I'M A CHAPLAIN. HERE'S WHY I OPPOSE REPLACING SCHOOL COUNSELORS WITH CHAPLAINS.

As a mother, I volunteer in my children's elementary school. I have served as a room parent, listened to children read, hosted classroom celebrations, and volunteered at a PTA fundraiser and in the classroom. I'm free to volunteer, just as other community leaders and parents do regardless of their profession.

As a board-certified chaplain and a pastor at First Baptist Church of Austin, I care deeply about spiritual discernment and flourishing faith communities. Our houses of worship and other religious institutions are free to serve the needs of families in all spiritual matters.

As both a parent volunteer and a chaplain, I urge our area school districts to keep these two roles separate. It's best for our students. It protects our parental rights.

This is an issue that we all must educate ourselves about now that the Texas Legislature passed Senate Bill 763. The law forces school districts to decide whether or not to employ chaplains or accept volunteer chaplains. Rejecting the chaplain program is the only ethical and safe choice for our children.

Some school boards are under the impression that they must approve of chaplains as volunteers in reaction to SB 763 because chaplains were not previously barred from volunteering based on their profession. This is false. No policy change is needed to allow me or any other person who happens to be a chaplain to participate in existing volunteer opportunities. Approving this new, undefined volunteer opportunity that is only for chaplains will create confusion for school leadership, embolden those who

seek to misuse the authority of chaplains to promote only one faith among public school families, and will ultimately invite lawsuits over chaplains in our schools.

Having completed three years of education for my Master of Divinity degree and an extensive internship followed by a year

of residency in clinical pastoral education, having received ordination by a local church and endorsement by a national ecclesial body within my faith tradition, having been through a rigorous certification process, and having to maintain board certification with 50 hours of continuing

education each year, I am equipped and trained to serve individuals seeking spiritual care without imposing my own faith traditions upon them. A chaplain program in public schools that does not require such training, qualifications, or eth-

ical safeguards is a danger to children and their spiritual well-being.

For these reasons and others, I joined more than 170 Texas chaplains in signing this letter opposing the creation of chaplain employment or volunteer opportunities under SB 763.

A chaplain program in public schools is unethical. It's not a safe response to the shortage of school counselors or concerns over school safety. It violates the right of parents and guardians to choose the religious leaders who influence their child's spiritual journey. Please urge school districts to reject the chaplain program.

November 7, 2023, Constitutional Amendment and County Proposition Election

STATE CONSTITUTIONAL

We've got a slew of constitutional amendments on the ballot this year coming out of the 88th legislative session. It's funky that our state does this, and for many years the Chronicle recommended voting against all such amendments in protest of cluttering the state constitution. But this is part of how our state functions, so we've done some digging through the clutter so you don't have to.

1) Protecting Bad Neighbor Farmers: NO

Texas already has a broad Right to Farm statute, which was further broadened in the last legislative session anyway. Adding a constitutional amendment on top of that is not only unnecessary, it also gives an unprecedented level of protection for agricultural businesses that are bad neighbors, creating unreasonably high standards for cities to sue over threats to public health like overuse of pesticides. Texas Farm Bureau, which represents larger agribusiness, lobbied hard for this, and organizations representing smaller farmers like the Farm and Ranch Freedom Alliance have come out against.

2) Property Tax Exemption for **Child Care Centers: YES**

Part of the reason younger generations are not having kids is because child care is too damn expensive. We should do everything we can to reduce that cost - allowing owners of child care centers to access tax exemptions for properties used to operate those facilities could help do that.

3) Blocking a Net Worth Tax: NO

Republican legislators would like to amend the Texas Constitution to prohibit a hypothetical wealth tax, or "net worth" tax, which shifts tax burden to wealthier Texans; they argue that it penalizes business owners and people who may have significant assets but low cash flow. The Legislature isn't currently considering a net worth tax, but this would eliminate the option of ever doing so.

4) Big Three Property Tax Compromise: NO

Property tax relief and increasing school funding were two of very few priorities that Democratic and Republican legislators agreed on going into the 88th legislative session. They failed to address the dire state of school funding in any meaningful way, but a big package of tax breaks for property owners - with a pittance offered to public schools - did reach Gov. Greg Abbott's desk after a second special session. Texas voters are now being asked to amend the state constitution to allow the package to take effect. This proposal devised by the state's Top Three Republicans would not add any new funding into the state's beleaguered public school system, but it would temporarily reduce the amount of revenue districts need to generate through property taxes by giving schools a one-time injection of funds from the state's budget surplus. We encourage Austin voters to reject this premise; the state should simply increase the basic allotment for schools in the state budget. This relief proposal also leaves renters out of the equation, though they indirectly pay a quarter of state school property taxes. Democrats pushed to include direct relief for renters because there's no guarantee homeowners will use tax savings to reduce or stabilize rents. That didn't make it into the proposal, and that's another good reason to vote this prop down.

5) Adding University **Funding: YES**

In the past, the University of Texas at Austin and Texas A&M University have received most of the state's available research grants. Proposition 5 would create two new funds that would provide money for research grants to some of Texas' other large universities, including Texas State University, Texas Tech University the University of Houston. and the University of North Texas. This will strengthen these universities, benefiting regional and state economic development.

6) State Water Fund: YES

A \$1 billion investment in Texas' broken water infrastructure is needed, and will address the roughly 50 gallons of water a day lost per home through leaky pipes. Part of the fund is also appropriated toward new supply projects, including marine desalination and treated fracking wastewater, as well as education programs about water loss. Sierra Club has not taken a position on Prop 6, as there are concerns about low-income rural communities not being prioritized for infrastructure investments and about the environmental and health impacts of possible supply projects, but the Chronicle feels an urgent investment in water is necessary, and we'll be watching the Texas Water Development Board for a transparent rulemaking process.

7) Incentives for New Gas Plants: NO

Though the ballot language is vague enough to seem positive, Prop 7 would actually just give low-interest loans and grants to encourage the construction of new gas plants - benefits that they already get from the private market – and literally stipulates that new battery construction projects need not apply. Yes, we need more energy sources, but this would essentially create a taxpayer-backed subsidy for gas plants alone, creating an unfair disadvantage for renewables and their backups.

8) Expanding Broadband: YES

Broadband access is not equitable in Texas, and Prop 8 would create a broadband infrastructure fund to expand high-speed internet to Texans statewide, including where private companies don't operate. This has broad bipartisan support, and the Legislature has already appropriated \$1.5 billion to the proposed fund, contingent on voters approving this amendment.

EARLY VOTING ENDS FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 3

TRAVIS COUNTY VOTERS may vote at any "vote center" (where you see a "Vote Here/Aquí" sign).

VOTER ID: Texas law requires registered voters to show one of seven forms of photo ID (current or expired within four years) issued by the Texas Dept. of Public Safety or U.S. government. Voters without photo ID may vote after signing a Reasonable Impediment Declaration and providing supporting documentation. Visit countyclerk.traviscountytx.gov/departments/elections for a list of acceptable forms of ID and supporting documentation. No photo ID is required when voting by mail, except for first-time voters who did not include ID information when registering. You will receive a notice with your ballot if ID is required.

9) Raising Teacher Retirement: YES

Retired teachers in Texas do not have a cost of living adjustment built into their retirement plans, so some retirees have trouble keeping up with their bills. This year, legislators approved such an adjustment, proposing to transfer \$5 billion from the current budget surplus to the Teacher Retirement System in order to keep it solvent. The transfer must be approved by voters, however, The Texas AFL-CIO, Raise Your Hand Texas. Texas Association of School Administrators, Texas Association of School Boards, and many other groups support this proposition, and we do too.

10) Corporate Tax Break on Medical **Devices: YES**

We're generally against tax breaks for corporations, but at least this one would go to manufacturers of medical devices and biomedical products. Let's just hope that the executives at those manufacturing companies will pass their tax savings on to hospitals and patients who need those devices.

11) Adding El Paso Parks: YES

Currently, most large counties in Texas are allowed to issue bonds to create parks and improve those they already have. El Paso County is not one of these, however, which has hampered its ability to develop a network of recreational facilities. Prop 11 would allow it to join the other counties. We support El Paso in voting to invest more in their parks.

12) Eliminating Galveston Treasurer: **NO ENDORSEMENT**

Proposition 12 would eliminate the office of the county treasurer of Galveston County effective January 1, 2024, which would mean assigning the duties of the treasurer's office to people in other county offices. There's some history in Galveston driving this proposed amendment, but the Chronicle News team is not well-positioned to report on it, so we're staying out of this one.

13) Older Judges Allowed: YES

Proposition 13 would raise the age at which state judges are required to retire from 75 to 79. As 84-year-old federal Judge David Hittner recently demonstrated in placing a temporary restraining order on the state's anti-drag bill, older judges can do a lot of good.

14) Historic Investment in State Parks: YES

This \$1 billion fund coming out of the surplus would support the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department in buying land to establish and develop new state parks, something sorely needed to conserve natural areas and to keep up with the demand of 10 million (and counting) Texans a year trying to access our current parks.

COUNTY PROPOSITIONS

Travis County will hold a bond election in conjunction with the scheduled Texas constitutional amendment election, and it's the first time in six years Travis County residents will vote on major investments in transportation infrastructure and parks. If both proposals pass, the monthly property tax impact for the owner of a median-value Travis County home will be about \$4.

Proposition A -**Transportation Projects: YES**


This \$233 million investment in transportation projects is geared toward safety and capacity. The focus will be on several substandard roads across Austin, which share features like missing shoulders and narrow lanes. Each proiect also includes sidewalks and bike lanes or shared-use paths. For most homeowners, the monthly property tax impact would be a little under \$2.

Proposition B -More Parkland: YES

With a little more than \$276 million, the county promises to acquire more land for parks and water conservation along existing greenway corridors in Lake Travis. Onion Creek, and Colorado River areas, among many others. The funds will also cover the creation of new community trails, buildings, and amenities. With rapid development in the county, if we want these areas preserved as parkland, now is the time to act. The median monthly property tax impact would be about \$2.



TESLA INVESTS IN COUNTY WORKFORCE

Last week, the **Travis County Commissioners** Court approved Tesla's \$750,000 community investment plan, to go toward community partners like the **Austin Area Urban League**. **Colorado** River Alliance, and Del Valle ISD, as the Tesla Gigafactory, the second-largest factory building in



the world, prepares to release its Cybertruck. The company's paid nearly \$2.2 billion to Travis County suppliers in 2022 alone, plus \$15 million in property taxes over the last three years. Read more online.

LUBBOCK PASSES ABORTION TRAVEL BAN

Lubbock County is now the largest county to pass a travel ban that prohibits pregnant Texas women from seeking an abortion. The ordinance passed on Monday; enforcement will be done through filing private lawsuits against the individuals deemed responsible for transportation. The Texas Tribune reported.

LOSING CRUISE? Amid a year of expansion to Miami, Nashville, and elsewhere, General Motors' **Cruise** driverless cars have become ubiquitous Downtown and notorious for behaving strangely so much so that the feds are now looking into the company. Court Is in Session

Recapping the emotional first three days of APD Officer Christopher Taylor's murder trial by Austin Sanders

Possibly the most politically important murder trial in Austin history is in its third day of evidence as the Chronicle goes to press Wednesday, Oct. 25. For prosecutors to secure a guilty verdict, they must convince the jury that when Austin Police Officer Christopher Taylor shot Michael Ramos, neither Taylor nor any other individual at the scene faced an imminent threat that justified the use of lethal force.

During the first day of testimony, Oct. 23, prosecutors emphasized that officers had access to a citywide "Be on the Lookout"


(BOLO) bulletin, written by an officer who responded to a suspected auto theft call the previous night involving Ramos. That BOLO did not include any information indicating that Ramos was armed or dangerous.

During the second day of testimony, Oct. 24, the 911 caller who prompted the fatal encounter between Taylor and Ramos took the witness stand. "If I could take that day back I would," testified Meko Scott, who called 911 on April 24, 2020, and falsely told dispatch that Ramos was armed. "I feel like I killed him."

Scott testified that before making the call, she saw Ramos and his girlfriend doing drugs in the Prius. APD detectives did not find a gun in the vehicle or at the scene during their search, which went on for two days following the shooting.

"I never saw a gun," Scott repeated from the stand, pausing at several moments to wipe tears from her eyes or to let emotions recede. "I've been dealing with this," she said at one point. "I'm having anxiety attacks." Though Scott never saw a gun, she testified that a number of people in the parking lot at the time were speaking critically of Ramos' presence at the apartment complex and that one - "a Hispanic lady," according to Scott - said that he had a gun. Through the course of their investigation, detectives with APD's Special

Investigations Unit interviewed several witnesses to the shooting but were not able to track down the woman Scott referenced.

On day two, jurors also heard from Rebeca Garcia, who had been dating Ramos at the time of his death and was sitting next to him in the Prius moments before he was fatally shot. Taylor's defense attorneys, Doug O'Connell and Ken Ervin, opted to reserve delivery of their opening arguments until after prosecutors rest their case, but questions focused on Ramos' history of drug use and engaging in criminal activity signal where their strategy is headed. O'Connell asked Garcia, "When you were driving around in [the Prius], did you happen to notice things like credit cards with random people's names on them?" Garcia said she was aware of the credit cards in the Prius, "but not in a suspicious way." She didn't think about it, Garcia said, because "during the whole relationship I felt safe and [Ramos] was my best friend."

When prosecutors questioned her, Garcia testified to the fear she felt during the encounter, as saw eight officers draw their weapons at the couple and shout orders at them. "Everything was going so fast," Garcia said. "We're looking back at each officer and they're just yelling." Garcia said she was looking for an officer who would help her and finally made eye contact with one who appeared to signal her with a head nod that she could exit the vehicle. She did and lied face down on the ground. Moments later, she heard Ramos drive off. Then, the three rifle shots that killed him.

From the stand, Garcia said that she was detained by APD for hours, during which she was barefoot and handcuffed after losing her shoes at the scene of the shooting. She described her mental state as "desperate." In his cross-examination, O'Connell asked Garcia why she jumped out of the car before Ramos attempted to flee. "It was a dangerous situation and you knew it was about to get more dangerous," O'Connell said, "because the only way out of that parking lot was through or around those police officers."

Video of the shooting from the perspective of the police officers and from civilian bystanders has already been widespread. But in court Tuesday, prosecutors presented a digital re-creation of what Ramos saw, produced by the digital forensics company Visual Law Group. Using video footage captured by the body-worn cameras on each responding officer, the dashboard cameras in their patrol vehicles, and bystander cellphones, Visual Law CEO Mark Johnson explained from the stand, his team was able to produce an "animated version of the crime scene" able to show the shooting from new vantage points.

Using a process called "photogrammetry" - which can be used to extract measurements in three dimensions from two-dimensional photos - Johnson's team was able to determine that Ramos was traveling at a speed of about 81/2 mph the first time Taylor shot him. The digital rendering viewed by jurors also showed that as Ramos fled and was shot, he was moving away from Taylor and the other officers.

On the third day of testimony, an officer who participated in the encounter that led to Ramos' death took the stand for the first time in the trial - Darrell Cantu-Harkless.

Through questioning from Dexter Gilford, who leads the Civil Rights Unit in the Travis County District Attorney's Office, and through footage from the officer's body-worn camera, prosecutors attempted to portray Cantu-Harkless as one of the only officers on scene who tried to de-escalate the confrontation. But due to the chaotic nature of the encounter, it was difficult for Ramos to remain focused on the officer.

"After some point," Gilford asked Cantu-Harkless, "was [Ramos'] attention distracted from you completely?"

"Yeah, he was focused on the rest of the officers," Cantu-Harkless responded. Footage from Cantu-Harkless' body camera showed that after Ramos was shot with a lead-pellet round and started driving away, Cantu-Harkless entered his patrol vehicle. He said he was prepared to use his vehicle as a shield to defend himself, as Austin Police Department officers are trained to do.

In their questioning, prosecutors tried to solicit testimony indicating that Cantu-Harkless did not feel he was facing an imminent threat. Gilford asked the officer - who was positioned closest to Ramos when he began to drive away - if he would ever hesitate to use lethal force if he felt himself or his fellow officers were facing a deadly threat. "No, I wouldn't hesitate," Cantu-Harkless said.

Gilford also asked the officer about the statement he gave to a detective in APD's Special Investigations Unit, which is tasked with investigating officers accused of criminal conduct. In that interview, Cantu-Harkless said that when Ramos began to drive off, his fear was that the man - who was believed to be armed but was actually unarmed - would fire a gun as he drove away from officers. Cantu-Harkless did not say, however, that he feared Ramos might use the Prius as a deadly weapon – which is a critical component of Taylor's defense strategy. (Even if Ramos wasn't armed, they can argue that the car itself was a threat.) The SIU detective interviewing Cantu-Harkless did suggest the possibility that the Prius could have been a deadly weapon, though, prompting Cantu-Harkless to give that answer.

Prosecutors are expected to continue presenting evidence the rest of this week, with Taylor's defense beginning their case next week.

State school funding can go toward daycares and Montessori schools when districts partner with them

Texas Takes the Tab

Preschool funding loophole has tax dollars going to religious schools. Who benefits? BY ROB D'AMICO

Through October, legislators have been debating whether public school money should be diverted to pay for Texans' private school tuition. But that's already happening, through a little-discussed program that some call a "loophole" or "gaming the system." Perfectly legal partnerships between public school districts and private (even evangelical Christian) pre-K schools allow districts to enroll kids in schools hundreds of miles away. The state pays for it, with districts and private schools determining their split.

While much of the opposition to private school vouchers being debated in the Legislature focuses on lost revenue to public schools, concerns about taxpayer money

funding religious education also play a significant role. Opponents to the education savings accounts (ESAs) proposed in the legislative special session say this is the foundation for a plan to significantly increase state funding to Christian schools – part of an agenda by Christian nationalists to take a bigger piece of Texas public education and the tax money funding it.

MONEY AND MILES

Those concerns about separation of church and state aren't an issue for Graydon Hicks III, superintendent of Fort Davis ISD, a small, rural district in Far West Texas. "That doesn't bother me a bit," Hicks said. As for the funding issue, Hicks has found a

way to make partnering with private schools a financial boon to his district, which was facing financial ruin after the state failed to provide any significant additional funding the past two legislative sessions. The super-

intendent is using early learning partnerships that allow districts to enroll students from private entities – usually day care and Head Start centers with pre-K kids – and share state funding allocated per pupil with the entities. In essence, it's like a voucher with state money funding private school students, but it can also pump money back to the public schools.

"Oh, it's huge," said Hicks, who estimated that with about 115 additional students, he might take in \$780,000 this year from the program. That may be chump change for a district like Austin ISD with a \$940 million budget, but it's a savior for Hicks' tiny

district, which was facing a \$500,000 deficit. "It puts me in the black and lets me start building my fund balance," he said. "I can start looking at teacher raises, facility improvements, new vehicle purchases, those kinds of things." Hicks said the district takes half of the state funding, with the rest going to the partner schools.

These partnerships began long ago in 2003 when state law changed, compelling districts to explore partnerships if they planned to create pre-K programs – a means to save taxpayer dollars by piggybacking on existing providers when districts couldn't afford to create new facilities. What wasn't intended, however, was what Hicks is doing to maximize his revenue potential: partnering with schools in faraway places from his community, sometimes hundreds of miles from his district. This year Hicks partnered with Alpine Montessori School and Alpine Christian School (both 25 miles away), Transformative Leadership Academy in Monahans (113 miles away), and, once agreements are signed, two El Paso schools (200 miles away.) Hicks is even eying Fort Worth-area partnerships some 469 miles away for next year. Hicks' strategy is not the norm, as a review of district partnerships shows only a few other districts going outside their boundaries to enroll students, and even then they're mostly close to their district.

"I wish we were in a state that fully funded public education and didn't kind of force districts to find these kinds of loopholes in order to secure funding that they need to educate their enrolled children," said Michelle Hartmann, former superintendent of Pawnee ISD, which was one of the first districts in Texas to enroll students in faraway locations. "If it's a potential pathway that brings in additional revenue for public school districts to educate their children – especially at a time when they're under-

funded – then I think schools need to look at it."

Pawnee ISD in South Texas appears to lead the state in these remote partnerships, with nine partners outside of the district – three each in the Galveston, Fort Worth, and Coastal Bend areas. Pawnee ISD Superintendent Anthony Annis, now in his first year there, said the general formula is partners

taking 60% of the state funding and the district retaining 40%. But his district generally covers staffing expenses and invests in curriculum and other upgrades for the partners, all of which only enroll pre-K

students. Key for him has been the ability to lower recapture payments to the state with the additional enrollment. The move has reduced the district's recapture from about \$3.5 million in payments to \$1.4 million. "Without those off-campus sites, we'd be like Fort Davis, facing shutting our doors."

CHRISTIAN CURRICULA

One of Fort Davis' partners - Alpine Christian School - has raised eyebrows for another reason. The evangelical Christian school promotes all students to become "effective leaders and servants for Christ" and to "establish and develop a personal relationship with God the Father through Jesus Christ." Social media accounts for the school show that prayers are said, religious imagery is found throughout the school's classrooms, and lessons involve biblical passages. The school declined to comment for this story.

It's uncertain how many partnerships are operating in Texas, because data from the Texas Education Agency is incomplete. A TEA spokesperson told us 174 partnerships are in place, but a list from the agency showed 57 districts partnering with 133 private entities. Three Dallas ISD partners two day cares and a K-12 school - include "Christian" in their names. Those schools, unlike Alpine Christian, have no reference to religion in the materials found on their websites or social media. (Directors for those schools did not return calls for comment.)

"Taxpayers should never have to subsidize private religious institutions," said Imelda Mejia, communications director for the Texas Freedom Network, a nonprofit that works to support religious freedom, and individual liberties, particularly in public education. "But the biggest concern that I see. which is what I think is a very real concern happening all over Texas, is that our legislators aren't doing their job in funding our public schools. So, administrators have to get creative and look for funding elsewhere."

Hicks said, despite his personal belief in the benefits of Christian education, that his intention is not to seek out religious schools or promote religious education. "That's not what I'm doing right here. What I'm doing here is I'm trying to take care of this public school. And this is the only tool I have left to make sure my kids are taken care of in Fort Davis." He also points out that enrolling in the Christian school is a choice made by local parents, so no one is being forced to participate in that environment.


There's another wrinkle: Despite the funding influx, Fort Davis ISD partner private schools that the Chronicle reached said they are going to keep charging their current tuition - which runs about \$5,500 to \$6,000 a

year - unless a child is eligible for free pre-K under state guidelines. The extra state revenue will provide a level of stability for schools struggling to make ends meet, they said, "We really didn't want to change and disrupt the tuition structure until we saw how this partnership would play out," said Katie Nixon, Alpine Montessori Board president, "We will continue to evaluate tuition and fees as we along." Lindsey Balderaz, the Transformative Leadership Academy director, said they're planning to use the extra state money to increase scholarships for lower-income students to afford their tuition and keep their tuition rates from inflating.

WHAT ABOUT US?

For Austin ISD and Round Rock ISD, these partnerships are hardly boons. Both districts have partner facilities, but while Fort Davis and Pawnee ISDs take about half of the state money these partnerships elicit, AISD and RRISD are giving the vast majority of the funding to their private partners.

AISD has at least 16 partner facilities under the administrative umbrella of United Way and its Success by 6 initiative, which aims to prepare kids to be academically and emotionally ready for kindergarten. "[We're] ensuring that these private schools are utilizing high-quality materials and curriculum and that their teachers are well trained, so that when these students do enter our schools at kindergarten, they're well prepared," said Jacob Reach, AISD chief officer of governmental relations. He said the program supplements a wide spectrum of pre-K and Head Start programs throughout the district, and the district only retains 6% of their added state funding for administration and training costs. "This isn't making money for the districts," he said. "It's just covering the cost."

Uneven splits benefit the private entities, but in some cases they may also be a result of the competition that the partnership model creates. For instance, Alpine ISD Superintendent Michelle Rinehart said she learned about Fort Davis ISD partnering with her local private schools when the deals were almost done, and it didn't sit well with her that a district 25 miles away was getting additional revenue for her community's kids. "I'm really of the mind that if private schools are wanting to enter these

up. As it is, they're put in a position of having to make a better offer than Pawnee.

Rinehart said districts should get "first right of refusal" in these deals, meaning the local district should be approached to gauge interest before a remote district forms a partnership.

Hartmann, who now consults with districts on educational policy, agreed on the need for a first right of refusal. "It makes sense," she said, "that if there is going to be a partnership between public and private. that it is a communitywide partnership that benefits all schools in one community, instead of private schools partnering with an outside public entity." But she said that overall, these partnerships - even remote ones - are a win-win for parents, private providers, and districts. When done right, she says, they are longstanding legal partnerships that can provide additional service to parents and students. "Often the day cares and Head Start centers can expand access to afterschool care and resources for low-income students that wouldn't be available in small school districts," she said.

While the unusual partnerships used by Fort Davis and Pawnee appear to be limited to those districts, more superintendents may embrace the idea if their budgets are stressed from losing funding to a state voucher program - something that could lead to even more tax money going to religious education.

RRISD partners with five day care and Head Start programs also under the umbrella of United Way, according to Denisse Baldwin, the district's early learning director. The district only partners with schools offering half-day programs for 3-year-olds who meet guidelines for free schooling. The additional state funding "helps lower the overhead cost for providers, whether that's for salary or for building instructional materials," she said. Baldwin said the district only takes 8% percent of the state funding, with the rest going to the providers.

Rinehart, who also called remote partnerships a "loophole" in the law, said she intends to try and form partnerships with Alpine Montessori and Alpine Christian next year, essentially taking them from Fort Davis ISD.

Pawnee Superintendent Annis said the reason his district offers private providers 60% of state revenue and other big investments in their facilities is to prevent other districts from swooping the private schools

Security Guard Nearly Killed in Machete Attack Urges **Stronger Social Safety Net**

Police union blames prosecutors by maggie Q. THOMPSON

"You know what was weird is that when it was happening, it was like the Titanic. Everybody was just eating and I was bleeding on the floor."

Corey Duncan Stewart, a longtime security guard in Austin, was working an evening shift at a restaurant in the luxury Austin Proper Hotel when a man he escorted out grabbed a machete and swung toward Stewart's neck. Stewart blocked it, and the blade sliced about halfway through his wrist. severing an artery and the ulnar nerve. Doctors told him he was only two minutes away from bleeding to death. Fortunately, he still has his hand, but it's been two months and he still can't feel two fingers.

Out of work and receiving only 70% of his previous income from workers' compensation, he's struggling with rent, pain, and nightmares. After decades in security, he must find a new line of work that doesn't require two completely functional hands. Something else he didn't expect: that the Aug. 21 attack would become political.

The man charged with Stewart's assault, Justin Bergin, has been homeless and in and out of jails for about a decade. The Austin Police Association jumped on the story, arguing that Bergin should've been in jail and that County Attorney Delia Garza was to blame.

"I see a lot of homeless guvs my age, in their mid-40s. I get it," Stewart told the Chronicle. "I feel like I've worked my ass off my entire life and I have nothing to show for it. I have no savings. I have debt. I'm a couple of bad choices away from being homeless myself, and it just seems that there's not much of a safety net for people who are on the edge. What happens when you fall through the cracks? How do you survive?"

As for Bergin, he told us he really, really wants help. "I want to see a doctor," he said. He suffered a traumatic brain injury in 2014 after being attacked with a hammer and has been prescribed several antipsychotic drugs in his life. He says during his four stays in Travis County Jail he's always received some combination of his psychiatric meds. but after every release he's been adrift. Integral Care, the county's public mental health authority, has an intake team in the jail to coordinate services post-release, but Bergin told us no one from Integral Care has ever helped him continue the prescriptions he's received while incarcerated.

A month after Stewart nearly died, the APA published a press release on the assault, saying Bergin's most recent arrest was rejected by Garza - though the County Attorney's Office tells us that's not true. They accepted the charge and Bergin was released from jail shortly after because it was a low-level, nonviolent offense. they sav.

APA wrote in the release that "Garza has made a pattern and practice of wholesale rejecting Criminal Trespass charges," seemingly calling for someone to take on the

expensive process of petitioning for Garza's removal from office. The new "rogue prosecutor" law in Texas redefines official misconduct to include a "policy of refusing to prosecute a class or type of criminal offense."

Stewart says he didn't have anything to do with that APA press release. But for him, the traumatic event crystallized how alone Travis County residents can be in their suffering. Stewart feels alone handling a sudden injury that eroded his finances overnight. He's gotten some help through GoFundMe (gofund.me/724ccc02), but not

enough to make up for lost work. The other side of the coin is Bergin. Stewart wants Bergin locked up for life now - "I feel like he's that much of a threat" - but figures he should've gotten treatment years ago.

"I feel like there should be more of a social safety net in our society," Stewart said. "To help people to get back on our feet, instead of being like, 'All right well, you fucked up, good luck with your life, good luck being homeless or maybe you'll get arrested.""

Historic Meeting in 3, 2, 1...

Get ready for an unprecedented joint meeting on land use changes

Members of the public will have the opportunity today. Oct. 26, to share their thoughts with City Council members and **Planning** commissioners on forthcoming changes to the Land Development Code that represent the most sweeping changes to the rules that regulate housing development seen in decades. These changes are intended to address Austin's affordability crisis by increasing housing supply throughout the city. The proposed LDC changes under public review are:

- Rezoning all single-family (SF) lots, citywide, to allow up to three units per lot.
- Permitting the use of tiny homes and RVs on SF lots.

- Increasing the number of unrelated adults who can live in one dwelling unit.
- Revising site regulations for duplexes, including reducing the minimum lot size for those housing types from 7,000 square feet to 5.750 square feet.

Council will not vote on any of the proposed ordinance changes at the meeting - that will happen in December, after two additional public hearings – but the hearing will serve as the first opportunity for residents to provide comment to both bodies. That makes the meeting unprecedented – it'll be the first time Council and the Planning Commission hold a joint session to hear from residents on potential LDC revisions; doing so is one

way for local governments considering zoning changes to notify property owners of the changes, a requirement under state law.

Who attends the public hearing will be interesting to observe. In the past, individuals and groups who have opposed such policies - mostly older, whiter homeowners have dominated the conversation. But that dynamic has shifted over the past year with a younger, more diverse crowd showing up to public meetings to plead for policies that would allow for more housing development.

The proposed changes mostly stem from a resolution authored by Council Member Leslie Pool that her office has dubbed the **Home Options for Middle-income Empowerment** initiative, which was approved on a 9-2 vote (CMs Alison Alter and Mackenzie Kelly against). Other ideas included in the resolution, such as reducing the minimum lot size in all SF zones to 2,500 square feet and allowing more impervious cover on those lots, are likely to be considered at a later date. - Austin Sanders

New "One-Stop Shop" for Trauma Recovery Is the First in Texas

In 2021. City Council put \$1 million toward funding a trauma recovery center where survivors of violent crime can receive clinical case management, psychotherapy, and legal advocacy. Earlier this year, Travis County matched that, and in July, Council authorized a two-vear pilot contract with the African American Youth Harvest Foundation, a nonprofit, which will operate a "one-stop shop" for those affected by violence. It's the first in Texas but follows a national model that many other cities have adopted.


Opening a TRC was one of the main priorities of the **Reimagining Public Safety Task Force** that grew out of the 2020 reckoning around the criminal justice system, aided by the city's contracted study of Austin's violent crime statistics for the newly established Office of Violence Prevention. AAYHF won the bid to be the operator largely because their building also houses around 30 other nonprofits, solving a pervasive problem in social services: "What makes us unique is not only will the referral be made to us, but we can offer a number of other services to those same clients without them leaving the building," explains Michael **Lofton**, executive director at AAYHF. "Once they have counseling, they may need food, they may need clothes, they may need a bus pass, or they may need insurance." AAYHF and its partners can also offer legal assistance, help finding housing, and job training for those recently released from prison and attempting to reenter the workforce.

"We're also working with the Juvenile Justice, Black Men's Health Clinic, and district courts Downtown - just about any and all first responders," explains AAYHF Technical Director Calvin Kelly. "We currently get a lot of referrals." The program is set up for 120 people each year of the pilot, so 240 total - but Lofton stresses that no one will be turned away. "One of the major components of the national model is this concept of assertive case management. We are not only providing interventions, but we are in many ways providing prevention."

Eligibility for the center is broad: If you've been affected by human trafficking, domestic violence. violent interactions with law enforcement, or even a car crash, vou're welcome. "We want to make sure that individuals recognize that trauma will impact their physical, emotional, psychological spaces," says Lofton, "and that there's a space here to provide that level of support they will be looking for, and very much need." Each client will be offered 16 to 32 counseling sessions with a dedicated case worker, depending on their needs.

Council Member Vanessa Fuentes, who chairs the **Public Health Committee** that will receive updates on the center's progress, says this model is a step in the right direction compared to current practices, where the Austin Police Department's Victim Services counselors show up on-site, but a week after the crime. "There's no response, there's no coordination." says Fuentes. "I think that is a perfect example of how our systems are flawed, and why we really have to think through systems-level approaches."

Fuentes hopes the center can expand and scale to serve more Austinites in the future with the help of state or federal funding: "By establishing it with our governmental partners, we are opening up the pathway for sustainability for years to come," she says. The efficacy of the center will be measured by many metrics, including whether there is a repeat violent incident or the center secures the person housing, services, or jobs: "But probably the most significant thing is that you can't quantify the impact this is going to have on someone who's just gone through a horrific ordeal." - Lina Fisher





The Vile Bodies of Saltburn

Emerald Fennell's follow-up to Promising Young Woman opens Austin Film Festival BY RICHARD WHITTAKER

A Conversation With Emerald Fennell

Don't let the fancy mansion fool you. While Emerald Fennell's aristocratic erotic thriller Saltburn has been compared to the standard novels of the English gentry - the homoeroticism of E.M. Forster, and Evelvn Waugh's end-of-an-era mournfulness - darker-minded dramatists loom over their shoulders. The scathing sociological insights of Harold Pinter. The twisted psychosexual politics of Joe Orton. "It's impossible for me to not acknowledge what comes before," the writer/director noted, "to pretend that this exists in a vacuum." Instead, she relishes playing with the audience's metatextual acquaintance with her

antecedents "as a way of making the game a little more complicated and surprising."

Both playwrights' stories often dealt with interlopers, "with these subversive, deep, sexual, masculine power[s]," said Fennell, an Oscar winner for her script for 2020's Promising Young Woman. "That's always something I'm fascinated by."

It's a fascination that is overt in Saltburn, the story of two Oxford students - poor orphan Oliver Quick (Barry

Keoghan) and gilded aristocrat Felix Catton (Jacob Elordi). It's a love story, but "not necessarily falling in love with a person," Fennell said. "It's falling in love with the person you might be, you might create of yourself. Because so much of it is the reflected glory of someone loving you back."

When Felix opens the gates of Saltburn, the family estate, to Oliver, the question is whether it's a spider inviting the fly into his

web or the innocent bird hosting a cuckoo in its nest. Regarding that clash between depravity and naivete, Fennel mentioned Hilary Mantel's historical novel Wolf Hall "and what she said about being in the court of the king being like playing with the lion. You're tousling its hair, and all the time you're thinking, 'Those claws, those claws,

Like many such tales of the landed gentry, Saltburn is a period piece - although, unlike most, not set in the Edwardian or interwar eras, but in the mid-2000s. The timing, however, was not simply so Fennell could include a literally killer needle drop of Sophie

Ellis-Bextor's "Murder on the Dancefloor." In those Gothic country house dramas, she said, "it's always somebody looking at a time they couldn't get over, so it has to be long enough for them to be obsessed. but not so long that it was practically difficult. So about 15 years felt about right."

The timing also adds a certain awkward pleasure due to the mercurial vicissitudes of "the trend cycle," she observed. Set any earlier, "it would have

been Nineties, Y2K, which is already cool. and if it had been set now it would have felt like a Voque photo shoot, something beautiful. But 15 years ago, no matter how sexy you were, a 'Carpe Diem' tattoo and a bad St. Tropez tan, it's humanizing."

However, whatever the period, Saltburn Manor itself represents a particular convention of the genre: the stately home that operates outside of time. It's not so much a building as a system, above the petty

concerns of those that connive and scheme within its oak-paneled and curtain-draped walls. "It's a place where things are cleaned up without you even knowing," she said, "where mirrors that are broken in the night are magically fixed. ... A place where everything is seen but nothing is said."

That's why it's vital to keep as close an eye on majordomo Duncan (Paul Rhys) as he does on his charge: not the entitled and ennobled Catton family, but Saltburn itself. Fennell recalled, "I said, 'Duncan is the house,' and he said, 'Yes, I know what you mean.' A lot of other actors were like, 'Oh, yes, metaphorically,' but I would always go, 'No, no, no, Duncan is the house. He's the embodiment of it,' [and] Paul was the only person who profoundly understood what I meant."

However, don't ask her where the real Saltburn is, because she's not telling. All she gives away is that it's somewhere that has never been seen onscreen before. "It needed to feel like a discovery," and that was challenging "because one of our most successful exports has been the British country house in our media, so we're very, very familiar with them. So it was about finding somewhere deeply special that felt like a secret place."


The fictional Saltburn itself is laid bare during that all-important needle drop. The song accompanies the film's denouement, an epic tracking shot built around an extraordinary and daring moment for Keoghan, who Fennell described as "a perfect Pinter or Orton performer. ... When it comes to things that may feel to other actors difficult or transgressive or exposing, he has none of that. He's incredibly comfortable and confident in his body, so as an actor watching him is thrilling."


There's a constant line of questioning with Fennell's work of how she "gets" actors to perform certain scenes. "There's a hint of coercion," she observed, but that couldn't be further from the truth. "Because of the nature of things that I make and the scripts, what you find is that people are either all in or not for them. And what I end up with is people who are, from the beginning, all in."

"The point of the movie is not to look away," she concluded, "We're inviting people to feel something that may be complicated, and to do that all of you have to be committed right from the beginning."

Saltburn will be released in theatres on Nov. 17 by Amazon MGM Studios Distribution.

Chase Joliet's debut feature shows its Austin roots BY RICHARD WHITTAKER

Grapefruit may not have been filmed in Austin – but it may as well have been.

Receiving its world premiere at this year's Austin Film Festival, the gentle comedy is the feature debut of writer/ director Chase Joliet, who called it "a story about three broken people who save

each other." In it, Joliet plays Travis: Recently released from prison, he's moved in with his mom (Rosanna Arquette) as he struggles with sobriety, rehabilitation, and the chaotic influence of fellow recovering addict Billie (Joliet's wife, Steph Barkley).

Audiences may recognize Dallas native and former Austinite Joliet from Texas projects like

Krisha, Zombex, and Buck Alamo or (a Phantasmagorical Ballad) - the latter directed by another Austinite, Benjamin Epstein, who also produced Grapefruit. They may also recognize another Austin-to-California transplant, Ashley

Rae Spillers (Zero Charisma, Saturday Morning Massacre), with whom Joliet took acting classes at Laurel Vouvray's Austin studio, and local funny man David Lucas, amongst others.

Yet, Grapefruit actually filmed in Tracy, Calif., "which is this small town east of

San Francisco," said Joliet. It's producer Brooke Dooley's hometown, "and it's such a small town to where she could call anybody and be like, 'Oh, I used to go to high school with her,' 'Oh, I know the guy at the bus stop.' We would literally get on a bus, tell the bus driver, and he'd be like, 'OK.' We'd film on the bus all night."

And it's not quite accurate to say that

Grapefruit wasn't filmed in Austin. Eagleeyed viewers may recognize that one scene was shot at a particular bus stop on South Congress. "I flew out, I had a small team in Austin, and we just shot that in two hours one night."

However, Joliet didn't want to tie Grapefruit to one location, but rather "a universal Americana" - and most especially the abstract Middle America of author Raymond Carver, who he was reading heavily while he wrote the script. "I wanted it to feel like it can be anywhere, because this story happens everywhere." Moreover, he wanted to evoke Carver's empathetic depiction of his troubled, complicated characters. "We're all imperfect, we're all flawed, and I think that's beautiful."



Review: The Year That Broke Politics

How the 1968 election became a preview of our modern political mayhem by JAY TRACHTENBERG

Worldwide, 1968 was guite a political year, but especially so here in the United States. With the country deeply divided much like it is today, there was discord everywhere you looked. The war in Vietnam was raging, the Civil Rights struggle was in full flower, civil unrest was the order of the day, and an all-important presidential election was on the horizon.

These events set the backdrop for the contentious political campaign that would follow. Luke A. Nichter, a history professor specializing in presidential studies at Chapman University, brings it all into sharp focus in The Year That Broke Politics: Collusion and Chaos in the Presidential Election of 1968, a painstakingly well-researched (there are as many pages of footnotes as text) and largely engrossing narrative. With the benefit of a 50-year perspective and the opening of previously unavailable archives, Nichter (The Last Brahmin: Henry Cabot Lodge Jr. and the Making of the Cold War) takes a fresh look at 1968 with an eye for reexamining some long-held but questionable beliefs on both sides of the aisle.


The book concentrates on four main characters: outgoing President Lyndon Johnson; vice president and Democratic presidential candidate Hubert Humphrey: former vice president and Republican presidential nominee Richard Nixon; and, most interestingly, American Independent Party candidate George Wallace. (Evangelist Billy Graham appears throughout as a major supporting figure.) Besides devoting an entire chapter to each, Nichter weaves his narrative by deftly examining the fascinating relationships between all of these players, none more intriguing than that of Johnson and Nixon, longtime rivals realizing they have common cause.

In fact, LBJ was more partial toward Nixon than Humphrey because he felt the former would better sustain his legacy and a Republican victory would keep him as the most powerful Democrat. even out of office. Humphrey, as VP and candidate, needed to promise a quick wind-down of the war to satisfy his increasingly angry base while not undermining LBJ's less dovish gestures toward peace, trying in vain to stay in the president's good graces.

During all this, former Alabama Governor George Wallace proves to be a direct precursor to Donald Trump. A scrappy and effective campaigner running a third-party, populist campaign geared heavily toward the blue-collar, rural South, he eschewed his previous blatantly racist rhetoric and instead railed against Johnson's Great Society programs ("big government"), public education, crime, and civil rights legislation. He would garner almost 10 million votes - 13.5% of all ballots cast.

Richard Nixon, having lost the presidency to JFK in 1960 and the California governorship two years later, would make a spectacular comeback in 1968. Running basically as a moderate between the anti-war, Great Society Democrats and the populist Wallace, Nixon had a huge lane he could fill. More highly organized and well-funded than his rivals, he became the "law and order" candidate, promising to quell the unrest in the cities and on college campuses, striking a nerve with the great "silent majority." And quite frankly, after eight years of Democrats in the White House and a tumultuous nation seemingly out of control, the voters were more than ready for a change. It was Nixon's time, and he would have won in a landslide had Wallace not been on the ballot.



Nixon was greatly disliked by the press, and Nichter seems to bend over backward to try and rehabilitate his image, especially in reexamining charges of treason leveled at Nixon for allegedly trying to undermine the Paris peace talks just days before the election.

I was particularly drawn to this book, as the first half of 1968 was my last semester of high school; indeed, Bobby Kennedy was shot two weeks prior to my graduation. My first semester of college coincided with the fall campaign, back when it didn't get serious until after Labor Day. Under 21 and therefore unable to vote, my friends and I were still highly engaged, as being drafted and sent to fight in Vietnam was a major concern for us. Nichter's insightful scrutiny of such an extraordinary and ultimately prescient year has certainly helped to clarify events that, 50 years on, may no longer be top of mind.



"That's probably the best part about doing what I do; booking, curating and scouting new talent," De Leon says. "I love forming new relationships with the queer people I work with, having them perform at a Sister Fisters showcase and then seeing the trajectory of their artistry grow afterward." But, she adds, sometimes the impetus is a lot simpler: "Sometimes I just think to myself, 'What kind of party would I personally like to go to? What kind of show do I want to see?' and then I make it happen," De Leon says. "Every Sister [Fisters] showcase has a unique point of view and there is a story being told."

De Leon recalls the origins of the Sister Fisters title as a fun band name for her and a friend's burgeoning musical ambition. "I wanted us to have a name that was feminine, in your face, and cutting edge," De Leon says, "in the similar sense that the name 'Bikini Kill' sounds." However, after the realization that neither party had instrumental talent, De Leon filed the band name away until a year later when making the case to Swan Dive's booker why she, then-security at Barbarella, could fill an open date in the venue's calendar. "He gave me the date to throw an event and asked what my booking production name was going to be," De Leon remembers. "[Without] a second thought I immediately said, 'Sister Fisters.' And so it goes! The name isn't for everyone but neither are we."



Elsewhere Garden Bar & Kitchen is no saint, but it's a lovely beer garden in a lush stand of trees overlooking the San Antonio River on the outer edges of downtown San Antonio, away from all the tourist haunts.

Readers of the **San Antonio Current** have chosen the 3-year-old establishment as the Best Bar for the last two years. The title is well deserved.

Walking into the bar is like entering a neighbor's well-kept backvard. The pair of giant topiary giraffes flanking a sign that says "Be Kind" at the entrance sets the laid-back atmosphere.

This is such a chill place, it hardly needs misters to cool the hot summer air. A large covered pavilion reminiscent of an outdoor, oldworld beer hall attracts most of the patrons. Off to the side, a line of **porch swings** overlooks the river and the occasional barge filled with tourists.

Of course, man and woman cannot live on ambience alone. The bar offers almost **five dozen beers**, including a fair representation of local and regional craft brews. A full bar services everyone else.

The food menu is basic pub grub done well. It covers an assortment of food groups between two slices of bread headlined by a big, juicy hamburger. The Philly cheesesteak sandwich with waffle fries is the star of the show. The kitchen landed a win for Best Bar Food in the Current's Best of San Antonio list last year.

THE VERDE REPORT BY ERIC GOODMAN

What's Next for Austin FC as the Page Turns to 2024

Ding-dong, the wicked **Austin FC** 2023 season is dead.

That's reason enough for Verde fans to celebrate this Halloween weekend, after Saturday's 1-1 draw against the **San Jose Earthquakes** officially brought ATXFC's dreadful year to a close. Now the club's attention shifts to an offseason that Sporting Director **Rodolfo Borrell** has repeatedly promised will bring significant change, even as polarizing head coach **Josh Wolff** is set to return.

In retaining and publicly backing Wolff, Borrell has made a clear statement that he believes Austin FC's main issue this past season was not poor coaching, but rather a broken roster. This columnist tends to agree. Outside of one star in **Sebastián Driussi** and a handful of solid pieces in Brad Stuver, Dani Pereira, Leo Väisänen, Jon Gallagher, and Owen Wolff, the club's payroll is an absolute mess. But what can Borrell and company realistically hope to accomplish in just one offseason, and where should they start?

IMPENDING FREE AGENTS

Plucky veteran winger **Ethan Finlay** is already no longer an ATXFC player after his contract with the club expired at the end of the regular season. As many as six other players – namely, Will Bruin, Hector Jimenez, Adam Lundqvist, **Alex Ring**, Memo Rodríguez, and Maxi Urruti – could join Finlay on the open market if the club elects to decline each of their 2024 options, freeing up as much as \$3.7 million in salary.

That's exactly what Austin FC should do. Of the players in question, only Ring made significant contributions to the club's limited success in 2023, but not enough to justify another year at his \$1.65 million Designated Player salary number. He's unlikely to command anything close to that on the open market entering his age-33 season. So even if Borrell views Ring as an important cog in the club's 2024 plans, it should be at a renegotiated, much lower figure.

ADD A THIRD "REAL" DP

Restructuring Ring's deal would have another benefit in that it would free up a Designated Player spot for Borrell to sink his teeth into. As things stand, though, that DP

would be capped at the relatively limited \$1.65 million wage because Austin FC also employs two **U22 Initiative** (young DP) players. Here's where Borrell will really earn his money.

To be frank, Austin FC has failed the U22 Initiative experiment. Žan Kolmanič, due in large part to injury, has yet to develop into a true difference-maker. Moussa Djitté, meanwhile, spent the entire season on loan in France and Turkey and does not appear to have a place in the Verde plans. If Borrell can find a way to offload both of those players from the ATX books, the club would be entitled to a third "true" DP spot with an unlimited salary figure to join the likes of Driussi and (the thus far very underwhelming) Emiliano Rigoni.

If Borrell has sights on bringing a big-name European star – the kind he spent the last three decades working with – to Austin, that's how it would have to happen.

START THE YOUTH MOVEMENT

On Sunday, **Austin FC II** defeated **Columbus Crew 2** 3-1 in the final of the 2023 **MLS NEXT Pro Playoffs**, winning the league in the team's first year of existence. It's a pretty remarkable achievement, and multiple players could be ready to make the jump to the senior team for 2024.

Austin FC should prioritize getting some of the "FCito" grads into the fold next year when appropriate. CJ Fodrey, Valentin Noël, and Sébastien Pineau are all deserving of a serious look.

Working Man's Blues in The Killer

Fincher and Fassbender deflate the assassin myth in this deadly metaphor about modern capitalism by RICHARD WHITTAKER

There are few more overblown creations of fiction than the jet-setting hit man, taking lucrative contracts to murder the rich and powerful, then disappearing into the night. In David Fincher's The Killer, all the efforts by the titular unnamed assassin (Fassbender) to add a level of philosophical sheen through a constant internal monologue are soon revealed as little more than desperate attempts at self-justification for the world's most tedious job.

Fincher initially pulls off a bait-and-switch with opening credits that speak both to his kinetic Fight Club and to every recent James Bond - which, superficially, Fassbender seems to be

auditioning for. But this collapses into a halfhour of exquisite, beautifully crafted tedium as the killer sits in a room and waits. This is Fincher as minimalist, distracting the audience with the building tension as the killer waits in an empty Paris office for his target to appear - which he finally does, accompanied by a leather-and-PVC-clad sex worker (Ganderton).

The scene is voyeuristic, but there's a twinge: The killer and the dominatrix are one and the same, both being hired to inflict pain for the pleasure of the wealthy. When the hit inevitably goes awry and the Killer has to pay the consequences for his failure - edging his client without the promised explosion - the temptation is to ignore that twinge. But that would be a mistake.

> Reunited with Se7en scriptwriter Andrew Kevin Walker for this adaptation of long-running French graphic novel series Le Tueur, Fincher isn't really that interested in the actual mechanics of assassination: Even

though the Killer mentions rare and devious methods of murder, almost every death comes courtesy of that most unskilled and brutish of weapons, a gun, Rather fascinatingly, the Killer doesn't compare himself to other professionals, but to straightahead serial killers, totally deflating any mythologizing. Instead, it's really a character

study of a working-class stiff of the kind that Raymond Carver would enjoy, who would work in a factory that sounds like the score by Trent Reznor and Atticus Ross, barely music but more rhythmical pops, fizzes, and growls.

Fincher and Fassbender build up the Killer in little details that seem prosaic: his tastes in food, in music, in TV shows, and his reliance on a mantra from which he strays more and more with every repetition. To reinforce that structure, the narrative is split into chapters that all demark a target, and each is given a monologue. While all eyes will be on Tilda Swinton as a fellow assassin, it may well be that delivered by Kerry O'Malley as Dolores, a lawyer's personal assistant, that is the most powerful: evocative, indeed, of Jennifer Carpenter's heartrending turn in Dragged Across Concrete as the innocent bank teller caught in the crossfire. Dolores is far from innocent, but she presages and amplifies Fincher and Walker's ultimate point about modern capitalism. The finale may infuriate some, but in this sharp-edged metaphor, it's the only one that makes sense.

INSPECTOR SUN

It's undeniable that the old serialized detective adventures remain thrilling romps. It's also true that some of them are very hard to watch because of the amount of gross racism and stereotyping that they contain. Even watching the greatest cinematic Chinese American hero, Charlie Chan, is tough once you realize it's Swedish actor Warner Oland in yellowface.

So for adults hoping they can share some of the delicious period design and stylish antics without having to recoil at shameful accents and orange peel teeth, animated whodunit comedy Inspector Sun is the perfect replacement.

The script by Rocco Pucillo clearly is woven out of the threads of that bygone era of dastardly villains, quirky but charismatic gumshoes. valiant sidekicks, femme fatales, and a certain pre-war stylishness. It all begins with Inspector Sun (Chieng), a copper whose antics garner him newspaper headlines and the ire of his chief. He's also lost a leg, which brings him down to seven: Yes, Sun is a spider, and everyone in this adventure is an insect, arachnid, or bug of some kind. They live, as bugs do, alongside us, and so when Sun is unceremoniously ousted from the force after yet another botched investigation, he decides adventure awaits in New York. His mode of transportation: the miniature compartments reserved for creepy-crawlies on a flying boat. This is, after all, the Golden Age of travel, where everyone wore suits or dresses, there were jazz bands in the dining room, luggage was monogrammed, and there was a corpse that met a premature end. Luckily for everyone, Inspector Sun is here to save the day!


Well, except that he's a bumbling fool, a preening dolt in a fancy suit with an immaculately waxed pencil mustache. The only creature alive that has more faith in Sun than Sun is his unwanted new assistant, Janey the hyperactive jumping spider (voiced with suitable verve by Kleimo), and the only person who needs Sun to solve the inevitable in-flight murder is the titular black widow (Greer) who, even more inevitably, is in the hot seat for the murder of her tycoon husband, Dr. Bugsy Spindlethorp (Geer).

Inspector Sun takes all those tropes and gives them fresh life that will make little kids want to don a fedora and start talking about life on these mean streets - even if Sun wouldn't wear so gauche a piece of headwear. Much of the comedy is derived from his idiocy and eventual somewhat redemption, with thrilling action sequences and a good handful of poop jokes thrown in for good measure. Well, what do you expect when the pilot is a fly?

Its former, fuller title of Inspector Sun and the Curse of the Black Widow gives clues as to aspirations to make this the first strand in

a web of intrigue for Inspector Sun. Honestly, that wouldn't be a bad thing. This first film is a delight, a giddy old-school serial adventure romp that will introduce kids to the wonders of vintage cinematic detectives.

SUITABLE FLESH

D: Joe Lynch; with Heather Graham, Barbara Crampton, Bruce Davison, Judah Lewis, Johnathon Schaech. (R. 99 min.)

Do you remember good, ol'-fashioned American sleaze? Joe Lynch does.

Not just that, but Lynch remembers that one of the absolute masters of sweaty innuendo and lascivious excess was also a master of horror: Stuart Gordon. While he may be best remembered for the gore that oozed out of every frame of his adaptation of H.P. Lovecraft's "Herbert West-Reanimator," there was an equal amount of subversive sexuality at play. Lynch doesn't shy away from the feverish raunchiness that lurked just under the surface – or beneath revealing leather lingerie. That's only fitting, since he is literally picking up where Gordon left off: by bringing one of his unproduced projects, scripted by Gordon's longtime collaborator Dennis Paoli, to the screen.

Suitable Flesh is a loose but still loyal adaptation of another Lovecraft story, 1933's "The Thing at the Doorstep." There have been multiple adaptations before, most emphasizing the gothic aspects of the tale of body-swapping horror, but none so unrelentingly horny, starting with the casting of two actors with pivotal roles in the maturation of film audiences of certain ages: Boogie Nights' Rollergirl herself. Heather Graham, and the wearer of those infamous leather undergarments in Gordon's From Bevond, Barbara Crampton.

But sex is the last thing on anyone's mind when they're first introduced, as clinical

psychiatrist Dr. Daniella Upton (Crampton) is off to meet her newest and most dangerous patient: her old friend and colleague Dr. Elizabeth Derby (Graham), locked up for not just a hideous murder but extensive abuse of a corpse. In a Gordon-esque flashback, she explains exactly what happened and how it involves her own patient, Asa Waite (Lewis), and his conviction that his decrepit and degenerate daddy, Ephraim (Davison), is trying to steal his body.

That Stuart Gordon saucy twist comes in with the idea of using someone's flesh for your own pleasures, and while Elizabeth finds her heart melting for poor Asa, her compassion turns to passion whenever he seems to undergo a personality change and ... well, let's just say the Massachusetts Board of Registration of Psychologists might not approve of their sessions on (and under and up against) the couch.

For most of its run, the greatest volume of body fluid in Suitable Flesh is definitely sweat. as Elizabeth violates her Hippocratic oath on her scratchy office carpet with Asa, then goes home to her perpetually shirtless husband, Edward (Schaech, having a blast as a silver-fox himbo). Crampton, a Gordon regular, leaps back into the lascivious fray with wild abandon, but it's Graham who really gets to scratch the story's freaky itch. And that's complicated by the body-swap plot: After all, this is a story where just about everybody ends up inside of everyone else (pun most definitely intended). This means an incredible interplay between Graham and Lewis, which has to be by turns tender, terrifying, and randy.

And it's a particular kind of sexy that Lynch is going for, the salacious and sultry sensuality of the Eighties, complete with constant sax solos. Honestly, this may be the only horror film that invokes Red Shoe Diaries and Cthulhu equally.

Would Gordon approve? One would like to think yes, and not just because of the suitably grisly and titillating mixture of sex and violence, but because Lynch made a horror-sex-comedy for adults, one in which sexuality - especially the sexuality of women in their 50s and 60s - isn't something of which to be afraid. Now that's hot. ***1



RECIPES AND STORIES BY JOEL FRIED + INTRODUCTION BY MELANIE HAUPT

The life cycle of an Austin restaurant is contingent upon many factors: its appeal, its culture, its location. There are also external factors: the price of rent, changing demographics, global pandemics. The longer a restaurant's tenure, the more likely it is to render itself an indelible part of Austin's history. These restaurants become part of the city's fabric, attracting tourists and celebrities and amassing stories that enter into local lore, passed along by local old-timers and service industry veterans.

One way to celebrate historic Austin restaurants that are no longer with us is to revisit iconic recipes, as we did in last year's (award-winning!) "Dearly Departed Dishes" feature. Just like last year, Joel Fried of Eldorado Cafe has amassed a handful of recipes from beloved restaurants from Austin's past. This year's entries are Basil's, Mars, and the Night Hawk (last year's list: Threadgill's, Holiday House, Las Manitas, and the Stallion Grill). This time, though, he sat down with folks associated with those

Cooking, who got his start in the hospitality industry at the iconic Night Hawk restau-

rant. The result is a raucous and touching

assemblage of celebrity sightings, innova-

tion, pragmatism, and community building.

The recipes Joel has assembled with the help of his industry peers are both artifacts from these important, erstwhile restaurants and avatars of all those stories waiting to be told to anyone who'll slow down

BASIL'S PECHE ANGELICA

This past year, Austin came close to having our own Chris Rock and Will Smith moment at the Basil's reunion. It was the first time owners Alan Lazarus and Marshall Slacter had been in the same room since their breakup decades ago. Rather than slapping each other, they were able to hug it out, much to the relief of the former Basil's staffers gathered in the room.

"Yep. We buried the hatchet ... just not in each other," joked Slacter. Considering some of the challenges the two shared during Basil's run, ending a 35-year feud should have been easy.

Basil's was almost the restaurant that wasn't thanks to the Memorial Day flood of 1981. Imagine spending months meticulously planning your opening on a shoestring **BASIL'S** budget, hitting auctions to find cheap 900 W. 10th equipment, hiring friends and family to (1982-2003) help with the construction, and leveraging every relationship you have to open, only to receive a call in the middle of the night that your restaurant is gone.

Lazarus and Slacter went to bed that night with three buildings on their restaurant property and woke up with two. Unfortunately, the missing building housed the recently purchased kitchen equipment. This included a gigantic 10-burner double oven range and a three-door fridge, which apparently were floating south toward San Antonio. The main building survived because a dumpster had been pushed up against it, protecting it from the rushing waters.

The pair was able to secure an emergency Small Business Administration loan through a relief program, purchased the property from a retired judge, and bought replacement kitchen equipment from the Ogdens, who ran the

apocalyptic-looking restaurant graveyard on Oltorf in South Austin.

Once opened, Basil's quickly established itself as the go-to place. There were regular celebrity sightings in the small house at West 10th and North Lamar, Kim Basinger dined almost nightly while shooting the 1987 romantic comedy Nadine, ordering her favorite pasta pomodoro, Ann Richards frequently showed up unannounced. Lazarus would put a tablecloth on a prep table back in the kitchen, where Richards wouldn't stop talking or smoking while she dined. These days, fancy restaurants harness cigar smoke in cognac snifters to provide

> a smoky essence to desserts and savory dishes. Back then, we could just use our governor's cigarette smoke.

Growing up in NYC, Lazarus' passion was Italian food. Being across the street from the original Whole Foods afforded him a vast ingredient selection. With a solid kitchen crew, including The Austin Chronicle's own Virginia B. Wood as his first pastry chef, Lazarus and his crew churned out great food and began to develop national notoriety. Bon Appétit magazine featured his popular Peche Angelica, a seared wild redfish topped with sautéed artichoke hearts, jumbo lump crabmeat, and a Dijon mustard cream sauce.

Though considered fancy, Basil's never felt stuffy or uppity. It was a great place to take a date or someone special as it offered a genuine, comfortable, and relaxed atmosphere with delicious food and professional yet friendly service. Or as Barbara Chisholm described it in the Chronicle in 2000, "The place screams - no, whispers - romance."

PECHE ANGELICA

INGREDIENTS

four 5-ounce redfish fillets 4 teaspoons salt seasoned flour for dredging 4 ounces butter 4 ounces olive oil 1 teaspoon garlic, minced 1 teaspoon shallot, minced 12 ounces artichoke ½ cup white wine 1½ cups heavy whipping cream 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard 12 ounces jumbo lump crabmeat

PROCEDURE Season each redfish fillet with a teaspoon of salt. Season both sides. Dip each fillet flesh-side in flour. Shake off excess and place on plate, ready to be cooked. Heat 2 ounces oil and butter in large sauté pan over medium-high heat until melted and butter foam has subsided. Carefully place each fillet in pan skin-side down with tail folded under to make an even fillet. Cook for about 2 minutes until bronzed on the side. Flip and cook other side approx. 2 min-

utes until fish is barely cooked through. Place on warmed plate. Remove excess oil and butter. Add the second 2 ounces of oil and butter. Heat over medium-high heat until butter melted and foam subsided.

Add the garlic and shallots and sauté until fragrant and they start to soften.

Add artichokes and white wine. Reduce the white wine by half. Add cream and Dijon mustard. Mix until well incorporated into cream. Reduce cream until thickened.


Stir in crabmeat. Adjust seasonings as needed. Spoon crab mixture equally over

the redfish.

Garnish with

chopped parsley.

MARS' RICE PAPER SHRIMP AND FIVE-SPICED BABY BACK RIBS WITH CHINESE BBQ SAUCE

It was hard to decide what excited and delighted you more about a visit to Mars restaurant in the Nineties. Was it the sleek interior with intensely deep red walls? Or was it the talented and dynamic kitchen that had complete freedom (and a tandoori oven) to globe-trot and create any dish they could imagine with delicious results?

Virginia B. Wood described the interior as "uniquely incendiary" and she had a point. Mars was sexy. The candlelit dark booths were cozy and romantic. Each one felt like a private chef's table due to its proximity to the open kitchen. Elegant light fixtures hung from a blue ceiling with stars. However, it was the walls that I truly remember. It took a team of painters almost two months to layer and texture MARS 1610 San Antonio

seven different colors of red to create walls so intense customers could feel them as much as see them. One step into Mars and it was obvious this was not another cafe slinging Tex-Mex or barbecue. This was something new and different.

Georgia Coleman, the original owner, chose the tiny house on San Antonio because she had grown up nearby in Clarksville and her father's law firm had been a few doors down. The address had also been home to the original Oat Willie's, which for some reason was also the forwarding address for many musicians. It wasn't uncommon to see Doug Sahm and other local troubadours swinging by Mars to pick up their royalty checks and mail at the restaurant's bar.

The interior provided the perfect stage for the unique food the kitchen produced. Tim Kartiganer, Georgia's partner and Mars' original chef, had just returned from California. He'd worked in some notable Los Angeles

kitchens that showcased ingredients not common in Texas restaurants at the time. The food was never stuffy or pretentious but it was adventurous. Tim would search MT Supermarket for things that looked cool and then teach himself how to cook it. His first menus included items like a beef tenderloin with soy mushroom reduction, lamb kofta, Thai bouillabaisse, hummus/baba ghanouj with herbed naan, and five-spiced baby back ribs glazed with a Chinese barbecue sauce.

Shortly after Tim and Georgia sold Mars to Lori Simon, she hired a chef named John Bullington. Together, they carried on the culture

of culinary adventure and kind treatment of the staff. While every restaurant in this article is greatly missed by longtime Austinites, the loss of Mars places a marker for when Austin changed from a sleepy laid-back town brimming with live music to the more polished and modern version we know today.

"Mars represented a period that was special. When it closed, Austin went the way of tweezers," Bullington commented. There is no doubt that the food is fancier, the chefs are better trained, and they execute with more discipline than we did back in the day, but that also comes with more pressure. We were not cooking under the judgment of social media and heavily funded PR teams. Bullington said he was always able to keep things in perspective: "At the end of the day," he deadpanned, "all the hard work, all the stress we put into our jobs just ends up in the toilet. We are nothing more than glorified poop artists."

FIVE-SPICED **BABY BACK RIBS** WITH CHINESE **BARBECUE SAUCE**

INGREDIENTS

2 racks baby back ribs 5 star anise 2 cinnamon sticks 2 tablespoons cloves, whole 5 árbol chiles 1 ounce salt 1 ounce brown sugar water to cover barbecue sauce ½ bunch cilantro, chopped ½ bunch scallions, chopped

PROCEDURE

Cut ribs into 4 rib sections. Place ribs and rib seasonings in pot. Cover with 1 inch of water. Bring to boil and simmer 30-40 minutes or until tender. 4 tablespoons hoisin sauce 4 tablespoons plum sauce 2 tablespoons oyster sauce 2 tablespoons soy sauce 1 tablespoon sesame oil 1 tablespoon brown sugar 1 tablespoon sambal chili paste 1 tablespoon garlic, pureed 1 tablespoon ginger. freshly grated

PROCEDURE

Mix the ingredients thoroughly until smooth.





RICE PAPER SHRIMP

INGREDIENTS

1 package rice paper 15 shrimp, large, peeled 1 red bell pepper, julienned 1 serrano, sliced thinly bowl of water for softening rice paper

PROCEDURE

Dip rice paper in water and place on a dry tea towel or kitchen towel.

Place some portion of vegetables on rice paper and top with 1 shrimp.

Wrap by folding in the sides and roll up tightly, like a burrito.

Pan sear on each side, 1-2 minutes per side until shrimp is cooked through and paper is crispy. Serve with wasabi dipping sauce.

INGREDIENTS

THE NIGHT HAWK / FRISCO'S SMOTHERED PORK CHOPS

"There is nothing accidental about quality."

It sounds like a canned training slogan you are forced to recite when starting a job at a chain restaurant that requires staff to rock at least three pieces of flair. For Harry Akin, the founder of the Night Hawk and the Frisco, it was a way of life that permeated his entire company.

If there was a Mount Rushmore of Austin restaurateurs, Harry Akin's face would be front and center. We owe Akin a debt of gratitude for every adult beverage we serve at the Eldorado. Imagine a time when you couldn't order a margarita with your queso. Thanks

to Akin, we don't have to live in that terrible reality, because he worked to change Texas' liquor laws to permit the sale of single alcoholic drinks.

His most important contribution extended beyond the world of restaurants and into civil rights. Akin helmed one of the first businesses to desegregate in Austin. In 1963, he spoke to the Austin Rotary

Club and urged them to "develop a conscience over racial matters" as he led the way for local businesses to allow entry to anyone, regardless of color. LBJ eventually invited him to be part of a national panel on race relations. However, his progressive thinking came at a cost.

"There is no doubt he lost his reelection for mayor because of his beliefs," recalled Hoover Alexander. Alexander worked for the chain in the Seventies and Eighties before eventually starting Hoover's Cooking, where he carries on many of the traditions he learned from the Akin family.

Akin had high expectations for his staff, but he also provided them with a path to success. The Night Hawk's infamous manager training program was grueling, but it provided careers to men and women of various races. He was known as a tough but fair boss who believed in human resources rather than relying on a Human Resources Department. He knew that his employees were his greatest asset and he treated them with kindness, respect, and compassion regardless of their gender or race.

It was refreshing to learn how the Night Hawk and Frisco worked so hard to create careers for their employees. This was

> much more than just a job. The staff at Night Hawk watched families raise their children as they raised their own while serving up thousands of Top Chop't sirloin steaks and those famous homemade pies.

I was fortunate to speak with some of the staff who were the last guard of the Frisco: Alexander, Gina Day, Darlene Prasla, Tyler Wallis, Liz Mabry, Tracy

Olson, and Debra K. They had worked under R. Harry Akin, who ran the Frisco with the same compassion and precision as his uncle. Some were there for the final day. It was odd that during a discussion about a restaurant, we rarely talked about the food. Instead, I sat back and listened to years of stories, memories, and life.

The former Frisco servers could remember where each regular customer sat and what their favorite meal was. The stories tumbled out from the past and after a while. I felt like I had worked at the Frisco as well. This kind of hospitality doesn't exist in Austin anymore; it extended beyond the table and into people's personal lives.

SMOTHERED PORK CHOPS

INGREDIENTS

1½ quarts beef stock 2 tablespoons beef base 1 tablespoon black pepper, ground 1 teaspoon garlic powder 1½ teaspoons Worcestershire sauce 1/4 teaspoon salt ½ cup vegetable oil 1¼ cups onion, minced 1½ teaspoons garlic, minced 34 cup flour seasoned egg wash (2 eggs, 1 cup of milk, salt and pepper to taste) 4 pork chops

PROCEDURE

Combine beef stock, beef base, pepper. garlic powder, and Worcestershire in stock pot. Heat to 170 F.

In sauté pan, heat oil on medium-high heat. Sauté onion and garlic until onions are tender.

Gradually whisk in flour to mixture, making a roux. Stir continuously until roux has turned light brown.

Add roux mixture to stock pot, whisking in thoroughly. Keep whisking and cook until gravy is slightly thickened.

Dip pork chops in seasoned egg wash. Dredge in seasoned flour to lightly coat pork chops.

Fry in vegetable oil heated to 350 F until golden brown.

Drain.

Place chops in 2-inch-deep pan in single layer. Cover with gravy. Cover pan with foil and place in 350 F oven for 45 minutes.

Go to Dallas and Take a Left: Nineties Post-Hardcore Giants Unwound Resurface

Drummer Sara Lund reflects on the band's "delightful" reunion dates by Julian Towers

Half a year after wrapping their first tour in over two decades, Unwound heads to Austin. But Levitation won't be the first time the Olympia post-hardcore icons have reunited to play a local festival.

The year is 2001: Unwound is scheduled to headline the South by Southwest Kill Rock Stars showcase at old Emo's. But following a convoluted series of missed connections, bassist Vern Rumsey has been left behind in Washington, drummer Sara Lund is stranded at the Denver airport, and guitarist Justin Trosper lands in the city completely alone ... except for all Unwound's gear. Thankfully, a protracted J Mascis gig delays the showcase long enough for Lund to get another flight.

With only 15 minutes of playtime, the makeshift duo extends their abrasive, repetitive noise jam "Fingernails on a Chalkboard" as members of the band XBXRX invade the stage and hop on Trosper's shoulders.

"It's a total circus as we play this one song over and over," recalls Lund. "We go back, go to bed, get up, and fly home. Classic Unwound gig ... except no Vern, of course."

"Classic Unwound gig ... except no Vern, of course," is the bittersweet expectation Levitation audiences can hold as well. The bassist passed away in 2020, after plans for this year's reunion tour were already in motion. Despite that tragedy, Lund says the shows have been "delightful" affairs. Jared Warren (Karp, Melvins) joins on bass, while Scott Seckington of Nocturnal Habits steps in on guitar/keys, expanding the band's nervous, claustrophobic, and noisy posthardcore to a fourpiece onslaught.

With the group's profile having risen exceptionally since their salad days thanks, in part, to the same internet-savvy Gen Z cohort who made post-breakup stars out of Duster and Sweet Trip they're also the biggest shows Unwound has ever played. Numero Group, which has reissued the band's catalog over the past decade, hosts Unwound with Codeine, Karate, and Chisel on Thursday, Oct. 26, at the Far Out Lounge.

Austin Chronicle: What's been the biggest surprise of these shows?

Sara Lund: I just assumed it was just gonna be the old folks from the old days, but to look out every night and see a sea of super young faces was just incredible. What that means to me is our music is timeless, which is what you want when you're making music - you want it to be something that will last forever.

And every night was a reunion with old friends, people that hadn't seen each other in 20 years. We're all able to have a great time but also acknowledge and hold space for our grief around Vern. It's almost like every night is this celebration of life in a way.

AC: Are there mixed emotions, not having had that feeling when you were an active trio?

SL: [The band] died the way we died because we had to, it wouldn't have mattered how popular we were. In fact, it might have even made it worse. And it was rough, at the time and for many years afterward, knowing there was some momentum in the 2000s in the tier of bands we were in around the time we broke up. But to be beloved and discovered now, to have this kind of experience without Vern being here to experience it with us, is also bittersweet. I mean. I wish - we all wish - so much that he could have been a part of this, but it couldn't have actually happened with him.

AC: Do you feel like you're as good a musician as you were 20 years ago, or better

SL: Controversial, perhaps, but I can honestly say that 20 more years of practice will actually make you a better musician [laughs]. Of course, that doesn't mean the music we made now, if we made new music, would be better. It'd definitely be a lot less angsty and dour! That being said, life is still hard. Life is still a struggle. The struggles are different when you're 50 than when you're 20.

AC: Your set lists skew very early. Beloved final album, Leaves Turn Inside You, isn't especially represented. What can we expect if y'all keep going?

SL: Hopefully we'll be able to do something totally different for another kind of tour. A lot of our set-list-building this year involved the low hanging fruit of like, "What songs are not going to be insanely hard to relearn?" The 2023 tour got booked and sold out when we had basically had two band practices!

Thankfully, we then took the month of January and really hunkered down, and of course everything went very well. We were just keeping things a little easy on ourselves, starting from not having any idea how it was gonna go. The built-in idea there was, "If this goes well, then maybe we can do some more. Play some of the later stuff later." We'll see.

Inside Levitation 2023

Alongside the April relaunch of joint event Austin Psych Fest, Levitation continues to hold down its Halloween weekend slot. This Thursday through Sunday, the homegrown festival welcomes a heavyweight slate of headliners including Unknown Mortal Orchestra, Flying Lotus, Oneohtrix Point Never, and Unwound. After rebranding from Austin Psych Fest to Levitation in 2015, the festival transferred to a multivenue format in Downtown Austin in 2018.

Returning Levitation venues to be drenched in liquid light include Stubb's, Mohawk, Empire, Hotel Vegas, Elysium, Parish, Antone's, and the 13th Floor. For the first time, the club-based festival will incorporate East Austin electronic hub the Concourse Project and South Austin outdoor venue the Far Out Lounge. Four-day GA passes run \$440, while individual shows run from \$17 to \$67 at levitation.fm.








The Concourse Project, Friday 27

Alongside presenters like Numero Group and Desert Daze woven throughout the fest, Los Angeles-based label Brainfeeder's curation naturally works in a two-hour block from founder Flying Lotus. A veteran of Texas festivals due to sustainably epic live sets. the producer grandnephew of Alice Coltrane (see 2008's "Auntie's Harp") embodies the label's electronic, jazz, and hip-hop



dimensions in his own famed, heady evolution. Friday pulls two more from the catalog: Salami Rose Joe Louis' flitty, fun takes on interstellar jazz influences upped acceleration on May album Akousmatikous, not to mention the Bay Area warper's work with Toro y Moi and Alice Phoebe Lou. UNKNOWN MORTAL ORCHESTRA, PANDA BEAR + SONIC BOOM

Let the faux-fi reign! Auckland, New Zealand's Unknown Mortal Orchestra, the brainchild of principal Ruban Nielson, made a mark on the early 2010s with pioneering, compressed production that warped his guitar-forward pop with hooky melodies through a time machine. That has extended to his work on fifth album V, released earlier this year. Carrying on in the throwback vein, Panda Bear (Noah Lennox of Animal Collective) and Sonic Boom (Peter Kember of Spacemen 3) come together after their 2022 debut album collaboration Reset, which layered their vocals on top of Fifties and Sixties pop loops. - Abby Johnston

ALAN PALOMO (NEON INDIAN)

Empire, Friday 27

Alan Palomo touches back down in the Lone Star State following last month's release of his first LP in eight years. the electronic jazz-funk World of Hassle. A significant career moment for the Monterrey-born, Denton-educated Neon Indian bandleader - it's Palomo's debut offering under his own name and sees him mainly singing in his first language, Spanish. London indie trio Girl Ray brings new disco celebration Prestige from across the pond, with Dallas alternative R&B crooner Ariel & the Culture and local Latin-psych outfit Money Chicha also sharing the stage. Flizabeth Braaten

DURAND JONES

Mohawk, Saturday 28

Veterans of Austin's festival circuit, Bloomington, Indiana's Durand Jones & the Indications finally shucked down to the Louisianan bandleader on May's Dead Oceans solo debut. Wait Til I Get Over testifies a deeply Southern accounting of Black tradition, strings and piano sweeping in opener "Gerri Marie," which sounds like an Atlantic Records duet session between Donny Hathaway and Nina Simone, with Jones inhabiting both sanctified parts. He tops a ridiculously progressive ATX roots stacking: Jalesa Jessie's soul rockers Chief Cleopatra, a DJ set from Black Pumas keeper Adrian Quesada, and cosmic R&B from Kalu & the Electric - Raoul Hernandez

SONIDO GALLO NEGRO

Hotel Vegas, Saturday 28

There's no singular genre or culture driving the trippy and tropical instrumentals of Sonido Gallo Negro. The Mexico City octet pulls from cumbia, Peruvian chicha, Cuban mambo. American surf music, and even the cinematic sounds of Ennio Morricone for their bouncy, flute-andtheremin-spiked compositions. Levitation attendees are well versed in drippy visual projections, but SGN's set beams with live drawings from renowned illustrator Dr. Alderete. Their dance party unites an elite contingent of like-minded Texans: Houston psychedelic-electronic duo Gio Chamba. Austin vibe maestros El Combo Oscuro, and local indie-- Kevin Curtin synth-cumbia favorites Como Las Movies.

AMYL & THE SNIFFERS

Stubb's, Saturday 28

For those keeping up with the barrage of tour snaps from Austin-based Die Spitz - specifically of vocalist Ellie Livingston fully aerial in red cowboy boots - those are from dates with Amyl & the Sniffers, who whisked the band away following their ACL Fest debut. The young Texans appear a perfect match for the sharp, throwback Aussie punk act, led by demonstrative singer Amy Taylor. At least enough to come up with some deranged inside jokes from the road. Inside this Spitz/Sniffers lineup sandwich lies the stadium-sized rock chug of Los Angeles group Militarie Gun. Rachel Rascoe

BIG BILL, NEMEGATA

The 13th Floor, Sunday 29


Imagine some kind of highly controlled experiment where you raised four people without any exposure to pop culture, then vaguely explained to them what a punk band is - "fast drums, vocals that are unmelodic and intense, distorted guitars" - and told them to form one. I think that band would be Big Bill. Topically, stylistically, and presentationally, they're enchantingly unusual ... and great. Six weeks ago Shakey Graves released his finest album, to less fanfare than the previous three studio full-lengths. That's probably because Movie of the Week lands thematically abstract and far from the indie folk sound that broke him a dozen years ago. But the record is a trip, imbued with antenna-TV Hollywood dreams, crafty production, channel-flipping interludes, alternative stylings, and a handful of legit earworms like "Big in the World," "Century City," and Sierra Ferrell duet "Ready or Not." Shakey's traveling band remains a live force, selling out large clubs and frequently filling Red Rocks Amphitheater, so expect an epic homecoming. - Kevin Curtin

Full of Hell is simply the ideal night-of-the-31st band. 


