

Medicare for All Is the Timely Solution for Texas Health Care

Nearly 1 in 10 Texans may lose their health insurance over the coming months. Women and children will be hit hardest.

It's clear, we need Texas to expand Medicaid now. In addition, we need to restructure our national health insurance system.

Doctors know firsthand the benefits of consistent health insurance. Dr. Lauren Thaxton, an OB-GYN in Austin, says, "Stable insurance coverage throughout a person's life can increase health and wellness and allow issues to be addressed before they become critical."

Texas already ranks last in the nation in health care affordability. The U.S. overall has the highest rate of women dying in childbirth among developed nations. So, as state officials decide whether 2.7 million Texans can keep their Medicaid over the coming months, these statistics may get worse. It is time for Texans to demand a solution.

At the start of the pandemic, the national government - under both Presidents Trump and Biden saw the value of health insurance. They required states to SINGH AND ROHIT keep people enrolled in Medicaid until the end of the pandemic. This meant millions of Texans who otherwise may have lost their insurance stayed insured.

Continued coverage had the biggest effect on Texas women. Before the pandemic, almost 90% of pregnant Texans with public insurance lost coverage in the year after birth. For the past three years, though, all these women stayed covered. They were able to keep seeing their doctors and manage their health after having a baby. Pregnancy takes a toll. Stable insurance meant that Texas women were able to manage complications and recover from their pregnancy.

Texas is now reevaluating all Medicaid recipients because the federal rule keeping people on Medicaid expired at the end of March. As the rule goes, the dependable insurance that Texans have come to know may go with it. As health care providers, we worry about what this means for our patients.

There is one solution we could start with: expanding Medicaid. The state can change its requirements, bring more people onto Medicaid, and get more federal funding in the process. This would stop the bleeding short-term and keep the gains we made in the past three years. But, this would not solve the root problem.

If the cost of the U.S. health system were its own country, it would be the third-most expensive country in the whole world, just behind the United States and China. Yet, we have the highest rates of infant, mother, and avoidable death in the developed world. Why? According to experts, the reason is simple: prices. In the U.S. we simply, and unfortunately, just pay more - without any added benefit.

More insurers leads to more spending. At the University of Toronto hospital in Canada, there are 1,272 patients beds and seven billing clerks total. At the Duke

Medical Center in the U.S., there are 957 patient beds and a whopping 1.600 billing clerks. Nearly double the number of patients. These examples span the country.

A national single-payer system would keep everyone insured, reduce costs, and leave money for patient care.

Naysayers commonly cite cost as a reason not to change our system. But as it stands now, we are paying more to achieve less. The U.S. Congressional Budget Office confirmed single-payer would give everyone insurance, eliminate co-pays and deductibles, and save \$450 billion annually. Our current spending helps neither patients nor doctors. It helps insurance companies. Insurance CEOs have tripled their personal profits in the past decade.

The time to act is now. In Texas, and in the short-term, we must contact our state representatives to support House Bill 204 and Senate Bill 71. We must expand Medicaid. But, if we're to be serious about improving the worst health system in the developed world in the long run, we must enact Medicare for All. The livelihood of women and children, and wallets of U.S. taxpayers, depend on it.

HEADLINES

RAINEY ARE YOU OKAY? After two fatal drownings in Lady Bird Lake this year. Austin police added lighting in the Rainey Street District and fencing along the Ann and Roy Butler Hike-and-Bike Trail. This week. Council will consider a resolution to create a comprehensive safety plan for the district, co-sponsored by Council Member Zo Qadri, whose district includes the area.

REMEMBER THE TIME West Downtown could soon be designated as Austin's latest National Register District. which would mean most exterior modifications and new construction would need to be approved by the Historic Landmark Commission. Proponents will make their case before the State Board of Review on May 13.

HEAL THE CITY Ascension Seton announced Monday that the **Dell Seton Medical Center** at UT-Austin will receive a \$280 million expansion. In its first major addition since opening in 2017, the new space will include 150 more hospital beds, four new floors, and 160,000 more square feet.

WANNA BE STARTIN' SOME HARM REDUCTION in a bipartisan vote, the **Texas House** passed a bill that would decriminalize fentanyl test strips in the state. It still needs approval from the Senate, and Gov. Greg **Abbott**, who signaled support for its passage last year.

P.P.G. (PRETTY PREDICTABLE, GREG) Speaking of **Abbott**, one of his top priorities this legislative session, \$10,000 handouts for parents moving kids from public to private schools, hit a major roadblock last week. The House approved an amendment to the biennial budget bill that would ban state funding toward "school vouchers or similar programs."

TEA IS NOT MY SAVIOR The state's conservatorship over Austin ISD's special education department is off to a messy start. Parents of kids with disabilities are stuck in a back-and-forth limbo between the **Texas** Education Agency and the district, the Austin Monitor reported.

MONARCH IN THE MIRROR KUT reports that far fewer monarch butterflies will pass through Texas on their annual migration route this year. The World Wildlife Fund, which tracks these migrations, said part of the reason is that many monarchs didn't spend their winters in Mexico, due to shrinking forests.

WILL YOU BE THERE Residents of the northern part of Hays County are facing long wait times for emergency medical services to arrive due to underfunding, according to KUT. Hays County's population has grown significantly in recent years. To combat the slow response times, North Hays EMS District Administrator Doug Fowler said voting for a proposition on the May 6 ballot to raise property tax revenue is the first step.

Drowning in Paperwork

City's lifequard hiring program may be leaking applicants

It's that time of year when the city Parks and Recreation Department is traditionally filling the mailboxes and airwaves with pleas for lifeguard candidates, sounding increasingly desperate as the opening day for city pools draws nearer. That's no **PUBLIC** different this year - PARD's Aquatics Division is offering a NOTICE pay boost to \$20 per hour, with flexible schedules and schol-

BY NICK arships available for training BARBARO sessions - but what's new to the discussion is some added scrutiny on the hiring process itself, in the form of a Special Report from the Office of the City Auditor, delivered in March in response to a request from last year by

former City Council Member Kathie Tovo and current CM Leslie Pool.

CMs Chito Vela and José Velásquez requested a briefing last week on the audit and the hiring process. PARD has

> not yet scheduled that, but meanwhile, there are a few interesting talking points in the report, starting with the top-line numbers: With PARD needing 860 total lifeguards to fully staff all pools, they were at just 75% of that at the end of the summer 2022 season. (And the numbers had

been worse at the beginning of the season; on June 10, PARD posted that they had "444 lifeguards ready to work" and fewer than half of the city's pools were

open.) The report doesn't really address recruiting itself - how could we get more applicants? - and I expect that's something Council members are going to want to look at; they already decreed that pay raise to the city minimum wage of \$20 and may want to ask what other outreach efforts are going on. But the auditors focused solely on the people who did apply.

Overall, given the number of ongoing and returning employees, PARD needed to hire 636 lifeguards for the 2022 summer season and had 1,100 qualified applicants, who passed the first screening through the city job portal (eCareer) and were manually entered into a system known as TOPS, newly created by PARD Human Resources



to manage the hiring of temporary employees. The auditors found another 52 applications that never made it into the TOPS system, and no one seemed to know quite why; also, there was a known scheduling glitch that caused the city job portal to send out rejection notices to 95% of the applicants. In the end, only 422 people completed all steps in the hiring process and were officially hired, and of those, only 376 worked at least one hour during the summer. And of the 680 or so who didn't get hired, most were eliminated because they failed to finish the required paperwork, or to pass a criminal background check, or to complete the lifeguard certification course. The auditors make no effort to delve into that or opine on whether that's a normal dropout rate, but that too is something CMs may inquire about during their briefing.

Meanwhile, if you or someone you know wants to apply, that part's pretty easy: Just go to lifeguardaustin.com.

Humanizing Machines

Exploring the ethics around Al's breakneck advance

At times **UT-Austin**'s **Good Systems** Symposium felt a bit like listening to a Drake album, with conversations heavily focused on trust issues, broken promises, and community engagement (maybe not so Drake on that last one). Artificial intelligence experts took turns calling out the human side of a technology that, on its surface, appears to be very much not human. The emphasis on the natural world extended all the way to the decor - a string-of-pearls plant centered and two Swiss cheese plants framed the panelists.

As its technology hurtles toward uncharted territory, AI is in a precarious place and increasingly moving beyond labs and research centers into the public eye. Autonomous vehicles abound in Austin (hello again, Waymo) and ChatGPT is barreling ahead with designs on revolutionizing the search engine experience and beyond. Meanwhile, more than 20,000 people have signed an open letter to Al labs that poses the guestion, "Should we risk loss of control of our civilization?" and calls for "a pause on giant Al experiments." The signatories include prominent tech figures such as Elon Musk and Steve Wozniak, but also many academics, including several from UT-Austin.

Chad Jenkins, a robotics professor at the University of Michigan, pointed out that while technology is moving at a fast pace in the present moment, some of the models

being used aren't particularly new. "The first neural network was McCulloch and Pitts in 1944. Rosenblatt at Cornell developed the first object recognition system using neural networks in 1958," he said. "This has taken decades to get to this point." Jenkins, who delivered the conference's keynote address. agrees with how the letter emphasizes the benefits and risks of the technology. However, he opted not to sign it. "I believe that if somebody really wants to develop Al technology, a moratorium is not going to stop them," he said. Instead, he sees education as the key to building positive AI tools.

Jenkins, who said that computing and Al literacy should extend to K-12 education, would have likely been delighted to hear the response of the event's youngest attendee - a boy about 15 years younger than anyone else in the lecture hall. He told the Chronicle that the most interesting thing he learned was the difference between "symbiotic robots that work with humans and autonomous robots." If the rest of Generation Alpha is already considering the implications of how humans and robots interact (and can casually use "symbiotic" in a sentence), we might be in good hands.

Indeed, that human-robot relationship is an area that UT Good Systems researchers are exploring. Ken Fleischmann, a professor in UT's School of Information, described a project focused on designing tools that

will make work safer for deaf welders. The researchers built a hand tool decked out with sensors and Internet of Things technology (humans and robots tested the tool) and also created a basic augmented reality training program for welders.

The impact of AI and robotics on labor is another area of focus for Jenkins. "I worry that if we only think about AI and robotics to do things more efficiently ... that will lead to replacement of jobs, and that will lead to people not having opportunity," he said. "But if we're thinking more broadly, and we're investing in areas such as education, infrastructure, health care, these longer-term investments that will have a really positive impact, then there becomes opportunity to reinstate people into the economy to address really critical needs."


Health care is the under-the-radar field that Jenkins and others see as one of the most potentially beneficial applications of Al. particularly as the U.S. population ages. However, given health care's history of racial discrimination, it raises the issue of whether or not humans can feed unbiased data into Al systems. Jenkins said diverse representation will be important in the advancement of the technology.

Meme Styles, a data activist, founded Measure to provide data support to Blackand brown-led organizations. During a panel on using AI to advance racial justice, she said that "racist algorithms" harmed her 21-yearold son and exacerbated his schizophrenia. She added that she hopes a less-biased algorithm can be developed, but that it's important to consider the questions posed to find the data that eventually informs AI technology. "What is the historical and cultural context of the problem that you're seeking to solve with your design and your solution? What communities have provided their input?"

UT's Good Systems program seeks to address some of those sorts of questions in part by making the Austin community more central in the process. Marc Coudert, the city of Austin's Climate Resilience and Adaptation Program manager, said six years ago the Rockefeller Foundation organized a workshop bringing together city and county leaders to discuss climate impacts, which led to collaboration with community groups such as Go Austin/Vamos Austin. When he began speaking with community members he realized that many had taken their own initiative to start addressing challenges brought on by climate change and that there is a long history of "well-founded mistrust" of the city. "If we're taking data, how does it connect to people's lives?" he asked. "When we're talking about people's lives, how do we get them the data so they can tell us how to make a decision?" Because, in the end, it will be up to humans to ensure that AI is a tool for good.

Amarillo Judge's Ruling Could Lead to Nationwide Ban on Abortion Pills

U.S. District Court Judge Matthew Kacsmaryk last week struck another blow against reproductive freedom in the United States, ruling that the Food and Drug Administration's approval of the abortion-inducing drug mifepristone was unlawful. More than half of abortions in the U.S. are done with pills, and nearly two-thirds of Americans believe medication abortion should remain legal.

On the same day as Kacsmaryk handed down his ruling, a federal judge in Washington State ruled that the FDA must keep the drug available in Washington, D.C., and 17 blue states that sued over the issue - raising the odds that the future of mifepristone will, sooner rather than later, be decided by a conservative-dominated U.S. Supreme Court facing questions about its legitimacy.

While a ban on mifepristone would have an outsized effect on states where medication abortion is legal and abortion is more broadly protected by law, it would also vastly restrict the thousands of Texans seeking legal abortion care in those states. Of course, mifepristone can still be ordered from international pharmacies, and Texans cannot currently be punished in civil or criminal court for seeking out their own abortion (helping another person attain an abortion is what's banned).

"Less than a year after Dobbs, where we saw our freedom tossed back to the states, we are now seeing the first strike at a national ban on abortion." Morgan Hopkins, president of the abortion justice organization All* Above All, said at a press conference on Monday, "Attempting to ban mifepristone nationally is one step toward the anti-abortion movement's goal of banning all abortion in every state."


Kacsmaryk, an appointee of former President **Donald Trump** and longtime member of the


Federalist Society, did not get the mifepristone case by accident. Abortion opponents brought the case in Amarillo, in a state where medical abortion is already outlawed, specifically so Kacsmaryk could rule on it. His ideological background was not lost on abortion rights leaders who spoke at the Monday press conference. Mini Timmaraju, president of NARAL Pro-Choice America, noted that the judge's rejection of the word "fetus" in his opinion is connected to a broader attempt to define fetuses as people and limit reproductive freedom. "He's signaling efforts to go after birth control, [in vitro fertilization], other procedures that we know these organizations have been after for decades." Timmaraju said. "This is where we can see this rhetoric around so-called personhood creeping into the opinion."

The case could also have significant impacts on the drug approval process outside the realm of reproductive rights. "Under Judge Kacsmaryk's ruling here, virtually anybody who opposes an FDAapproved drug could drag the agency into court [and] could challenge their decision," said Nancy Northup, president of the Center for Reproductive Rights. "The decision would also be destabilizing for the research and development of new drugs.' Northup said the ruling, if upheld, could imperil the FDA's accelerated approval process for drugs to treat life-threatening conditions including cancer, Alzheimer's disease, and a range of vaccines.

Leaders of organizations such as Planned Parenthood and the Center for Reproductive Rights remain focused on eventually winning in court, but a number of Democrats, including Sen. Ron Wyden (Ore.) and Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (N.Y.). are urging the FDA to ignore Kacsmaryk's ruling entirely. Abe Asher

Plum Dumping

Kyle wastewater plan raises question: Can Central TX waterways handle exponential growth? BY LINA FISHER

The **city of Kyle** is fixing to dump about three times as much wastewater into Plum Creek as it currently does. But the creek won't be able to withstand that influx, advocates say, unless the state locks down stricter pollution regulations. At a March 30 meeting of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality at the Kyle Public Library, the city's mayor, Travis Mitchell, explained their rationale for a permit amendment application that would allow that much discharge: "Kyle has experienced unprecedented growth over the course of the last 15 years.

Our entire infrastructure our roads, our water, our wastewater - they've all been stressed to the max." In 2000. Kyle had a population of around 6,000; now it's home to more than 50,000. "And now here we are 20 years later, trying to put the infrastructure together of a big city."


It's a common story as the Hill Country continues

to boom, and its flip side is steadfast pushback from advocates attempting to safeguard the natural environment from the cumulative impacts of encroaching development. At the library, representatives from the San Marcos River Foundation, Hill Country Alliance, and Greater Edwards Aquifer Alliance as well as residents of a subdivision near the city's treatment plant voiced concerns that this permit's standards are too lax for the already overburdened Plum Creek. It would allow a phased increase from the current limit of 4.5 million gallons of wastewater per day to 12 million, serving an estimated 90,363 people by 2040. The city currently discharges 3.6 million gallons and expects to hit 9 million by 2025. The permit also allows high levels of polluting nutrients in the discharged wastewater that could be filtered out, and does not include limits on toxic algae-producing phosphorous, though those regulations would kick in once the city crosses the 4.5 million gallon threshold.

"The question I think all of us have is,

why is the current permit so lax?" asked Mike Clifford, technical director for the Greater Edwards Aquifer Alliance. "Every single other wastewater treatment plant we deal with in Texas has phosphorus testing. The current state of Plum Creek is a disaster," he continued, noting that 18 wastewater plants already discharge into it. Plum Creek has violated state

surface water quality standards in the past and suffers from high levels of E. coli, nitrates, and algae-producing nitrogen and phosphorus, explained SMRF's Virginia Parker, who noted that SMRF has recently settled with large developers in the region, such as Cherryville, HK Real Estate Development, and the city of San Marcos, for more stringent pollutant controls. After Clifford's comments, TCEQ reps expressed willingness to implement more stringent requirements, admitting that 15 mg/L total

suspended solids is too high a limit for the size of the creek. Five mg/L total suspended solids "is a really normal standard in the area," said Parker. "I don't think we're being unreasonable with this request."

"The sooner we get the permit, the sooner we can start doing a good job so we can continue to protect the environment," urged Kyle's consulting engineer on the project, Raj Bhattarai. "Without the capacity, we cannot do maintenance on the existing plant." And the city plans to offset the amount of water it needs to discharge by building out its purple pipes - infrastructure that would reuse treated wastewater on city-owned land for things like irrigation and toilet flushing. Currently, the Plum Creek Golf Course reuses about 900.000 gallons of treated wastewater a day, but thanks to a \$2 million federal grant secured by Rep. Lloyd Doggett, by 2025 the city plans to expand that infrastructure to commercial buildings, schools, and parks. How

much wastewater can be diverted will depend on demand.

Though Plum Creek is experiencing more frequent flooding as a result of increased effluent discharge, Clifford told the Chronicle that should TCEQ implement tighter pollutant controls, GEAA is overall "encouraged by [Kyle's] beneficial reuse plan ... we think they can come up with an overall plan that will improve the quality of water in Plum Creek" using the federal grant. "Normally municipalities are just starting to get to that or aren't that serious about it."

The mayor spoke in favor of the amended permit, but two Kyle council members, Miguel Zuniga and Yvonne Flores-Cale, joined the advocates in urging caution. "I appreciate growth, I embrace growth, I embrace technology," said Zuniga. "But I also want to do my part to preserve our natural resources, and leave something for future generations."

APD VICTIMS SERVICES UNIT CALLS ON LOCAL THERAPISTS FOR HELP

Local therapists, the **Austin Police Department** wants *vou* to help with long-term intervention for survivors of crime. The incentive? Free professional training - cost of textbooks not included.

The **APD Victim Services Unit** is now accepting applications from Austin-area nonprofit and private practice counselors to participate in an up-to-three-year program first launched in 2018. Selected counselors will be trained in a form of trauma therapy known as eye movement desensitization and reprocessing. That training can cost up to \$4,000. In return, the therapists agree to offer 50 pro bono sessions for survivors of trauma within the next three years.

Victim Services supervisor **Stephanle Burgess** said that this call for applications is unrelated to the officer and civilian staffing shortages at APD. Rather, this relatively new project began as a

partnership with the Commission for Women and the Austin/Travis County Sexual Assault Response and Resource Team to provide longterm therapy for survivors of sexual assault. She said that in-house Victim Services counselors "have a more short-term intervention with survivors of crime," Burgess said. "Really, our role here at Victim Services is to be on-scene or to support the survivor throughout the investigation, and then to get them referred over to those longer-term resources that are already in place."

With \$50,000 available for this training program, APD plans to assemble around 40 local therapists. EMDR, an extensively researched form of therapy that focuses on the disturbing emotions and symptoms resulting from a traumatic event, is a highly soughtafter mental health treatment and "a great marketing tool for any

clinician to have in their tool belt," according to Burgess. The training, led by Austin-based therapists Rick Levinson and Dr. Christie Sprowls, typically costs between \$2,000 and \$4,000. (Out-of-pocket textbooks total around \$120.)

"As part of this program, therapists don't have to do EMDR," Burgess said. "So just because they receive this training and are providing the pro bono sessions doesn't bind them to have to commit to one sort of therapeutic model. They can still use their own clinical judgment alongside the survivor to determine what's best for their care." Burgess added that although the program originally limited the pro bono sessions to survivors of sexual assault, it has since expanded to all victims of crime. Interested therapists should apply by April 25 at 5pm to be considered. - Dex Weslev Parra

So Is It Safe for My Dog to Swim in Austin This Summer?

Since 2019, Austin's scourge of toxic algae has ebbed and flowed, terrorizing the dog-owning community. After suspicious but as-yet untested algae (which we should assume is toxic and avoid, the city says) was found at **Red Bud Isle** and **Jessica Hollis Park** March 10, the *Chronicle* asked **Brent Bellinger**, a senior environmental scientist for Austin Watershed Protection, for some advice on where the risk is highest this summer and what the city is doing to mitigate it.

"Any place in Austin carries some risk with it," he says. "The degree of that risk varies over time" and with the weather. After heavy rains like we had last week, which wash algae-producing nutrients like phosphorus and nitrogen into waterways, "it'd be advisable especially in the urban creeks to avoid any contact with the water for probably a good week, just to let bacteria levels settle back down."

Over the last few years, the city has found toxic cyanobacteria in almost every major waterway in Austin. At least five dogs have died as a result of ingesting the algae, and a person fell ill in 2021 after swimming at **Sculpture Falls** and ingesting the water. After that, the city implemented a five-year pilot for a mitigating product called PhosLock, meant to bury phosphorus and prevent it from contributing to algae production. That study has produced varying results, in places with varying sediment chemistry, possibly due to weather, says Bellinger: After August rains last year, PhosLock results at Festival Beach "were not what we had hoped for," but at Red Bud Isle, even without any applications of PhosLock over the dry winter of 2021, phosphorus remained pretty static.

One of the most concerning incidents happened last summer, when a dog died after swimming at Barking Springs. Could algae migrate over to Barton? After testing, Bellinger's team did find trace amounts of the toxin in the water, but well below the World Health Organization's recreational standards. This year, he says, they'll start monitoring a little earlier, to get a jump on collaborations with the Lower Colorado River Authority and the U.S. Geological Survey in studying the dynamics of the algal blooms. LCRA has been monitoring the Highland Lakes, and USGS will study why warmth-loving cyanobacteria has grown in cooler, groundwater-fed springs like Barton Springs: "This is something that's very under-studied globally ... looking more at the surface water-groundwater dynamics, and how those interact with the presence of toxic cyanobacteria at six sites around Austin." If things were to get really bad, says Bellinger, there are different options researchers are lab-testing: "Over the years, solicited or not, I've received treatment options from almost two dozen companies around the world."

This year's testing should yield preliminary results next month. In the meantime, Bellinger says, "There's no reason to avoid every single place around Austin out of fear. Most of the algae that's out there is benign, it's nontoxic. If there's no bad smells, you don't see any scums or sheens on the water, your risk is lower than a comparable spot that is stagnant, it's got a funky aroma – those would be places to avoid. Go to the Walsh boat ramp and let the dog jump into the water, but keep them away from the shoreline. You know, don't let the dog eat weird stuff. And it's fine." – Lina Fisher





THE RULE OF GREG

An Army sergeant thought he could get away with murdering a Black Lives Matter protester in plain sight. Governor Abbott is about to prove him right. BY BRANT BINGAMON


he 12 jurors who served in the Daniel Perry murder trial took an oath to be fair and impartial. They promised to carefully consider the evidence presented to them - eight days of it, much of it very detailed. They spent 16 hours, spread over two days, reaching a unanimous conclusion. On the afternoon of April 7, they pronounced Perry, an active-duty Army sergeant, guilty of murdering Black Lives Matter protester Garrett Foster in the summer of 2020.

Less than 24 hours later, Texas Gov. Greg Abbott promised to replace their decision with his own. The governor did not attend the trial and has not seen the transcript, because it doesn't yet exist. But he announced that he had asked the seven members of Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles to recommend that he pardon Perry, a legal necessity before he takes that action. "I have made that request and instructed the Board to expedite its review," the governor wrote on Twitter. "I look forward to approving the Board's pardon recommendation as soon as it hits my desk."

Perry, stationed at Fort Hood but moonlighting as an Uber driver, ran a red light on the evening of July 25, 2020, and drove into a crowd of about 20 Black Lives Matter demonstrators in Downtown Austin. He stopped and protesters rushed to his car, slapping and kicking it. Garrett Foster, a 28-year-old Air Force veteran carrying an AK-47 in accordance with Texas' open carry law, approached the driver's side door. Perry lowered his window and shot Foster five times in the chest.

Perry surrendered to Austin Police Department officers and in an interview a short time later said he'd shot in self-defense, thinking that Foster was about to raise his gun. The officers believed Perry and released him. He was indicted for murder a vear later, and his trial commenced on March 27. In it, prosecutors displayed online conversations between Perry and friends showing that, in the weeks before he shot Foster, Perry had fantasized about killing a BLM protester, even arguing that he could get away with it by claiming self-defense. He was convicted on April 7.

Abbott's promise to pardon Perry came after a groundswell of rage from Republicans across the nation. Within two hours of the verdict, Tucker Carlson, recognizing Perry as one of his own, described him to his Fox News viewers as an honorable veteran who had been forced to defend himself. He called the murder conviction a "legal



atrocity." He said he had invited Abbott to appear on his show to ask if the governor

was considering a pardon for Perry.

"But for some reason Gov. Abbott's office told us he just can't make it," Carlson said, baiting the governor. "So that is Greg Abbott's position. There is no right of self-defense in Texas."

Immediately, conservatives who'd never heard of Daniel Perry were tweeting about the case. Kyle Rittenhouse, a vigilante acquitted of murdering two protesters in Wisconsin in 2020, tweeted his support. Texas Republican Party Chair Matt Rinaldi retweeted several incendiary posts calling the man who coordinated Perry's prosecution, Travis County District Attorney José Garza, a "[George] Soros prosecutor," a shorthand that became ubiquitous. Attorney General Ken Paxton told Fox News that Garza "cares more about the radical agenda of dangerous Antifa and BLM mobs than justice." When Paxton later wrote that "self-defense is a God given right," 2,000 people responded with some version of, "What are you going to do about it?"

So Abbott was certainly pressured to act. Still, his choice to overrule the jury shocked many, particularly those in the criminal justice system. "This is the kind of thing that happens in places like Uganda and El Salvador," said Rick Cofer, a former Travis County assistant district attorney now working in private practice. "Because they have such a weak rule of law. And if the powers that be don't like what a court does they just ignore it. That is what's happening here."

Cofer added that because Abbott is a skilled lawyer – he is the former attorney general of Texas and served on the Texas Supreme Court – he knows better than anyone how inappropriate his proposal is. "He knows that calling for a pardon in the middle of trial court proceedings is unheard of. It is unprecedented. It pushes against due process. And it treats Daniel Perry differently than every other defendant in the state of Texas."

Many have made the point that there is no way Abbott could be as informed about the trial as the 12 jurors who delivered the verdict. The trial was not broadcast live.



It was recorded but the recording is not accessible to the public. The trial transcript won't be finished for weeks. The only evidence and testimony available to those not physically present at the trial is the reporting in print and on archived TV broadcasts. That reporting greatly simplifies the evidence. Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick illustrated the danger of relying on news reports when he told Fox News on April 8 that Foster had pointed his weapon "through the side window, right at Sgt. Perry." As those who saw the trial know, Patrick was either repeating misinformation or lying.

"Clearly, reading a news report, you can't be as discerning and discriminating as a juror laying eyes on a witness, watching their demeanor, and hearing all the testimony and the interplay of the testimony with other witnesses," said retired District Judge Charlie Baird, a former member of the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals and a man with four decades of experience in the law. "That's why we have juries."

Baird called Abbott's request of the Board of Pardons and Paroles an "obvious political ploy" and said he hopes they'll reject it. The board's seven members, who make \$125,000 per year and can be fired immediately at the whim of the governor, usually only review cases after they've been appealed. Baird noted that they had been asked to recommend a pardon before Perry was even sentenced and without the usual reams of testimony that accompany pardon applications.

"It just shows no respect for the process that's in place," Baird said. "You know, you've got a good judge - I think everybody thinks the world of [District] Judge [Clifford] Brown, who oversaw the trial. I think there were good lawyers on both sides. You've got jurors who were obviously dedicated and committed to obeying their oath and discharging their duty. So it just undermines the criminal justice system and the safeguards that are in place.

"So I hate to see this. It's absolutely unprecedented. I just think Abbott has taken the bait of Tucker Carlson."

THE PROTESTS AND THE TRIAL

Garrett Foster and his fiancée Whitney Mitchell stood out among the activists who participated in the 2020 Black Lives Matter protests. Mitchell is a small Black woman, a quadruple amputee. Foster was a large white man and Mitchell's full-time caretaker, bathing her, brushing her teeth, feeding her, and, as she later put it, helping with "everything a person does through the day."

The couple began attending BLM protests after the murder of George Floyd. In Austin, Floyd's murder unleashed the most disruptive demonstrations in the city's history on May 30-31, 2020, with thousands of young people thronging APD headquarters,

cursing police, and repeatedly shutting down I-35. Police responded by shooting dozens with mesh bags filled with lead shot, referred to as beanbag rounds. Many protesters were hurt, at least 20 of them critically.

After the violence, BLM protesters marched several times a week throughout the summer. Foster and Mitchell attended almost every protest. They typically began at APD at 7pm with speeches and chanting. The protesters then took over the Downtown streets, stopping at the Capitol and City Hall, then returning to APD between 10pm and midnight.

The protest on the evening of July 25, 2020, followed this pattern, except that on this night, instead of pushing Mitchell in her wheelchair as he usually did, Foster walked at the back of the marchers, carrying the AK-47 he had begun bringing to the protests. The couple's friend, Jeremy Lett, pushed Mitchell. They had been marching for two hours when they turned back toward APD at 9:50pm, heading north along Congress Avenue with about 20 others. As the group reached Fourth Street, Daniel Perry drove into the crowd.

Foster approached the car. He made some kind of comment to the driver inside. Almost instantly, Perry lowered the driver's side window and shot Foster five times in the chest with a .357-caliber revolver he'd had ready between the front seat and the console. Protesters screamed and ran. Foster collapsed.

Perry drove two blocks away, called 911, and surrendered to APD officers. He told them he'd been texting, that he hadn't seen the protesters, that he'd turned into them by mistake – claims that were disproven at the trial. He said he'd fired in self-defense, that he'd "never been so scared in [his] life."

Perry was interviewed by senior homicide Detective David Fugitt, a recently retired officer who remains a legend at APD. In a video played at the trial, Fugitt, seated, asked Perry, standing in front of him, to demonstrate how Foster had held the AK. Perry seems uncertain but holds an imaginary rifle pointed down at the officer. "I believe he was going to aim it at me," he stammers. "I didn't want to give him a chance to aim it at me, you know?" Fugitt later testified that he thought Perry had a legitimate claim of self-defense. He let him go.

José Garza, running for Travis County District Attorney at the time, promised the community that if elected he would present the Perry case to a grand jury. After winning in a landslide, he did. On July 1, 2021, a grand jury indicted Perry for murder, assault, and deadly conduct.

When the trial began in late March, lead prosecutor Guillermo Gonzalez kicked off the state's case by bringing in the protesters who saw Foster die on July 25, 2020. "I remember Garrett saying, 'Move on,' and I remember hearing gunshots and Garrett just falling down in front of me," Mitchell told the silent court, weeping, her words soft. "He just fell over and I remember jumping down and he was laying on the gun ... I had to scoot myself to him. I had to scoot myself over to him."

The half-dozen protesters who appeared next all repeated a version of the same story: They heard squealing tires as Perry's car sped into the group. They slapped and kicked the car. Garrett Foster strode to the car and said something to the driver. The window opened and Foster was shot. No one saw Foster raise his gun. APD officers testified that they recovered the gun with the safety on and no bullet in the chamber.

As decisive as the testimony was, it had been expected. What hadn't been - and what observers later decided was the turning point of the trial - were the social media posts and texts from Perry displayed on the trial's third day, demonstrating, in his own words, that he deeply

hated BLM protesters and had fantasized about killing them. "I might have to kill a few people on my way to work, they are rioting outside my apartment complex," Perry wrote to a friend in June of 2020. "I might go to Dallas to shoot looters," he wrote on another occasion. In one post he wondered whether he would be allowed to cut off the ears – presumably as trophies – of protesters who "committed suicide" by challenging him.

Perry also speculated about how he might get away with killing a protester – by claiming self-defense. Prosecutors presented a Facebook Messenger chat between Perry and a friend, Michael Holcomb, which occurred two weeks before he shot Foster. In it, Perry argued that shooting protesters was legal if it was in self-defense. Holcomb tried to talk Perry down. "Aren't you a CHL holder too?" he asked, referring to the men's licenses to carry concealed handguns. "We went through the same training

Perry's attorneys, Doug O'Connell and Clint Broden, began presenting their defense on the sixth day of the trial. Much of it focused on how Foster had held his AK-47. Several witnesses, reviewing indistinct photos, testified that Foster was ready to shoot Perry and capable of doing so within a split second. Others said Perry had driven carefully, not recklessly, into the protesters.

The defense attorneys saved their best witness, Detective Fugitt, for last. "There was a legitimate argument for self-defense," Fugitt told the jury. He said pictures from the scene showed Foster with his elbow up, his feet set, ready to fire his weapon. During cross-examination, it became clear that Fugitt and Gonzalez did not like one another. The detective, quite mannerly when speaking with O'Connell, deflected Gonzalez's questions with a hint of a sneer. When Fugitt launched into a protracted defense of mistakes he'd made

in a separate homicide case, brought up by Gonzalez, Judge Brown abruptly ended the digression. "The colloquy is too much at this point," the judge said.

In closing arguments, assistant prosecutor Elizabeth Lawson emphasized that Perry had "instigated this whole thing" and reminded jurors of Holcomb's admonition: "Shooting after creating an event where you have to shoot, is not a good shoot." O'Connell and Broden asked jurors to consider the fear they would feel in encountering someone with an AK-47. Broden smashed his foot into the side of a car door he'd brought into the court to show how

frightening the protesters would be as they surrounded the car. He and O'Connell referred to them as "ants on candy."

Lead prosecutor Gonzalez made the final presentation, returning to the idea of "instigation." He reminded jurors that Perry ran a red light and then lied by telling police he'd been texting and had pulled into the group by mistake. "That's the crux of this case – why did he run that red light?" Gonzalez asked. He tied the social media posts with what he referred to as Perry's instinctive recognition of a "target of opportunity." "They fit together quite nicely, the social media posts and the red light,"

Gonzalez said. "And in Texas, I can get away with it' - that's his state of mind."

It took 16 hours for the jury to decide they agreed. There were gasps as the verdict was announced, then, gradually, the sound of sobbing. Mitchell wept with Foster's mother, Sheila. Perry's mother, on the other side of the courtroom, buried her face in her hands. Perry stood silently at first. Then, he collapsed into the arms of one of his defense attorneys, pushing his head against the man's chest and sobbing loudly. Moments later he was put in handcuffs and led away.

TWO LEGAL SYSTEMS

Daniel Perry has not yet been sentenced as the Chronicle goes to press. Brown is expected to sentence him by the end of the week, after reviewing additional social media posts from Perry not seen at the trial.

On April 11, O'Connell and Broden requested a new trial, saying that Garza had suppressed evidence collected by Fugitt that supported Perry's self-defense claim. It was an old argument, first floated after Perry's indictment, that had never gone anywhere. Brown has yet to rule on it. Meanwhile,

Garza asked the Board of Pardons and Paroles to grant an interview with his team and with Foster's family before issuing a recommendation on the pardon. It's a kind of interview that the board never conducts. The members of the board don't even meet each other face-to-face.

If they don't grant an interview, perhaps they'll consider Garza's public response to Abbott, a day after the proposed pardon. Then, Garza had, like so many others, invoked the rule of law. "In a state that believes in upholding the importance of the rule of law, the governor's statement that he will intervene in the legal proceedings surrounding the death of Garrett Foster is deeply troubling," he said. "In our legal system, a jury ... gets to decide whether a defendant is guilty or innocent - not the Governor."

It was a typically circumspect response from the D.A. Others were more expansive. "Gov. Abbott is just the cowardly, puppet face of Tucker Carlson with this pardon," said U.S. Rep. Greg Casar, D-Austin. "The jury deliberated for two days. Abbott didn't deliberate for two minutes before springing into action and promising a pardon because Tucker Carlson pushed him to. And that's just such a perversion of our criminal justice system – people being convicted, or not being convicted, or getting pardons, because of what extreme right-wingers on Fox News have to say. Abbott can't claim that he's for public safety or equal justice under the law or impartial trials after what he's done with Perry, and after what he threatened to do in these other cases."

Casar's mention of "these other cases" refers to a different threat by Abbott: that he will pardon 19 Austin police officers indicted by Travis County grand juries for shooting protesters with beanbag rounds during the May 30-31, 2020, demonstrations. The officers, charged with aggravated assault, could each be sentenced to 99 years in prison. O'Connell, who represents many of them, told the Chronicle he is not ready to comment on any potential pardons. But the cases are expected to begin filtering into county courtrooms in the coming year.

The Chronicle contacted Rinaldi and local GOP political consultant Matt Mackowiak to ask how Abbott's political career will benefit if he pardons a string of police officers. Neither wanted to go there. Katie Naranjo, the chair of the Travis County Democratic Party, said she has no doubt Abbott will pardon the officers if he gets a chance.

"That man couldn't find a moral compass if it were glued to him," Naranjo said. "He's going to continue to silence voices and this is the most literal silencing of a voice I've

Many noted that Abbott's offer to pardon Perry is part of a trend: State Republicans, once the party of "local control," are increasingly seeking to dominate the "election fraud." Lt. Gov. Patrick has deemed the bill a priority. He refers to Texas' progressive D.A.s in terms reminiscent of black-and-white television shows, branding them "rogue prosecutors" whose "delinquent behavior will not be tolerated."

Garza is the rogue-est of these rogue D.A.s. In responding to Abbott, he vowed to continue doing what he's doing. But he

Walker, Texas Comic

Devon Walker brings Lone Star State laughs to SNL and Moontower Just for Laughs by VALERIE LOPEZ

In October 2016 longtime Austin resident and new comic Devon Walker was a guest on my podcast, Comedy Wham. Seven years later, ahead of his return for Moontower Just for Laughs Austin, I'm still struck by how ageless and wise Walker was at that first meeting, brimming with poise and charm even as he was just starting to run open mics in the (then) small Austin comedy scene. He was part ambitious comic and part chill friend you hang out with talking about George Strait and the Spurs.

Fast-forward to September 2022, and the opening credits of NBC's Saturday Night Live. Walker sports a charming grin while holding a set of red balloons as longtime announcer (and former cast member) Darryl Hammond bellows his name as one of this season's new featured players. Walker is a tall, imposing force, but those balloons perfectly capture his playful personality. Like most of the other new featured players, Walker is a stand-up comic who's been



thrown into the weekly fire to learn how to write, pitch, rehearse, and perform sketches. Now millions of viewers are paying attention to him and asking, "Who is this kid?"

Born in Washington state and raised Pflugerville, Walked shared that "as a young kid, I always wanted attention." The class clown, he'd always been told he was funny, and while earning a master's degree in organizational development, he turned to comedy and never looked back.

Walker's comedy career began in 2014 with an open mic performance at the original Cap City Comedy Club where, in a bit of kismet, he met future SNL castmate Andrew Dismukes. Walker took a break to focus on a new relationship but returned to the stage in 2015 after the relationship ended. Of his return to the open mic rigmarole, Walker says his motivation was, "Let me see if I can be better." The tastemakers of Austin comedy quickly took notice. In 2016, he made his first-ever festival appearance, at Moontower, and appeared on Piranha, a show created and hosted by Matt Bearden where comics deliver their sets and a panel of celebrity judges buys their best jokes. Walker's appearance was unique. The judges flipped the script and gave Walker money to keep his material, telling him no one could tell the jokes the way Walker did. Competing as a finalist in the 2017 and 2018 Cap City Comedy Club Funniest Person in Austin contests, the proof was there. He was getting so much better and itching to get better in a bigger comedy market. After his 2017 appearance on Comedy Central's Up Next, L.A. and New York took notice, and he gave himself a year to decide which coast would claim him.

Walker talks a lot about "full circle" moments, and one came on May 5, 2018. Donald Glover was slated to host and perform as the musical guest on SNL. Dismukes was a new writer on the show, and Walker asked his open mic friend if he could get tickets. Between seeing the show and taking in NYC, his fate was sealed as the Big Apple's newest resident. quickly landing writing jobs at Netflix's Big Mouth and FreeForm's Everything's Trash

and keeping busy during the pandemic by creating digital shorts for Comedy Central. Walker's demeanor is so laid-back, you don't sense the highly ambitious side of him. He gives credit to his father for achieving the American dream through hard work and the desire to give his children a better life. And now, in under 10 years since his first open mic, he's a featured player on the longest-running TV show in history.

But first he had to get past the audition process: performing on the main stage with creator and producer Lorne Michaels sitting in a dark corner. Walker was told, "No one's going to laugh, but don't let that trip you up." After stepping on stage, performing to

empty seats, he was shocked and relieved to hear laughter. Walker kept the carefully guarded secret that he'd been cast as a featured player on the 48th season while the rest of America (minus Walker's

mom - she knew) waited until August for the announcement. The 47th season cast went through a large exodus, and Walker is part of this rebuilding year and the show's most diverse cast to date.

While Michaels has never divulged his magic formula for talent spotting, it appears to have evolved since the show's 1975 origin. Not only is there a strong Black presence (Ego Nwodim, Punkie Johnson, and now Walker), there's Asian representation with Bowen Yang, Hispanic representation with Marcello Hernandez, and the show's first-ever nonbinary cast member in Molly Kearney. The cast looks more and more like the America that it skewers every week.

Walker shared that among favorite sketches he co-wrote was "Hot Girl Hospital" with host Megan Thee Stallion and "Baptist Church" with host Michael B. Jordan. He loved being cast in "HIV Commercial" with host Aubrey Plaza, because he was front and center, and "Kenan & Kelly" with host Keke Palmer, because he performed an impression in the faux *Kenan & Kel* sketch. That was a dream come true for him.

When I talked to Walker in 2016 he shared a philosophy of "where you're at is never where you want to be." If we could predict the future, Walker would graduate to full cast member for SNL's 50th season, a remarkable milestone. And, like his original comedy

> heroes - Chevy Chase, Chris Rock, Tracy Morgan, and Will Ferrell - he'll become a household name. Oh, and he'd like it known that he's available to be a courtside fixture for San Antonio Spurs games. After

all, not all dreams are comedy-related.

The 32-year-old feels like an old man when it comes to today's Austin comedy scene, saying, "It was better back in my day," but he readily admits people always think fondly of their early days in comedy. Austin may no longer be home, but when asked if he considered himself a New Yorker or a Texan, without hesitation. Walker reached over to show me a necklace pendant in the shape of Texas. "I'll be a Texan 'til I die."





Moontower Just for Laughs headliner Vir Das on belonging, connection, and that monologue ...

Vir Das was already a comedy superstar when he headlined the 2019 Moontower Comedy Festival. But as he celebrates his return for the rebranded 2023 Moontower Just for Laughs Austin, he arrives at different level, courtesy of when he delivered a six-minute monologue at the John F. Kennedy Center for Performing Arts

in 2021. Called "Two Indias," it's been referred to as a poem because of how he delivered it, "but what people don't realize is that the reason that

there's paper in my hand through the speech is that it's something I wrote it at 3:30pm and then performed at 10:30pm."

It didn't seem anything special at the time. He'd just finished a regular show, and then delivered this extra bit, like he'd done several times before, "where we talk about politics and governments, et cetera." He hired a wedding photographer to capture the moment, as he discussed the split nature of India: its divisions. hypocrisies, dichotomies, diversities, and possibilities. It was simultaneously a love letter and a charge sheet, representing the same complicated feelings anyone has about their homeland - and it became a

viral sensation, sparking conversations, applause, and fury. "I don't think you get to predict when you create a conversation or when you become a conversation," he said. "You just have to run with it."

The video became a cause célèbre, sparking what Das described as "seven or eight days of outrage" (a polite response

> to death threats and calls for his arrest). Yet as people had time to absorb what he was saying, he saw a subtle change in his audiences: not in the who, but

the how. He said, "Earlier on they were coming in the door because you made them laugh and that's great, but now they were coming through the door with maybe 10% more emotion - either way, happy or sad." For Das, that change came because there was a new connection between him and his audiences "and that has been a privilege to have across the world," he added, "and then you want to work doubly hard to honor that."

And he truly is a world talent. While the "Two Indias" recording took place in the U.S., "98% of those views came from inside India," Das said. "It was very much a domestically viewed video in that sense."

That reflects something unique that Das brings to his comedy, what he calls the "perpetual outsider prospective," as someone raised across the Indian diaspora. Born in India, raised in Nigeria, educated in public and private schools in India, "and then I went to Galesburg, Illinois." He's been a star in Bollywood, "where I was the kid from American drama school, and now I work in Hollywood where I'm the guy from Bollywood.

"I've never really fit in," he added, "and I've never really had a sense of belonging.

So you transition through all these bubbles, where you try to take something from the bubble without the bubble taking the best of you."

Yet because of the conversation around "Two Indias," he's now become part of a special club, his name mentioned in the same breath as Bill Hicks, Lenny Bruce, and George Carlin, "and I always find that a little bit daunting because my mission is a little bit more basic. ... I want to be an authentic Indian voice that is unapologetically global."

Review: Zach Theatre's *Roe*

Revised text of the abortion rights drama proves that timing is everything

I found myself in a bar after seeing Zach Theatre's opening night performance of Lisa Loomer's Roe. The plan was to gather my thoughts about this riveting retelling of Roe v. Wade, the 1973 landmark Supreme Court decision that guaranteed the right to an abortion. Instead, I gained perspective when the house band played a Trace Adkins song from the film Country Strong, whose titular lyric suggested that "It can happen so fast/ Or a little bit late/ Timing is everything."

Roe is a well-written historical drama that focuses on the two Texas women at the center of Roe v. Wade - the pregnant, damaged plaintiff Norma McCorvey aka "Jane Roe" (a thoroughly engaging, always interesting Amber Quick) and her gutsy young attorney Sarah Weddington (a marvelously compelling Nisi Sturgis). It chronicles their lives leading up

to their first meeting, takes us into the courtroom as the lawyer pleads her case, and charts their divergent political paths after the case has concluded. And because it was written in 2016, when the option of abortion was secure, safe, and accessible, the playwright graciously takes the high road by giving both sides of the pro-life/pro-choice debate their comparable moments in the spotlight and depicting their respective players as passionate followers of their conscience and moral compass.

But this is also a memory play told by both McCorvey and Weddington, who admit that their memories are unreliable. imperfect, and often contradictory. As such, Roe is more of a creative piece of storytelling about an impactful moment in recent history than a documentary-style staging of historical facts. Characters are given the freedom to reenact their lives

while offering context, commentary, and humorous asides, like what Wikipedia and their obituaries say about them in the future. It also allows the sizable ensemble - a terrific gathering of talented, highly invested actors featuring Cliff Miller as born-again Christian pastor Flip Benham, Sandra Valls as McCorvey's lover Connie, and Amy Downing as Weddington's comic relief co-counsel - to play multiple roles.

And so Roe entertainingly addresses a very complex topic without oversimplifying it, creates relatable characters that are able to relay their politics without sounding preachy, and never comes across as didactic. Director Jenny Lavery and her designers use a perfect balance of ambient music and voiceover (Phillip Owen, Eliot Haynes), huge visual projections (Stephanie Busing), and dramatic lighting (Rachel Atkinson) to establish time and place. Period costumes (Jenny Hanna-Chambers) and a brilliantly devised and executed onstage costume change serve to transition from one decade to another. Transitions from one scene to the next are speedy and seamless entrances and exits of set-pieces and props (Michelle Ney) performed by the actors.

This play was originally slated for production at the Zach in 2020, but was canceled after three rehearsals due to COVID: Now it is being staged at a time when abortion is no longer readily accessible and all but illegal in Texas, where providing one can be a felony punishable by up to life in prison.

As such, Roe is no longer the same play. Its balanced retrospection now seems naive. And the pride the play generated among advocates of women's rights in general and Texans in particular - since it is in Dallas and Austin where much of the drama unfolds - has been replaced with a great sense of loss.

Timing is everything.

The 2016 script has since been revisited by Loomer, and in the version of the play now onstage at the Zach, there's a revised prologue and epilogue that give the first and final word to pro-choice lawyer Weddington. This rendition of Roe is more polemical as well, because in this day and age it has to be. All of this comes across as a call to action whose urgency earned applause from the opening night audience.

Come see Roe for the personal stories behind the politics and the remarkable performances. Stay for the rallying cry.





ROXY CASTILLO CONTAINS MULTITUDES: a former burlesque Best of Austin nominee, wrestling manager extraordinaire, and queen of silly, sexy, saucy stand-up. Her many impressive shiny facets are a perfect addition to this year's Moontower Just for Laughs Festival, as she's featured on the lineups of two April 19 shows: Home Base (Velveta Lounge, 7pm) and Hello Lover! A Comedy Dating Game (Cap City. 8:30pm).

Paring down all those multitudes, Castillo describes her performance persona as a melding of two distinct people: "your raunchy Tia" and "preteen trapped in an adult's body." Through these halves of the whole Castillo package, she aims to present a conversation between her younger and older self. "It's me trying to make sense of who I've been and who I want to be," she says. "It's like, equal parts your annoying little sister AND your raunchy auntie who got bold enough to take the microphone at the family function and make everyone listen to her."

Taking part in Just for Laughs represents a dream fulfilled, Castillo says. "It's humbling and validating to be invited to perform at such a prestigious festival." she says. "So many comedians and performers that I admire have come through Just for Laughs. and getting to see them AND (maybe) work with them is a dream. Pinch me. I just wish Hanson was somehow part of this then lil Roxy could die happy." Her personal mustsees of the fest are Meg Stalter, Patti Harrison, Sarah Sherman, Monet X Change, and Punkie Johnson - a who'swho of queer comic knockouts.

As a 13-year veteran of the near-full spectrum of Austin's artistic scene, Castillo considers it to be a welcoming space for performers. "In my experience, Austin is one of the most diverse and inclusive places for performing," she says, "from comedy, to wrestling, to burlesque, drag, fantasy role playing, etc. There's room for everyone." That goes double for Bat City's queer comedy crop, which Castillo describes as thriving despite the horrors visited on LGBTO Texans by the state. "It's inspiring to be a part of the growth, creativity, and adaptation that queer artists are bringing to Austin's stages," Castillo says. "Making our laughter and joy loud and heard is an act of resistance."

The **Center for Wildlife Rescue** at the Texas State Aguarium in Corpus Christi, which opened March 2, profoundly improves the response to wildlife crises, and it's open to the public for free.

"It's a game changer," Jesse Gilbert, CEO of the aquarium, says of the new wildlife rehabilitation center.

During Winter Storm Uri in 2021, thousands of cold-stunned sea turtles were in danger of drowning. The aquarium cared for over 1,700 of the reptiles.


Wildlife officials told Gilbert that because cold weather events are becoming more common, a facility was needed that could handle twice that number of turtles. The idea for the rescue center was born.

Opened in 1990, the aguarium added a wildlife rehabilitation component in 1993. The entertainment aspects of the aquarium support wildlife rescue.

The center is the largest coastal wildlife rescue program in Texas and one of the largest in the nation. Among the state-of-the-art veterinarian equipment is the only CT scanner in Texas specifically for wildlife. It does noninvasive diagnostics and groundbreaking research.

The rehabilitation center treats sea turtles, raptors, dolphins, shorebirds, and even ocelots, cats indigenous to South Texas. New arrivals to the Texas coast the center can handle are 2,000pound manatees.

A visit to the center begins in the lobby, where X-rays show the insides of animals. Budding veterinarians can see the CT scanner



and operating room. At the end of the hall is a pool large enough to hold several dolphins, sharks, or manatees. Around the corner are multiple tanks of the "hospital" where sea turtles get well.

The Wildlife Rescue Center is a short walk from the Texas State Aquarium in the North Beach area of Corpus Christi. The rehabilitation center opens daily from 11am to 4pm.

LAFC Hammering Highlights Big Weakness for Austin FC

On the surface, the football clubs of Austin and Los Angeles aren't so different. Both are relatively novel institutions, part of a recent trend of **Major League Soccer** expansion. Both possess among the league's most vocal and active fan bases. Both teams' stadiums were even designed by the exact same architecture firm. And last season, they both competed in the penultimate round of the playoffs to determine the Western Conference representative in the league's championship game.

There is, however, one crucial department in which the clubs have nothing in common. It was evident during the aforementioned Western Conference Final eight months ago, won decisively by **LAFC**, 3-0. And it was brutally, painfully exposed in last weekend's rematch, which the Angelenos took by the very same scoreline. Designated Players.

If you've followed MLS (or this column) with any regularity, you're well aware what DPs are and what they mean to the clubs to which they belong. They are the highest-paid players on the roster and, theoretically, the best. Since entering the league in 2018, no club in MLS has exemplified this concept better than LAFC. Its shortlist of past and present DPs includes former league MVP and single-season record goalscorer Carlos Vela, 2020 Golden Boot winner Diego Rossi, and multitime All-Star Cristian Arango. The latest member of the club, striker Denis Bouanga. single-handedly posterized Austin over the weekend with a scintillating hat trick that certainly impressed ATX head coach Josh Wolff.

"They have a very, very special player in Bouanga," Wolff said. "He has some exceptional talent that makes it challenging and certainly swings things in their direction."

The Verde and Black have a special player of their own in **Sebastián Driussi**. But as we enter the meaty center of the club's third season, Driussi has become the exception that proves a sobering reality: Austin FC is striking out on its most important signings.

Excluding Driussi, the list of players who have held a DP or U-22 DP tag for El Tree is a who's who of underachievers, outcasts, and failed experiments. The list goes:

Cecilio Domínguez, Rodney Redes, Tomás Pochettino, Žan Kolmanič, Moussa Djitté, Alex Ring, and Emiliano Rigoni. Three of those players – Domínguez, Pochettino.

and Djitté – have already come and gone from the club, and Redes would no doubt have joined them in exodus if any other club would take him. Kolmanič and Ring have at least filled roles and contributed, but neither is setting the world alight.

Then there's Rigoni, with whom the club has been very patient since his midseason arrival last year. That patience has yet to be rewarded, and it's wearing thin. The winger has given Austin FC next to nothing in 18 total appearances dating back to August 2022, and the trend lines are going the wrong direction. After failing to capitalize on several scoring opportunities earlier in the season, Rigoni hasn't had a look at goal – or recorded an official shot – in over two games.

These problems aren't new for El Tree. They existed last year, but a transcendent season from Driussi, along with career years from **Diego Fagúndez**, **Ethan Finlay**, and others, masked the ineptitude of Austin's top investments. Now that Driussi and the supporting cast have cooled off, the problem is all too apparent. If things don't turn a corner soon, especially concerning Rigoni, the Verde and Black may not see the MLS Cup Playoffs – let alone a Western Conference Final – again for a long time.

The Beauty After the Disaster

In Suzume, the creator of anime smash Your Name crafts a modern fantasy about how we live with massive loss by richard whittaker

For much of the latter half of the 20th century, America's exposure to Japanese pop culture was viewed through the fires of the atomic bomb. Metaphors of mass destruction, both intentional and accidental, colored interpretations of works like Godzilla and Akira. But catastrophe is the way of an island, especially one as tectonically unstable as Japan, and that's at the heart of Suzume, the latest modern fantasy from anime master Makoto Shinkai.

Initially, Suzume feels like a wild fantasy, with the titular teen (Hara in the original Japanese version, Nichole Sakura in the English-language dub) trying to help a magical three-legged chair hunt down a talking cat. But Shinkai has never been interested in oddity for oddity's sake, and this time he was moved to tell this story by the devastating Tōhoku earthquake and tsunami of 2011, in which nearly 20,000 people died, with over 2,000 still missing to this day.

Suzume has lived through disaster. Orphaned and now living with her Aunt Tamaki

(Fukatsu/Jennifer Sun Bell) on the island of Kyushu, her very average rural life is disrupted with the appearance of Sōta (Matsumura/Josh Keaton), a blush-inducing stranger who asks her a peculiar question: Does she know of any ruins in the area?

That question reveals a hidden world that sits beneath and within our own, one of small gods and mourning, and of our obligations to the past, especially to catastrophe. Within Shinkai's Japan there is a giant worm that is the cause of all earthquakes, and the constant struggle is to minimize the damage it causes. Not to vanquish it, no: Instead, Shinkai accepts that Japan will always have disaster in its nature, and it is in our response to it that we can find respite and community.

Shinkai has a remarkable ability to find the connections that everyone shares: For example, much like Momoru Hosoda did with Belle and Summer Wars, he seamlessly engages with social media in a way that feels organic and

grounded (still a surprisingly rare skill with filmmakers). But here it's really about how everyone in Japan has been touched by disaster, like how friendly small-town girl Chika (Hanase/ Rosalie Chiang), who takes Suzume in, recalls

being covered in mud from a landslide. Or how the signs of those disasters remain in what Sota calls "lonely places." But most importantly, it's about how we live with disaster, and how we both close the door on the tragedies of the past and still

acknowledge their impact. "We live side by side with death," as Sota says, and the question remains what kind of neighbors we shall be.

Suzume is a beautiful as any of Shinkai's works, but adds a level of danger that he has never really played with before. It's not simply in the worm - a seething, blood red storm; a Lovecraftian mad, blind god who thrashes wildly

and causes cataclysms - it's in those lonely places, the torn lanterns, rusted fairgrounds, and boats dumped on roofs that are the traces of lost lives. Such images are both quietly terrifying and subtly heartrending.

As in Shinkai's recent films, the mystical mechanism that opens up the world and the story - whether it be switching bodies or controlling the weather - rarely imposes itself on the emotional aspects. Yet there are elements of Suzume's cosmology that, for a change, feel a little overbearing and ill-defined.

However, where Shinkai remains peerless is in taking those big, magical, melodramatic swings and landing them with a gentle, compassionate touch. His power is also in his use of metaphors that could be clumsy,

such as the image of literally locking the door on old, painful memories and experiences. What should be cloying and obvious instead becomes universal and touching.

MAFIA MAMMA

A feminist action-comedy punctuated by the occasional severed human appendage, *Mafia Mamma* gets commendable marks for its high concept: Mild-mannered suburban mom Kristin Balbano (the incomparable Collette) – married to a philandering man-child, stuck in a sexist work environment at a pharmaceutical company, and distressed by the recent departure of her only son to college – discovers her self-worth when she improbably dons the mantle of Italian mob boss after the death of her mafioso grand-father. Capiche?

While the specifics of this novel premise of middle-aged female empowerment set in the gorgeous Calabrian region of Italy are challenging enough on their own, their execution is further complicated by a vacillating tone that indiscriminately samples satire, romance, gallows humor, and feel-good entertainment (among other things) in a rat-a-tat-tat gangster setting of murderous mayhem. It's like someone's always turning the knob in one direction, and then in another in *Mafia Mamma*, rarely settling on any mood with clear reception. It can be a frustrating farrago.

There are some worthy laughs early on, but screenwriters Michael J. Feldman and Debbie Jhoon have a bad habit of working the best of them to death, like the tiring running joke about how the Italian mobsters are scandalized by the fact that Kristin has never seen *The Godfather*. (Clemenza's cannoli makes a cheeky guest appearance here.) Fortunately, the gags don't dumbly spoof Coppola's masterwork like those

cringeworthy Cosa Nostra pasticcios from 20 or 30 years ago that deserve to sleep with the fishes. The movie has the sheen of class, and the peppy playlist, featuring sublime cuts like "Il primo whisky," gives it an infectious kick.

But those attributes can't disguise how the script shortchanges Kristin's evolution into a badass crime boss deserving the *rispetto* of her criminal peers. You don't buy it, even if it's supposed to play ironically. She more or less stumbles into this authority, her lethal moves to exert power more accidental than cold-blooded.

the exception being when she gruesomely kills a would-be rapist/assassin in a homicidal rage by using the spiked heels of her Manolo Blahniks to pop an eyeball and stab his testicles. Even more so, the film's seemingly obligatory celebration of the good things Kristin ultimately accomplishes because she's a mensch at heart is badly rushed, largely reduced to a squishy montage of winemaking and prescription drug dispersals that compresses time in the service of ending things on an upbeat note.

But even if the character had turned into a distaff version of Sam Giancana, what's not to like when this Donna Corleone is played by Collette (who also serves as the film's producer)? She can make just about anything tolerable. Calling an actor "relatable" might sound condescending, but Collette has a knack for making normalcy special. Here, her everywoman character's desire to break free from her put-upon life of subservience to others' needs and expectations gives the actor license to smile, and smile big. It lifts the movie higher than it otherwise would go. Brava, Ms. Collette. Brava.



When Nicolas Cage walks out from the foyer in full Dracula mode during Renfield's luscious black-and-white re-creations of Tod Browning's Dracula, it's clear the actor is about to have the time of his life. Cage's performance is, reliably, the strongest part of the latest take on Bram Stoker's bloodsucker: However, Renfield focuses on the titular familiar (Hoult) to mixed results. At its best, it's a fun horror-comedy romp, with great practical effects work and clear affection for its villain. At its worst, it's an overstuffed. poorly CGI'd take on another piece of familiar IP.

Renfield is starting to reconsider his toxic relationship with Count Dracula. For decades, he's been at the count's beck and call, spiriting victims away to the pair's lair and eating bugs to gain superpowers to protect his master. After attending a few meetings of a support group for struggling co-dependents as a cover for finding dinner for Dracula, Renfield begins to see a way out of his cursed lifestyle. However, it's when the familiar sees police Officer Rebecca





(Awkwafina) stand up to local gang the Lobos in a restaurant confrontation that he understands the potential of standing up for himself. Rebecca's father was killed by the gang years ago, and she's seeking real justice, which is hard to do when the majority of the police squad is on the Lobos' payroll. When the Lobos and Dracula come together to forge a path toward world domination, Rebecca and Renfield become unlikely partners in stopping the unholy alliance from achieving their goals.

If this plot summary sounds a little sweaty and overstuffed, that's because it is, and there's more to be found within the plot of Renfield, including a flaccid romantic arc between Renfield and Rebecca that goes nowhere. This packed yet hollow script is one of the film's chief weaknesses. For every moment Cage gets the opportunity to vamp and ham it up in burgundy velvet suits or gnarly makeup, elevating the material he's been given to work with, there's one that falls flat, usually involving CGI blood that feels more 2003 than 2023. Hoult is serviceable as Renfield, but while his sad boy energy makes sense for the narrative it's still missing the feral devotion that made Dwight Frye's take on the character in the 1931 Universal classic so iconic.

Despite its faults, the affection the movie has for its predecessor (most notably in its opening black-and-white sequences) is clear and contagious. There's also fun work being done by the players rounding out the support group, clueless to the gravity of Renfield's situation until it's too late. Cage's choices – the cadence of a word, a well-placed hand, a too-wide smile – are all delightfully unhinged. It's a gift to see an actor as committed as Cage

taking a big bite out of a role. If the movie doesn't match up, at least Cage delivers, deliciously. It's a meaty performance that's worth sinking your teeth into.

SHOWING UP

If Kelly Reichardt is known as anything as a director, it's her keen eye as an observer, her ability to create understated and convincing environments that are in and of themselves so immersive that the push and pull of narrative seems secondary. Moreover, her grasp of the importance of minutiae – such as the taste of cream in period bovine drama First Cow – finds that story can be found in the tiniest of components. Sometimes, such as in eco-drama Night Moves, action is the shadow of what is to come, rather than what is depicted.

But observation is not always enough, and that seems true with the perfectly presented but oddly hollow *Showing Up*. Set in the world of small-time artists in Portland, it functions as a well-crafted portrait, but leaves wide open the question of why Reichardt chose this particular subject matter.

That she chose longtime collaborator Williams for their fourth film together is little surprise, this time casting her as Lizzy, a ceramic artist in the sub-subsistence level of creativity. She

keeps body and soul together (scarcely) through a menial office job at the private art institute run by her mother (Plunkett), then returns to the home she rents from fellow artist Jo (Chau), who uses her own slightly more successful career as a good excuse to be a slumlord. She doesn't have time to fix Lizzy's hot water but does have time to scavenge a tire to turn into a swing in her backyard. Meanwhile, Lizzy, who has to scrounge showers from friendly galleries, is caught between her bureaucrat mother and her free-spirited (read, immature and narcissistic) potter father, played with gusto by Hirsch. Meanwhile, her brother (Magaro) is headed for a full-scale psychotic break, while the rest of the family treats him as the real, if erratic, genius offspring.

At times, Lizzy verges painfully close to pastiche, a shambling, grumbling figure in shades of grimy beige, as worn out as her yellowing Crocs. At others, she is genuinely empathetic, especially after she becomes caregiver to a wounded pigeon – a broken-winged intruder who swiftly becomes a window into the exact dynamics of her relationship with Jo. Yet Williams plays her with such purposeful understatement that she becomes constrained by her own restraint, as all the while her friends, family, and colleagues live in obliviousness. There's at least a hint from Williams that Lizzy understands her own shortcomings, but that's the nearest anyone comes to an epiphany.

The end result feels authentic, but oddly purposeless. Reichardt regularly cuts to the young, unnamed, and voiceless students at the art school creating their own works, tenderly ministered to by affable kiln tender/flautist Eric

(Benjamin); yet there's never any real juxtaposition against the grinding mediocrity of Lizzy's existence. Are they being set up for exactly the same kind of prolonged failure as she is? Or can they aspire to what we are told is Jo's level of success? Not that it's altogether clear where Reichardt stands on that, either. Lizzy often stares with frustration at Jo's life and career sometimes quite literally. In one scene, at one of the two exhibitions Jo has while Lizzy can barely mount one, she has an expression of muted awe at her frenemy's large-scale textile creations: But as she passes into the gallery, the words "Astral Hamster" are revealed in its title. Is this mockery? A vague jab at pretension? After all, it's hard to see great inspiration in any of these works.

This is the creative industries as grind, but with oddly little appreciation for the perspiration. Artists involved in similar scenes may suffer painful pangs of recognition about the specifics of art life (especially in a running subplot about cheese), but little beyond that. This is the cinematic equivalent of a great still life of a bowl of fruit: The technique is undeniable, but it's just a bowl of fruit.

Kimchi Mentorship

How one cottage food purveyor is helping to launch careers by MELANIE HAUPT

It was always part of the plan to hire a Clifton student or two to work at the farmers' market. The way Jieun Beth, owner and founder of Kimchi Rók sees it, hiring a Clifton Career Development School culinary arts student has multiple benefits. Not only will it free up time for her and her spouse to expand the company's reach, "it will help us bring in more revenue, which means we can hire more students and grow together symbiotically."

GROWING TOGETHER

During their last three years in high school, Austin ISD students can attend specialized career technical education classes at Clifton CDS, located in Coronado Hills. They are bused from their home campuses for a half-day block on alternating days and receive instruction in a variety of subjects, including welding, plant science, early learning (child care), health care, and hospitality, including culinary arts. Clifton's culinary program is already relatively well known, having

for several years; the lunches, which cost \$9, feature an entrée, sides, and a dessert all scratch-made by Clifton students, and often feature vegetables grown on-site in the school's small garden.

Tatiana Antonio, the culinary arts teacher at Clifton CDS, reckons that about a quarter

offered Friday luncheons to the public

at Clifton CDS, reckons that about a quarter of her students pursue culinary school and jobs in the food industry. "A lot of kids will join the program because they just want to learn how to cook for themselves. And you know, it's fun and they like eating, too. I have to tell them it's Culinary Arts, not Eating Arts," she laughs.

In the second year of the culinary program (and most of the other Clifton programs as well), Antonio explains, students participate in on-site or off-site internships to gain work-related experience. This year, one of the internships available to culinary students is with Kimchi Rók, a small cottage food operation that sells a variety of kimchis at the SFC Farmers' Market at Sunset Valley on Saturdays.

"I first heard about the school from my friend, who was a special ed teacher," says Beth. She wanted to work with students with special needs, share her cultural expertise in Korean cuisine, and work together to possibly employ some Clifton culinary students.

In October 2022, Beth started working with Clifton students, spending Tuesday mornings teaching them the basics of making kimchi and developing a new product for market: kimchi mandoo (dumplings). After months of trial and error, Beth launched the mandoo at the farmers' market in February. She donated part of her sales of the mandoo back to the school. "Students have learned so much from her," says Antonio. "It has been an incredible and unique experience for [them].

"Some of our other internships with other businesses are a lot of production. They go in, it's not a give-and-take. It's not like, 'Oh, we want your feedback on a recipe.' It was just like, you know, 'Go chop these 55 onions.' It's been very different with this experience because it's been very symbiotic. So she can never leave," Antonio laughs.

LONG AND WINDING ROAD

Beth was born in College Station, but moved with her family to Southern California when she was a toddler, then to Seoul, South Korea, when she was 6. Upon returning to North America in middle school, her path wound from Vancouver to Savannah, finally landing in Austin, where she earned a Master of Fine Arts in studio art at the University of Texas.

Beth's primary identity is as a visual artist, having exhibited nationally and internationally. From 2018 to 2022, she served as the inaugural exhibit coordinator at the Austin Central Library, building an exhibition program from the ground up, curating 50 exhibits and seven public artworks while working as the director, curator, installer, and administrator. She has also served as an educator and mentor, always with an emphasis on serving her community.

She came up with the idea for Kimchi Rók in 2017, but it wasn't until the Texas Legislature updated the Cottage Food Law in 2019 that she took action. "As I was considering this business, I didn't want it to be just about profit," Beth explains. "I really wanted to bring in that social impact. My mom made really, really good kimchi. It's kind of uncommon for somebody to make their own kimchi because it's a lot of work. So when I left my previous job, I [asked myself], 'How can I [highlight an] underrepresented community?' I thought about mothers, how they can often be forgotten with their hard work and all the things they do for the family."

"I think her kimchi recipe is kind of interesting; it's different from some of the other ones out there," says Antonio.

"My mom never used sugar in the kimchi," Beth explains. Sugar precipitates the fermentation process, giving bacteria the fuel it needs to preserve the veggies. "She used Asian pears, but they're very expensive here, so we use apples instead." Beth also

uses kombu as a flavoring agent instead of MSG, a common ingredient in commercial kimchi. As a result, Beth says, "the whole jar itself is really healthy for you."

Kimchi Rók kimchi, which Beth debuted at the Sunset Valley farmers' market in October 2020, comes in three standard varieties, all sharing the same building blocks of napa cabbage, Korean radish, chile pepper, and onion: traditional, vegan, and "funky," which has been aged for three months. (Sometimes there's also an "extra funky," aged six months, available.) And as of March 2023, market shoppers can purchase kimchi pork mandoo and bulgogi kimchi fried rice, both developed in collaboration with Clifton culinary students. What's more, shoppers at the Sunset Valley farmers' market can purchase those items from Logan Nicolosi, Kimchi Rók's first Clifton hire.

PREPARING FOR LAUNCH


It's the day of the Austin Council of PTAs luncheon, and the Clifton Cafe is bustling. Teenagers hustle between tables, straightening inverted drinking glasses on top of black tablecloths and placing platters of gluten-free Mexican wedding cookies alongside baskets of multicolored morning glories, left over from the school's plant sale a few days prior. Pastel-colored balloons float above the scene, anchored on tables and carts.

"Where's Logan?" hollers Antonio, scanning the room for her student.

"Right here," a deep voice responds from across the room. Logan Nicolosi strides across the room, his street clothes covered by a pristine black apron. At around 6 feet tall, he towers over just about everyone in the room, including the adults. A black baseball cap provides cover for his hair and dramatically hoods his light blue eyes. Nicolosi, in his second year in the Clifton culinary program, has found a springboard into a future career, thanks in part to the partnership with Kimchi Rók.

At the outset of the collaboration, Nicolosi conducted independent research and started experimenting with his own kimchi fried rice recipe, distinguishing himself as just the kind of go-getter Beth was looking to bring into her kimchi community.

"He's always showing off his skills. He inspired our bulgogi sauce," says Beth. "I wanted to combine bulgogi and kimchi fried rice. Logan came up with this sugarand-soy-sauce-based sauce that is basically bulgogi sauce; it goes well with the kimchi fried rice."



farmers' market in March: Beth plans to hire more Clifton students moving forward. "We are grateful [to have] Logan, as we can now expand to participate in additional markets like the Downtown SFC Market and also use the time to make more inventory to supply to local shops," she says. "We wish our business will grow to provide job opportunities to people that appreciate the tradition of our artisan kimchi and Korean food."

Jieun Beth of Kimchi Rók

Nicolosi, who has wholly embraced the creativity inherent in recipe testing and experimentation in the kitchen, will graduate from Eastside Early College High School next month and wants to pursue cooking as a career. But first, he plans to spend the summer working at the farmers' market, in addition to working a full-time food industry job. Come October, he plans to join the Navy so that he can work as a culinary specialist and earn scholarships that will help subsidize his post-military culinary education.

"I think if you are in AISD, you should definitely try and join Clifton. And it's not like a, you know, survival-of-the-fittest kind of thing," says Nicolosi. "It's more like we work together to develop all these amazing recipes and such. You get your food handler's [card], so you can start working in fast food or an actual cooking job. It's a lot of fun, but it is hard work."

RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS: RENT PARTY'S HOT JAZZ MAKES PEACE WITH THE SWING ERA

Fridays @ the Long Play Lounge East, 7pm

Less than a mile from Downtown on East Cesar Chavez, nestled in between the thunderous dance music pumping out of the Granny's Tacos truck and the plaster Pegasus charging skyward in front of High Noon, the Long Play Lounge East sits perfectly in the sunset.

Stepping into the soft darkness, the impressive in-house vinyl collection piously stands guard like the Wailing Wall. But, of course, there aren't any records spinning because it's Friday night. Which means that from 7 to 9pm, the jazz Manouche stylings of Rent Party, as well as the dedicated dancers they attract, will be pushing the energy level and the A/C unit to the very brink.

I discovered Rent Party at the Continental Club's newly annual Tom Waits birthday tribute. At home, their 2020 release, High Five and Rotate, drove my daughter nuts by making her dance with me whenever she happened to walk by while it was playing. That was when I realized Rent Party is the perfect name for them, because they make you want to dance in your living room.

"Even people who don't know about jazz, we just prop the door open, they see the wall of dancers and they're like, 'What the hell?'" says Emily Becker, general manager of Long Play East. "It really brings them in."

Since 2015, Rent Party has been holding down a weekly residency in Austin, first coming together at the former Hyde Park cafe Dolce Vita on Sundays, where they played for just free food and coffee. Moving to Stay Gold in 2017, their flourishing endeavor was put on hold for 18 months during the pandemic. When Stay Gold became Long Play in 2020, they fired back up.

"It was never like, 'Let's start a new band,' it was more like an organic happening," remarks violin player Alen Cileli. "We really enjoy playing with each other. It's just a group of friends, so we're real tight ... We have a really good time."

This sentiment is echoed by subtly vivacious lead singer Sarah Ulloa. When asked about pros and cons of maintaining a long-term gig, she smiles and says, "Just today, I was having kind of an off day, a little depressed, but as soon as that first note hits it's like, 'There we go, happiness again." Further describing the Zen-like path to the "center of the song," she states with a low, steady calmness: "It's the best form of therapy."

That spiritually centered outlook serves Ulloa well. In addition to exercising the scat command of Sarah Vaughan lighting up the Apollo, she also pulls impressive double duty as RP's drummer on nothing more than a single snare. No small feat, considering the level of musicianship in this group.

Phil Spencer comfortably takes on more solo time than your standard double bass player, stimulating the crowd every time. Jamey Cummins and "Shakey" Jake Harrell bounce leads effortlessly, while Cummins steps it up for the vocals on "It Ain't Right Jack," a wonderfully inspired, hot club-twisted version of the closely named Ray Charles classic. The real ace in the boot for Rent Party, though, is the violin and clarinet.

After World War II, the bebop revolution basically stripped jazz down to the piano, a few horns, and a whole lot of heroin. The violin, clarinet, and banjo were essentially weeded out through natural selection. But with RP's David Jellema volleying between the clarinet and cornet and Alen Cileli rocking on violin like Stéphane Grappelli after a bottle of good wine, you can feel that connection to a young, roaring France in the Twenties.

Coming in hot to 9pm, they launch into their closer "Bei Mir Bistu Shein" ("To Me You Are Beautiful"), the song that launched both the Andrew Sisters and the popular swing music era. Although largely forgotten to pop culture, this is a crowd favorite, clearing the seats. Even the barback is on the dance floor by this point.

After the show, I ask Cummins why their set works so well in the atmosphere of a Friday night, to which he replies: "For me, it feels like a reward for making it through the week."

A year after releasing their fourth fulllength, IV, the gleaming shoegazers churned out EP Crumble, maintaining New Wave danceability while melting into deep guitar tones. On their second Friday in a row at the venue, HOT/// CAKES deliver garage eclecticism. Alt-rockers Glasshealer and the popping-up-everywhere "Where's Waldo" of the indie scene, Emily No Good, round out the bill. - Laiken Neumann
