Last year we festooned our annual Gift Guide Issue with a grackle-in-a-Santa-hat pattern for readers to repurpose as wrapping paper. It was such a hit, we've done it again: This year, Art Director Zeke Barbaro has combined two quintessentially Austin somethings - bats and tacos - for a design that is at once charming and kinda gross (quite the balancing act, that). I hope it's useful for your gift wrapping, or just gives you a laugh.

I know it's the holidays and I should keep this light, but here's a discouraging data point from "The State of Local News," an annual report published by the Medill Local News initiative at Northwestern University:

"Texas, the nation's second largest state with 30 million residents, grew 50% between 2005 and 2022, the fastest of any state in the country. During the same period, it lost 65% of its newspaper journalists."

This isn't news to anyone, but the state of news media isn't great. We live in an age of shrinking staff and shrinking revenue. growing news deserts, eroding trust in the media (one of the MAGA movement's signature achievements), and a tortured relationship with tech companies like Meta and X.

One way the Chronicle has been able to weather the storm battering our industry is through our donor program, which we launched in 2018. Our supporters sustained us during the worst of the pandemic and have enabled us to produce award-winning journalism. "It started out as a normal outing. My wife and I had to run to the grocery store. We were driving down the road casually going over our shopping list when the car ahead of me started to slow down anticipating the yellow light. I started to move my foot from the gas to the brake as any normal person would do when they see brake lights in front of them but I couldn't. I couldn't feel my foot. #### **FAYETTE ON THE NAUGHTY LIST**

Dear Editor

Great reporting in December 1st's Coal Stocking cover on our Fayette coal plant. ["Coal for Christmas," News] LCRA does deserve coal in its stocking. Lina Fisher did a masterful job of looking at this over-the-top polluter from many perspectives. Fayette is the fourth largest CO2 polluter in Texas – and that's saying something. It belches 71% of Austin's community wide CO2 emissions. We've been fighting Fayette's emissions for years and I can tell you Austin City Council gets it and LCRA doesn't. Austin has been working to close the plant - or at least our portion of it for over a decade.

Fisher's article shines the spotlight on LCRA where the real intransigence lies. This selfgoverning empire of power and water is accountable only to the governor who appoints its board of directors. The Texas Legislature and TCEQ give it a pass on pollution and climate issues. LCRA runs our life-critical water supply on a five-year plan that looks back to historic river flows while ignoring ever growing issues of climate change, upstream demand, changing land use practices and aguifer reductions that deplete spring flows. Their commitment running

the coal plant "forever" totally ignores climate change and the health impacts of coal pollution. To change LCRA, change the governor.

A second huge issue is water. The coal plant uses 6.355.072.053 precious gallons of Colorado River water a year – 2022 numbers – from the Highland Lakes and LCRA and Austin's river rights. That's almost equal to the water use of the city of Cedar Park, Leander or Pflugerville. It's quite astonishing. This could be put to much better use supplying the region's citizens, businesses, and farmers in these drought challenged times. Thanks to the Chronicle for focusing on the LCRA's responsibility in keeping this coal pollution filling the skies and lungs of Texas – and in the huge water dividend that could be realized in shutting it down.

As a society we increasingly seek technological solutions to the problems we create for ourselves. With each ice storm and heat wave we Texans experience, however, it's becoming clear that the environmental challenges we face are beyond the

reach of technology alone. The city of Austin, a rapidly evolving tech hub that holds on to its proud culture of barbecue, bats, and bass, could be an example of how embracing both tech and tradition can ensure a healthy, prosperous future.

In March of 2023, I worked alongside the city of Bee Cave to bring back one of humanity's oldest, forgotten traditions - the idea that a community is not made up of humans alone. By formally proclaiming the bee as an Honored Resident of the community, the city became the first government in the nation to imbue a non-human animal with tacit personhood, and affirmed their right to "exist and flourish" free from the harm so often inflicted on this most vital of creatures.


As an attorney, I follow the Rights of Nature movement with great interest, but the legally binding protections it confers are swiftly challenged in the courts and frequently struck down. Symbolic declarations, like those pioneered by Bee Cave, instead challenge us to question our place in the world, not as masters over Nature but as just one member of a living community of "persons" who deserve our respect and empathy.

Every city has a particular species that is closely tied to its cultural, economic or ecological wellbeing. The city of Austin's bats tick all three boxes, instilling civic pride while providing over \$10 million in tourism revenue each year, as well as the priceless services they render to our health - they consume a staggering 10,000 to 30,000 pounds of mosquitoes on each nightly flight. By officially welcoming this intelligent, social species into our community, the city of Austin would inspire its human residents to value the protective web of organisms we depend on to sustain us and to mitigate the worst effects of climate change.


If this idea seems radical, it is. As any gardener will tell you, the word "radical" also refers to roots, and the notion that other-thanhuman species are endowed with personhood dates back to the roots of human culture. In a world where corporations, the very entities who continue to lead us deeper into climate crisis, have legal personhood, it seems unreasonable that living creatures should not have their personhood recognized, even symbolically.

Combating climate change is a group effort we need all the help we can get to fight disease, drought, and flood. We say in Texas that "it takes a village," but who exactly gets to be a member of that village is up to us to decide. To me, the 1.5 million residents of the Congress Avenue Bridge are so much more than mascots. Let's give them the welcome they deserve.

#### NO HOME SWEET HOME FOR AUSTIN'S BLACK AND **LATINO COMMUNITIES**

As a new appointee to the Planning Commission and as an African American mother who suffered the consequences of previous land use plans implemented by the city. I feel it is necessary to be on the record about the HOME initiative: As originally drafted, it's a plan that has written out Austin's Black and Brown communities, crafted without meaningful consideration of the unintended consequences to Communities of Color.

How could that be, I've repeatedly asked, given the tortured history of Austin regarding land use plans that discriminated intentionally (1928) and unintentionally (the 1990s policies that displaced Black and Brown residents from East Austin)? How could it be that once again the city is considering a major land use overhaul without prioritizing the interests of Communities of Color, which still are suffering the fallout from systemic racism of past land use policies, such as Jim Crow zoning, redlining of Black and Brown communities, and racially discriminatory restrictive covenants?

As a planning commissioner. I put these guestions to my colleagues and was heartened that they took some initial steps in the way of unanimously approving what I refer to BY ALBERTA as "Morally Imaginative Amendments" to improve the HOME initiative. We passed the plan, 11-2. It's a good start, but not enough to adequately write in Black and Brown communities to a land use ordinance that would govern single-family zoning in Austin.

The HOME initiative (Home Options for Middle-Income Empowerment) aims to address Austin's housing crisis by generating smaller single-family homes for "middle-income" households by allowing up to three housing units to be built on a single-family lot instead of the current two.

But HOME's "middle income" language fails to recognize the wealth gap between Black and Brown families and their White counterparts. In 2021. median income for White households was \$93.012. according to city-data.com. By contrast, it was \$57.894 for Hispanic households and \$48.350 for Black households.

City of Austin 2019 figures show the median Black household earned just 54 cents for every dollar of income the median White household earned, while the median Hispanic household earned 60 cents. Black and Brown residents are written out.

That conclusion is further bolstered by the absence in the original HOME plan of any criteria. or requirement that additional density zoning be linked to affordable housing that serves those who fall between 50% and 85% of the MFI.

And nowhere in HOME is there any mention of anti-displacement interventions (such as the \$300 million in Project Connect) for what few if any are denving would happen under HOME's market-driven approach. We're written out.

There're also the political ramifications regarding the ability of Black voters to elect an African American to the City Council or Austin school district under single-member district systems that carve seats for Black representation, as their numbers would dwindle faster and more significantly under HOME.

How do we write in Black and Brown communities? To accomplish that the City Council must add teeth to all the Planning Commission's amendments, but especially to those that create access to capital via low-interest

or forgivable loan opportunities for participating homeowners who want to build an additional unit on their property; incentives, including low-interest loans and density bonuses, for developers who build three units of which one is affordable; and requirements that HOME be implemented in accordance with Austin's Climate Equity Plan to ensure environmental justice for underserved communities.

Along with that the city must develop anti-displacement initiatives for historically underserved homeowners and renters.

Having been one of the families displaced in the 1990s by redevelopment initiatives targeting East Austin, this is a pain point, which clearly strips away whatever veneer Austin presents as a racially progressive city. It might as well be 1928 (creation of the Negro District) or the 1930s (redlining) or the 1960s (a double-decker Interstate 35) or the 1990s (East Austin designated as the "Desired Development Zone").

Sadly, it's 2023 with the HOME initiative, which, if approved in its current form, would spur another forced relocation of Black and Brown residents as we approach the 100th anniversary of 1928.

#### CAN KATE COX ABORT HER DYING FETUS?

Dallas woman Kate Cox filed an emergency lawsuit Tuesday asking a **Travis County** judge to allow her to end her pregnancy. It's the first request of its kind to a judge since before Roe v. Wade in 1973, The Texas Tribune reported. Cox's fetus was diagnosed with a chromosomal anomaly

that is almost always fatal around the time of birth, and the fetus is developing abnormally.

NURSES ON STRIKE Nurses at **Ascension Seton** had their second-ever oneday strike Wednesday.

And again, Ascension informed them they'd be locked out for an additional three days after the strike. Unionized nurses, who say shortages in basic supplies have made their jobs even harder, planned a bake sale Saturday to buy basics.

## The Next Storm's A-Coming

How ERCOT and Austin are preparing for it BY LINA FISHER

On November 17, the Electric Reliability Council of Texas dropped a winter prognosis assuring that it is "not projecting emergency conditions this winter and expects to have adequate resources to meet demand." They added that since the catastrophic 2021 Winter Storm Uri, ERCOT has made several improvements, including inspecting power plants for proper weatherization, adding additional battery capacity, designating gas plants as critical infrastructure so they won't shut

down during blackouts, and launching a text notification service in May of this year.

Some have called that confidence into question: In his Energy and Power newsletter November 21, energy consultant Doug Lewin pointed out that only last month, ERCOT had issued an unprecedented request for power plants to build out additional capacity in anticipation of a stressed grid this winter. (They had to cancel that request due to the lack of applications.) "Which is it?" Lewin wrote in

the newsletter. "Are there major problems that call for extraordinary measures? Or is everything fine? It can't be both." He says the improvements noted by ERCOT in their release, plus the massive amount of solar power that has been added in the last few years that kept the grid stable during the sweltering summer months, means "we're in better shape" than three years ago, but "the likelihood of at least some rolling outages is probably close to 100%."

**2020 APD CHARGES** Travis County District Attorney José Garza announced Monday, Dec. 4. that his office would dismiss charges against 17 of the 21 Austin police officers indicted for felony assault for their actions during 2020 anti-police brutality protests. In all 21 cases, grand juries determined there was enough evidence to support charges for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon. Read more online.

MUSK'S CYBERTRUCK EVENT AT GIGAFACTORY Elon Musk has advertised the launch of Tesla's Cybertruck since 2019, but after the company's "delivery event" last week, you may now spot one on a road near you. While attendance to the delivery event was reserved for certified shareholders of Tesla, it was also cast via livestream on X (formerly Twitter). Musk is determined to produce 250,00 vehicles in Austin by 2025 despite challenges to the production of the Cybertruck, the Statesman reported.

THE ADLER APARTMENT COMPLEX After the city of Austin and a partner purchased seven apartment complexes in pricey areas to keep inexpensive, tenants at these complexes say they are being displaced due to rising rent, KUT reported. At each of the apartment buildings bought by the city and Austin Housing Conservancy, residents told KUT their rent went up as much as 25%, and they now owe fees, too.

#### WHEELS ON THE BUS WON'T GO AROUND

Cap Metro's effort to electrify its entire fleet of buses has been hampered by glitches and, now, the bankruptcy of a company selling million-dollar electric vehicles, the Austin Monitor reported. Cap Metro already has six of Proterra's buses in service, but 17 more are just waiting in a factory because Proterra hasn't been able to charge them.

> **HELP PAYING RENT IS HERE** Austinites struggling to pay rent can now apply

for assistance, after \$8 million made it off the runway for Austin residents this Tuesday. It's much-needed - eviction filings have risen to pre-pandemic levels following the expiration of its eviction moratorium at the end of 2021. GOP < 3 NAZIS The Texas Republican Party decided not to denounce Nazis last week. #### WINTER STORM CONTINUED FROM P.10

Mayor Kirk Watson also expects a severe storm this winter: In a press conference last Friday outlining how the city has improved its winter storm preparations since 2021, he stressed that "we should anticipate that we will have a big weather event. That's just one of the realities of the changes in our climate."

On the bright side, the city has made several changes since both Uri's and Winter Storm Mara's after-action reports highlighted how broken the city's internal and external communications and coordination were for winter weather. "One of the things that I'll highlight is better coordination, with regard to communication not just to the community,

but within the city government to make sure that people know what's going on and can react in an appropriate way," said Watson.

Austin Energy General Manager Bob Kahn highlighted that the public utility has expanded its emergency management team and that vegetation management crews have made "good progress" since Mara trimming at-risk branches. However, in September a city audit found that crews were behind schedule due to a lack of applicants, despite Council approving increased funding for four new crews. Kahn noted in the conference that finding enough people to do the trimming has been a problem.

Another city department that has been experiencing severe understaffing, the 911 call center, had better news: Assistant City Manager Bruce Mills noted that the call center will be "close to 100% staffed" in the next three weeks.

As far as road safety, Richard Mendoza, director for Transportation and Public Works noted that "the classical approach here in Austin has always been to kind of wait out the storm, let us thaw out within 24 hours. That's no longer occurring. We have added resources and equipment and trained our personnel to be proactive and apply anti-icing and de-icing agents on our critical roadways and bridges. In addition, we have trained operators to move snow accumulations."

Several responses remain the same, including the city's Multi-Agency Resource Centers and the county's six community centers opening as warming shelters. Emergency Medical Services Chief Robert Luckritz noted that Community Health Paramedics will clock additional hours in the days leading up to forecast winter weather to connect with people experiencing homelessness, making sure they have adequate transportation to warming centers.

Despite the changes, Watson put a heavy emphasis on Austinites' personal responsibility: "Lots of different approaches have been put into place over the past year. But there will be things that are unexpected, that will cause a disruption. Responses will

> not always be perfect, or at least the way we might want them to be exactly under the circumstances. This is a team effort. It's not just the government - we must all individually also participate and be prepared."

> At the conference, Ken Snipes, director of Homeland Security and **Emergency Management**, highlighted the Ready Together emergency

preparedness training program that HSEM launched in September for the public. The course emphasizes making a plan, having a kit of supplies, knowing your neighbors, and staying informed through emergency text alerts and the like. HSEM plans to host the course quarterly in 2024, and future training dates will be listed at readycentraltexas.org. You can download HSEM's neighborhood preparedness guide from that site and sign up for Austin Energy text alerts about winter weather by texting REG to 287846. The city also urges people to sign up for Warn Central Texas notifications at warncentraltexas.org.

## State Health Care Agency Urging 55-Hour Christmas-Themed Work Weeks to Address Medicaid, SNAP Backlogs

For the last three years, workers at the **Texas Health and Human Services Commission** have
worked mandatory overtime of 20 hours per month.
Now, U.S. Rep. **Lloyd Doggett** has obtained an internal
email from HHSC leaders urging employees to work
even longer and harder – just in time for the holidays.

"During the month of December, [we] will be hosting the Holiday OT Blitz(en) to bring our lead days down!" the email reads. "You can work as much voluntary overtime as you want to in December beyond the mandatory overtime."

The HHSC email goes on to introduce "The 6 Days of Merry Service Challenge." Employees who work at least 55 hours from Dec. 4 to Dec. 9 will be entered into a drawing for "amazing" but unspecified prizes. "We are also encouraging you to spread the joy and share your daily experiences and highlights with your ... teammates," the email says. "[We] will be sharing some of your heartwarming stories and festive photos."

The 6 Days of Merry Service Challenge comes as HHSC has become a hostile work environment, according to a group of anonymous whistleblowers. Since July, the whistleblowers have sent a series of letters to Gov. Greg Abbott asking that he step in and fix dysfunction at HHSC. "With every passing day, the situation continues to decline," said the most recent letter, released two days before Thanksgiving. "We are still experiencing major morale [and] communication issues and a gross lack of leadership."

HHSC helps coordinate food and medical care for at least 6 million Texans – 1 out of every 5. It organizes and approves applications for Medicaid, the government program overseen by the **Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services** that provides affordable health care for low-income citizens. And it organizes food assistance through SNAP, the

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program overseen by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Early this year, the federal government announced that with the end of the COVID pandemic it would stop automatically reenrolling people on Medicaid and SNAP. It gave the states a year – from April 2023 to April 2024 – to return to their standard practice of reviewing and approving applications for the programs.

Advocates say Abbott should have realized that the end of automatic reenrollment would cause a major increase in work for HHSC employees, but he did not recommend the hiring of more people or make any plan. Instead, state leaders decided to process the applications in eight months, by the end of December, rather than by next April. Hundreds of thousands of people were erroneously kicked off their health care and food assistance, requiring HHSC to go through the applications manually to fix the improper cancellations. Almost immediately, a backlog in approval for the programs developed. It is now taking more than six months from the time applicants apply for SNAP to when their application is reviewed by HHSC. It's unknown how long the waiting period is for Medicaid.

Doggett is criticizing Abbott for "offer[ing] a raffle rather than a solution." He says the governor should hire more workers and put effective leadership in place at HHSC. "Disadvantaged Texans shouldn't have to win a raffle to secure needed health care, and going hungry is hardly 'Merry,'" Doggett said in a statement. "Thousands of Texas children, seniors, the disabled, and others are the victims of two wrongs: Governor Greg Abbott's Administration's blatant violation of federal Medicaid rules, and CMS failure to use its oversight authority to protect them." — Brant Bingamon



### **An Unenacted Act**

After the city refused to implement key elements of the police oversight act, its authors are suing

The battle between city leadership and advocates for a strong system of police oversight will now move to the courts.

A lawsuit filed in state district court names multiple city leaders as defendants because of "their shared failure to enforce essential provisions of the Austin Police Oversight Act." Approved by a broad majority of voters in a May election and supported by nearly all of City Council in a September resolution urging implementation of the ordinance, the APOA would restore power to the Office of Police Oversight. That city agency is tasked with investigating police officers accused of misconduct, though it's been hampered since 2021 following a successful campaign waged by the Austin **Police Association** to undermine the office.

But as the lawsuit - filed by **Equity** Action, the social justice advocacy organization that authored the APOA and propelled it to resounding electoral victory - contends, the oversight law has not been implemented. At least, defendants in the suit Interim City Manager Jesús Garza, interim Austin Police Chief Robin Henderson, and OPO Director Gail McCant have not done so in the ways that are most meaningful to truly accomplishing civilian oversight of the Austin Police Department.

advisor Kathy Mitchell said. "It defies the concept of an independent investigation."

The plaintiffs seek an injunction from the court ordering the defendants to enact key elements of the APOA. Those include a provision requiring OPO to have "direct access, without hindrance" to internal APD records OPO needs to investigate alleged miscon-

duct. Other unimplemented provisions deal with transparency: ensuring OPO is the central repository for misconduct records, allowing OPO to publicly release certain records, and allowing the agency to act as a liaison between those complaining about police misconduct and APD.

#### WHAT'S LEFT TO IMPLEMENT

At a Nov. 21 meeting, city staff acknowledged that the ordinance hasn't been fully implemented. Though they emphasized the city was in compliance with 82% of the APOA, McCant said her office was only conducting full investigations into complaints with APD approval. She said OPO wasn't investigating anonymous complaints, unless the complainant chose to sign a sworn affidavit (revealing their name).

McCant confirmed that OPO also wasn't doing its own fact-finding investigations, partly because they were still trying to hire two civilian investigators and a supervi-

> sor to conduct that work. Data shared at the meeting showed that between July and September, OPO referred a total of 24 complaints to APD for investigation (compared to about 18 referrals per month in 2021), half of which resulted in no disciplinary action.

> "City employees, especially in the Office of Police Oversight, have been working diligently to implement

all aspects of the new law. I am proud of their work, and while I always wish we moved faster to implement changes, the OPO staff are working hard to meet all new mandates of the Austin Police Oversight Act," Garza told the Chronicle. "The outstanding question - regarding whether the

historically confidential APD personnel files should be made public - is an important and delicate one. For that reason, we welcome the lawsuit. It will allow the courts to weigh in on this important issue."

#### THE G FILE

Equity Action's lawsuit draws attention to a provision of state law that has been at the center of the debate over the APOA's legality since before it was even approved by voters. "Most flagrantly," the suit states, Garza and Henderson "have refused to discontinue APD use" of the G file. Chapter 143 of the Texas Local Government Code permits departments to maintain a secret personnel file for officers accused of misconduct (known as the G file), which only the department can access. Departments can store records of misconduct investigations that did not result in disciplinary action: that can include unfounded allegations and allegations that were proven, but which the police chief - who has sole authority on disciplining sworn personnel declined to discipline.

For decades, the G file has been viewed by advocates as an impediment to police oversight and, crucially, as optional. The law says a police department "may maintain" such a file. For just as long, the city's position has been that the G file is mandatory and that the only way to close it would be through negotiation with the police association in a labor contract. But the APA would never agree to shutting down the G file, because they believe its contents could be weaponized against officers wrongly accused of misconduct. So, the G file has largely been considered untouchable - that is, until passage of the APOA, which explicitly states the city "shall not" maintain one.

Through the campaign to approve the APOA, the city stuck to its guns, arguing Chapter 143 requires cities to maintain a G file and the APOA, as a city ordinance, is trumped by the state law. But that position began to shift in October, when the city argued (in court and in response to our questions) that, actually, the G file is optional - but only the police chief has the authority to close it down. The city's new position was that the city manager, who manages the chief just like they do every other department head, does not have the authority to order the chief to close the G file.

Now, after decades, the G file question will be litigated in court - an inevitability that assistant city attorney Neal Falgoust seemingly alluded to at the Nov. 21 OPO meeting. "APD does still maintain a G file," Falgoust said in response to one question. "We are evaluating some legal issues ... that we need to address through the legal process."

#### **5th Circuit Hears Case Against** "Incomprehensible" Book Ban

The largest independent bookstore in Texas, Austin's BookPeople, is continuing to challenge House Bill 900, the law recently enacted by state Republicans that seeks to ban books from school libraries.

The company joined Blue Willow Bookshop from Houston and several bookseller associations on Nov. 30 to argue before the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals that HB 900 violates the U.S. Constitution. Laura Lee Prather, the booksellers' attor-

nev, told the judges that HB 900 would make booksellers comply with a maze of "incomprehensible and vague" requirements, force them to say things against their will, and forbid them to say things they haven't yet said - all in violation

of the First and 14th Amendments, she argues. She also emphasized that HB 900 will keep kids from reading valuable books.

"It will be a race to the bottom," Prather said. "Classics won't reach students. Books about uncomfortable truths that young adults need to be made aware of, books about sexual abuse, about human trafficking, won't reach those bookshelves."

HB 900 was passed in the spring to ban what Republicans describe as pornography in school libraries. But instead of establishing

censorship offices at the State Board of Education and the Texas Education Agency to enforce this Legislature-created problem, the law foists responsibility for identifying books with "sexually explicit material" onto booksellers. It forces them to rate every single book they have ever sold to a school that is not part of a school curriculum but that is available to students (i.e., library books) beginning no later than next April. For those with sexual content, the

booksellers must include a detailed analysis.

Critics of HB 900 say it seems designed to stop booksellers from selling any books to schools at all. BookPeople's CEO, Charley Rejsek, has said it would require the hiring of untold

numbers of people to review the books. Prather described the law as setting an impossible task, saying that its requirements would compel booksellers to become experts in the varying curricula of the 1,200 school districts in Texas.

"There is no way for [booksellers] to determine what is directly related to the curriculum and what is in active use," she said. "Even if they were able to do that and ascertain that - at tremendous economic cost to them - then they have to determine

how to rate the books. And there is a maze of criteria that have to be applied."

HB 900 requires booksellers to submit analyses of books with sexual content to the Texas Education Agency for approval. If the agency disagrees with an analysis, it may rewrite it, and the bookseller must then post TEA's analysis as its own. Prather said that this part of the law amounts to "compelled speech" - that is, forcing people to say things they don't want to say - a violation of the First Amendment. She also argued that HB 900 is a "prior restraint,"

blocking the expression of speech that hasn't yet been uttered, another violation of the Constitution. She asked the conservative judges on the 5th Circuit not to wait for the Supreme Court to determine the legality of HB 900, but to issue an injunction to stop its implementation as soon as possible.

"In the absence of an injunction, the financial, reputational, and constitutional effects of the required ratings will be irreversible," she said, "Even if HB 900 is ultimately overturned, this bell cannot be unrung." - Brant Bingamon

#### AS EXECUTION FALLS OUT OF FAVOR NATIONWIDE, TEXAS ACCELERATES

For the first time in 23 years of polling, Gallup reports that a majority of Americans now believe the death penalty is unfair. The finding is part of the **Death Penalty Information Center**'s yearly report on capital punishment, released last week.

The **Gallup Crime Survey** has asked for opinions on capital punishment since 2000, Between 2000 and 2015, most said they thought it was applied fairly in the U.S. In 2016 the number began dropping. This year's historic low of 47% mirrors doubts that have led to fewer people being sentenced to death and fewer states conducting executions. For the ninth year in a row, fewer than 30 people were put to death nationwide, with only five states conducting executions. As of December 1, fewer than 50 people have received death sentences in just seven states. Both numbers are the lowest in 20 years.

But in Texas, executions actually increased. This year the state killed eight people, the highest number since 2019. Five of the eight (62.5%) were people of color. Florida executed the second-highest number of prisoners nationwide. Its six executions were the most since 2014, and came with the backing of Gov. Ron DeSantis, who is running for president.

The Texas executions this fall have been ironic. Three of them were scheduled for prisoners participating in a first-of-its-kind program on death row - the Texas Department of Criminal Justice's Faith-

> **Based Program**. The death penalty is reserved, by Texas statute, for people whom juries decide cannot change and will forever be dangerous. But according to TDCJ. the program "is based on the belief that individuals. no matter their past, can change if given the right tools and opportunity to do so." As part of the program, the agency provides courses on processing trauma, redefining the concept of manhood, and accepting responsibility for one's actions, among other topics. Over two dozen of the row's approximately 180 inmates have participated since early 2021. Prison officials and inmates alike believe the program is

improving death row, but that didn't keep the state from seeking to execute three program participants, including its first inmate coordinator, Will Speer. He was leading prayer over prison radio daily.

Speer was temporarily spared five hours before he was scheduled to die, but the two other Faith-Based participants - Brent Brewer and David Renteria - were killed on Nov. 9 and 16, respectively.

Brewer had argued that the prediction that he would be dangerous for the rest of his life was based on junk science - the testimony of notorious Austin psychiatrist Richard Coons, who never met Brewer. Renteria had claimed he was threatened by gang members into abducting 5-year-old Alexandra Flores and that he did not kill her. His attorneys were denied access to evidence they said would have shown he was not responsible for the child's death.

Other questionable Texas executions this year included those of Robert Fratta, John Balentine, and Arthur Brown Jr. Fratta argued that prosecutors presented misleading evidence at his trial, including a false claim that he had antisocial personality disorder. The courts rejected Balentine's claim that his Amarillo trial - which had an allwhite jury and a foreman who used racial epithets and said a death sentence was "biblically justified" - was tainted by racism. Brown had argued that he was ineligible for the death penalty because of intellectual disability.

As the public loses faith in the death penalty, the nation's Supreme Court is embracing it, with the court rejecting petitions from death row inmates at an accelerating pace. One of the rejected cases is that of Robert Roberson (of Palestine, Texas), whose Supreme Court petition was supported by five retired judges and a variety of scientists who argue that the theory of shaken baby syndrome that led to his conviction is now thoroughly discredited. The Supreme Court refused Roberson's appeal without comment. - Brant Bingamon

For the bookworm on your buying list. there were some notable releases by or about Texans this year that I'm sorting into two piles: feel-bad and feel-good. In the former camp, true-crime junkies will want to check out Waco: David Koresh, the Branch Davidians, and A Legacy of Rage (Simon & Schuster) by Jeff Guinn, who's previously profiled cult leaders Charles Manson and Jim Jones. Jo Scott-Coe's Unheard Witness: The Life and Death of Kathy Leissner Whitman (University of Texas Press) revolves around the actions of another madman. UT Tower shooter Charles Whitman, but focuses instead on examining the life of his first victim – his wife. And for a whole planet gone mad, consider Austinite Jeff Goodell's The Heat Will Kill You First: Life and Death on a Scorched Planet (Little, Brown and Co.), a bone-chilling exploration of the impacts of climate change.

How about a pick-me-up? Recently retired President of Prairie View A&M University Ruth J. Simmons details her journey from Jim Crow Texas to the highest echelons of

academia in memoir Up Home (Random House), a national bestseller. If you want to maximize the number of remarkable Texans chronicled in one tome, check out Texas Monthly's anthology, Lone Stars Rising: The Fifty People Who Turned Texas Into the Fastest-Growing, Most Exciting, and, Sometimes, Most Exasperating State in the Country (Harper). Meanwhile, coffeetable book Goodness Lives Here highlights the inspirational work being done by local nonprofit Mobile Loaves & Fishes on the occasion of its 25th anniversary, and all proceeds benefit MLF's ongoing mission to support our unhoused neighbors.

Finally, two more books from two of Austin's most reliable storytellers: Lawrence Wright's satirical novel about Texas politics, Mr. Texas (Knopf), and historian H.W. Brands' latest, Founding Partisans: Hamilton, Madison, Jefferson, Adams and the Brawling Birth of American Politics (Doubleday) – good reminders both that no matter how bad things seem, history has a story to share that's probably even worse. - Kimberley Jones

#### Climate Conscious Kris Kringle

From sky-high electricity bills to the bonedry greenbelt, the effects of climate change on our region are pretty clear these days. That's a bummer, but bee-, bird-, and butterfly-friendly gifts are not.

For friends and family who are inclined to turn their own yards or balconies into little slices of heaven, our local nurseries and garden stores are holiday gift treasure troves. Shoal Creek Nursery and the Natural Gardener both sell wildflower seeds year-round, and lots of flower seeds like to be planted in colder weather. Some bee favorites include asters, blackeyed Susans, bluebonnets, lavender, oregano, and sunflowers. Birdhouses and bird feeders make cute gifts, but have you considered a bee boarding palace? Natural Gardener recommends the gift of one of these bee hotels, which look like birdhouses but are full of holes that give beneficial bugs a place to rest.

For bird lovers, there's the gift of membership to the Travis Audubon Society – that comes with access to a 715-acre sanctuary and admission to monthly talks. For something to wrap, pair it with binoculars or a *Birds of Central Texas Reference Guide*, available to buy online at the Texas Capitol Gift Shop (where proceeds support maintenance of the Capitol grounds).

But maybe you're feeling fancy. Maybe you're looking for a big-ticket item to blow your loved one out of the water. If so, consider an e-bike, scooter, or moped. If you go this route, you can get a rebate from Austin Energy ranging from \$200 to \$1,300 (info at t.ly/z3MiB). That's a grinch-certified steal!

always nice. Consider a membership to the renovated and newly opened Texas Science & Natural History Museum. You can pair the gift card with a plush dino from the museum's gift shop. Or keep it simple and toy-free: The children in your life may not appreciate opening what is essentially a gift card, but just wait until you take them to the museum to see the giant dinosaur bones. — Austin Sanders

#### Enzo Ferrari: The Man and the Machine by Brock Yates, Random House, 560 pp., \$24 (paper); Ferrari releases Dec. 25 from Neon.

Retitled since its 1991 release as Enzo Ferrari: The Man, the Cars, the Races, legendary auto sports journalist Brock Yates' definitive biography of the man behind the jewel in Italy's sporting crown gets a new tie-in edition. While Michael Mann's biopic Ferrari focuses on the run-up to the fateful and tragic 1957 Mille Miglia road race, this is the complete life of the racing icon, from his own time on the track to his life as a team owner. Finally back in print, try tracking down the hard-to-find original hardcover for the autophile in your life.



#### American Prometheus: The Triumph and Tragedy of J. Robert Oppenheimer

#### Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI

In Killers of the Flower Moon, Martin Scorsese's excoriating true-crime drama about the horrifying conspiracy to murder Osage Nation members and steal their oil rights, Texas Ranger Tom White is a minor character who doesn't even arrive in Fairfax. Okla., until deep into the movie. David Grann's equally traumatizing book places White and the investigation front and center to explain how it took federal intervention to break through the willful intransigence of state and local law enforcement and the complicity of courts.



#### The Color Purple

by Alice Walker, Penguin Books, 304 pp., \$18 (paper); The Color Purple releases Dec. 25 from Warner Bros. Pictures.

This Christmas sees the release of the film of the musical inspired by the success of the film of the landmark novel by Alice Walker. The power of the Pulitzer-winning story of three generations of Black women in 1900s Georgia remains undimmed 40 years after publication, and it still has the ability to infuriate reactionary book banners who fear its story of bravery in the face of racist and sexist oppression.

## **Review: Broadway** in Austin's My Fair Lady

Sharp-tongued classic musical still needs to fix its modern ending by RICHARD WHITTAKER

It's always the way that, no matter how the rest of a show is, you're always left with the strongest memory of the final moment. Thus it unfortunately is with the Lincoln Center production of My Fair Lady, the touring version of which is currently performing at the Bass Concert Hall as part of the Broadway in Austin series.

Fortunately, that memory will eventually be swept away by rising recollections of the preceding three hours of this captivating, funny, touching and wry rom-com musical, crammed with instantly recognizable showtunes, much of it spent in the captivating company of Anette Barrios-Torres as rough-tongued Sarrrf Laahndan flower girl Eliza Doolittle and Jonathan Grunert as pompous phonetician Henry Higgins.

The 1956 musical, from the heart of the Broadway-defining run by lyricist Alan Jay Lerner and composer Frederick Loewe, jumps to 1912 England and tackles an inherent truth: How you sound defines who you are. Nowhere is as rife with accents as the British Isles, where a skilled ear can tell not which county but from which side of which town a speaker hails. Higgins accepts a wager with houseguest Colonel Pickering (John Adkison) that he can have the caterwauling Cockney Eliza comport herself as a lady to the manner born within six months.

And caterwaul Eliza does. Barrios-Torres almost impeccably threads the needle of her inevitable mishmash delivery, reducing parts of her initial speech to a feline wail before a heartfelt "Wouldn't It Be Loverly?" - a tease for her enchanting vibrato for "I Could Have Danced All Night" and the fiery energy of "Show Me." (Truly, is any other musical as loaded with instantly recognizable tunes?) Equally, Grunert adds a brittle arrogance to Higgins that makes Broadway in Austin's My Fair Lady

But, alas, this production ends on a bum note in dischord with the spectacle before.

the bombastic "Why Can't the English" and

"A Hymn to Him" even funnier.

The underlying story has undergone Running time: 175 min. constant transformation. The original myth of Pygmalion, the ivory statue who comes to life, is a crude metaphor for an unsullied woman. George Bernard Shaw's 1913 play Pygmalion was a commentary on how the English middle and upper classes see their "social inferiors" as less than fully human. But while director Bartlett Sher undoubtedly digs deeper into the ... shall we say, challenging gender politics of the Lerner and Loewe text throughout the performance, the Frankensteining of Shaw's

downbeat ending onto the musical's giddy levity is like ashes in the mouth. There are ways for Higgins to get his comeuppance and for Eliza to get her well-deserved victory, but this, quite frankly, ain't it, and for a nearly three-hour musical to peter out in such a way is deeply anticlimactic. One at least has to admire Sher for sticking to his guns, as this final beat has been a point of deep controversy

> since the original 2018 staging, with even proponents of his thesis often disappointed by the awkward execution.

This could be why Sher's second act delivers a rousing good time with a gorgeous vaudeville interpretation of "Get Me to the Church on Time," with Michael Hegarty as a hilariously dissolute Alfred P. Doolittle

on one last hedonistic cavort through London before his nuptials. It's one of many showcases for the choreography by Christopher Gatelli, meshing as perfectly here in its chaotic color splashes with Catherine Zuber's sumptuous costume designs as it does with in the purposefully stilted and stylishly drab ensemble delivery of "Ascott Gavotte," or the captivating swirl of "The Embassy Ball." Hopefully, those are the moments that will abide.



# **Review: "The Dog Show"**

HIROMI STRINGER CURATES A FICTITIOUS. DOG-OBSESSED MUSEUM IN HER CURRENT SOLO SHOW BY MEHER GAZILBASH

In Hiromi Stringer's latest exhibit, "The Dog Show: Time Traveler Umeyama's Drawings From the 21st Century." the Japanese-born and San Antonio-based artist imaginatively expresses her own experiences as someone bearing witness to a foreign land. She also presents an elaborate love letter to dogs.

"It was almost 30 years ago, one steamy, hot summer day, when I saw someone walking a Siberian Husky dog on a busy street in Bangkok, Thailand," she begins in the show's notes. "It was when the word globalization started to appear here and there. Why a Siberian anything in Thailand?"

Stringer (unsurprisingly a devoted canine lover in her personal life) developed the idea for her show

after learning that dog breeds are a relatively new concept. Breeds stood out to her as indicative of contemporary culture, laving bare our modern desires and ambitions. By adopting a fictional persona, she presents insightful commentary on the many absurdities of modern life in America and asks us to consider a novel perspective.

"I want to know about the world I live," she adds. "I came to this foreign country, the US, when I was in my 30s. A personal paradigm shift including cultural and language differences strengthened my curiosity of wanting to make sense of this place. Mundane quotidian objects of our times surely inform us about our current existence. Both events and 'stuff' in our lives have root causes or reasons. My approach is using the mundane as an extension of the broader world."

Stringer carries out this examination of the mundane by transforming grayDUCK Gallery into the fantastical Umeyama Time Teleportation Museum. UTTM's mission is to present the research of Stringer's alter ego. Shoei Umeyama, a scholar

from 19th-century Japan who is one of the world's first teleporters, a predicament that was introduced to him in his late 30s.

The official museum brochure details the peculiar circumstances that led to Umeyama creating his rich collection of time travel drawings. Living in Japan at a time when the country was under governmentenforced national isolation, he regularly found himself transported to completely random points in time. In the face of these jarring changes, the academic in him naturally felt inclined to record his observations of these strange new worlds. Umevama's field notes of his time in South Texas in the 21st century make up this specific exhibit. inviting us viewers to look at our environment from

his vantage point.

Umevama focused on studving dogs during his time in Texas. Lining the walls of UTTM are Umevama's documentation of his encounters with different breeds in curious scenes. Using paint on rice paper, he captures puppies riding in strollers, little dogs in Hello Kitty jackets,

and even a cat wearing a leash. Each piece is also marked by Umeyama's notes, written in Japanese, adding to the mystery for non-Japanese speakers.

Of course, underlying the entire show is a profound adoration for canines and the companionship they offer. The serious pretenses under which we are asked to examine dogs and dog-related artifacts are both hilarious and eveopening. Teasing vet not scornful, the body of work presents a lighthearted, timely, and loving look at the ridiculous-looking gremlins we seem to take everywhere and dress up in human clothing. As the audience, we can walk away a bit more inquisitive about what we consider to be normal. and how that status quo came to be.





## **Meet the Stoner Who Puts Plants Onstage at Concerts**

ZAK PETERS AND PLAY TO THE PLANTS BRING GREENERY TO AUSTIN MUSIC.

Perhaps you've gone to a concert in Austin and noticed dozens of potted plants on and around the bandstand: umbrella trees and fiddle-leaf figs amongst the stage monitors, hanging pothos and Boston ferns dangling from the ceiling, and – maybe in a particularly wild moment - a peace lily in the outstretched arms of a crowdsurfer.

If so, you're witnessing the vision of Zak Peters, the plant connect for Austin music - except he wishes he was dressing stages with a different type of greenery.

His music-and-plants concept germinated five years back in the Boston area when he noticed his weed plants grew better to the sounds of synth-heavy music. Peters began taking them down to his basement studio where friends and local bands would perform live to an enthusiastic audience of cannabis vegetation, broad-

The effort, dubbed Play to the Plants, could only be jeopardized by moving to a state with archaic marijuana laws – which is exactly what Peters did. But in 2021, he began booking PTTP shows in Austin, decking out stages with

cast via livestream.

Rodeo. It's a level of traction Peters never predicted, but which he attributes to Austin's accepting nature.

"In Boston, they thought it was ridiculous and wanted nothing to do with me, but in Austin, we've been embraced," Peters laughs. "If you would [have] told me when I moved down here that I'd be doing plant stuff with the Black Angels, I'd have thought you were a fuckin' lunatic."

Officially, Play to the Plants is a "cannabis-themed media, events, and booking company," which sounds quite professional, even if the way Peters transports the plants to clubs is

comically DIY.

"There's not one bit of professionality in trying to fit about 30 plants in an 2001 Cadillac DeVille," he admits. "It's incredible how many plants you can fit in. It's also dangerous to be behind me because I can't see vou."

The hallmark of a Play to the Plants-affiliated show is Peters coming onstage to thank the club and sponsors and then - if the venue gives its blessing - taking a huge, hilarious rip off an 18-inch bong. It's a not-sosubtle act of protest against Texas' restrictive cannabis laws.

"People do get pumped up when they see it," attests Peters. "I thought they'd be like, 'What the fuck is this idiot doing?' but you hear people throughout the crowd like, 'Hey look. LOOK! Guy's got a bong! Wooooo!' It's fun to get away with in Greg Abbott's backyard."

Asked how PTTP will adapt when cannabis is eventually legalized in Texas, Peters says he'll obviously hope to decorate stages with glorious marijuana plants, but there's another cannabis advocate he'd be more happy for.

"I just hope we get to see recreational weed in Texas while Willie's still alive," he says. "That dude's fought for it so fuckin' hard."

houseplants. It's a simple artistic touch, decorating a bandstand with plants, but one that brings good vibes. After all, plants improve people's moods (proven by research) and enjoy being taken on field trips to hear psych bands (not formally proven by research). Over the last 21/2 years, bands and venues have increasingly requested Play to the Plants – run by Peters with partners Spencer Voiss and Elana Streuding and made possible by the generosity of Tillery Street Plant Co. (where Peters works) - to furnish flora for shows. The plants now make regular appearances at venues like the Far Out, Hotel Vegas, the 13th Floor, and Mohawk, plus gatherings like Austin Psych Fest, Levitation, and last weekend's Wizard

# DAY TRIPS BY GERALD E. MCLEOD

The **Buffalo Bayou Cistern** in **Houston** has done it again, this time with a special winter light show that immerses the visitor in an underground dreamscape of light and sound even more exciting than the last show.

When the lights go off in the cavern, patrons are engulfed in an inky darkness until the lights begin washing around the 221 25-foothigh concrete columns in waves of colors. The spaces between the rows of pillars become tunnels of flashing light, creating a feeling of weightlessness.

This light show surrounds you as you stand on the observation deck that encircles the giant tank looking in. At the end of the choreographed light show, when visitors clap or make a loud noise, the echo sends a tsunami of light washing over the space.

This is the second annual **Cistern Illuminated**, a winter light installation created by Houston artist and engineer Kelly O'Brien. For his second art piece in the Cistern, O'Brien has expanded the audio and visual effects.

The Cistern is an 87.500-square-foot reinforced steel underground reservoir built in 1926. From the inside, it looks somewhat like a buried flying saucer. It held 15 million gallons of water to supplement the city's drinking water system.

After springing a leak, the tank was decommissioned in 2007. Plans were to dig it up and turn the area into a parking lot. That is until the **Buffalo Bayou Partnership** rediscovered the Cistern in



2010, when the organization was developing a 160-acre park west of downtown, along the waterway. The unique space opened to the public in 2016 and has hosted several site-specific light shows.

Cistern Illuminated is at 105 Sabine St. in Houston. The winter light show is on display through Jan. 7, 2024. Tours last 30 minutes on Wednesday through Friday from 10am to 5pm and Saturday through Sunday from 11am to 5pm. Information and the \$12 tickets are available at buffalobayou.org.

# WITH PLAYOFF SELECTION, TEXAS IS BACK TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S ELITE STATUS

UT faces Washington on New Year's Day BY ERIC GOODMAN

After nearly a decade and a half of disappointment, underachievement, and national ridicule, the University of Texas is finally a legitimate college football national championship contender once again. Put more succinctly, Texas is back.

After winning the Big 12 Championship Game in dominant fashion - 49-21 over Oklahoma State on Saturday – to round out a 12-1 season, the Longhorns on Sunday were selected to College Football Playoff for the first time in the 10-year history of the format. Texas will compete for its fifth national championship and first since the 2005 season.

The Longhorns were awarded the No. 3 seed in the four-team playoff and will face No. 2 seed Washington in the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans on New Year's Day, with a spot in the national championship game - taking place at Houston's NRG Stadium on Jan. 8 - on the line.

Texas came out on the right side of the most heated and controversial playoff debate the sport has ever witnessed, which resulted in the exclusion of undefeated ACC champion Florida State at the expense of one-loss Texas and one-loss Southeastern Conference (SEC) champ Alabama, whom Texas beat in Tuscaloosa in September. The Tide will play undefeated top seed Michigan in the Rose Bowl, the other national semifinal game.

Texas head coach Steve Sarkisian told ESPN after learning his team's fate that the program is exactly where he hoped it would be in year three of his tenure. It's been a rapid rise for Texas under "Sark," after the Longhorns went 5-7 in his first season. The team showed improvement in year two, going 8-5 with all five losses coming in one-score games that Texas seemingly found new ways to lose each time.

This season. Sark's 'horns found ways to win close games when necessary. Then, late in the season when it became clear that "style points" would factor heavily into which teams make the cut for the playoff, Texas rose to the occasion and won its last two games by a combined margin of 78 points.

"This has been a heck of a journey for us, so to earn a seat at the table, to be at this tournament, is one that we're humbled by, but we're excited for it as well," Sarkisian said.

Despite being the weaker seed. Texas opened as a 4.5-point betting favorite over Washington for what promises to be a top-tier quarterback battle between Heisman candidate Michael Penix Jr. for the Huskies and UT's Quinn Ewers, coming off the best game of his career in the Big 12 title game. Ewers completed 76% of his passes for 452 yards and four touchdowns against the Cowboys, with one interception.

It's not just the Texas football team that's returned to elite form, either. If anyone around the nation had forgotten what an amped-up UT fan base is capable of when fully engaged, just ask Big 12 Commissioner Brett Yormark, who felt the wrath of 40,000-plus Texas fans when his postgame speech was completely drowned out by unrelenting booing along with chants of "S-E-C," the conference Texas will join next season. (Yormark brought this on himself when he publicly told Texas Tech's head coach to "take care of business" against Texas ahead of a game Texas ended up winning 57-7.)

Perhaps the most exciting part about Texas' season is that regardless of what happens in the College Football Playoff, Sarkisian's program appears set up for sustained success in the years to come. As recently as last season, the thought of Texas competing in the mighty SEC in 2024 was intimidating. But after UT stormed the house of the eventual SEC champions and came away with a double-digit victory, it now appears as though the SEC should be more intimidated by mighty Texas. Whether Ewers elects to return to Austin for his senior season or 2024 marks the dawning of the Arch Manning era, UT looks primed to have the advantage at quarterback against just about any team it might face in the coming season.

A fifth national championship would easily cement 2023 as the most important season in Texas football history. But what the program has already achieved by simply making it back into the championship picture after 14 years on the outside looking in can't be underestimated.

Texas is back, and it looks like they might stay awhile.

# The Agony and the Ecstasy of *Maestro*

Bradley Cooper is masterful in front of and behind the camera in this truly moving biopic of musical leviathan Leonard Bernstein by KIMBERLEY JONES

A titan of 20th century culture, back when regular folks actually knew the name of a conductor. Leonard Bernstein was also a composer, activist, teacher, and television fixture: he combined the latter two to unlock classical music for generations via his Young People's Concerts at the New York Philharmonic. Actor/ writer/director Bradley Cooper - triple duty again following his first feature, 2018's A Star Is Born - taps into an instructional vein himself by starting his movie about Bernstein with a quote from him: "A work of art does not answer questions, it provokes them." The quote feels preemptive, a "how to read this film" cheat code and gesture at mollifying anyone who might gripe about Maestro's lack of biographical bullet points or other traditional signposts of the biopic genre. But who wants bullet points, anyway, when you can have a dream ballet instead?

That dance happens about 30 minutes in, and by then you'll know if Maestro - itself an ambitious and exuberant work of art- is to your taste. But the moment isn't just showboating, or mere homage to a time when movies would stop dead in their tracks for dreamy dance sequences. It pirouettes off a rehearsal of Fancy Free (the 1944 ballet Bernstein scored and then turned into Broadway musical smash On the Town) which turns fantastical. The dance becomes illustrative of the tensions that will define Bernstein's life and the scope of the film about him: the push-pull between his composing and his conducting; between his appetite for men and his love for the woman

he eventually marries, Felicia Montealegre (Mulligan); between his authentic self and a public-facing persona others warn him will suffer if he doesn't minimize his Jewishness, his homosexuality. From this bravura sequence, everything flows downstream, deepening our understanding of the man and the marriage. Cooper and co-writer Josh Singer take a symphonic approach to the material; Maestro unfurls in movements, shifting in force and feeling - forte, piano, espressivo. It moves.

Maestro is a technical wowzer, with the makeup, costume, and production design convincingly summoning the film's sweep from the Forties to the late Eighties. Cinematographer Matthew Libatique, who won an Oscar for his work on A Star Is Born, cycles through black & white and color, depending on the era depicted, and a

camera that swings from the rafters or arrives like a whisper, depending on the mood.

The sound design, though, is challenging. Between the chattering mid-Atlantic accents and the complication of actors speaking out of the side of their mouths around a cigarette, I

reckon I missed 30% of the dialogue. (Remember Lenny: "A work of art does not answer questions, it provokes them." In my case, it was "Huh? Did you catch that?") The score is plucked. appropriately, from Bernstein himself, including a laugh-out-loud music cue: When Felicia narrows her eyes at Bernstein's much younger lover, we

hear the brassy opening notes from West Side Story, forecasting a rumble. There are visual bemusements, too, as in a Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade reference so surreal and delightful, it must be pulled from real life.

Does it matter if it's real? How close to the facts must a work of art cleave? Is photorealism a virtue, or a cage? Cooper drew ire when an early trailer revealed a large prosthetic nose, which detractors called antisemitic and Bernstein's children defended, saying it was representative of their father's "nice, big nose." (The casting of Mulligan, a white British actress, to play a woman born in Costa Rica has also been decried.) Maestro provokes questions about representation - a worthy conversation - and certainly actors with closer lived experience might have

brought something different to the roles. But what Cooper and Mulligan are doing here is extraordinary, delivering exquisitely stylized performances, as big as the screen they're projected on. Her mesmerizing, musical

laugh. His open face and a voice that sounds like a permanent head cold. We see the work, the figurative (and sometimes literal) sweat that went into crafting these characters. It's capital-M Movie Acting, and I couldn't love it more. It moved me.

The chaotic opening scene in anime maestro Havao Miyazaki's autobiographically inspired The Boy and the Heron is as harrowing as anything he's put on film. The setting is 1943 Tokyo, and the hospital where the mother of 12-yearold Mahito (Santoki) is located is ferociously ablaze. As sirens scream and silhouettes of floating ash drift against a blood red night sky, Mahito frantically rushes from home to the inferno to help extinguish it, only to helplessly witness the building collapse upon those inside. Miyazaki and his Studio Ghibli crew execute this breathless introduction with bravura, capturing the moment's physical adrenaline and panicked emotion through near-expressionistic animation paced like a furiously beating heart. It's a gut-punching overture for a film that, strangely enough, becomes more cerebrally impenetrable as it journeys deeper and deeper into a fantasia only the great Miyazaki could imagine. But wow! What a beginning.

The story in Miyazaki's screenplay begins in linear fashion after a still-grieving Mahito and his take-charge father (Takuya Kimura) move to a fairy-tale-like cottage in the Japanese countryside a year following the boy's mother's death. Mahito grows more despondent after meeting (without any forewarning) his new pregnant stepmother, Natsuko (Yoshino Kimura); indeed, he's visibly terrified by her invitation to touch her baby bump. (The fact that she's his deceased mother's look-alike younger sister complicates his feelings all the more.) Ominously, a gray heron who greeted his arrival at the country house becomes more determined to interact with Mahito, particularly after the increasingly depressed teenager uses a rock to inflict a serious head wound upon himself after being bullied at school. This kid is pretty messed up.

But once the pesky bird is revealed to be a humanoid (the human teeth and gums protruding from its elongated beak are grotesquely creepy), the unlikely pair soon embarks on a surreal adventure after entering a portal on the estate's grounds in search of a missing Natsuko. Going down the rabbit hole to an underworld wonderland where dream logic refracts reality, the two Candides encounter creatures more fantastic than the heron-man himself: renegade pelicans doomed to die; giant green parakeets with a taste for fascism and human flesh; a young woman who possesses literal firepower; and the cuddly warawaras, white marshmallowlike beings with stubby appendages and dots for eyes who float upward to earth to become humans upon maturation. Again, it's all very Miyazaki, visually familiar and yet still capable of commanding a sense of awe.



The continuity in the narrative, however, increasingly wobbles to the degree that any coherent recitation of the plot in the film's later section is challenging, if not impossible. And what it all means is unclear, absent any "there's no place like home" homily in the end. Maybe the film is simply a fanciful manifestation of one person's healing passage through a landscape of grief and trauma. But there is little doubt that The Boy and the Heron is one of the Japanese auteur's most cinematic feature-length films - maybe the most cinematic - in his relatively limited oeuvre. At times, it is an exquisite thing to experience. The 82-year-old Miyazaki has publicly stated this is his last film, but he has said that twice before in the past. Let's hope he's fibbing once again.

Self-actualization is a complicated, chaotic. exhilarating thing. We all stumble along, feeling our way through the vast expanse of the world as we grow up, making messes but learning all the while, too. None of us ask to be born, but we all are tasked with making sense of it and making ourselves, even if it takes our whole lives. Therein lies the thrill of life: We must lean into it all, the pleasures and the pain, to be human. So goes the story of Bella Baxter (Stone), the heart and soul of Poor Things, the latest film from director Yorgos Lanthimos.

Based on the novel of the same name by Alasdair Gray, Poor Things is a period Frankenstein piece that is also a story for our times. It's a journey toward self-actualization

and autonomy that relishes in the tactile pleasures of life without shying away from the contradictory, messy parts.

Bella is the reanimated creation of Dr. Godwin Baxter (Dafoe, surprisingly moving and funny), an unorthodox scientist marked and maimed by his father's experiments. He is protective of Bella, hiding her away from the world even though she yearns for more. When a dedicated student. Max McCandles (Youssef). begins studying and then becoming enamored with Bella, she begins to slowly learn about the world and her hunger for adventure grows. As Bella becomes increasingly aware of the outside world and of her own body and its capacity for pleasure, she decides to escape to travel the world with sleazy lawyer Duncan Wedderburn (Ruffalo). Her travels with and without him are transformative, letting Bella come into her own, with all the complications that come with it.

A constant complication that Bella faces is the discomfort of the men around her as she comes into her own. Even the well-meaning,



#### From Revolution to Entertainment in We Are Fugazi From Washington, D.C.

Chronicle writer Joe Gross goes documentarian for the hardcore pioneers by TIM STEGALL

"The danger of documentaries is always: archive, archive, talking head," says Joe Gross, journalist, music historian, Chronicle contributor, and part of the trio of filmmakers responsible for We Are Fugazi From Washington, D.C., playing as part of the Sound Unseen Film + Music Festival. "Something that I love about this movie - and I don't mean this in a braggy way, I mean it literally – is that we avoided that."

This would be crucial to any film about visceral Nineties art-punk powerhouse Fugazi – singer/guitarists Ian MacKaye and Guy Picciotto, bassist Joe Lally, and drummer Brendan Canty. They never utilized standard methodologies, period. They transformed hardcore the way postpunk did punk, by expanding its musical remit: introducing dub and jazz elements, avoiding ballistic tempos, indulging new rhythms and extreme, whisper-to-scream dynamic shifts.

They revolutionized musical business ethics and methodology. As punk went mainstream with alternative rock's rise, Fugazi shows remained resolutely all-ages, with \$5 admission even as their popularity grew. They remained self-managed and -booked, recorded for independent Dischord Records, sold no merch, and refused interviews with publications that accepted tobacco or other poisonous corporate advertising. They never exactly "broke up," per se. Playing their final show in London on November 4, 2002. they've been on hiatus since. They get together to play privately and pursue individual solo projects.

Hence, any documentary about such an unconventional subject itself required an unconventional approach.

Filmmakers Jeff Krulik (Heavy Metal Parking Lot) and Joseph Pattisall (The Legend of Cool "Disco" Dan) sought Gross (formerly of the Austin American-Statesman) for this project because he literally wrote the book on Fugazi - the 33 series volume on their 1993 album, In on The Kill Taker.

Born in 1974 and raised on what he has called the Virginia side of D.C., Gross was too young to fully grasp the pioneering punk bands from which Fugazi evolved (MacKaye founded hardcore

legends Minor Threat, who inspired Lally to play bass, while Canty and Picciotto were in proto-emo outfit Rites of Spring). However, he immediately comprehended the importance of Fugazi's 1989 EP Margin Walker. "I remember going to Olsson's Records downtown, the Metro

Center location, and they had an entire wall that was just that EP," he explains. "I was like, 'All right, this is a big deal."

When initiating We Are Fugazi, Krulik envisioned a quick-and-dirty mash-up of YouTube clips, celebrating the 20th anniversary of their hiatus. "When we contacted Ian, he said, 'Wonderful - I don't want to have anything to do with this," Gross adds.

Then MacKaye had some ideas.

He gave the filmmakers access to his video archive, built from years of fans filming and videotaping Fugazi shows and sending him copies: But he determined the film must honor the filmmakers who shot the original footage, interviewing

> them. Only one interview with the band is included: a vintage video magazine MacKaye conversation. The resultant film, assembled in approximately two months, is stunning, particularly a Woodstock-like split-screen sequence from a legendary gig before the Washington Monument. Or the way it starts with "Song #1" at an early gig and ends with a 2002 reprise.

"The first time you see it, the whole audience is jumping up and down and feeding back energy to the band," enthuses Gross. "When you

see it at the end, it's them feeding a kind of sedentary audience that energy. It's really interesting. It's like, 'Well, I guess this is where this kind of music ended up.'

"Fifteen years earlier, it was lifechanging," concludes Gross. "Fifteen years later, it was entertainment."

caring men in her life, like the good doctor and McCandles, want to rein her in and exert control over her. It's a struggle every woman can understand: men being intimidated and confused by a woman who knows exactly what she wants and runs after it. It also speaks to the complications Bella runs into with sex, which serves as her great awakening to the world and her own bodily autonomy. Later in the film, she works at a brothel, learns about all the different desires men have, and is confused by the idea that some men want to have sex with women even if the women don't. In these ways, this movie is incisive about patriarchy and the insidious ways it seeps into life through not only obviously nefarious men but well-meaning ones, too.

Poor Things balances sincerity with a delicious unpredictability. Bella is a woman who has the most thrilling opportunity - coming into her own sexually and intellectually with no shame. She carries none of the societal pressures of being a woman, freeing her and the movie to follow her whims. We often can't track where Bella's desires will take her, meaning the film's plot unfolds in gloriously chaotic fashion. It's a thrill to surrender to a movie and let it lead you through all its discoveries and revelations even if you don't know where it's going.

Not only is it perfectly paced and sequenced, Poor Things looks beautiful, too. Cinematographer Robbie Ryan captures Bella's lush, surreal world beautifully – first in stark black-and-white and then in storybook-perfect colors. The ensemble cast is delightful, with Ruffalo's Wedderburn a great pathetic, comedic foil to Stone's determined, headstrong Bella.

Poor Things is a revelation, a potent story about self-creation that's worth seeking out, and that's worth getting lost in.

#### **HOW BLACK MUSICIANS SANG THE BEATLES INTO BEING**

#### **Texas State professors' new book** recontextualizes Paul McCartney's narrative


Back in 2014, when Katie Kapurch was first ensconcing herself in the Beatles academic community, she went to a conference at Penn State commemorating the 50th anniversary of the band's invasion of the U.S., the birthplace of the music they helped make so famous.

When she returned to San Marcos, she showed Jon Marc Smith – her partner, in writing and otherwise - the program for the event. The first words out of his mouth were, "Where are all the presentations about all the Black people?" The resulting conversations led them to contribute to the 2016 collection New Critical Perspectives on the Beatles, where they explored Paul McCartney's "Romantic vision of racial harmony" in flashy Eighties collaborations with Stevie Wonder ("Ebony and Ivory") and Michael Jackson ("Say, Say, Say").

The San Marcos-based couple dives further into the Beatles' lesser-acknowledged historic influences in their new book, Blackbird: How Black Musicians Sang the Beatles Into Beingand Sang Back to Them Ever After, released last month with Penn State University Press. Kapurch, an associate professor of English at Texas State focused on pop culture, has taught classes on the Beatles since 2015 and published various articles on the Fab Four. She ran up against some resistance when trying to convince Smith - a novelist and senior lecturer in English at Texas State - to make McCartney's song "Blackbird" the touchstone and title of their book.

"I didn't wanna write that much about Paul McCartney, and it really isn't that much about him," says Smith, whose interest in music stems from his Texas troubadour father. "So it became a book about how important birds and flight imagery are to Black music, and therefore, practically to all American-influenced pop music."

As part of the academic community centered on that history, Kapurch says she's witnessed a contemporary spin on the 1968 White Album track, which McCartney has said was inspired by the famous plight of the Little Rock Nine to integrate an all-white Arkansas school.




"McCartney's stories about 'Blackbird' as a civil rights story have completely overtaken the song. You can barely bring it up without someone saying, 'Oh, and he wrote it for civil rights!" she says. "[We] had to really go back to the beginning of American popular song, and the tradition of minstrelsy, and really dig into bird imagery."

She adds: "What we tried to do with the book was get around the subjectivity of McCartney and tell the story of Black music's influence, and the response to the Beatles through those other texts and artists, not allowing him to take over the book."

To anyone who considers this a takedown of the Beatles' legacy, Smith says: "We are not trying to deflate the Beatles, well maybe I am more than Katie [...] What we're trying to do is to put the Beatles' story in context. To look at it in all of its historical truth actually strengthens the story - the myth takes away from the power. Lying about the truth makes everything much

Calling his vision psychedelic jazz, the Honolulu native pulls funk, psych, hip-hop, free improv, and spiritual jazz into his orbit, spinning out an acid flow from some other quadrant. In H-Town he's known for his lunar eclinse concerts, performing brand-new tunes under the aura of the titular phenomenon. Digital EP Synesthesia Live, showcasing at this special Monks show, will enlighten the masses. - Michael Toland

### THE COMMON LAW by Luke Ellis

#### **Neighborhood Parking Battles**

You look outside your window and there's a vehicle parked in front of your Austin house. You have no idea who owns it. The vehicle stays there for a long time and you start to get annoyed. Why would someone decide to park in front of your house? And why for so long? Now you are beyond irritated and start to wonder - is it legal? Listed below are Austin parking-related questions that "The Common Law" has received.

Someone in my neighborhood likes to park a camping trailer in front of my house for weeks in a row It's not an RV It's the type of camping trailer that gets towed by a truck. Can they use the public street for long-term parking of the camping trailer?

No. Austin's local ordinances prohibit this. Under § 12-5-10, a person is not allowed to park on a public street "a trailer or other non-motorized equipment designed to be towed by a vehicle or other self-propelled equipment"

My neighbor's great. Except ... he parks his really big motor home on the street for several months each year. We think it looks ugly. Is the neighbor allowed to do this?

No. According to Austin city ordinance § 12-5-11, a motor home should not be parked on a public street for longer than 72 hours. Specifically, the ordinance states "a person may not park a self-propelled motor home or other motor vehicle containing a permanently installed sleeping facility or human sanitary treatment or disposal facility on a public street or alley for longer than 72 continuous hours."

Lots of folks in my neighborhood drive up the side part of their yard and park on the grass alongside their house. Is that allowed?

Probably not. As a general rule, Austin city ordinance § 12-5-29 says that a person cannot park a car in the "front yard or side vard of a residential property, except in a driveway or a payed parking space." There are some exceptions to this ordinance, so to learn more, go to the city of Austin website (ci.austin.tx.us) and look up ordinance § 12-5-29.

Anyone dealing with neighborhood parking practices that don't comply with city of Austin ordinances should contact Austin's nonemergency line (311).
