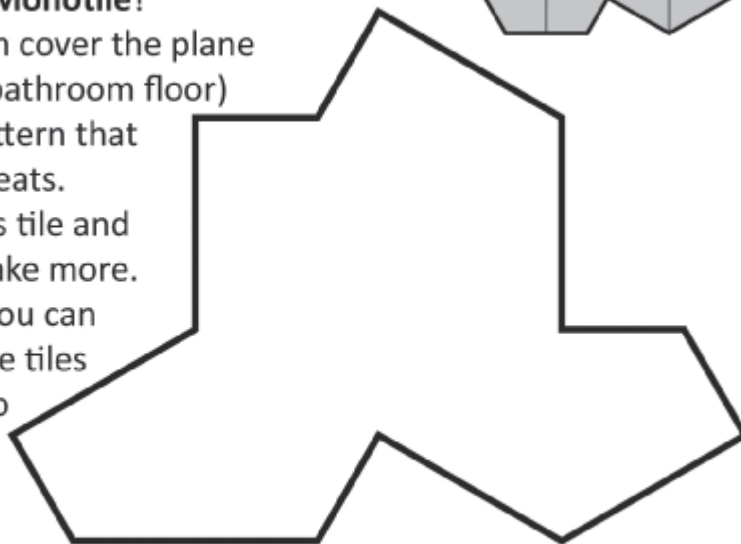

That Carl’s quiet ostentation is summed up in this attention-grabbing do is somehow suitable. For a master of understatement, whose delivery implores the audience to lean in for every word, Wilson has a long history with memorable, scene- and character-defining haircuts. Dignan’s weird, elevated buzzcut in *Bottle Rocket*; Hansel’s flowing locks, cascading down his face, forcing him to peek out with puppy-dog bashfulness; “and in *Loki*, my character has that gray, kind-of-silver kind of crewcut.” The roots of that look go back to another memorable haircut, the straggly silver mane of Father Ra-Shawbard in the “Batsh*t Valley” episodes of *Documentary Now!* In the spoof of *Wild Wild Country*, it’s suggested that the sex cult guru was actually an FBI informant, and so for one insert shot “they put this quick little wig on me, and I was like, ‘God, that’s kind of a good look.’ For *Loki*, originally, they were going to have it like my normal hair has been in a lot of movies, so we ended up trying that and now I couldn’t imagine that character not looking like that. And certainly with Carl Nargle, it was a great feeling to go in and put that wig on and those clothes, because that was his superhero look that he put on.”

This is not performance as cosplay, but rather about how we all put on an outward persona, and how much of our identity is summed up in our hair. Wilson noted how everyone in the JFK era mimicked that neat crew cut as the cool look, and then the Beatles grew their hair out and everyone followed suit. Or think how a bad haircut makes you feel. “That is a painful thing and you really go, ‘I’m not going to go out for a couple months until it grows back the way I want it.’ We’d like to be evolved enough to go, ‘Oh, that doesn’t matter,’ but it’s a big thing to us.”

Owen Wilson and the Joy of *Paint*

The star of the new wry comedy on the inner and outer life of Burlington’s No. 1 art show host **BY RICHARD WHITTAKER**

It starts with the hair.

No, it doesn’t. It starts with the script. In this case, the script for *Paint*, written by Brit McAdams. In 2010 it was named by industry insiders to the Black List of the best unproduced scripts. It was that script, about a Bob Ross-esque artist, that caught Owen Wilson’s attention. “I don’t read many scripts and go,

‘Oh, that’s a really good script,’” Wilson said.

But the hair. The elaborate and carefully tended yet seemingly accidental helmet, a dandelion clock of wispy curls that almost fades into the air; and the accompanying beard, trimmed to a hint of a point. It’s what makes Carl Nargle so instantly recognizable and allows him to dominate a room even

when he’s seemingly so humble. And what’s so bad about that? After all, he is the host of the No. 1 show on PBS in Burlington, Vermont. “Success has engendered a little vanity and ego, and I can’t fault him for that,” Wilson said. “That creeps in with the best of us, and it makes for a more interesting, funny character to play.”

And that exterior presentation seeps back inside. Wilson recalled his boyhood in Dallas, where his father, Robert Wilson, was CEO of KERA, the local PBS station. One night, legendary journalist Tom Wolfe was a dinner guest, and the author of *The Electric Kool-Aid Acid Test* turned up in his signature white suit. “When my dad answered the door, Tom said, ‘I come as advertised.’” With Nargle’s own signature look, even though *Paint* is set in 2019, “you can imagine Carl existing in the Seventies and not having ever changed. I kind of admire that when somebody commits to a look and that becomes their uniform.”

Wilson has had his own uniform in the past. When he and Wes Anderson were in L.A. working on the script for *Bottle Rocket*, “I did start to wear white pants and white shorts, and that ended up being a look that we went for with the character of Dignan. It’s very pristine but you are a little bit self-conscious that you’ve got a look, you’re getting attention with that look.” Nowadays, his look is almost an anti-look, “trying to blend in. ... Everything is gray or blue, navy blue, edging toward charcoal.” He has, he admitted, toyed with the idea of becoming a cool suit guy, “but every time I put on a suit I just get the feeling of, ‘Oh, look at this guy, wearing a suit,’ and it’s hard to break through that.”

But there’s no avoiding the bushy-haired elephant in the room. Carl Nargle is Burlington’s Bob Ross, and the instant you talk about Bob Ross you stir latent warm feelings in the hearts of everyone who ever watched the PBS icon put in a happy little bush, or mix ochre and umber. He sits in a pantheon of public broadcasting legends – alongside Mister Rogers and Nancy Zieman of *Sewing With Nancy* – about whom audiences will always be protective. “He makes you feel a certain way,” Wilson said, “and feel encouraged, and you just recognize that there’s a gentle kindness in the guy.” If *Paint* had just been a spoof of Ross, Wilson said, he wouldn’t have been interested in the script: Moreover, he doesn’t see it as having Carl as an analog for Bob, but rather as having his story be a way to discuss what Bob Ross represents. He said, “It says something nice about our culture that somebody like that can be so popular still. Because you would not pick him. In this day of social media and all these other competing things, that somehow that person has endured, I think that’s kind of interesting.” ■

Seven of the Best With Owen Wilson

FROM SMALL TOWN CROOK TO THE ULTIMATE SPEEDSTER, THE MOST UNMISSABLE ROLES OF THE TEXAS ACTOR’S CAREER

There’s an old saying in cinema: “One of the studio, one for the artist.” This idea that a filmmaker or actor can ever really keep a foot in both worlds without a feeling that they’re slumming it, either when it comes to pay or artistry. But that’s never felt true with Owen Wilson. Emerging through the indie explosion of the 1990s, he’s retained that cachet while topping the box office in mega-franchises, at every turn still seeming like a star with underground instincts.

Dignan in *Bottle Rocket* (1994/1996)

A rare triple launchpad for the careers of three of major talents of indie cinema – Owen Wilson, his brother Luke, and Wes Anderson. In 1994, the trio collaborated on a short about two inept small-town crooks, starring the brothers, directed by Anderson, and written by Owen and Wes. Two years later, with the backing of James Brooks, they turned it into their debut feature, retaining Owen’s laconic and starry-eyed delivery as buzz-cut wannabe heist man Dignan.

Kevin Rawley in *Meet the Parents* (2000)

In Jay Roach’s slapstick romantic comedy of discomfort, it’s clear that future father-in-law Jack Byrnes (Robert De Niro) is the nemesis of Greg Focker (Ben Stiller) in his quest to woo Jack’s daughter, Pam (Teri Polo). But it’s ex-boyfriend Kevin that provides the clear villain of the piece – clear to Greg and Greg alone, that is. As the too perfect, too nice, too handsome Kevin, Owen adds a subtle slice of corn-fed, homely malice to the literal boy next door, his stalkery ambitions to get Pam back all wrapped up in smooth passive-aggression.

Hansel McDonald in *Zoolander* (2001) and *Zoolander 2* (2016)

Stiller created empty-headed supermodel Derek Zoolander in 1996 as a sketch character for the 1996 VH1 Fashion Awards, and the fact that he came back in 1997 and got his own spin-off movie four years later proved the character had catwalk-ready legs. But it’s the addition of Owen as the harebrained hipster-hippie Hansel that made this high fashion spoof acerbic, hilarious, and sweet. If the joke was that Stiller was the antithesis of model good looks, Wilson was more plausible – yet he never once fell into the straight man role, instead matching Stiller for idiocy. It’s their combined self-assured stupidity that makes the Walk Off one of the all-time great comedy set-pieces.

Eli Cash in *The Royal Tenenbaums* (2001)

Three of Owen’s great collaborators come together in the story of the dysfunctional Tenenbaums: Anderson in the director’s chair, with whom Owen co-wrote the script; brother Luke as moody tennis prodigy Richie Tenenbaum; and Stiller as manic math wiz Chas Tenenbaum. Off to one side is Owen as Eli, the starstruck novelist next door desperate to be part of the bourgeois Tenenbaum legacy even as the children do their damndest to escape its toxic, destructive clutches.

Lightning McQueen in the *Cars* Franchise (2006 onward)

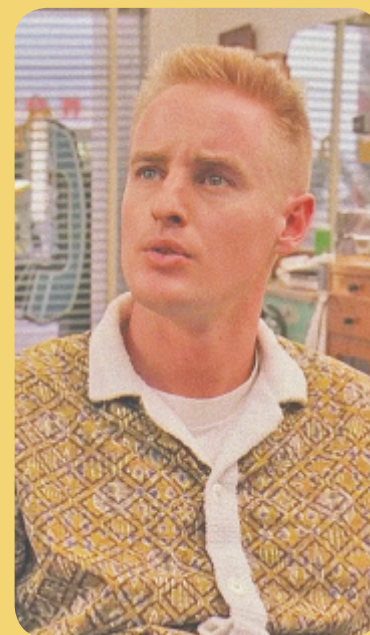
There’s a generation of kids whose favorite anthropomorphized cartoon character isn’t a bear or a lion or a dog, but a bright red NASCAR speedster going by the name of Montgomery “Lightning” McQueen. Wilson already had his voicework wings in the most Texas way possible playing Luanne Platter’s fiancé, Rhett Van Der Graaf, in *King of the Hill*, but over the border in New Mexico he brought humor and heart to the hubristic champion who learns humility and how to be a friend in the little town of Radiator Springs. Animated immortality awaited in films, TV shows, video games, and even one of the best rides in Disneyland.

John Grogan in *Marley & Me* (2008)

“Couple buys a dog, hijinks ensue” scarcely seems like the kind of story to snuggle into the hearts of audiences. Yet Wilson starring in and narrating this sometimes-slapstick film version of John Grogan’s 2005 memoir of dog ownership was so quirky and heartfelt that you really understood that Marley was, indeed, a great dog.

Mobius M. Mobius in the *MCU* (2021 onward)

The Marvel Cinematic Universe is a place of miracles and wonder, seeming to leave little space for ordinary people beyond running away from some cosmic punch-up. No place, that is, unless you’re Mobius, lower-middle management at the Time Variance Authority and wrangler of the trickster god, Loki. Mixing a working man’s blithe and blind commitment to tedium with a quasi-religious belief in the TVA’s mission, all wrapped up in a very Seventies suit, Mobius may be the perfect melding of all prior aspects of Owen – the surrealist, the silly, the observational, and the crowd-pleasing. ■



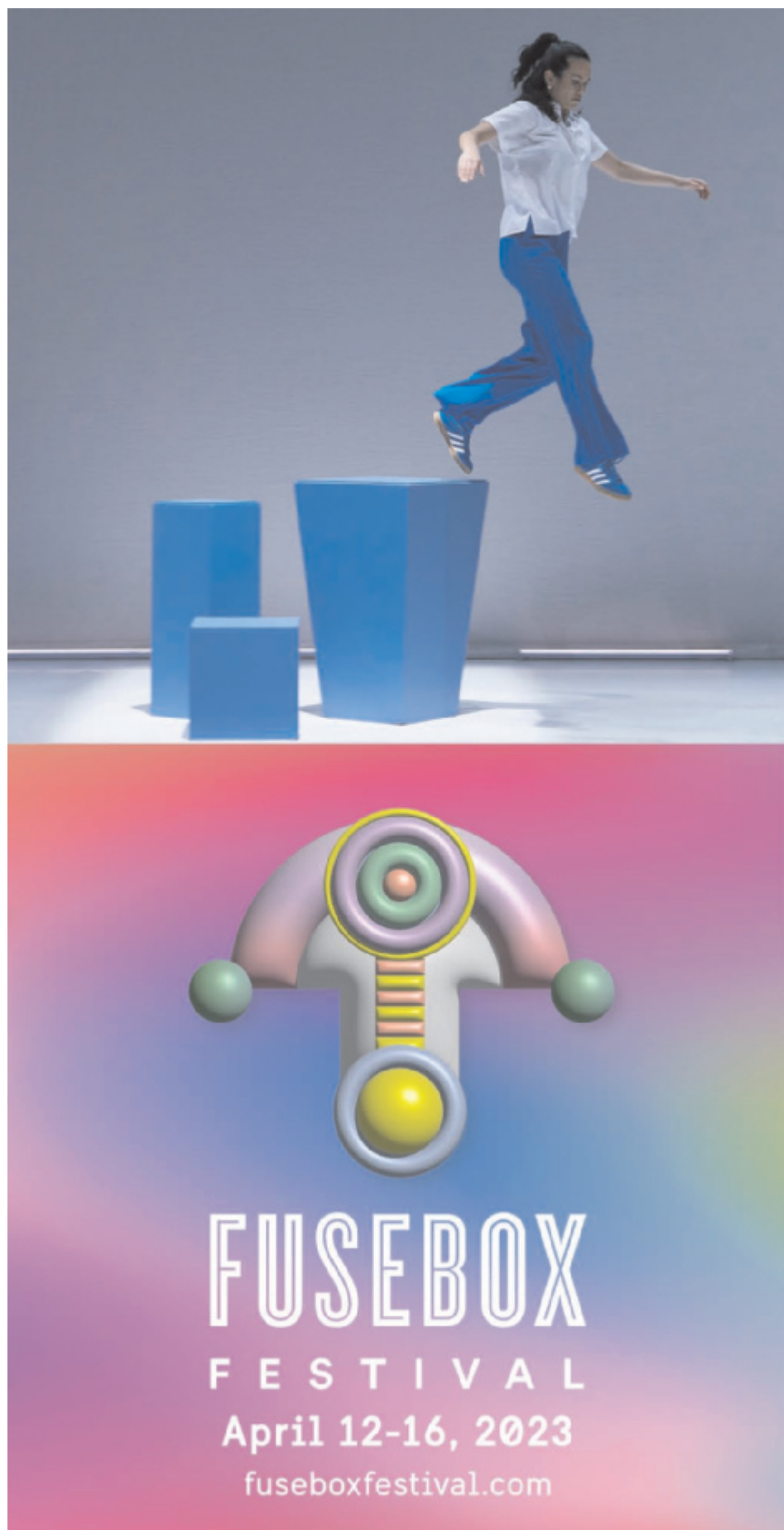

So much to see, so much to do! And as the festival shifts to a (mostly) paid ticketing model this year, we figured it’d be even more helpful to throw some recommendations your way.

RUDE MECHS: CONTRANYSMS (A PERFORMANCE RITUAL)

Yes, those ever-exciting Rude MechS are back (they never really left, y’know?) with a new arch and participation-rich spectacle that’ll bring our current state(s) of political affairs into sharp focus while stretching a grin across even the most typically dour face. Thus: “Remember in the not-too-distant past when American citizens from the far, far left and far, far right who were caught posting violent rhetoric online were sent to Chant Camps? The camps were supposed to retrain people to mean the same thing when they said words like ‘Democracy,’ ‘Love,’ and ‘Justice.’ Rudes revisit this alternative history and recreate the tragic ending that collapsed that timeline with the audience cast as inmates chanting along.”

And now this: “The Surrogate project began with offering myself in a 40 week performance where I’d serve as a gestational surrogate for a parent who would have an app to monitor and control me 24/7. What I eat, what I do, what thoughts I meditate on, and more. The parent would have complete control over the body in which their baby is growing. What began as a speculative proposal became real when a close friend communicated her desire to enact this with me.” And what happened next? McCarthy’s multimedia Fusebox presentation, in partnership with UT’s School of Design & Creative Technologies and the Museum of Human Achievement, will let you know.

More than 100 songs, originally interpreted by artists ranging from Barbra Streisand and Bad Bunny to the Flaming Lips and Juan Gabriel, comprise this *Anthology of the New Depression*. For Fusebox, Wood brings a selection of these reimaged popular and folk classics to the stage in an intimate voice-and-piano performance.

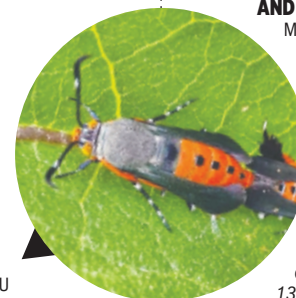

Kelli Nevarez of **LaVaca BBQ** in **Port Lavaca** is a member of a very exclusive club. She is one of only a handful of female pitmasters in the state, and the only one listed solo among **Texas Monthly's** 50 Best BBQ Joints of 2021.

A former first-grade teacher in her early 30s, Kelli loves to talk barbecue. When she's not minding the pits, she is often helping on the serving line or cleaning tables and talking with customers.

She owns the restaurant in a former gas station with her father, **Lupe**, an engineer, and her mother, **Christine**, a retired teacher who works the cash register.

Christine says it was natural for her daughter to take over the pitmaster duties when they opened in 2019. Prior to opening the restaurant, Kelli accompanied her father on the cook-off circuit.

At first, Kelli refused to call herself a pitmaster.

"I always felt it was a title that had to be earned," Kelli says.

Validation came in 2021 when *Texas Monthly* added the little eatery on the coast to its prestigious list.

I visited the restaurant late on a Friday. The **brisket** was lean, yet moist, with a spicy bark. The side dishes were sinus-clearing spicy. "We like to add a modern Hispanic kick to our traditional foods," Kelli says.

A cup of **free vanilla ice cream** pushed the dining experience over the top. Christine used to give a seminar to teachers on customer service that was illustrated with a restaurant that offered free

pickles, and she says, "We already gave away pickles, so I came up with **Blue Bell**."

LaVaca BBQ is at 532 N. Virginia St. in Port Lavaca, and is open Thursday through Saturday. The satellite location in **Victoria**, at 2001 N. Navarro, will become their flagship location in 2024.

“VerDos” Brings the Energy at Fraction of the Price

Austin FC matches at **Q2 Stadium** are many things. Entertaining? Sure. Loud? You bet. Affordable? Eh ... not exactly. For the tens of thousands of El Tree supporters not fortunate enough to call themselves season ticketholders, the get-in price alone generally starts around \$70 per ticket and frequently rises well into triple digits.

For most fans, that math ain't pretty, limiting the amount of Q2 outings to just a handful per season. Fortunately, there's now an outlet for the penny-pinching soccerholics in town to get their fill of Verde and Black for a fraction of the cost – without sacrificing all of the Q2 Stadium energy.

Enter **Austin FC II** – or “VerDos” as some fans have dubbed it – Austin FC's brand-new B squad competing in **MLS NEXT Pro**, Major League Soccer's minor league division. Similar to the NBA's G League and Hockey's AHL, it serves as a developing and proving ground for young players – including draft picks, academy products, and speculative signings – on the radar of MLS clubs but not quite ready for major league action.

VerDos plays its home matches at **Parmer Field**, located beside Austin FC's **St. David's Performance Center** just south of Pflugerville. It's a modest venue by comparison, more reminiscent of a stylish high school ground than Q2 Stadium, but it gets the job done. Directly attached to the grandstand, the **Pitch** dining and activity complex serves as both an extensive concessions zone as well as a spacious lounge area, handy for halftime boondoggles and periodic leg-stretching breaks.

And here's the biggest headline of all: Every ticket is just \$11.50. And parking is free.

At that price, VerDos should have no trouble attracting decent turnouts, especially from within Austin FC's populous supporters' groups. That includes the club's house band, **La Murga**,

striking up the same tunes and chants you'll hear at Q2 Stadium. The 1,200-seat Parmer Field could barely contain the paying attendance for Austin FC II's debut home match on March 24. That atmosphere is unlikely to be topped, but the norm may not settle too far from it.

The biggest reason for that is quality. No, **Sebastián Driussi** won't be turning up to kick it with the B squad anytime soon, but there is still plenty of talent on display. For starters, a healthy chunk of Austin FC first-team players have been “loaned” to ATXII to get some competitive minutes on their belts. That includes center back **Kipp Keller**, first-round SuperDraft pick midfielder **CJ Fodrey**, intriguing forward **Alfonso Ocampo-Chavez**, defender **Charlie Asensio**, and promising goalkeeper **Damian Las**.

In addition, the Baby Oaks boast several graduates of Austin FC's fledgling academy, including one player who could be worth the price of admission all by himself: **Micah Burton**. The precocious, just-turned-17-year-old attacking midfielder officially signed with Austin FC II late last month.

“It's a dream come true to sign my first professional contract, and especially to do so with the Austin FC organization,” said Burton, coming off a dynamite **CONCACAF U-17** Championship tournament in which he scored three goals in seven games for the U.S. “I've grown a lot as a player and a person with the **Austin FC Academy** the last few years, and want to thank my family, teammates, coaches, and all the staff who have helped me along the way.”

However, it's been another midfielder, **Valentin Noël**, grabbing the spotlight. The 23-year-old SuperDraft pick from France already has two goals and an assist on the young season, and will look to build on that total Friday night when Austin FC II takes on the **Tacoma Defiance** in its second-ever home match. ■

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The New Anarchist's Cookbook

How to Blow Up a Pipeline reinvents the eco-drama as a commando raid **BY RICHARD WHITTAKER**

Xochitl believes she can change the world. Theo is dying from a rare cancer linked to the petrochemical industry, and Alisha will follow her through the gates of hell even if she's no fan of self-sacrifice. Shawn is a wide-eyed idealist. Dwayne's been dragged to idealism through eye-opening loss. Logan and Rowan think monkey-wrenching is cool. And Michael is so angry at the world that he doesn't even care how much damage he does, or to whom.

Eight people, drawn together by a firm belief that the oil and gas industry needs to be stopped. Not altered. Not legislated. Not reformed. Stopped, dead in its tracks. And they're brought together in the appropriately titled *How to Blow Up a Pipeline*, a political screed disguised as a *Dirty Dozen*-esque commando raid. Writer/director Daniel Goldhaber adapts Andreas Malm's non-fiction treatise on violent eco-activism, *How to Blow Up a Pipeline: Learning to Live in a World on Fire*, into a fictional narrative about the octet targeting an oil pipeline across a deserted stretch of West Texas. They plan, they learn, they research how to construct and deploy a barrel bomb, and they risk their lives to send a message – that the cost of disruption of the oil supply, whether it be in short-term pollution or prison, is worth it.

Malm's book is predicated on the necessity for direct action, and Goldhaber's adaptation brings together an assorted group of Gen Zers, each with their own motivations revealed through flashbacks and philosophical discussions. Each becomes a personification of desperation, anger, and idealism at different levels, and for different reasons. Theo (Lane, a veteran

of such social realism from *American Honey*) and Alisha (Lawson, *Farewell Amor*) are intended as the emotional heart of the story. Yet Alisha, the sole voice against violent direct action, also becomes the flint against which some interesting sparks are struck, while intrigue revolves around

the exact motivation of seeming hipster tag-alongs Logan (Gage, *The Way Back*) and Rowan (Froseth, *The Assistant*, *Sharp Stick*). However, the greatest tension revolves around two characters: Weary (*It Follows*) as taciturn farmer Dwayne, the redneck strange bedfellow who is quietly livid at the eminent domain ruling in favor of an oil company that took his land from him; and more especially around Goodluck (*The Revenant*, *Blood Quantum*) as Michael. Twitchy, dangerous, self-destructive, there's an inherent burning nihilism to his embracing of the plan, and his willingness to be dubbed a terrorist against imperialism and the fossil fuel industry opens up fascinating avenues.

In a less interesting film, this would all be seen through the eyes of freshly radicalized documentarian Shawn (Scribner, *black-ish*), but Goldhaber amplifies the tension by keeping this an ensemble. There's no single figure with whom to empathize, but rather a concentration on the issues, the justifiable rage about inevitable environmental collapse, and the nerve-racking tension of waiting to see what – or who – will explode.

It's rare that a political or social manifesto is adapted into a narrative film, and when it does happen, as in the case of the risibly mawkish *The Secret: Dare to Dream*, it's usually undertaken by unquestioning acolytes. After all, who else would want to take on a creed other than a true believer? The original book, published in 2021, is a moral justification for the destruction of infrastructure and resources relating to the oil industry, a pointed rebuttal to peaceful protest as not only too little, too late, but discredited as a tactic. Arguably, Malm has already done all the philosophical heavy lifting for Goldhaber and his co-writers, Jordan Sjol and cast member Ariela Barer, who also plays the fiercely idealistic Xochitl.

Moral queasiness comes from Goldhaber's selection of a site for the bombing. The presentation of a "no harm, no foul" victimless target, along with a narratively satisfying opportunity for martyrdom, may feel like a cop-out. That feeling may be amplified by the idea that the bombing is not intended as a major strike in its own right, but a battle cry to encourage similar actions – an accusation that may well end up being leveled at the film itself. Accusation, or source of adulation? That will depend on the viewer's perspective.

I don't care about Michael Jordan. But then, I don't care about David Justice or Buck Weaver, and that doesn't stop *Moneyball* and *Eight Men Out* from being on my list of all-time favorite sports movies. I have a sneaking suspicion that *Air*, the humorously told story of the origin of the Air Jordan sneaker, may end up on that list. Because sports movies that concentrate on the actual playing of the game are pointing the camera the wrong way. The back office is where the real action is.

In this case, it's the Beaverton, Oregon, offices of the Nike corporation in 1984 where schlubby, paunchy sports marketing executive Sonny Vaccaro (a very downbeat Damon) is charged with finding rising college talents headed for the NBA draft that Nike can endorse. Or rather, that will accept Nike's endorsement. Converse runs the game; Adidas is the cool kid on the block, courtesy of Run-DMC; meanwhile, Nike is the other company, discounted in no small measure because they're the weirdos on the West Coast, as hyperaggressive sports agent Dave Falk (a gloriously overblown Messina) belligerently reminds Vaccaro. Which is unfortunate because Vaccaro, a compulsive gambler with a great eye for talent, has decided to bet the house on one of Falk's clients: a talented 21-year-old called Michael Jordan.

And this is where director Ben Affleck (working from a script by Alex Convery) makes a truly fascinating decision. This is the story of the deal, and Jordan himself was not really part of the process. Instead, his interests were represented by his parents, Deloris (played with steely grace by Davis) and James (Tennon), and so the basketball megastar is silent and only seen from behind – and never, ever on the court. He was winning his victories elsewhere, and this is instead about the team that came together to make the Air Jordan not only a hugely successful shoe, but also a landmark in sports licensing.

It's here that *Air* diverges thematically from *Moneyball*, a movie in which brutal decisions are made and accepted in search of a championship. Vaccaro, Director of Marketing Rob Strasser (a suitably fraught Bateman), future Air Jordan brand Vice President Howard White (the returning and severely missed Tucker), and delightfully idiosyncratic shoe designer Peter Moore (Maher) aren't in a battle with James and Deloris but negotiating something bigger and better for everyone. Meanwhile, Deloris wants what's best for her son in an industry that has treated athletes – especially Black athletes – as disposable assets. Floating through and above the dance, then occasionally blundering through the dealmaking and understandings, is Affleck as Nike boss Phil Knight, the test model for the modern wacko CEO.

In her assured film debut as Freddie, Park holds your rapt attention. She is, as they say, a natural. Park is most engrossing in those scenes in which Freddie acts out, her inner emotional turmoil manifesting itself in mesmerizing fashion, as when she's outfitted in black leather and bloodred lipstick while on a Tinder hookup date with a much older man. This casting was a happy accident. French Cambodian director/screenwriter Chou initially met with Park before filming began to pick her brain about her experiences as a native Korean transplanted to Paris with her family at an early age and determined afterward – to Park's surprise – she was the one to play his lost protagonist, despite a lack of acting experience or training. It was a gamble, but one that paid off nicely.

THE SUPER MARIO BROS. MOVIE

D: Aaron Horvath, Michael Jelenic; with the voices of Chris Pratt, Anya Taylor-Joy, Charlie Day, Jack Black, Keegan-Michael Key, Seth Rogen, Fred Armisen. (PG, 92 min.)

An everyman hero, voiced by the universally liked Chris Pratt, goes on a quest, discovering along the way hidden depths within himself and surprising the audience with how soulful and inventive animated entertainment based on a kids game can be.

There are a lot of reasons to be nostalgic for 2014, and one of them was how *The LEGO® Movie* defied its seemingly cynical origins (there's a registered trademark in its title, ffs) to prove a four-quadrant blockbuster could also be funny and startlingly weird and sincerely heartfelt. Despite sharing more than superficial similarities, *The Super Mario Bros. Movie* ticks exactly zero of those boxes.

Audiences will probably still show up, lured by a well-loved intellectual property (the Nintendo franchise that first saw life in 1983 as an arcade game) and thirsty for a family film (the last major studio theatrical picture was December's zippy *Puss in Boots: The Last Wish*). With Hollywood in high panic over declining box office, every film released in theatres becomes a kind of referendum on the moviegoing experience. *The Super Mario Bros. Movie*, alas, feels like a straight-to-DVD release – dull and derivative.

Pratt and Day voice titular brothers Mario and Luigi, two Brooklyn plumbers who accidentally get sucked into another realm and are separated. Luigi lands in Dark Land (full of jump scares and skeletal Koopas that might be too spooky for younger viewers), while Mario touches down in Mushroom Kingdom. In the quest to save his brother, Mario connects with Princess Peach (Taylor-Joy), Toad (Key), and Donkey Kong (Rogen, one of the few semi-reliable sources of humor) to defeat the nefarious Bowser, voiced by Jack Black as a Meat Loaf-like crooner with designs on Peach.

Working from a script by Matthew Fogel (*The LEGO Movie 2: The Second Part*, *Minions: The Rise of Gru*), *Teen Titans Go!* creators Aaron Horvath and Michael Jelenic faithfully re-create characters, worlds, and gameplay from the first NES title and its many spinoffs. But to what end? Whatever invention there is here, it's baked into the DNA. And whatever fan-service thrills we might get from seeing those familiar pneumatic pipes and Bullet Bills retrofitted for the big screen fall away fast when there's nothing else to prop the thing up: not a compelling story or especially interesting voice performances or a single original idea. And when there's nothing to emotionally invest in, then all that's left is the nagging feeling you'd rather just be playing the damn game. Because, really, there's only one scenario in which it's pleasurable to passively watch someone else navigate the Rainbow Road, and that's in a dorm room after generous bong rips.

This isn't the first attempt to draw blood from stone when it comes to this particular Nintendo property. A nightmare-inducing live-action attempt starring Bob Hoskins and John Leguizamo famously flopped 30 years ago. But in going to such great lengths to avoid that film's grim weirdness, *The Super Mario Bros. Movie* filmmakers have flattened the concept into benign nothingness. They've course-corrected into the side of a mountain. There's no heartbeat here.

Restaurant Review: Golden Hour

The menu is extremely delicious, but bread will cost you extra **BY A. RICHMOND**

What a time to live in Southwest Austin, where Menchaca Road flows like a river, which until now has lacked something like Golden Hour: a cafe/wine bar as upscale or as low-key as you want to make it. With anchors like Cherry Creek Catfish Co. and a burgeoning entertainment district south of Slaughter, a friendly, quiet spot with a serious coffee program, an all-natural wine selection, and a gorgeous patio area is head-twistingly unexpected.

There are no entrées, just small plates, for breakfast, lunch, and a light dinner, on the menu at Golden Hour, along with an all-natural wine program. “I was going with a Marfa or Santa Fe vibe, or Paris or L.A., if that makes sense, to remove the fluff,” chef/owner Barclay Stratton said. A former line cook at Lenoir, Stratton cites LoLo, Austin’s first natural wine bar, as an inspiration.

Proud of his sourcing, Stratton gets many ingredients from gourmet food importer Regalis Foods, including the 5 kilogram tower of Rodolphe Le Meunier butter tempering behind the counter. Breads and other baked goods come from Sour Duck, excepting the olive oil cake, which is made in-house.

Breakfast any day of the week at Golden Hour can easily feel like brunch, because the daily toast is sumptuous and indulgent. The space is modern, elegant, but could use some more sound absorbency. My toast of the day was sourdough topped with a large dollop of labne, covered with smoked salmon, sliced shallots, and capers and drizzled with olive oil. Reader, it was sublime: rich, satisfying, delicious, kept me going strong all morning. My inner cheapskate squealed at forking out more than \$20 for breakfast with tip, but I loved my espresso, and sitting on the elegant natural leather chairs at the counter was a luxurious experience.

That said, dinner gave me some sticker shock, specifically at the chalkboard’s casual declaration that a plate of roasted red peppers and local chèvre is \$14. I ordered the high-priced peppers, plus a cheese plate and a glass of ¿Y tú de quién eres? white wine suggested by the counter staffer. My husband opted for the green salad with seaweed, mushrooms, and toasted breadcrumbs recommended by the staffer, who claimed it as her favorite thing on the menu.

The cheese plate skews sweet, and Stratton says that it will always have strawberry preserves and honey. How are we meant to eat the \$14 roasted peppers, which arrived on their own, without any accompaniments? I used a knife and fork, but some bread or crostini would be better for sopping up and enjoying the parsley-flecked oil. Please be advised, diners are meant to order bread if they want it. It’s on the

menu. And the cheese plate, while fabulous, only comes with two small slices of bread. This, I feel, is not enough bread (not now, not ever). But the green salad – a large bowl filled with hand-torn butter lettuce and avocado, studded with white beech mushrooms (sourced from Regalis Foods) and topped with toasted breadcrumbs – was a revelation. It felt like a steal, and my husband admitted days later he was still thinking about “those crunchy bits.” But chatting during dinner was challenging; the ambient volume was between 60 and 90 decibels while we were there.

The wines we tasted were delicious and paired very well with the food, and the food was excellent, if nervy. We decided to share a bottle of Soto Vino Space Cowboy, a fresh, young-tasting effervescent natural red wine. Natural wines are made from grapes and a natural starter (like a sourdough starter), and contain no additives, unlike conventional wines. In some varieties of natural wines,

expect thicker legs, and maybe a brighter orange hue than you’ve seen before.

When questioned about the price point, Stratton said, “People don’t get upset paying a 300% markup on a bottle of wine. A \$20 bottle here could be \$80 at another restaurant. We may undercharge for food. I think we price appropriately. Your ticket is reasonable. That middle-range restaurant is missing from Austin.”

Three caveats for Golden Hour: They don’t take reservations. Menchaca is a Texas Department of Transportation road and has strict signage laws, so use GPS to guide you as there’s not much to keep your eyes peeled for when the speed limit is 45 mph. Finally, when experiencing sticker shock, think about how you want to feel after you eat, and embrace the small-plate concept. You may be surprised at how good it feels. ■

Caroline Rose Practices *The Art of Forgetting*

Austin pop auteur explores fluctuating relationship to the past on fifth LP **BY GABRIELLE SANCHEZ**

When it came to crafting their new record, pop songster Caroline Rose had one crucial rule: no suits. In tune with many other artists, the freefall of the pandemic allowed Rose to take on a freeform, deadline-detached recording process. The artist compressed their sharply self-produced solo experimentation in their Austin home studio, devoid of pressure from financial interests.

"I threw all that out the window on this album, and it's a better album because of it," says Rose, calling from a coffee shop in Vermont, where they spent time with friends ahead of the album release. "Now I'm never gonna involve any suit ever again in the album-making process."

Their previous record, *Superstar*, was released just days before the pandemic shut down live music across the country. The singer/guitarist and their band had just kicked off a tour, and after heading back home to Austin, the business of being Caroline Rose took the back seat. In the midst of global turmoil and a stalled album promotion, Rose endured a harrowing breakup.

The singer-songwriter began to write, but not with song material in mind. A new record was not the goal, but to simply tap in and process the swirl of macro and micro issues at hand. The result, *The Art of Forgetting*, is by far their most confessional and emotionally enrapturing work to date.

The self-awarely manufactured, glossy pop image Rose is known for falls to

pieces on their fifth studio album, continuing work with New West Records. Clarifying past indie rock distortion and often slowing to mid-tempo, the LP prioritizes emotional rawness and a sense of fragmentation. It's a new manner of writing for Rose, who acknowledges the vulnerability involved in airing out one's troubles for a wider audience.

"When you're writing something for yourself, it's really cathartic and it's great to get it off your chest," Rose says. "But when it goes public and everyone has access to it, it's absolutely terrifying. I flip-flop between being really proud of myself and feeling like I'm being really courageous, and then other times I'm like, 'I'm psychotic and masochistic, and this was insane and I deeply regret it.'"

"At this particular moment in time, I'm proud of it."

In line with this greater sense of creative freedom,

Rose finally pieced together a long-dreamed short film for the album. The three-parter, divided into videos for "Miami," "Tell Me What You Want," and a to-be-announced third track, charts the singer's own varying experiences in recurring locations. Directed by Rose's close friend Samuel Aaron Bennett – at South Congress' Austin Motel and Sagebrush, as well as ATX Film Studios – the short ebbs and flows as Rose wanders through scenes pulled from their own time spent at the local haunts.

Rose says the Technicolor Austin Motel has been the stage for pivotal life events.

"I just end up there a lot," the artist says. "Even before I moved to Austin, fate just brought me there."

Differing looks at memory in the short film tie into *The Art of Forgetting's* reflection on a fluctuating relationship to the past. During the writing process, Rose spoke often with their grandmother, whose voicemails are heard many times throughout the album. Rose witnessed their loved one lose memories and grapple with a lifetime fading away.

All the while, they cast many painful memories away out of self-preservation. These different insights (inspired by reading Bessel van der Kolk's *The Body Keeps the Score*) informed not only the record but Rose's own way of processing grief. The LP title, pulled from a line in "Miami," began to transform from something rooted in frustration and dejection into an empowering position for healing.

"The art of forgetting is a healthy letting go: learning how to let go of things that are damaging to you in order to move on and create new memories," Rose says.

When piecing together the record from their home studio, Rose prioritized acoustic instruments and tape recordings

to foster a sense of decay. Tying in with the theme of fading memory, Rose toyed with granular synthesis – taking singular sonic stamps and chopping them to bits, or smearing the sound. Altering the acoustic instrumentation digitally allowed them to achieve a sense of dissociation.

As opposed to the hyperstylized pop of *Superstar*, *The Art of Forgetting* chases emotional catharsis, reflection, and intimacy. Catchy hooks make way for slow, dramatic builds, and trademark humor dissolves as melancholy fills the spaces of the meditative record. When seeking a moment to pause, Rose spends time in the yard of their South Austin home.

"I have such a great little spot. I rent this place that has the most beautiful live oak tree in the yard," Rose says. "Laying under that live oak in the hammock is my favorite thing in the world. The trees in Austin are so special."

All of the heartache, pining, and grief at the top of *The Art of Forgetting* eventually allow for newfound hope and resilience. The heartrending years culminate in the final line of the listful, open-ended "Where Do I Go From Here?": "Now go out and start living the rest of your life." ■

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What Texas Artists Had to Say on the CMT Music Awards Red Carpet

Jackie Venson, Midland, and more talk country music's Austin migration **BY MAGGIE Q. THOMPSON**

About a centennial after it was called country & western, and post-2010s bro country, the industry arrived in Austin Sunday night, seeming ready to lean back into the “western” palette of the genre. On the occasion of the CMT Music Awards touching down at the local Moody Center after decades in Nashville, the *Chronicle* caught up with Texans on the red (OK, aqua) carpet. Across the board, they felt that the CMT's relocation to Austin plays into a greater shift in what listeners want out of their country music. Here's what the Lone Star talent had to say.

JACKIE VENSON

“It's funny because Austin has always been really irreverent to this kind of behavior,” Austin singer-songwriter and guitar wiz Jackie Venson said, standing among spray-tanned and hairdoed reporters, publicists, and musicians. “Austin's always made fun of it. ... We don't care about your Grammy, we have the Austin Music Awards. We don't care about your Carnegie Hall, we have Paramount Theatre. ... So, it's funny. But also it's cool because it's a big platform and you can't deny that.”

Later that night, Venson got a taste of that big platform firsthand, playing “You Oughta Know” onstage with Alanis Morissette and a group of women country singers. The Austinite said she was shocked by the opportunity. Does Venson believe the country music industry is shopping Austin as a spot for expansion? “It totally is.

“We have a very adverse to mainstream being-told-what-to-do culture here,” she added skeptically. “We're hippies. We park on the grass. We don't like HOAs and we're mad at the police. We legalized weed. So you cannot be bringing any of that weird stuff that sometimes comes with country music culture – you can't be bringing that shit up in here. We aren't gonna tolerate it for even a second.”

But she's hopeful Nashville and Austin can help each other. “The mainstream industry sometimes paints itself into a corner with all these rules like, you have to be young, pretty, thin, all that weird stuff. Maybe that can be healed by our energy of, like, ‘Nope, my armpits are hairy and I swim in the creek and I bring my dog everywhere.’ But we kinda need them, too, to get out of our bubble. It is a bigger world than Austin, Texas.”

MIDLAND

The men of Midland, Dripping Springs-based country supernova behind new classic “Drinkin’ Problem,” took shots of their own brand of tequila on the aqua carpet before heading out on tour for six months (with an April 15 date in Georgetown, FYI). On CMT's local move, lead singer Mark Wystrach told the *Chronicle*: “I don't know that they're trying to shop [Austin] or what they're doing, but I think they're recognizing that Austin is a legitimate capital of live music.” Bassist Cameron Duddy chimed in, “Pop music isn't only in New York or L.A. Country music isn't only in Nashville.”

JENNA PAULETTE

Rising-star singer-songwriter Jenna Paulette said she wants to “keep one foot on the ranch and one foot in the country music industry.” After eight years in Nashville, Paulette said she'd finally built the connections and career needed to tour nationally, while now being based in her home state of Texas. She pointed to Cody Johnson and the Paramount series *Yellowstone* as drivers of an industry movement toward Texas. “There's an interesting thing happening right now in country music. There's a throwback thing happening. People are okay with tradition and there's also this interest in Western and the cowboy. That's always been my favorite but it's also always been who I am.”

DRAKE MILLIGAN

North Texas-raised Drake Milligan found his way to Nashville as a high school senior cast as Elvis Presley in the CMT series *Sun Records*. He's been in Tennessee for the past five years now and clearly riffs off Nineties honky-tonk hits on his 2022 album *Dallas/Fort Worth*, particularly George Strait. Handily, it's co-produced by Strait's longtime producer, Tony Brown. “I grew up on my dad's records,” he said. “We all grew up loving Brooks & Dunn and George Strait and Alan Jackson, all that great music in the Nineties. All of a sudden what's old is new again. People love stories and great records. They love steel guitar and fiddle. It's an exciting time to be a part of country music.”

AMANDA KATE FERRIS

Another Nineties-embracing DFW darling, Amanda Kate Ferris is making big moves in 2023. Her March EP *Pedal Steel* breaks out the gate with a song penned by the Love Junkies – the powerhouse trio of Nashville songwriters (Hillary Lindsey, Liz Rose, and Lori McKenna) behind countless country chart-toppers that have a habit of not fizzling out. “The fact that [the industry] is embracing more of that traditional sound is huge. That's what I grew up listening to,” said Ferris. “The fact that they're having [the CMTs] in Austin says something too, that the industry is leaning in that direction. It's taken some time. We've got our boy Cody Johnson who is really leading that. He's done some incredible things for the industry. I'm excited that people want to hear it.”

MATTHEW LOGAN VASQUEZ

As All Get Out (Nine Mile)

Considering the press bio here, Delta Spirit's blood-covered 2022 LP *One Is One* sobered Matthew Logan Vasquez. San Diego-born roots emoters, their Texan Hill Country father-of-two spearheaded a sleek, buzzing, fervid sixth full-length. *As All Get Out* now follows suit. As many solo releases logged, the Dripping Springs twister unleashes equal

urgency and vibrancy on his own, but with a fair bit more classic rock. "Over It," on which MLV outs himself ("To the bully in the band: over it, over it"), confesses an uptempo, Strokesian banger. Likewise, "Can You Turn Me Up" cranks a road burner: driving, rushing, racing. Big riffs, big tempo, big solos, and screams roll down every window. Even so, midpoint between Laurel Canyon call to arms *Does What He Wants* (2017) and Neil Young-meets-Michael Lee Aday solo spotlight *Solicitor Returns* (2016), these eight firecrackers pivot on pop pensiveness. "Untouchable" circles back to 2018's *Texas Murder Ballads* with a twinkling, grooving, breakdancing shuffler. "Odysseus" sails sonic seas, ebbing beats, and flowing siren song. Crystalline closer "Recognize" strums gentle and restless, primetime Chapin, Lennon, Nilsson. Said aforementioned contextualizer states, "Present day, [MLV's] writing and recording for himself," so maybe Delta Spirit's not looking for studio time presently. No problem. *As All Get Out* gets there and fast.

ATLAS MAIOR

Hadal

Some musicians find an extant niche and set up camp within its borders. Others, however, set out for the hinterlands and build a castle. The turrets of Austin's Josh Peters and Joshua Thomson, aka Atlas Maior, still stand on their latest EP, *Hadal*. Thomson (saxophone) and Peters (oud) write music amalgamating American, Arabic, Moroccan, African, and Brazilian sources, assisted by bassist Tarik Hassan and versatile drummers Stefan Del Bosque and Aaron Parks. Bending these elements to their own purposes, the Maiorians set "Basalt" to synthesize Ornette Coleman, samba, and the Arab Peninsula. "Fata Morgana," meanwhile, evokes free jazz, swing, and Ghanaian highlife through lugubrious sax, caffeinated oud, and dual drum kits. Signposted by similar melodies and solo sections for alto sax and oud, "Ignis Fatuus" and "Hadal" form a two-part opus of Middle Eastern folk and spiritual jazz. Worldbeat jazz strains through personal vision to erect *Hadal* high on its own hill.

REDBUD

Long Night (Good Eye)

Redbud's introduction came during COVID with "To the Moon" (2020), a delay-washed fever dream glitched with arpeggiated keys and distortion, and "Opal" (2021), a somber acoustic introspection. While the quartet's debut EP features the same narcotic warmth of the aforementioned singles, *Long Night* traverses psychedelic fixtures without indulging in the genre's worst crutches of aimless meandering and overt obfuscation. Reverb swirls, fluid flanged guitars, and ethereal harmonies fuel "Island" as propulsive breakbeats roll in like crashing waves. On "Franny," singer Katie Claghorn's voice morphs into a playful cadence. It soars, dips, and carves while sonorous saxophone solos and jazz fugues drip and bleed into each other. Prior — cued in with a skittered crash of hi-hat and Technicolor-blossomed chords, respectively — "Kin" and "Sad on the North Side" suspend melodic lines in air like ghostly echoes. Often rushing into sweeping miniatures, Redbud's first collection finds clarity through the haze.

The motorcycles-and-music fest marks the return of the Resound team — who held Fun Fun Fun Fest as past iteration Transmission Events — to the shores of Lady Bird Lake. Friday packs artful Cincinnati violinist/singer-songwriter Sudan Archives with Magna Carda, Geto Gala, and DJ Lady Wonder. Saturday offers emotive Nashville indie rock figure Soccer Mommy — alongside Good Looks, Redbud, Animals on TV, Mom Rock, and more. Sunday matches Mexican Summer-signed psych rockers Allah-Las with Amplified Heat, Money Chicha, Nolan Potter's Nightmare Band, and Superfónicos.

TWO STEP INN

San Gabriel Park, April 15-16

Official resale available

Two Step Inn, a new two-day gathering by ACL-makers C3 Presents, tries out San Gabriel Park in Georgetown, Texas, some 30 minutes from Central Austin. Anchored by new-school country headliners Zach Bryan and Tyler Childers, both in huge font, the assorted lineup includes legacy staples like Tanya Tucker, Wynonna Judd, and Mavis Staples. Further, the press release also promises "country inspired sets from Diplo, T-Pain and more." The effort follows C3's September launch of FORMAT Festival in Arkansas. Though tickets sold out quickly (and started around \$99), the fest offers official resale with day passes starting around \$170.

OLD SETTLER'S MUSIC FESTIVAL

Tilmon, Texas, April 20-23

\$75 day, \$125-250 multiday

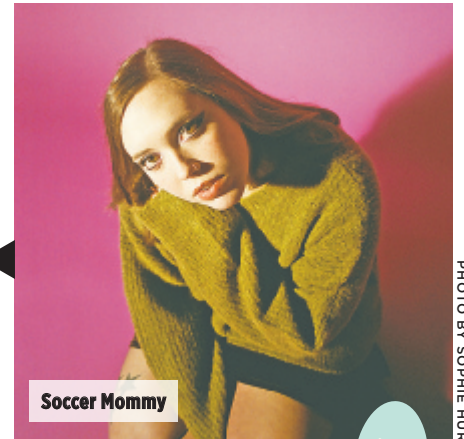
As a registered nonprofit, Old Settler's Music Festival commits itself to carrying the legacy of American roots music to a new audience. Today, more than 25 years in, the festival's Americana emphasis stretches from folk to jazz to gospel. Each night after musical performances, three campgrounds stretched over 29 acres host late-night jams. Alongside local food and clothing vendors, the four days pack British singer-songwriter Yola, Grammy-nominated for her country soul, and New York trio the Wood Brothers. Eclectic sounds from Molly Tuttle & Golden Highway, Shinyribs, Buffalo Nichols, Sunny War, Ley Line, and more will sound through the open land.

AUSTIN REGGAE FESTIVAL

Auditorium Shores, April 21-23

\$15 day, \$50 weekend

Since 1994, Austin Reggae Festival has hosted some of the genre's biggest names, alumni including Mykal Rose and Julian Marley. The locally owned music event annually benefits the Central Texas Food Bank. This year, the Skatalites, Jesse Royal, and Inner Circle will headline and bring storied iterations of their Jamaican sounds to Austin. Further, Hawaii-based Makua Rothman provides West Coast surf while Virginia reggae icon Mighty Joshua stages his mind-and-body-focused sounds. In addition to the international flood, local acts like Micah Shalom and Lion Heights remind of Austin's very own ska and dancehall artistry.

MOCO MUSIC & ARTS FESTIVAL

Lexington, Texas, April 28-29

Located on a 300-acre private ranch, MOCO Music & Arts' third iteration carefully curates 16 acts. Whether it be the catchy alternative-pop of Chicago's Paul Cherry or mellow beats from Philadelphia's ANTI-signed Son Little, the festival highlights young, new talent. Die Spitz's punchy hard rock and Superfónicos's Colombian fusion lead a strong standing of Austinites on the largely local lineup. Beyond food trucks, the DJ-hosting "Vibe Barn," and musical wine pairings by Wine Rack Soundtrack, attendees can involve themselves with live art and yoga during their two days outside, around 50 miles east of the capital.

AUSTIN PSYCH FEST

Far Out Lounge, April 28-30

Austin Psych Fest turns back the clock, reviving its classic name and format as an all-in-one-place festival headlined by Toro y Moi, Cuco, Black Rebel Motorcycle Club, Yves Tumor, and the Black Angels. The lineup — a typically international, multigenerational, and expansive palette of psychedelic music — also brings in two guitar heroes from Africa: the trance-inducing Saharan rocker Mdou Moctar and Vieux Farka Touré from Mali. Guitar-burning Japanese psychedelic space rockers Acid Mothers Temple return as longtime APF/Levitaton favorites, a distinction shared by the Danny Lee Rajan-helmed project Night Beats. French indie artiste Melody's Echo Chamber meanwhile makes her Texas debut.

RANCHO ALEGRE CONJUNTO MUSIC FESTIVAL

The nonprofit preservers of conjunto culture nearly canceled this year's fest due to city funding cuts, but turned it around to announce what Executive Director Baldomero "Frank" Cuella calls "a great mix of locals, legends, and longtime favorites from all over the state, all thanks to the creativity of booking coordinator Monica Castilleja." Friday at Central Machine Works pairs Austin's CruzSante and Los Texas Wranglers, while Saturday at Giddy Ups brings a release party for Los Cucuys de Rodney Rodriguez, headlined by Mark Weber y los Cuernos. Sunday wraps at Stubb's with Los Arcos Hermanos Peña, a family band from Dimmitt, Texas, and many more Lone Star sounds.

"BULLIES WITH BENEFITS"

Dear Luv Doc,

It really wouldn't change my life one way or the other. So, do you think I need to grow up or is my friend out of line?

One of the best ways to let go of the past is to leave it entirely. That works pretty well for most people. Even in medium-sized small towns there is often an existing social hierarchy that is nearly impossible to overcome. It's awfully hard to unseat the Monty Burnses of the world when they own half of Springfield and then, unlike Montgomery Burns, have the gall to procreate and pass it on to their often insufferable children. There is an undeniable feudalist vein that runs through small-town America that keeps our cities well-stocked with ambitious, hardworking, previously disenfranchised provincials whose forefathers probably fought and died so their children wouldn't have to take shit from some poncy, soft-handed, bipolar hemophiliac with a god complex. I know that may have sounded like a thinly veiled reference to Donald Trump, but I was actually referring to King George III – and others of his ilk.

You were smart to get out while the getting was good. Your banged-up biker bully probably recognized your potential early on and, as bullies are wont to do, tried to tamp it down before you got a true sense of your self-worth. You were probably just innocently showing early signs of a potentially deep and impressive intelligence. I know there's a tinge of Stockholm syndrome to it, but rest assured that somewhere down the line your friend had to make peace with this dude – if only to maintain his peace and sanity. In his mind, you got lucky, and I bet he can't understand why you don't understand that.

That said, your instinct to simply move on with your life is a healthy one, but sometimes it helps to find a way to move on mentally as well. Usually that's done with compassion and empathy, which aren't always the easiest feelings to summon. The good news is you clearly won this war even if you lost a lot of early battles. Don't let this busted up biker bully you out of an old friendship as well. Call your friend and explain how you feel.

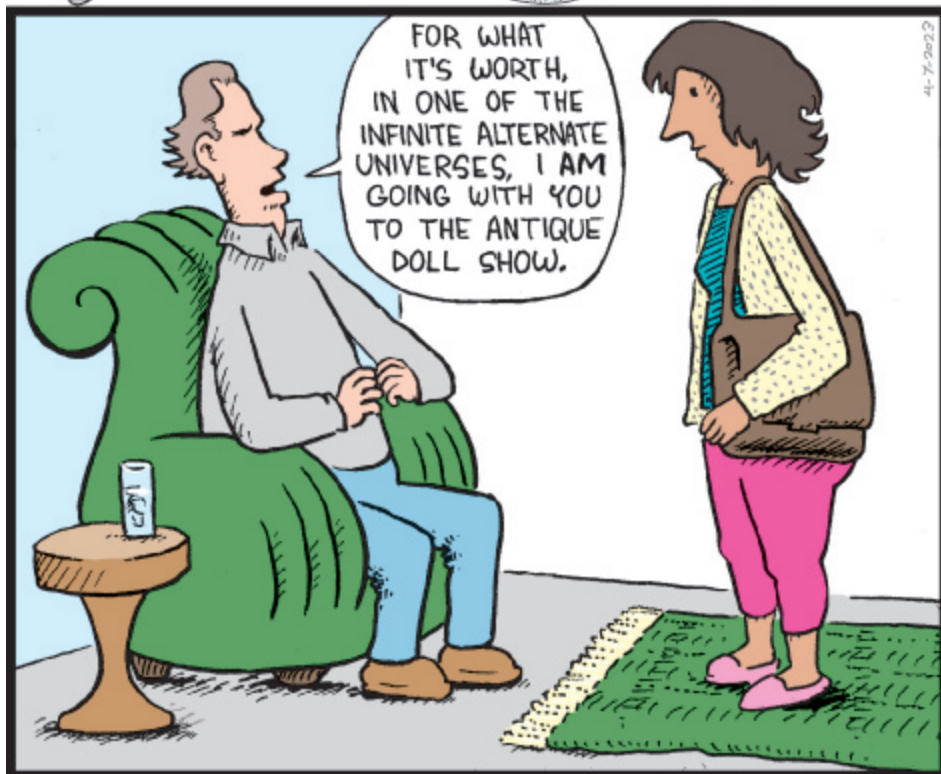

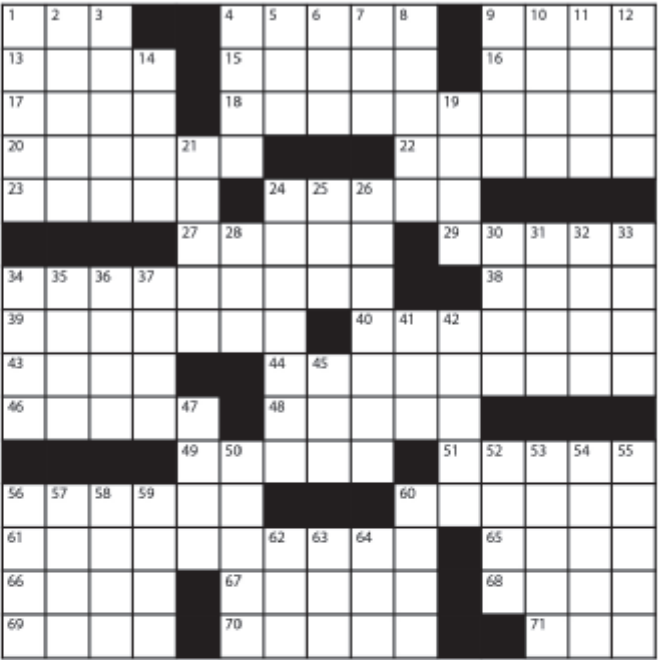

Overnight RV Camping at Zilker Park?

In recent months I've seen people camped out overnight in cars, recreational vehicles, and RV-style campers in the Zilker Park area close to the MoPac overpass. Is that allowed?

No. Vehicles are typically not allowed to park (or camp) overnight in a public recreation area. Zilker Park is considered a public recreation area.

Parking at Zilker between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. is expressly prohibited by signage as well as city ordinance No. 20170615-023. However, if a person or their vehicle is at Zilker between the hours of 10pm and 5am because they are participating in a sanctioned, permitted activity, then they are allowed to park at Zilker consistent with the permitted activity. The Trail

of Lights or Austin City Limits Music Festival are examples of permitted activities that may extend legal parking hours. If a vehicle is parked in Zilker between 10pm and 5am and there is no special event, then that vehicle is in violation of the city ordinance and is subject to ticketing and/or fines.

City ordinance No. 20170615-023 also makes it illegal to "camp" in Zilker between 10pm and 5am without a permit. It does not matter whether the camper intended to break the law; a ticket can be issued simply because the person was in fact camping at Zilker overnight. In other words, one cannot claim that they did not see the posted signs in order to avoid a ticket for RV-style camping. The city states that it has taken recent actions to make sure parking signs are visible in Zilker and officers have been notifying vehicle owners that camping is not permitted in Zilker.

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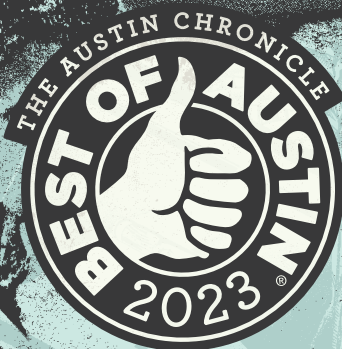
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
