A KID-FRIENDLY GUIDE TO AUSTIN MUSEUM DAY

No clue where to start planning your 2016 Austin Museum Day? Try this kid-friendly sample itinerary. Enjoy a day of discovery of our city's art and culture with themed stops revolving around technology. With so many wonderful Austin institutions participating in Museum Day, this is just one way to get the most out of your September 18th.



Start your Austin Museum Day with a treasure hunt at the Lyndon Baines Johnson Presidential Library (2313 Red River St.), where you'll find an exhibit of historical treasures from The University of Texas at Austin's Briscoe Center for American History. As the kids enjoy their hunt (and prizes!), you'll have plenty of opportunities to start your day's conversation about how technological advances change our world. And if your little ones like Pokémon Go, five bucks says they compare the scavenger hunt to their beloved game. The library opens at 9am, with the treasure hunt from 10am to 4pm.

Make your next stop at Women and Their Work (1710 Lavaca St.) for the gallery's Red Dot Art Spree, which runs from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and features original works by some of the most recognized artists in Texas. While Mom or Dad hunts for that perfect piece to take home, the kids can enjoy a game of I Spy, with coupons up for grabs for all of the correct answers.

After a quick lunch at one of Austin's many great eateries, head to the Texas Capitol Visitors Center (112 E 11th St.) to learn about the major archaeological dig conducted before the Capitol Extension construction more than 25 years ago. Chances are your kid wants or wanted or will want to be an archaeologist at some point, so my guess is they'll dig (I'm sorry!) seeing the toys and tools

from long ago. And you can keep up your discussion of technology as they test their skills at the center's hands-on dig site from noon to 5pm.

Kids ready for a snack? Head over to Laguna Gloria (3809 W 35th St.) between noon and 4pm to grab a bite from a local food truck before you and the kids discover how works of art at Laguna Gloria are influenced by the sky. Be sure to check out the aerial performance by Sky Candy, as well as the Mobile Planetarium, and contribute to a galaxy installation.

If you can pull yourself away from Laguna Gloria in time, make your way to the Harry Ransom Center (300 W 21st St.) for a free docent-led tour of the photography exhibition Elliott Erwitt: Home Around the World at 4pm. Talk to your little ones about the days no one carried cameras in their pockets at all times. And don't forget to show the kids the Gutenberg Bible and the world's first photograph on display in the lobby!

End your Museum Day with the ultimate kid-friendly technological experience: an interactive Pokémon exhibit and playable 80s arcade games at the newly opened Austin Toy Museum (1108 E Cesar Chavez St.) Get there before 7pm to show your kids the video games you first loved and wrap up your day of discovery by rediscovering the kid within.
