


# BRISCOE CENTER FOR AMERICAN HISTORY

**Celebrate Austin Museum Day with a visit to the newly renovated Briscoe Center for American History.** The center's \$7 million renovation means two new meeting rooms for classes and programs, 4,000 square feet of new exhibit space, and a fully updated reading room, where the Briscoe Center's vast archival collections can be accessed by the public. Founded in 1991, the center collects, preserves, and makes available the raw materials of historical research. One of the nation's largest archives for Texas and Southern history, the center's collection strengths have evolved to include American news media history and photojournalism, congressional and political history, and the history of the American energy industry. The center is located adjacent to the LBJ Presidential Library on the UT Austin campus. Come discover the *who, where, what, and when* of history—so you can work out *why*.

## Exploring the American South *Closing Sept. 23*



Drawn from the center's unparalleled Texas and Southern history collections, the exhibit chronicles the South between Revolution and Reconstruction. Through documents, diaries, photographs and other materials, many Southern voices are presented including enslaved individuals, soldiers, homemakers, planters, jurists, and free people of color.

## From Commemoration to Education *Through Dec. 15*



Commissioned in 1919, Pompeo Coppini's statue of Jefferson Davis was envisioned as part of a larger war memorial at UT Austin. In 2015, it was relocated to the center from the university's South Mall. No longer an object of commemoration, the statue—a work of art and piece of historical evidence—is now exhibited in an educational setting.

## Struggle for Justice *Coming Nov. 10*



*Struggle for Justice* showcases the center's resources for studying 40 years of the American civil rights movement, from Jim Crow to Black Power. The exhibit utilizes the work of over a dozen photographers whose archives are housed at the center, including Spider Martin, Flip Schulke, Charles Moore, Bruce Roberts, and R. C. Hickman.
