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

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

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

AUSTIN AT LARGE

50,000 PEOPLE EVERY YEAR

When I moved to Austin in 1988 the metro area had around 550,000 people. When Watson was elected mayor the first time nine years later, the metro area was close to 800,000, which is a huge jump in percentage terms, reflecting a steady annual growth rate of around 4.8%. That rate dipped about a half-point in 2001 with the dot-com bust, then held steady for the next 18 years or so, and now the metro area is home to 2.3 million people. Central Texas keeps adding between 50,000 and 75,000 residents a year, but that is now a rate of growth that's substantially slower than it was during my first 30 years as an Austinite, from an ever-larger base.

THE WOLF OF CONGRESS AVE. The **Texas Senate** passed a bill Tuesday (on a 19-12 vote) that would raise the penalty for voting illegally from a misdemeanor to a felony punishable by up to 20 years in prison, as Lt. Gov. **Dan Patrick** has made a priority. Next, the House votes.

NOT INTERSTELLAR, ACTUALLY LESS THAN STELLAR Austin's downsizing vision for an urban rail system by 2030 has a new challenge: Companion Texas House and Senate bills would force the **Austin Transit Partnership** to hold a citywide election before borrowing money to pay for **Project Connect's** upfront building costs.

After a years-long battle over the state takeover (sparked by F-rated schools), the agency confirmed Wednesday that it's appointing a board.

GHOSTS OF HUSBANDS PAST While we're mentally visiting Houston, a man is suing three Houston women who he claims assisted his now-ex-wife in aborting last year. The first case of its kind in Texas was filed by **Jonathan Mitchell**, the attorney behind the state's six-week abortion ban, and state Rep. **Briscoe Cain**, R-Deer Park.

THE PAPERBOY (NEEDS A NEW JOB) Canadian, Texas, in the Panhandle joined the many small towns across America becoming news deserts after losing its newspaper of 130 years this month. You may recognize **The Canadian Record**, owned by **Laurie Ezzell Brown's** family since 1948, if you tuned in to **Texas Monthly's** true-crime podcast **Tom Brown's Body**.

KILLER LLOYD U.S. Rep. **Lloyd Doggett** and Foundation Communities celebrated Tuesday the **\$3.5 million** in federal funds for the nonprofit's programs serving low- and middle-income families.

THE FUNERAL PLANNER Austin's archnemesis **blue-green algae** is back at Lady Bird Lake and Lake Austin. The city's **Watershed Protection Department** is warning dog owners about the toxic algae that can kill pets.

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
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The Austin metro area's population total (top) and growth rate (bottom) from 1988 through 2023 (dotted red line) and then as projected through 2037

There really is no contemporary American city, not even in Texas, that has grown as much, as fast, for as long as Austin. Indeed, I'm using metro-area rather than city-limits population because Austin proper is maxed out and full up and expensive AF with its massive housing shortage, barely growing at all since 2020 and stuck under 1 million residents, at No. 11 in the largest-U.S.-cities table; the new 50K-75K Central Texans each year (on net) are now going straight to the suburbs. They're still close enough to take advantage of Austin's unique attractions and opportunities, and to take upon themselves the everyone's-a-winner Austin ethos. But the decline in the regional growth rate is not just a statistical artifact; fewer people are going to come here and stay here if they can't actually live *in Austin*.

BUT WHY IS THAT A PROBLEM?

As much as we loooooove to complain about the effects of so much growth so fast for so long, the effects of population *decline* are much worse and Austin is a long way from that outcome. The problems with a long spell of market-induced growth rationing are pragmatic for certain employment sectors, particularly public-sector jobs with little wage flexibility like 911 call takers (see p.18), but others might enjoy a spell of only growing 2% each year instead of 5%. However, such thinking is immoral and unethical, sorry to harsh the buzz. Who gets to decide who stays and who goes and who never comes? Elon Musk? Kirk Watson? You?

The immorality comes in many forms. It is the height of irresponsibility to say that we should grow more slowly, and in a way that intensely harms the planet, because we have run out of places where we can build big apartment buildings far from affluent homeowners who have exquisitely rationalized their desire to discriminate, and to live in homogenous environs, into the horrors of the Austin Land Development Code. This has for generations purloined resources and power and opportunity from poorer and younger and not-as-white Austinites who are still, simultaneously, *encouraged* to move here, go to college, make music, get a midskills job, teach the children, take care of the garden, wait on tables. If Austin wants to be a place with a stable, slow-growing, aging, and increasingly white and affluent population, it has the right policies in place but the totally wrong brand.

To align the policies with the brand, official Austin needs to do about 50 times more hard work than it ever has to create a Vatican II-level program of change – not just rewriting the land use code or doling out a fixed stream of subsidy funds, but hardcore moves like seizing surface parking lots and one-story strip malls via eminent domain so we can build apartments there. (Ironically, that's not as politically difficult as rewriting the code, and the mayor has some *interesting* powers here, hint hint, says the former chair of the city Urban Renewal Board.) Luckily, many such places will be in the transit station areas that *must* be rezoned and rebuilt if we want the feds to come pay their share of Project Connect. Watson's on top of that, right? ■

School Boards and Rail Lines

Searching for a super, roughing out the rail routes

The **Austin Independent School District Board of Trustees** will be selecting a new superintendent by the end of May, in a selection process run by **GR Recruiting**. After stakeholder interviews and an online public survey, GRR will meet with the AISD Board this coming week to develop the profile for what they're looking for in a new super at a work session on Wednesday, March 22, and a public hearing at 5:30pm on Thursday, March 23. Then they'll post some ads, and start accepting applications by March 25. See more on the process at austinisd.org/board/superintendent-search.

Why should you care? Well, while AISD has been spared the culture war virus that's been sweeping the nation's school boards (for that, see our neighbors to the north in Round Rock ISD), the district has been beset by a host of other problems – falling enrollment, teacher retention (see p.14), changing demographics, “failing” schools – much of which tracks back to a district administration that no one has much faith in. So there's some hope that a strong new leader could light a fire under central admin that would give campuses a feeling that they're being heard and supported, rather than simply tested and judged. On the other hand, facing a national trend toward standardized testing and a state government that is genuinely not supportive of public education, that's a tall hill to climb.

But still, why should *you* care? Okay, how about this? A large chunk of your famously expensive **housing bill** is going directly to AISD. If you're a homeowner in the district, they get over half of your property tax payment. If you're a renter, the calculation isn't as transparent, but make no mistake, you're paying property taxes – they represent 20% or more of your total rent, according to experts. And again, over half of that is going directly to AISD.

But now that I've got you wound up about property taxes, I will say, there's not much AISD can do about it. Of all the money the district receives in taxes, it turns around and sends well over half of it – \$761 million in AISD taxpayer money – directly back to the state in “recapture” payments to plug a hole in state funding and allow the Legislature to fulfill its constitutional mandate to fund public education in the state. AISD's remittance is extraordinary: higher than the next four districts in the state added together, due to a formula based on our sky-high property values combined with

falling school enrollment. And everyone knows that isn't fair or logical for a district that's 70% minority and 52% economically disadvantaged, but given the Legislature's distaste for Austin and its woke values, no one's in a hurry to fix it. Meanwhile, the recapture money is redirected to property-poor school districts, but also increasingly to fund charter schools – including the ones competing to lure the most desirable and easiest-to-teach students away from AISD. Gotta love the Texas state government.

So I hope I haven't put you off your earlier excitement over the **superintendent search**. Don't forget that public hearing at the board meeting next Thursday; it's on AISD TV and online. See austinisd.org/board/meetings for more info, including how to comment at the meeting.

What Happens When Austin's Daily Paper Dies

Since 2018, the corporation that owns the *Statesman* lost half its staff **BY MAGGIE Q. THOMPSON**

What happens when a daily paper dies? What happens when that paper has, for generations, been a watchdog over the capital of one of the most populated states in the union?

Dysfunctional systems stay dysfunctional. Unwatched health care systems cause injury and death, under-covered schools fail to adequately educate, mostly empty courtrooms lead to wrongful convictions, and unwatched incarceration systems commit constitutional and human rights violations. Journalists are the nerves in a democratic body, feeling around for threats in the major organs of our society, alerting everybody else before those threats advance into crises. So when a paper can no longer afford enough reporters to cover health care, education, transportation, housing, courts, the Legislature, even city and county government – at a deep and sustained level – we lose nerve endings in entire organ systems.

Austin American-Statesman reporters and editors are clearly hardworking, if with frayed nerves. Editor-in-Chief **Manny Garcia** in February won the Editor of the Year Award from the **National Press Foundation** for the newsroom's coverage of Uvalde. They're doing things we at the *Chronicle* wish we could – like reaching Spanish-speaking readers by publishing stories in Spanish, for one. "At this point, we are doing everything we can to cover as much

as we can. We all care about this city and so we are willing to work those long days," said **Luz Moreno-Lozano**, a *Statesman* reporter and chair of the **Austin News Guild**, the union formed in 2021 to support the paper's rank-and-file reporters. "But that does come with a price. We're tired."

Enter, burnout. *Statesman* staff has been leaving in droves (for better pay and better-staffed newsrooms), while their corporate overlords fail to fill those vacancies. As a result, the capital of Texas is increasingly covered by what you might call a ghost daily – a newspaper that isn't sufficiently staffed to watchdog the various systems of power in a community. Such papers are often owned by **Gannett**.

Gannett, America's largest newspaper chain, found itself under the microscope Friday after the publication of a report by the **Nieman Lab** (Harvard's nonprofit news org) laying out how the corporate behemoth has gutted the papers it owns, cutting half of its jobs in four years. Those cuts aren't proportional to the rate of newspaper revenue decline, but they do make sense when you account for the giant, high-interest loan Gannett took out in 2019 to finance a merger with Gatehouse Media, per the Nieman Lab.

So the cuts deepened. Between 2019 and 2022, Gannett shut down roughly 1 in 3 of its 563 daily and weekly newspapers across

Homeless Shelter Closure Delayed, but Residents Are Already on the Street

The **housing crisis** affects almost everyone living in Austin, which will become apparent when you realize you're gonna need a second or third roommate to afford skyrocketing Austin rent. Or when you find a place you can afford and learn that you lost out to another applicant whose household income is triple yours.

The crisis is life-threatening, though, for the roughly 4,000 **unsheltered and unhoused Austinites** who live in a city with only about 1,000 shelter beds. Now, the city is set to lose 10% of those. Last month, the **Salvation Army of Austin** announced their Downtown shelter – the only Austin shelter that accepts single women – would close March 15 due to the building's state of disrepair and its estimated \$10+ million value (the organization intends to sell it and reinvest into their other local programs). Public pressure from elected officials, local homeless service providers, and shelter residents seems to have caused a shift in the organization's stance. After the Salvation Army repeatedly refused to delay the closure or to let the city temporarily lease the building, the city announced last week that "the Sally," as the shelter is called, will stay open another 30 days.

While the city and its partners attempt to steer current residents of the shelter to housing and other options, the announcement may have come too late for some. Of the shelter's 98 residents at the time of the closure announcement, 35 have already left without a housing plan lined up – what service providers call "exiting to the street."

"It's typical of emergency shelters, across the nation, to exit people to an unknown destination," ECHO Executive Director **Matt Mollica** told the *Chronicle*. But, he said, losing about a third of clients to unknown destinations in only 20 days is alarming. "We need to be assertive in our outreach now that closure has been delayed. ... We need to make sure those folks know they have a bed available and that they don't fall out of the system and lose the support they were receiving. That is a top responsibility for the entire response system during the closure extension period." – *Austin Sanders*

the country, and it went from 25,000 U.S. employees to 11,200 in 2022.

The *Statesman* is no exception. One *Statesman* reporter tells us that since November, 13 employees have left, and the paper has only made one full-time hire in that period.

The staffing impact on the community can be quantified, to a degree. Alliance for Audited Media statements obtained by **Joshua Benton** (founder of the Nieman lab and writer of the report in question) show that in 2018, the *Statesman's* average circulation on Sunday (the highest circulation day) was about 93,000. In 2022, Sunday circulation was down to 34,000 – a 63% decrease.

Gannett takes issue with that. In a statement provided to the *Chronicle*, a Gannett spokesperson said the Nieman Lab “utilizes Alliance for Audited Media (AAM) data to inaccurately depict Gannett’s circulation and subscriber figures. We have requested a correction. AAM data is used to help advertisers understand publisher reach in

specific markets, not to infer readership or paid circulation. Further, the story narrative contradicts our mission.”

Gannett spokespeople did not dispute the vacant positions or the stress that puts on a newsroom, nor did they answer questions about the news coverage gaps that those vacancies create. But *Statesman* reporters are acutely aware of both deficiencies.

After García’s National Press Foundation win in February, the guild tweeted “Gannett, the award-winning journalists at the *Statesman* could use some help. Fill the vacancies left by 22 colleagues leaving in a year. Give us honest and open communication. Provide meaningful cost of living raises for all. Hold healthcare premiums. A fair contract now.”

That fair contract hasn’t happened. The guild met with attorneys this month and are still working on it. Moreno-Lozano says they’re still working to improve pay and benefits in an increasingly unlivable city. “It’s been a long process.” ■

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Bill of the Week: Who Gets a Piece of Texas?

Texans take to the Capitol to battle discriminatory property bills **BY BENTON GRAHAM**

Texas Iranian-American Advocacy Day was supposed to be a day for Iranian Texans to gather from across the state. It was supposed to be an opportunity for **Max Jameson** to convey which Iran-related federal bills he did and did not support, for **Michelle Khodayari Lewis** to trek from San Antonio to the state's Capitol, and for **Anahita Ahmadi** to share their horrifying experience of imprisonment by the Iranian regime. While the group did get those messages across during their Feb. 22 event, the **Texas Legislature** managed to complicate the focus of the event through a pair of bills filed by Republican lawmakers that aim to put restrictions on buying property for folks with ties to China, Iran, North Korea, and Russia.

Senate Bill 147, filed by state Sen. **Lois Kolkhorst**, R-Brenham, initially included vague language aimed at barring individuals from those countries from purchasing property. SB 711, filed by state Sen. **Charles Perry**, R-Lubbock, takes it a step further. That bill, which several Iranian Americans described as “scary,” would require buyers from countries deemed national security

threats to receive written approval from the seller to complete the purchase. “Senate Bill 711 would allow the seller to proclaim, exhibit, and instill a patriotism, through sacrifice for the greater good through the knowledge of who’s trying to acquire it,” Perry said.

The Iranian American community wasn’t the only group to oppose the bill. Chinese Americans held a large protest in Houston’s Chinatown in February and flooded a **Senate Committee on State Affairs** hearing on March 2. “We are proud to call Texas our home ever since we moved here. As a foreigner in the United States, I have always felt safe ...

However, in January, when Governor Abbott endorsed SB 147, that shattered all the peace of mind,” one Chinese American speaker said. As Sen. **Charles Schwertner**, R-Georgetown, attempted to cut him off for reaching his allotted time, the speaker pointed out that previous speakers who gave testimony in favor of the bill had been given more leeway to go over on time. A wave of loud applause poured in from the gallery – an indication of the strength of opposition to the bills.

Prior to the March 2 hearing, advocates had managed to win a few concessions from Kolkhorst on SB 147. She agreed to sharpen the language so that the restrictions did not apply to lawful permanent residents, which she noted includes dual citizens. “We wanted to make sure that if these bills get passed that they have amended verbiage, and I do believe that Sen. Kolkhorst was very generous in her time and understanding in putting that amended verbiage in there. I think that made us feel heard by her,” said Khodayari Lewis, who met with several lawmakers during the Texas Iranian-American Advocacy Day.

Armin Salek, one of the event organizers, said there are mixed feelings in the

community about the bills and the concessions won. “We, as a community of organizers, agree that we want to prevent the Islamic regime and its beneficiaries from owning property in Texas, but we want to do it in a way that doesn’t punish ordinary Iranian Americans who have already suffered at the hands of the Islamic regime,” he said, adding that Perry’s bill appears to be a clear violation of the **Fair Housing Act** of 1968.

Banafsheh Madaninejad, who also helped organize the event and is a political science professor at Austin Community College, said she sees the bills as ineffective in keeping regime operatives out of Texas and that they “really [mess] with

EDUCATION: STAUNCHING THE FLOW OF TEACHERS STRAIGHT OUT OF TOWN

“I don’t want to leave Austin,” said **Traci Dunlap**, a kindergarten teacher at **Maplewood Elementary School**. “But what are my choices?”

Dunlap posed the question at a Downtown rally on March 12 as her union, **Education Austin**, kicked off its “We Know Our Worth” campaign to demand better pay for teachers and support personnel in the **Austin Independent School District**. Dunlap told the audience that she and her colleagues are now paid less than they were 10 years ago when adjusted for inflation. As a result, many have been driven outside the city by skyrocketing living expenses. Those who are still here are barely making it. “Most teachers I know work a second job,” Dunlap said. “But one job should be enough. This is not sustainable.” To address the increasing cost of living, Education Austin is asking for a \$12-per-hour pay raise for custodians, bus drivers, and other Austin ISD employees who are paid by the hour, and a 12% increase in base pay for teachers, counselors, and librarians.

“They know their worth, they know their value,” said **Ken Zarifis**, Education Austin’s president. “And coming out of the pandemic they know even more No principal, no superintendent, no associate

superintendent, no chief carried this district through the pandemic. It is the bus drivers, the custodians, the teachers, the TAs – it is these people who carried the district through the pandemic.”

In addition to pay raises, Education Austin is asking AISD to fully staff the schools, clearly define job descriptions, and place a hard cap on class sizes. “It’s about taking our workload from insurmountable to manageable,” said **Rachel Preston**, who teaches French at Bowie High School. “As a language teacher, I’ve never in my 12 years had the tools, resources, and support to have a manageable workload, much less a reasonable one.”

Preston and her fellow union members are all too aware that heavy workloads are driving teachers out of the profession, creating a cycle where the remaining teachers continue to be overburdened. She said the only way to fix the problem is to treat teachers right. “We know our worth,” Preston said. “Let’s push our leadership to give us what we deserve – a reasonable workload, achievable during contract hours. That is how we can fill our vacancies and attract educators back to Austin ISD.”

Iranian-Americans sense of belonging,” as she had to explain to her 13-year-old son why she needed to testify at the Capitol. The advocates, known as the **Texan Iranian-American Advocacy Group**, are also continuing their calls for politicians to sponsor Iranians on death row for their participation in protests. They hope the sponsorship can act as a form of protection for those at the mercy of a brutal regime.

In addition to state legislation, they’ve their sights set on national bills, with hopes that Congress will pass the **MAHSA Act**, which would sanction Iran’s supreme leader, president, and other leaders. Thus far, that bill has been largely backed by House Republicans. House Resolution 100, another bill around the Iranian protests, has received more bipartisan support. However, TIAAG opposes it because they worry it boosts the **Mojahedin-e-Khalq**, a cultlike group of exiled Iranians that has faced accusations of sexual abuse and other wrongdoing.

Members of TIAAG are seeking support from U.S. Reps. **Greg Casar**, **Lloyd Doggett**, and other Texas Democrats. Doggett told the *Chronicle* that he’s supporting the MAHSA Act and is holding off on supporting H.R. 100 given concerns around its language about MEK. “I want to do what little we can to keep the issue out there, and to let the people who are suffering in Iranian prisons and are subject to the death penalty know that we have not forgotten,” he said,


adding that he would consider sponsoring a protester on death row in Iran. A statement from Rep. Casar’s office noted that he “will continue to work with his fellow progressive Democrats on how to best promote human rights and advocate for democracy in Iran and across the world.” Members of TIAAG plan to visit Washington, D.C., later in the month and to host a Texas Iranian-American Advocacy Day every two years to promote a culture of advocacy. ■

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Austin's Petition Tradition Gets an Update

When you ask what has made (and kept) Austin weird, part of the answer must be this city's penchant for self-governance. Austin voters can write their own city ordinance, get a fraction of the electorate to sign a petition supporting it, and put it on the ballot for a yes/no vote. That's how the famed **Save Our Springs Ordinance** came to be law in 1992, creating some of the environmental safeguards that have helped define Austin culturally and politically for a generation – for better and for worse.

Since 1992, the petition initiative process has resulted in bans on **smoking** (in 2005) and **public camping** (in 2021, effectively criminalizing homelessness). But it's unclear how much these ordinances actually represent the will of Austin's electorate. That's why Council Member **Ryan Alter** authored a resolution to reexamine the process, which Council adopted March 9 on a 10-1 vote, with CM **Mackenzie Kelly** against.



There are a few problems with the current system: An Austin voter has to stay on their toes with multiple elections often taking place in one year. Turnout for these ballot measure elections tends to be much lower, especially when they take place off-cycle. Meanwhile, the number of signatures needed to get an ordinance on the ballot has not changed in a decade, while the city's population has boomed. In 2012, Austin voters approved an amendment to the City Charter that lowered the signature threshold from 10% of "qualified voters" (which is a count of all voters with an Austin address) to just 5% of qualified voters or **20,000**, whichever number is smaller.

"If we're going to spend valuable city resources on an election, that petition should stem from a representative cross section of the public, not an ever-shrinking sliver," said Alter.

A 2019 report by the city auditor found that peer cities in Texas require many more



signatures. Houston, Dallas, San Antonio, and Ft. Worth require between **10% and 20% of registered voters** to sign onto a petition initiative. According to Austin City Clerk **Myrna Rios**, given that Austin had 682,206 qualified voters in 2022, signatures from 20,000 people would account for only about 3%. In 1992, SOS campaigners collected 30,000 signatures – or about 11% of eligible Austin voters for that election.

Austin's petition initiative campaigns have not always been run honestly. And they cost voters serious money. Rios says the city will spend about \$575,000 to

administer the May 6 election, which will place only the two **Austin Police Oversight Act** initiatives on the ballot. **Equity Action's** "real" APOA will be Prop A, and the "imposter" APOA, supported by the **Austin Police Association**, will be Prop B. Also, Rios and her staff must follow a time-consuming process to validate a petition. All told, the clerk's office spent more than 2,400 hours, at a cost of \$132,957, to process the two petitions.

Alter's resolution could change the petition initiative process for the first time in a decade. It establishes a 2024 Charter Review

WEATHERING AUSTIN'S NEXT "UNPRECEDENTED" WINTER STORM

Though the weather this week has been South By-perfect, with agreeable highs in the 80s and lows in the 50s, just a mere month ago we were under a sharp rain of falling icy tree limbs, resulting in week-long power outages for the second time in two years. One of the calls

to action coming out of Winter Storm Mara – overshadowed by City Manager **Spencer Cronk's** storm-related sacking – was to scrutinize the vegetation management practices of the ratepayer-owned city utility, **Austin Energy**. Why did so much of Austin's beautiful canopy catastrophically collide with power lines?

As is often the case in Austin, it has something to do with homeowner-led efforts to keep Austin beautiful. **Elton Richards**, AE's vice president of field operations, traces veg management issues back to 2006, when **Hyde Park** residents successfully petitioned Council to reduce customer tree trimming to a 4-foot trim for slow-growing trees and 8-foot for fast-growing trees. A June 2006 Hyde Park Pecan Press issue refers to a tree-trimming "moratorium" secured by the neighborhood and advertises a free TreeFolks planting "to replace the one that was 'trimmed' by Austin Energy." Neighbors worried that improperly trained outside contractors butchered the trees, a concern Richards says has since been assuaged: "All the guys that work for me could get a job at the National Forest Service tomorrow." They also pressed Council to consider burying power lines. (Buried lines saved Dallas, hit about as hard by the recent winter storm, from the kind of power outages that Austinites endured.)

In 2019, AE General Manager **Jackie Sargent** reestablished the prior standard of a 10-foot trim for slow-growing trees and 15 feet for fast-growing. But more than a decade of minimal trimming practices left AE crews scrambling to catch up to new standards – of the

304 circuits citywide that require trimming, they've completed 62 circuits (149 miles) so far. They plan to finish another 250 miles in 2023 and the whole city by 2026. To mitigate homeowner complaints, six months before the trimming, arborists tour the neighborhood to assess trees and leave door hangers to notify residents. About 40% of residents call to ask questions, Richards says, and 10%-20% request an arborist-led walk-through.

During the flurry of press conferences this February, Richards made clear that the damage Austin trees sustained last month was pretty much inevitable; a half-inch of ice on a branch can weigh 500 pounds: "That wasn't a vegetation management issue." As the climate becomes more unpredictable, trees and power lines will encounter more ice. So if we can't help the trees, can we help the lines?

Post-storm, Council directed a third party to conduct a **feasibility study** for burying all overhead distribution lines. Sounds simple, but Richards says in a flood-prone city like Austin the process would be logistically ill-advised and "extremely cost prohibitive." One mile of line would cost over \$1 million, and distribution lines stretch about 2,400 miles. Without a bond, such improvements aren't in the cards.

If we can't bury the power lines, how can we improve climate resilience and avoid massive power outages every winter? Richards says, "I could take all the trees 40 feet away from all the power lines and take them down; then you don't have to worry about a tree ever coming onto a power line. But is that worth giving up the tree? I don't think it is. We get to the standard and reliability will improve, but it will not stop an act of God. There's nothing we can do about that." – *Lina Fisher*

Commission to explore potential changes to the City Charter for the Nov. 5, 2024, election. It also allows the commission to explore any charter amendment it wants – like transitioning the city to a “strong mayor” system of government, which voters soundly rejected in May 2021, but possibly because there was nothing like a robust charter review process that preceded it. The only change the commission is directed to explore is the usage of a “durable,” percentage-based signature threshold for initiatives, instead of the arbitrary 20,000 number. ■

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Public Safety: This Is 911, Can You Hold Please?

While Austin's police union and the city duke it out over the level of civilian oversight the **Austin Police Department** should operate under in the new police contract – with arguments about retention and police brutality threaded through those negotiations – there's at least one public safety issue everybody agrees on: When you call 911, you should not be placed on a **30-minute hold**.

But that is exactly what's happening during peak 911 call periods in Austin (think **New Year's Eve** and last month when a bunch of adolescents blocked off the intersection of South Lamar and Barton Springs Road to do donuts with their cars). This weekend is likely to cause similar problems, given the influx of people to Austin for **South by Southwest**.

The problem at the 911 call center is the same problem city departments are dealing with across the board – understaffing. But dispatch is hurting worse than most, with about **half of its positions vacant** for months now. "In an emergency, every second

counts," an APD spokesperson told the *Chronicle*. "The best way to reduce call wait times is to get more 911 call takers."

In one deadly example, **Duván Betancourth-Gonzalez**, a 34-year-old Colombian American father of two young children, bled out and died in June after being stabbed in a robbery. Betancourth-Gonzalez called 911 as he bled. Authorities said there was a "language barrier" because he only spoke Spanish. It took dispatch several minutes to figure out where the crime occurred, **Univision** reported. APD dispatchers and call takers do use **LanguageLine**, a 24/7 translation service that charges the city by the minute, for all non-English-speaking callers. When asked if having Spanish-speaking call takers in the room would reduce waits, the APD spokesperson told us that LanguageLine resolves that problem, though depending on how long it takes to connect to that line, it may extend the call time.

APD says filling 911 positions is "a top priority," but a mandated multistep process



candidates must go through slows down the process. After passing the initial criminal history and interviews, they do a 34-page **Texas Commission on Law Enforcement** background packet, drug screen, and psych exam. APD has added two new recruiting/hiring positions, streamlined the application process, and is placing ads to recruit more call takers.

Especially when the 911 call center is half-staffed, callers can call **311** to report non-emergencies. And this month, APD unveiled its enhanced **ireportaustin.com**, which allows callers to file reports online and "helps the report get to an investigator faster and prevents the reporter from extended wait times," per APD. 

Breaking Ground

Three new studios in the Austin area could mean space for the film industry to expand

The view from out front of Stray Vista Studios is pretty breathtaking. It's no wonder that studio founder and owner Nate Strayer picked this nondescript industrial park in Dripping Springs, looking right over the Hill Country (although, he confides, having a rum distillery as a neighbor doesn't hurt, either). "It's what I hear Burbank was like before Disney first opened his studio there," he said.

But it's the view inside that's really going to attract interest, the one created by the biggest Volume soundstage in Texas. The technology may be new to many, but they'll be familiar with the end results if they've watched *The Mandalorian* or any of a host of other films and TV shows shot on a Volume stage. Ranks of LED screens create real-time

environments, powered by the Unreal software engine. There's a real camera on the soundstage, and a virtual camera within the ranks of servers behind the screens. In seconds, the location shifts from desert to jungle — modeling tools can create mountains instantaneously. The end result is simple: infinite location shooting, massively reduced turnaround for projects. "As soon as you're done shooting, you have your hard drive of your final footage," Strayer said. "You don't have to do months of VFX or motion tracking."

To prove his point, Strayer played a video on his phone: a commercial that had been shot on the stage only a week earlier and now was almost completely ready for broadcast. Strayer said, "If you have a 30-second spot, and you need to be in five

different locations, you can spend five days shooting or have a bunch of company moves in one day, or you can come into a place like this and shoot the commercial in one day."

It's a technology that Strayer said he wished he'd had when he was a struggling filmmaker in L.A., or when he directed his feature debut, *Outlier*, in his native Michigan. Volume technology was starting to take off, so he started pitching investors and, looking for a location, he settled on Austin. He explained, "With this technology, a big use case for it is commercial," he said, and since a substantial component of Austin's productions are for national campaigns, it seemed like the perfect location. Having soft-opened in February, the space has already hosted three projects, including music videos and commercials.

Stray Vista is just one of a new wave of studios opening in the Austin area over the next couple of years. In June 2021, Bastrop City Council approved an agreement with the team behind L.A.-based Line 204 Studios for Bastrop 552, a 546-acre mixed-use development that would be anchored around nearly 500,000 square feet of studio space, with supporting milling and office facilities.

South of the city in nearby San Marcos, Hill Country Studios is planned to include 12 soundstages, totaling 310,000 square feet of studio space, plus 15 acres of backlot.

Austin is already a production hub: It has a top-tier crew base, and the surrounding area provides an incredible variety of exteriors, from desert to deep forest to big city to small towns. However, Austin Film Commission Executive Director Brian Gannon said, "Having that additional dedicated studio space is huge."

Two years ago, Gannon explained, "we had four shows going and we don't have four studios." He often has to work industrial real estate agents for unused warehouse space, and that's challenging, since leases for that kind of space are usually for 10 years, not a few months for a film or a year for a TV show. "It takes a certain kind of property owner who is prepared to work through that," Gannon said. For example, his office worked with Majestic Realty Co. to find space for HBO's *Love & Death*, and they found a new warehouse space that would be vacant for a year before it went into long lease. Gannon said, "To grow the industry, we need to fill the spaces that we have, but we also need new spaces."



And what space there is remains at a premium. Austin Studios normally holds its annual Texas Film Awards on the studio backlot (itself a converted airport); but this year, between the long-term lease of online entertainment behemoth Rooster Teeth and shooting for the CW's *Walker*, they had to go off-campus. That's good trouble for Austin Studios, but a sign of the premium on soundstages in the area, and these new developments will not just relieve that pressure but make the process of finding studio space a lot easier.

There are good signs from the Legislature that the state is finally getting behind film and TV production in Texas. First, Senate Finance Committee Chair Joan Huffman, R-Houston, filed Senate Bill 30, the draft supplemental budget. In it was a surprise proposal for an extra \$100 million for the Texas Moving Image Industry Incentive Program, the state's rebate program for film, TV, commercial, and gaming productions. The sum is separate from whatever is proposed for the next biennium in the regular budget. It's no secret in the film and TV community that many projects were either leaving Texas or not even considering it as a location due to the TMIIP fund being empty barely halfway through the biennium. If approved by lawmakers as part of the supplemental appropriation, this one-off boost could be available as early as April, making Texas even more attractive to productions that might start eyeing those new spaces. This proposal is supported by a raft of proposed TMIIP reforms from both Republicans and Democrats that would open up the fund to more, and bigger, projects.

Secondly, and more directly tied to studio development, is House Bill 4051, filed by Rep. Craig Goldman, R-Ft. Worth. Texas has “media production development zones,” in which new studios receive tax breaks during construction. Under Goldman's proposal, the minimum size for a community to be eligible for MPDZ status will drop from 250,000 to 100,000. According to Gannon, this is a sign that lawmakers understand that “production is happening around the state, not just in the large metropolitan areas.” Most importantly, it reflects an understanding that “this is an industry that is creating jobs, and it's exporting Texas around the world.” ■





Review: Steel Magnolias

BIG HAIR, STILL CARE IN CITY THEATRE'S STAGING OF THIS SOUTHERN CLASSIC

Robert Harling's *Steel Magnolias*, currently being staged by the City Theatre, is a mani-pedi of a play set exclusively in Truvy's Beauty Shop in Chinquapin Parish, Louisiana. The dramedy premiered off-Broadway in 1987 – the time when the play takes place – and was soon turned into a star-studded film on regular rotation on the Lifetime channel.

Truvy's place of business is a woman's world where men are mentioned but dare not tread and drawing dialogue revolves around local gossip, recipe exchanges, and Shelby. Shelby (Natalie L'Amoreaux) is an endearing, headstrong young woman whose diabetes and disappointing marriage lead to personal setbacks, medical complications, and tough love doled out by her ever-vigilant mother, M'Lynn (Tracy Hurd), who puts on a brave face when dealing with her daughter's fragility.

The play also features abundantly lovable salon owner Truvy (Jennifer Gonzalez), her born-again assistant Annelle (Angelina Castillo), and a duo of devoted locals – the charming and affable Clairee (Terri Bennett) and cantankerous Ouiser (Judith Laird) – who come in for a wash and a rinse but stay to dish, offer astute observations about life and love, and deliver some of *Steel Magnolias'* best dialogue. Throughout the play, these women are emotionally invested in Shelby's pain and pleasure and each other, which invites us to do the same.

What makes this play so entertaining is that the script is filled with clever, country-fried witticisms and hilarious, rapid-fire one-liners amidst all the heartbreak. When delivered well – which it is most of the time in this intimate production under Andy Berkovsky's velvet-gloved direction – each line hits home and each character's Deep South gentility and inner strength shine through. So does their authenticity, the result of the hard work invested by these talented actors. Castillo's Annelle and

Bennett's Clairee are particularly well-defined and multidimensional creations.

And yet, when L'Amoreaux enters the room as Shelby, the play seems to downshift to where the comedy strikes a better, more theatrical balance with the drama. It is not so much Shelby's diabetes as L'Amoreaux's organic effervescence and soft-spoken approach to the character that generate a stronger display of everyone else's affection toward Shelby. Only Hurd has trouble riding that wave. She works so hard – too hard, really – at putting on M'Lynn's brave face and doling out the aforementioned tough love that the character's adoration for her daughter, which is so central to the storytelling, never surfaces.

Hurd's performance is not helped by one of the worst big-hair wigs ever created, second only to the one adorning Gonzalez, which nearly turn both M'Lynn and Truvy into caricatures. Surely this must be the result of a budgetary

constraint rather than a creative choice by Michelle Malia. It is not until the emotion-filled final scene that Hurd leans into the brilliant monologue she is handed, bravely gives into the sentiment of the moment, and, wig be damned, flat-out crushes it.

Surrounding the actors at City Theatre's temporary performance space is Berkovsky's makeshift scenic design that does them no favors. The assorted artifacts and mismatched pieces and parts of furniture are enough to create a semblance of a beauty shop, but walls made of curtains and stand-alone set-pieces don't come close to the kind of lovingly constructed refuge Truvy would have created for her community of friends.

Despite these few shortcomings, there's plenty of Southern comfort to be found in this production, along with a steady supply of well-earned laughs and tears. ■

SOUTH BY SOUTHWEST IS A PLACE TO MAKE MOVES – and no one makes moves quite like **House of Lepore**, the local ballroom family headed up by recent Champions of Change Spacemaker of the Year Award winner **Mother Natalie Lepore**. In 2022, the Lepores brought to SXSW its first official ball, the **Dirty South Ball**, with the help of Black, queer-owned production company **Unbounded Agency**. This year, they're doing the whole damn thing themselves: The **Big-Stage Ball** at **Cheer Up Charlies** starts at 8pm with a showcase of DJs and live music from **BabiBoi Lepore**, **Cookiee Kawaii**, **Dai Burger**, **SMV**, **Diamond Dior Davenport**, **Sevndeeep**, and **Mia Gladstone**, before diving into a full-on ballroom competition on the outdoor stage. On CUC's indoor stage will be a hyperactive hot spot called **HyperPOP Palace**, featuring DJs **Amarji King**, **JPTR**, and **IDKRYAN**.

For anyone out of the loop: Ballroom competitions are a big part of underground queer, BIPOC culture, and consist of several categories that participants perform a runway-style walk during. Anyone looking to know more about ballroom can get an in-depth education every first Thursday at the Lepores' monthly mini-ball, **ATX Vogue Nights**, hosted at **Swan Dive**.

House of Lepore curates incredible themes, and the Big-Stage Ball is no exception. The only difference here, though, is that this stage is much bigger and more high-stakes thanks to SXSW. "The concept behind 'The Big Stage Ball' is both straight-forward and effective," BabiBoi explains. "We wanted to stay true to the core of what SXSW is about, which is live-music." To tribute the musical core of South By, the Lepores wove pop-star wig malfunctions, concert culture, j-ette dance formations, and more into their category guidelines. Marrying theme and intent is paramount to a cohesive ball worthy of the Lepores, as BabiBoi emphasizes that the evening's focus should be on "all of the wonderful LGBTQ+ talent that is billed on our line-up including musicians, DJ's, and Houses."

Speaking of houses, another highlight of this year's event is that attendants will be introduced to **11 of Texas' leading kiki houses**. In addition to the hosting Lepores, there'll also be the **houses of Juicy Couture**, **GZ**, **Old Navy**, **Nike**, **Von Dutch**, **Bodega**, **Mamba**, **Moschino**, **Mulan**, and **007**. By paying respect to the Lone Star ballroom community, the Lepores continue their mission to create space for the people central to ballroom's storied history. "[Although] it is a space that everyone is welcome to," BabiBoi elaborates, "we will always uplift the BIPOC Queer community and pay our respects to all of the Black and Latinx [trans women] that paved the way for ballroom to exist."

DAY TRIPS BY GERALD E. MCLEOD

The **Ralston Family Collections Center** at the **Alamo** in **San Antonio** displays 500 artifacts from early Texas rarely seen by the public. Among the items on exhibit are items from the **Phil Collins collection**.

In 2014, the British rocker donated more than 400 items from Texas' revolutionary period to the state. Collins became interested in Texas history after watching Disney's **Davy Crockett** television show as a child. As a famous musician, his fascination became an obsession.

The new exhibition hall is behind the Alamo church and the gift shop. The Collections Center opened to the public on March 3, 2023, and the two-story building is only large enough to display a fraction of the Alamo's collection of more than 3,000 artifacts.

Once the **Alamo Visitor Center and Museum** opens in 2026, the artifacts will go on permanent exhibition. The Collections Center will then host traveling exhibits.

The current display of artifacts donated by multiple collectors ranges from weaponry to personal items from the time period. The small cards identifying the objects give little historic context.

It would be difficult to pick a favorite item, but several things stand out. The ceremonial swords linked to **Sam Houston** and Gen. **Santa Anna** are among the most unique articles. Upstairs in the document room is a muster roll taken at the fort before the battle. On the first floor, a large diorama of the Alamo has Collins, in his

It Was “More Than Football” for Violette

Even by soccer’s dubious standards, **CONCACAF** – the sport’s governing body in North America, Central America, and the Caribbean – has a checkered reputation. Laughable playing conditions, inexplicable refereeing decisions, and bizarre fan conduct are all fundamentally ingrained in the region’s footballing identity.

But on nights like Tuesday night at **Q2 Stadium**, CONCACAF is everything that’s right about sports.

Fair warning: This is not an **Austin FC** column. If you’re here to learn why **Gyasi Zardes** managed zero shots on target in a match where ATX had 76% possession and 58 crosses, go elsewhere. If you need to rage-read something about Austin FC embarrassing its country in the CONCACAF Champions League, try last week’s installment, which followed El Tree’s stunning 3-0 loss to Haitian club **Violette AC** in the first half of the two-leg matchup. Austin’s 2-0 win at home on Tuesday wasn’t good enough to flip the script, so its story has already been told.

No, this is a Violette column. Because Violette deserves it. Because when you take a step back to understand exactly what the Haitian side achieved in eliminating an MLS club from the knockout competition, and you process exactly how high the odds were stacked against them, and you listen to what it means to those players given what’s transpired in their country over the past several months ... it’s no less than one of the most remarkable sports stories in recent memory.

“Honestly, it’s the most beautiful moment of my life,” said Violette captain **Steeven Saba**, holding back tears. “This game wasn’t about beautiful football for us. It was more than football. It was for everyone in Haiti.”

Things are dire in Saba’s home nation, which has been in the thrall of a humanitarian crisis since the assassination of President Jovenel Moïse in the summer of 2021. Gangs control much of the country; violence, hunger, and death are rampant. Recently the situation has escalated, and the Caribbean nation has asked for armed intervention from abroad to help end what a United Nations human rights official called a “living nightmare.”

Naturally, sport is an afterthought in such a climate. Haiti’s domestic league is suspended indefinitely. Prior to last week’s first leg against Austin, Violette had not played

an official competitive match in nearly 300 days. And when they did host the Verde and Black for their “home” leg, the match had to be played across the border in the Dominican Republic in a nearly empty stadium.

But through 180 minutes against an American club with every imaginable advantage, Violette stood tall, becoming the first Haitian club ever to win a CCL round. “Where we’re from, I always say we never stop fighting. We fight through adversity through anything that happens,” Saba said.

With six players barred from entering the United States due to unobtained visas and a bench that ran just three players deep, Violette defended its 3-0 aggregate lead like its life depended on it. Austin applied constant pressure and ran up the shot tally to a staggering 35. Sebastián Driussi found two second-half goals (one from a brutal goalkeeper error) and Austin came up on the wrong end of multiple video assistant referee decisions. But Violette never crumbled, and saw out arguably the biggest upset in CCL history.

“We knew we had to suffer through difficult moments. We knew it was going to take heart. Even with only 14 players, we wanted to go through, and we fought,” Violette manager **Rony Attimy** said, hoping that the historic victory can serve as some inspiration to his fellow Haitians through the turmoil.

“The players showed that no matter what the difficulty we are facing at home, we need to keep going,” Attimy said. “Keep fighting. Keep creating. Because in adversity, good things can still happen.”



Beat the Clock

Full Time reinvents the ticking clock thriller as a social drama **BY JOSH KUPECKI**

It all starts so peacefully, with a body in repose. Julie (Calamy) sleeps, the steady rhythm of her breathing soon broken by another beat: her alarm. Julie is the mother of two young children, a boy and a girl, whom she wakes so they can prepare for school. Julie is divorced, and she's having trouble contacting her ex-husband, who has yet to send the month's alimony. Julie longs to return to her career in the corporate world as a market researcher, and she has an interview this week. Julie currently works as the head chambermaid at a five-star hotel in Paris, but she lives in a distant suburb. Julie lives a life of such delicate balance that the smallest of variables could send everything tumbling down. But in French Canadian filmmaker Eric Gravel's relentlessly paced *Full Time*, fate sends no

less than a massive public service strike that paralyzes the railways and metros of Paris and its outside environs.

Full Time charts with harrowing immediacy Julie's struggle to keep it all together. The camera never leaves her as she figures out

how to cover her shift so she can go to the job interview, how to placate the put-upon Madame Lusigny (Mnich), who tends to Julie's children after school, and how to deal with the fact that at any moment her financial resources are going to dry up with a "card declined" message.

And looming over it all with crowds of stranded commuters and gridlocked traffic, Julie has to actually navigate to these places: work in the city, home to her family, shopping for an impending birthday party, and that nerve-racking job interview. It is geography as enemy. The film layers in reversals and complications, driven by Irène Drésel's wonderfully tense soundtrack and Mathilde Van de Moortel's virtuoso editing, which picked up awards at the Venice Film Festival and the Césars. The cumulative effect is (repeatedly) heart-stopping.

And while Gravel's film resonates with the larger themes of labor inequality, parenthood, job insecurity, and social unrest, *Full Time* never loses the focus of what it is, which is one of the best thrillers of the year.

High above the city in a Manhattan penthouse, art thief Nemo (Dafoe) is tasked with stealing the priceless artwork displayed within. With two out of the three works by Egon Schiele he set out to take in the bag, Nemo cuts his losses and prepares to make his exit with the help of his offscreen accomplices. However, there's a problem – a computer malfunction that's sealed the door and trapped Nemo inside. What started as a straightforward art heist quickly turns into a contained, tense survival thriller about the thief's attempts at escape and dissolution into madness. *Inside*, the debut feature from Greek filmmaker Vasilis Katsoupis, looks great on paper but falls short in execution. Flitting between arthouse parody and self-important nonsense, *Inside* could easily slide into the latter entirely if it wasn't for Dafoe's committed and reliably compelling performance.

We follow Nemo as he wanders around the penthouse, which is without tap water and temperature regulation thanks to the thief breaking the smart hub that runs everything. In between getting drunk and rummaging through the penthouse's rooms and cupboards, Nemo seeks escape through a central window on the roof. We also get a closer look at the art adorning the walls, made up of real works and two pieces commissioned for the movie that pop out amongst the austere visual sensibility of *Inside*. Eventually, the thief starts to break over time, talking to himself and getting attached to the pigeon trapped on the balcony and the people he sees on the security camera footage, clueless to his existence.

It's a concept that works when Dafoe is at his most committed. Nemo has to rearrange furniture and art, deconstructing the gilded cage he's trapped in to survive, and that results in an incredibly physical performance from Dafoe. He pushes tables down staircases, monologues, sings a bit of "The Macarena" (unfortunately no dancing), and even slurps down ice cubes and water trickling from a sprinkler with the rigorous commitment we've come to expect from Dafoe. Yet, his compelling performance is not enough to save the movie from a lack of vision beyond face value. What we get ultimately is a muddled message about art as necessity and then utility, all while the movie tries to cleverly create its own take on performance art through Dafoe.

Inside's narrative being so muddled is a disservice to a promising concept. There are shades of what could've made an interesting, or at least distinct, movie here: Nemo walking around a party in a hallucinatory dream (or flashback? it's never clear), the discovery of a cryptic, maybe even occult book, and empty nods toward the sexual frustration and isolation Nemo experiences while trapped. Instead of

being brave enough to follow through, the movie is more interested in gesturing toward its incoherent message, which is a shame. *Inside* has all the surface trappings of an arthouse hit, but don't look too closely – there isn't much there.

MOVING ON

Claire (Fonda) has traveled to Southern California to pay respects to her recently deceased college chum Molly (Dent), but also to murder Molly's husband, Howard (McDowell), because nearly half a century earlier, Howard raped Claire. It's a secret Claire has kept, and now that Molly has passed away, all bets are off for Howard. But Molly's funeral has also brought out Evelyn (Tomlin), another old classmate and, it turns out, an ex-lover of Molly's before Howard stepped in. So, when Claire confides her plan to Evelyn, it doesn't take a whole lot of convincing for Evelyn to hop on board, accessorywise.

Moving On's tone is a hard one to pin down, since it's constantly, uh, moving. It is predominantly a continued showcase for Fonda and Tomlin to gently trade barbs with each other and ruminate on the sadly specific lamentations of the twilight years. It's a subdued *Grace and Frankie*, although here Tomlin trades in the hippie tendencies and instead channels Fran Lebowitz, all deadpan and side-eye. Fonda's Claire is of single purpose here, but she does have time to reignite an affair with her ex-husband Ralph (Roundtree), and here the film dips into its heartfelt mode.

A boy who visits his grandfather at the assisted living home where Evelyn resides likes to play dress-up with her clothes, and his parents are none too pleased. Molly's daughter Allie (Burns) confesses to Evelyn that she found love letters written by Evelyn to her mother, still kept after all these years and hidden from Howard. Which is the other thread to this shambling film, the whole rape-revenge plot that is supposedly driving these characters.

But it's mostly played as a farce, until it gets *really fucking serious*, and then there's a joke about Viagra. McDowell's Howard is cartoonishly evil (even for Caligula himself), ultimately conceding that while the sex in question may have been rough, Claire really wanted it. Cue another murder attempt. It's dull and wearisome and any attempts to resonate do so in the most calculatingly maudlin ways (drinking problems and pet obsessions being two glaring examples). The film never lets these characters earn anything, despite everyone ending up moving on in *Moving On*. You're advised to do the same, when it materializes as one of your viewing options.

Don't ask who these humans are, how they existed during the tail end of the Cretaceous period, or what illness the girl suffers from. In fact, it's best not to think too deeply about any of the plot devices woven into this high-concept blockbuster. Besides, the film only spends 10 minutes on the bare-bones exposition before Mills' spacecraft crash-lands on Earth thanks to an unexpected meteor shower. The rest is prehistory.

rows of cryogenically frozen passengers. Assuming they all perished, Mills abandons hope until he discovers (surprise!) a girl named Koa (Greenblatt) who survived the fall. She doesn't speak his language, a conveniently modern English, but they must learn to communicate if they want any chance of reaching the faraway escape pod. Oh, and did I mention the dinosaurs?

At its iron-and-nickel core, 65 functions as a heavy visual effects popcorn movie. The pterodactyls and T. rexes appear convincingly realistic, even at high speeds. The advanced space weapons, including olive-sized explosives and a rechargeable rifle capable of paralyzing velociraptors, make for memorable action sequences akin to the *Predator* franchise. If nothing else, this PG-13 adventure flick entertains in bursts, ideal for intermittent viewing when it inevitably arrives on a streaming service.

Plagued by months of delays from distributor Sony Pictures Releasing, 65 struggles to find its footing. At once science fiction, horror, and drama, it's never enough of any genre. The tone toggles between curious and treacherous, which could work as a parallel to the inquisitive 9-year-old Koa and the hardened veteran Mills, but various technical aspects refuse to ever be in agreement. Take the score, a decidedly cinematic orchestra piece by composer Chris Bacon (A&E's *Bates Motel*), and watch how the onscreen action rarely aligns with the tempo or even the mood. The same could be said of the stunning yet not quite fitting cinematography from Salvatore Totino (*Space Jam: A New Legacy*, *Bird Box*).

Driver, for his part, knows how to captivate an audience. Even without the help of a fitted astronaut costume that clings to his sculpture, the star of *Marriage Story* and the *Star Wars* sequel trilogy plays a surrogate father with emotional ease, comforting his stand-in daughter and believably shouting in agony when she's in peril. Greenblatt (*Love and Monsters*) holds her own alongside the two-time Oscar nominee.

If you go into 65 expecting *Star Wars*-meets-*Jurassic Park*, lower your expectations. While there's not enough outer space to call it an intergalactic odyssey and barely enough dino havoc, 65 has just the right amount of vigor to survive its relatively short run time. If only we could say the same for the dinosaurs.

Take a Pizza Our Hearts

Fresh pies? Save us a slice!

We're really stepping on the third rail here, daring to engage in Pizza Discourse. For such a simple dish – baked dough topped with sauce, cheese, meat, and veggies – folks have strong and polarizing opinions about what makes great pie. The stasis point in the Great Pizza Debate, probably, is the style. There's New York style, New Jersey style, Chicago, Detroit, New Haven, Neapolitan, Sicilian ... the list goes on. This cacophony of voices and accents in the pizza space, with a dipping cup of globalization on the side, means that new pizza places have popped up in recent years like fungi after a good spring rain.

Austin has plenty of well-loved pizza joints that we're hereby endowing with emeritus status: Home Slice, East Side Pies, Bufalina, Pinthouse Pizza, Via 313, Conans, Mangia, Little Deli. These folks have earned their stripes over the years by consistently serving high-quality pizza in their respective styles. But there are also lots of young up-and-comers on Austin's pizza scene, slinging dough from food trucks to suburban strip malls, that are definitely worth a look-see. We've rounded them up here as a guide, which you can use to educate yourself and expand your pizza horizons.

BALDINUCCI PIZZA ROMANA 3300 Bee Cave Rd. #110, 512/382-1166 baldinucci.pizza

Baldinucci made the transition from ghost kitchen to West Lake brick-and-mortar in October 2022, and social media has been alight with rave reviews. The speciality of the house here is Roman pizza (the name of the restaurant may have tipped you off), with thick squares of buttery dough topped with a sweet-ish marinara and gooey cheese, and just about the most generous mounds of toppings I've seen on a pie. Here's a slab with a mound of quattro funghi; and my gods, would you look at the full serving of broccoli on that Bianco Florentine? The fam really loved the good old-fashioned pepperoni, which we ordered as a full tray. The pepperoni, cupped and crispy, is plentiful, the cheese is gooey and creamy, and the crust is buttery without being oily or greasy. Baldinucci also offers vegan Roman-style pizza with plant-based cheese and generous portions of veggies, and New York-style pizza in bold variants like lasagna and Buffalo chicken. Top it off with a cup of peanut butter and jelly gelato and you'll have the perfect Roman holiday without leaving the city limits. — Melanie Haupt

We can hardly believe the star power behind this newest (2022) pizza place that's rockin' pies in the heart of the Bouldin Creek neighborhood. Working a hybrid of New York and Neapolitan styles, Dovetail Pizza is a culinary collab from the wizards of Present Tense Hospitality (Salt & Time, Rosen's Bagels), Todd Duplechan of Lenoir and Vixen's Wedding, and Swedish Hill's Alex Manley (who developed the place's signature slow-fermentation dough). The mighty maestri and their crew make all manner of meat and veggies sing hallelujah on generous pies and serve them (and a panoply of unique starters, salads, and pasta dishes) with condiment options of chili crisp and herbed vinegar instead of the same ol' same ol' red flakes and parm, bringing a family-friendly goodness that shades to more grownup pleasures when the night is deep and the full bar crescendos with cocktails for perfect pizza pairings. We tried the meatball pizza special on our visit, with Salt & Time-concocted meatballs dotted with smol rosettes of ricotta. *Deliziosa!* — Wayne Alan Brenner

SAMMATARO PIZZA 1108 E. 12th, 512/690-1547; 900 W. 10th sammataro.love

What started as a New York-style pizza pop-up in West Lake in late 2020 is now an Eastside food truck and a West End brick-and-mortar, having moved into the space vacated by another pizzeria, 40 North, in January 2023. Walk up to the truck at the Arbor Food Park on 12th and enjoy a few BYOBrewskis while waiting for a fresh, wood-fired pepperoni pizza with those tiny little cup 'n' char 'ronis. The cheese is tangy, the pepperoni spicy, and the crust is perfectly chewy. The restaurant offers an extended menu including pastas, meatballs, and daily pizza specials, along with beer and wine. This is truly excellent pizza, but the price tag is a little extra, clocking in at \$30 for a 16-inch pie with one topping. — M.H.

PEDROSO'S PIZZA

8315 Burnet Rd., 737/600-1107

Name a more hyped pizza place in this town than Pedroso's. You can't, because every foodfluencer in Austin is praising this li'l food truck outside the Night Owl bar on Burnet Road to the heavens. The main attraction here is the Grandma style, which is a rectangular pie with a thickish crust that's reminiscent of focaccia and the sauce atop the cheese. Here we like the Double Pepp N' Peppers, topped with a heaping helping of cup 'n' char pepperoni and a double whammy of serrano and banana peppers. Hurts so good! Others swear by the New York style, available by both the slice and the full pie. Do not, under any circumstances, skip the caprese salad. You simply must start your meal with this elegantly executed, flavorful salad of sliced mozzarella and tomatoes, with a deliciously umami balsamic reduction. — M.H.

LOVE SUPREME PIZZA BAR

Ryan McElroy, who launched Thunderbird Coffee in 2006 and Bird Bird Biscuit (with Brian Batch) in 2018, decided to partner with his brother Wade and chef Russell Victorioso and open up a pizza joint on Manor Road in 2021. It's not just any pizza joint, though. It's a neighborhood place, ever-welcoming with sumptuous booths and covered patio and outdoor bar, that's so casually elegant it'd make Instagram weep. It's a destination that boasts New York/Neapolitan pizza – the dough flour here sourced from Barton Springs Mill – and several rich variations (along with salads, award-winning chicken wings, and omg those meatballs in marinara). We can recommend the margherita, which is somehow minimalist yet sumptuous at the same time, the exterior crust blistered yet concealing a soft and chewy interior. Among the beverage selection, an array of natural wines as curated by General Manager Paulina Cline. —W.A.B.

Longtime pizza explorer Tony Curet started out in Austin with the Neapolitan-flexing Dough Boys Pizza in June of 2020, eventually selling his wares (in partnership with Max Tilka) out of a dedicated food truck in the lot of Meanwhile Brewing Co. Now the talented chef Curet's gone solo with his newest business, Side Eye Pies, on that same brew-adjacent site, basing his beauties on cold-fermented, small-batch dough made fresh right there with Texas Red Wheat flour and native yeast from Barton Springs Mills. He loads those pies with handcrafted organic sauces, house-grated cheese, slow food-approved organic meats – sourcing the basics from Hi-Fi Mycology, Iron Ox Farms, and other local farms – and bakes 'em all in a wood-fired oven until they're properly hot and crispy and just what you're looking for in the way of classics, culinarily experimentals, and even a vegan pie. (Bonus: Their secret brunch weapon, a sweet dish – the Texas Skillet Pancake topped with homemade vanilla whipped cream, fresh fruit compote, and maple syrup – is not to be missed.) — W.A.B.

Of all the mid-March day parties, I believe Hair of the 3-Legged Dog stands among the great truly Austin experiences during SXSW. It takes place at one of the city's most vital venues, Hotel Vegas; it draws a super townie crowd; the sponsors are all legit local delights (stumble in to free breakfast tacos from Eldorado Cafe); and – as always – it waves the flag for Austin music. While we basically threw a punk show last year, this year's Hot3LD presents an all-over-the-map smattering of incredibly engaging live performers who all happen to be hitting a creative peak right now.

The haunting, high-energy, dark Americana quartet Rattlesnake Milk – recommended for fans of Hank Williams Sr. and people who keep an unregistered firearm in their truck's glove box – just made a career album, *Chicken Fried Snake*, that's sure to be a staple on Best of the Year lists from outsider country commentators. Kydd Jones, a longtime linchpin of Austin hip-hop and creator of the Onyx D'or fashion line, recently seized the spotlight with an immaculate opening verse on the X.O and Quin NFN collab "Pressure," contrasting "Dog I've been grindin' forever – came out the Salvation Army and ghettos" with "Can't even stand next to the King like Coretta."

Synth rock/post-punk trio Urban Heat is having a banner year: breaking out nationally with their emotionally resonant single "Have You Ever?" gracing the cover of the *Chronicle*, and getting booked to play May's Cruel World Festival at the Rose Bowl with acts like Iggy Pop, Echo & the Bunnymen, and Gang of Four. Being Dead, with their unfathomable quirkiness, hilarious stage demeanor, and garagey, harmonious, psychedelic outsider pop, were recently signed to indie springboard Bayonet Records with a yet-to-be-announced masterpiece coming soon.

Joseph Edward Beach, 60, of Austin, Texas, died January 10 at Doug's House, Austin, after a three-month battle with cancer.


